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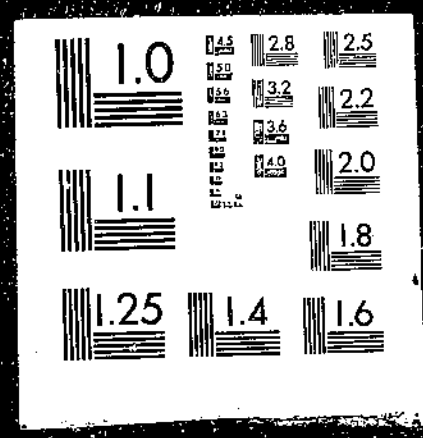

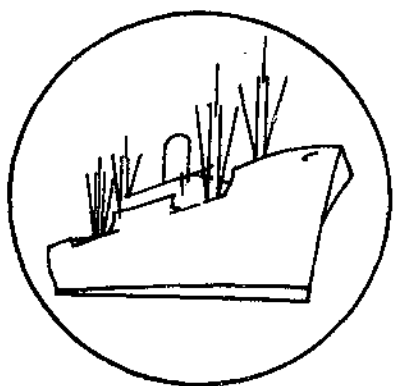

Digest

U.S. Agricultural Exports Hit a Record \$22 Billion in 1974 (see p. 5). For the fifth consecutive year, U.S. agricultural exports advanced to a new record in 1974. Exports of farm products rose one-fourth above the 1973 level to an unprecedented \$22 billion. All of the increase stemmed from higher prices, as volume fell about 8 percent. The sharp expansion in agricultural exports during 1974 was a continuation of the growth that started in late 1972 as a result of the opening of East-West trade, reduced agricultural production in some areas, a decline in fishmeal production in Peru, and a continuing rise in demand stemming from higher incomes. The value increases were primarily in soybeans, soybean oil, wheat, feed grains, and cotton; except for the soybean group, the volume for these commodities was below the level for a year earlier. With the exception of the USSR, nearly every region and country took more U.S. agricultural exports in 1974. Exports to Asia, totaling \$8.4 billion, increased by nearly \$2 billion, making it the top market for U.S. agricultural exports. Substantial increases occurred to the developing countries of Asia, Africa, and Latin America. Exports to most developed countries showed only moderate gains during 1974.

Calendar Year Imports of Farm Products Total \$10.2 Billion (see p. 43). U.S. agricultural imports reached a record \$10.25 billion during 1974. The higher value resulted almost entirely from price increases, as volume declined for most major items. Competitive agricultural imports advanced 26 percent in value to over \$7 billion, and noncompetitive commodities rose 13 percent to \$3.2 billion.

U.S. Agricultural Imports From EC More Than Double in 5 Years (see p. 54). Fiscal 1974 U.S. agricultural imports from the EC totaled over \$1.2 billion, more than double the fiscal 1969 value. The sharpest annual increase occurred in fiscal 1974. This area is the second largest source of U.S. farm product imports. Most of these imports were competitive with domestically produced items. Statistical tables provide import data by commodity and country.

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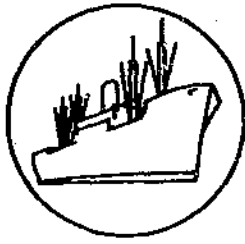
Selected Prices of International Significance (see p. 66). December was a month of weakened commodity prices nearly across the board. The Dow-Jones commodity spot price index declined 29 points to 391, and the Reuters index declined 43 points to 1197. International prices for wheat, rice, soybeans, soybean meal, cotton, cow meat, sugar, and cocoa beans all weakened during December.

U.S. Farm Exports Were a Record \$10.6 Billion in July-December (see p. 71). U.S. exports in the first half of fiscal 1975 advanced 7 percent to a 6-month record \$10.6 billion. The increase was accounted for by higher prices, as the volume of exports was off by around a sixth. Oilseeds and products were up nearly a fourth, and accounted for two-thirds of the overall increase. Although the value of wheat and feed grains was near last year's level, the volume was off substantially for both grains. The declines in exports to the USSR, Eastern Europe, and the PRC were offset by increases to Asia, Latin America, Western Europe, and Africa.

Sugar Leads 16-Percent Rise in Agricultural Import Value (see p. 103). During July-December 1974, U.S. imports of competitive farm products totaled \$3.7 billion, or one-fourth higher than a year earlier. Value gains for sugar, oilseed products, grains, fruit, and tobacco accounted for most of the increase. Noncompetitive items declined slightly to \$1.34 billion, largely because of lower coffee imports.

U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS HIT A RECORD \$22 BILLION IN 1974

U.S. agricultural exports totaled an unprecedented \$22 billion in calendar year 1974, one-fourth above the 1973 level. Export volume fell 6 percent, but the export unit value increased by one-third. Sharp export price increases occurred for wheat, feed grains, rice, soybeans, and vegetable oils, while prices for meats, hides and skins, and soybean meal fell from record 1973 levels. The export unit value of cotton for all of 1974 was up substantially, but cotton spot prices fell sharply during the last part of the year.

This was the fifth year in a row that the value of U.S. agricultural exports reached a new record. The sharp expansion in agricultural exports during 1974 was a continuation of the export growth that started in late 1972 as the result of the opening up of East-West trade, reduced agricultural production in some areas, a decline in fish-meal production in Peru, and the continued rise in demand stemming from higher incomes and larger populations in both developed and developing countries.

The 25-percent increase in U.S. agricultural exports boosted the favorable U.S. agricultural trade balance by \$2.5 billion to a record \$11.8 billion, despite a 22-percent increase in agricultural imports to a record \$10.25 billion. This agricultural trade balance helped to offset the country's deficit in nonagricultural products, which totaled \$14.8 billion in 1974, nearly double the deficit of a year earlier. The quadrupling of the price of petroleum imports was the principal reason for the deteriorating trade balance in nonfarm products. The cost of the U.S. petroleum import bill was \$24 billion in 1974--also a fourfold increase from a year earlier. Overall, the United States had a trade deficit of \$3.0 billion in 1974, compared with a favorable trade balance of \$1.3 billion in 1973.

Major Commodities Exported

Grains and Preparations

U.S. exports of grains and preparations advanced to an alltime high of \$10.3 billion in 1974, more than one-fifth above the 1973 level. Higher export prices more than offset a decline in export volume that occurred for all grains except rice. Export

unit values rose to \$177 from \$108 a ton for wheat, to \$125 from \$85 a ton for feed grains, and to \$494 from \$330 a ton for rice.

Exports of wheat and products fell nearly one-third in volume in 1974--from 38.8 million tons to 26.3 million. Nevertheless, this was the second highest level on record and was equivalent to around two-thirds of U.S. wheat production.

Most of the decline in wheat exports during 1974 occurred in shipments to the USSR, the People's Republic of China, and most developed countries. Exports to the USSR totaled 1.1 million tons in 1974, compared with 8.7 million in 1973. The People's Republic of China took 1.9 million tons--down from 2.6 million in 1973. Japan's imports of U.S. wheat were over 600,000 tons lower than in 1973. Exports also dropped to South Korea, Brazil, and Argentina.

Developing countries became important cash markets for U.S. wheat in 1974, as indicated by the sharp advances in exports to South Asia, the Middle East, Africa, and Latin America. While reduced food grain production because of bad weather was a factor in the growth of wheat exports to these markets, increased population and improved incomes were also important. Also, wheat production was down in Australia and Argentina, and Canada's wheat exports during much of 1974 were hampered by transportation problems.

Total world wheat trade in the current marketing year (July-June) is estimated to total 71 million tons--up slightly from the 68 million tons of a year earlier. The United States is expected to account for two-fifths of the 1974/75 world wheat trade.

U.S. rice exports totaled about 1.73 million tons in 1974, slightly above 1973's 1.63 million tons. The increase occurred in commercial sales for dollars as exports under Government-financed programs were down. Rice exports fell to South Vietnam, Bangladesh, Indonesia, and Korea. However, they increased to the Middle East, North Africa, and to the European Economic Community (EC).

U.S. feed grain exports of 37.2 million tons were about 10 percent below 1973's record of 41.5 million tons. There were several reasons for the decline. Because of the reduced U.S. crop from unfavorable weather, U.S. prices were up sharply and supplies available for export were very tight, which discouraged exports. In addition, production in some other major exporting countries was somewhat more favorable than a year earlier. The EC had a record wheat crop and had more available for feeding. At the same time, record prices, inflation, and reduced economic growth in major markets slowed the increase in production of livestock and livestock products.

U.S. feed grain exports to Japan totaled 8.7 million tons in 1974, down about 1.6 million tons from a year earlier. Japan purchased more grains from Thailand, South Africa, and other major exporters, while at the same time, expansion in the Japanese livestock industry softened.

U.S. feed grain exports to the USSR, totaling slightly over 2 million tons in 1974, were about half the 1973 level. Improved grain crops in the USSR in 1973 and a relatively good one in 1974 reduced feed grain import requirements. But if the United States had had larger supplies, our feed grain exports to the USSR would probably have been much larger because of the expanding livestock production in that country.

The EC's imports of U.S. feed grains totaled about 10.4 million tons, slightly below 1973's 11.3 million tons. The declines occurred primarily in shipments to the United Kingdom and Italy. Record grain production in the EC was one reason for the reduced need for U.S. grains. In addition, economic slowdowns tempered the demand for live-stock products. The higher grain prices and depressed prices for livestock and meats also discouraged feeding.

Other major markets for U.S. feed grains included Spain, Portugal, the Republic of China (Taiwan), South Korea, Mexico, Israel, and Greece. Exports to Mexico totaled over 2 million tons, up 123 percent from 1973 and the third consecutive increase on record.

Oilseeds and Products

U.S. exports of oilseeds, including products, rose for the 14th consecutive year to reach a record value of \$5.7 billion. The value was about one-fourth above the 1973 level. Most of the increase stemmed from higher prices, which were up about 20 percent. Export volume of soybeans and soybean meal was also above the 1973 levels. The volume of soybean oil exports was also up substantially, and higher prices helped to push the value up by nearly three times. Exports of soybeans totaled 515 million bushels in 1974, compared with 486 million in 1973. Demand for soybeans continued very strong because of the tight world protein-supply situation and a tight supply of vegetable oils. Peru, the largest fishmeal exporter, continued to have relatively limited amounts of fishmeal for export. During 1974, Peru exported an estimated over 600,000 tons of fishmeal, compared with 350,000 a year earlier. Normally, exports would approach 2 million tons, which would be equivalent to over 120 million bushels of soybeans. In addition, livestock production advanced, although at a much slower pace in Western Europe, Japan, and Canada and some developing countries. U.S. soybean exports have gained rapidly since World War II, with the increase averaging over 10 percent annually. The increase has been concentrated in the enlarged EC, Mexico, Spain, and the People's Republic of China. Exports to Japan, the largest market, fell to 101 million bushels from 117 million in 1973. Around half of U.S. soybean production is exported in the form of meal or soybeans. These exports account for about half of the world meal exports in either meal or oilseed form.

U.S. exports of oilcake and meal rose about 513,000 tons in 1974 to a record 5.8 million tons. In contrast to most commodities, the quantity increase was responsible for the value gain. Soybean meal prices were unusually high in 1973 when U.S. supplies became very tight because of the increased foreign demand and the relatively small U.S. output. The increase in soybean meal exports occurred primarily to the developed countries. Growth in meal exports to the EC has slowed somewhat in recent years, as the Community has expanded its oilseed crushing capacity and purchased more of its meal in the form of soybeans.

U.S. exports of cottonseed and soybean oil in 1974 totaled 2.3 billion lbs., up from 1.6 billion lbs. a year earlier. Soybean oil, which accounted for nearly all of the increase, rose to 1.7 billion pounds in 1974 from 1.0 billion pounds a year earlier. Reduced oil supplies overseas, primarily coconut oils, increased the demand for U.S. soybean oil. In addition, foreign consumption of vegetable oils has been gaining rapidly in both developing and developed countries in recent years.

Fruits and Preparations

U.S. exports of fruits and preparations in 1974 increased by over one-tenth to \$596 million. Higher prices accounted for most of the value increase; however, volume was up slightly. Of the major commodities, fresh citrus, other fresh fruits, and dried fruits showed the largest increase in 1974. Canned fruits were down in quantity, but higher prices kept value at the 1973 level. Larger U.S. production and competitive prices encouraged exports during 1974. Canada, our largest foreign market for fruits, accounted for over half of the exports of fruits and preparations. Exports also gained to the Middle East, Western Europe, and Japan.

U.S. exports of nuts and preparations gained by over one-fourth to \$156 million in 1974. Almonds accounted for most of the increase. But exports of walnuts, pecans, filberts, and peanuts also expanded. Europe, Japan, the Middle East, and Canada were principal foreign markets for U.S. nuts.

Vegetables and Preparations

Exports of vegetables and preparations increased by nearly one-third in 1974 to \$473 million. As with fruits, much of the advance was fresh produce which increased by more than 9 percent. Canned vegetables, dehydrated vegetables, and seasonings also showed healthy increases in 1974. Export value of pulses, especially dry edible beans, showed a substantial value increase during 1974, despite an 11-percent drop in quantity. Tight supplies from the reduced 1973 crops and increased foreign demand were the principal reasons for sharply higher prices. The volume of pulse exports was up in the second half of 1974 because of the larger U.S. output and the continued strong foreign demand.

Animals and Animal Products

U.S. exports of animals and animal products advanced by 12 percent in 1974 to reach a record of \$1,774 million. A substantial price increase and a moderate increase in export volume of animal fats accounted for the gain. Exports of most other items, especially cattle and beef, declined both in price and volume during 1974.

Exports of meats and preparations fell by about one-fifth in value and about one-tenth in quantity. Increased world livestock production coupled with reduced economic activity in major markets dampened the demand for U.S. products. Because of increased production in both the major exporting countries and the traditional importing countries, many countries restricted meat imports during the past year. The decline in pork exports occurred to Japan. Exports of beef were down, especially to Canada, Japan, and Western Europe.

U.S. exports of hides and skins totaled about \$462 million, slightly below the \$473 million worth exported in 1973. The value decline reflected reduced prices resulting from a drop in economic activity and increased competition from other major producers. Japan, taking nearly 40 percent of our hide and skin exports, continued to be our best market. However, we exported considerable quantities of hides and skins to Canada, Eastern Europe, the USSR, Mexico, South Korea, the Republic of China (Taiwan), and Western Europe.

U.S. exports of animal fats, oils, and greases increased over 76 percent in value to reach a record \$585 million in 1974. Quantity was up by about 17 percent. The tight supply situation for edible oils in both producing and importing countries contributed to the sharp advance in demand for U.S. animal fats. Inedible tallow exports increased to over \$480 million, up three-fourths from the year-earlier level and accounted for most of the 1974 gain in animal fat exports. Principal gains in inedible tallow went to Egypt, South Africa, Brazil, Mexico, India, South Korea, and the United Kingdom. However, other increases occurred in edible tallow, choice white greases, lard, and other animal fats.

U.S. exports of poultry and poultry products increased about 15 percent to a record \$138 million. Both prices and volume were up. Fresh frozen chicken showed the largest increase, up over one-fifth in quantity and 29 percent in value. But eggs and nearly all other poultry products also showed substantial gains.

U.S. exports of dairy products increased about one-fourth to reach \$76 million in 1974. Higher prices accounted for most of the gain as volume fell substantially for dry whole milk, and condensed and evaporated milk. However, infants and dietary supplements and cheeses gained slightly. A very tight supply situation in early 1974 and high prices discouraged exports of dairy products.

U.S. exports of cotton, totaling 5.2 million bales in 1974, were 6 percent below the 5.5 million of a year earlier. However, higher prices pushed the value up by two-fifths to \$1.3 billion. Cotton exports were unusually large in the first half of the year, when they totaled 3.6 million bales valued at \$899 million. During the second half, exports fell to only about 1.6 million bales with a value of \$436 million. The export unit value of cotton was very high in early 1974, and when market prices fell sharply in the last part of the year, the unit value held up because the price declines discouraged importers from purchasing cotton and completing existing contracts. Most of the decline in cotton exports occurred in shipments to Southeast Asia. However, exports also fell to Canada and Western Europe. The softening of demand in major markets was primarily due to the decline in real GNP.

U.S. unmanufactured tobacco exports, including cut tobacco, rose about one-fourth to \$886 million, a new record. Quantity was up about 8 percent. Principal increases occurred in bulk smoking tobacco, burley tobacco, and flue-cured tobacco. A rather tight world tobacco supply situation encouraged U.S. exports in the past year. The average export unit value of unmanufactured tobacco increased about 16 cents a pound to \$1.28. Consumers in the principal U.S. tobacco markets in Western Europe and Asia continued to increase cigarette smoking. The increase in U.S. exports occurred primarily to Japan, Australia, the Republic of China, Thailand, and Libya.

Major Markets for U.S. Agricultural Exports

U.S. agricultural exports increased to nearly every country and region in 1974, except the USSR. Asia is now the top foreign market for U.S. farm products, taking \$8.4 billion in 1974, compared with \$6.5 billion a year earlier. Grains and preparations accounted for most of the increase. The increase was most pronounced to West Asia and South Asia. Increased foreign exchange from higher priced petroleum stimulated exports to West Asia to hit a phenomenal \$1.3 billion--nearly 142 percent greater than in 1973. Reduced grain production in South Asia required a substantial

step-up in grain imports, and U.S. exports to this region rose 48 percent to reach \$835 million.

Countries in Southeast Asia, especially the Republic of Korea, Hong Kong, and the Republic of China (Taiwan) have become a very rapid growth market for U.S. agricultural exports. All of the increase in exports to these Asian countries occurred in commercial sales, but shipments under Government programs remained important. Exports to Southeast Asia, excluding Japan and the People's Republic of China, rose 15 percent to \$2.1 billion.

U.S. exports to Western Europe totaled \$7.0 billion--up over one-fourth from a year earlier. Higher prices for grains and soybeans accounted for most of the overall value increase. However, the quantity of soybeans and soybean meal rose during 1974. Despite the slowdown in economic activity, livestock production and inventory remained at near record levels in Western Europe.

U.S. farm exports to Latin American countries hit a \$2.6 billion record in 1974, compared with \$1.7 billion in 1973. The increase occurred to Mexico, Central America, Peru, Chile, the Caribbean, Colombia, and Venezuela. Exports to the Caribbean area were up 48 percent in value. Grains accounted for most of the increase in exports to Latin America. But soybeans, fruits, and vegetables were also up.

The People's Republic of China was a market for over \$666 million worth of U.S. farm products in 1974, an increase of 16 percent over 1973. Wheat exports totaled 1.9 million tons valued at \$234 million. Corn exports were 854,000 tons. Cotton, which accounted for all the increase, rose to 783,000 bales, with a value of \$186 million. Other commodities exported to the PRC included tobacco, soybeans, and tallow.

Exports to the USSR declined by two-thirds to \$304 million in 1974. The decline occurred in wheat and corn. Wheat exports fell to 39 million bushels from 320 million, and corn dropped to 2.1 million tons from 4.2 million. Exports of lemons, soybeans, and linseed oil also fell during 1974. The record USSR grain harvest in 1973 and an estimated crop of 195.6 million tons in 1974 reduced import requirements. The short-fall of the U.S. feed grain crop in 1974 hampered U.S. feed grain exports to the USSR in 1974.

Exports to Eastern Europe rose 8 percent to top \$626 million in 1974. Higher prices accounted for most of the gain. Corn exports to Eastern Europe rose 46 percent to 46 million bushels. But the quantity of protein meal exports to Eastern Europe declined.

Exports to Japan--the top country market for our agricultural exports--rose by 16 percent to \$3.5 billion. Only 4 years ago, Japan became the first billion-dollar foreign market for U.S. farm products. The increase in 1974 stemmed from higher prices as volume was down for most commodities. Wheat exports fell 17 percent to about 3 million tons, and feed grain exports were off by more than a tenth to around 8.3 million tons. But volume gains occurred for tobacco, soybean oil, fresh fruits, fruit juices, and cotton.

Africa was also a more important market for U.S. farm products in 1974. The value of shipments doubled to reach \$1.1 billion. Grains accounted for much of the increase. Drought in much of Africa stepped up the need for grain imports. Increased prosperity of the petroleum exporting countries in Africa also has boosted the demand for U.S. farm products.

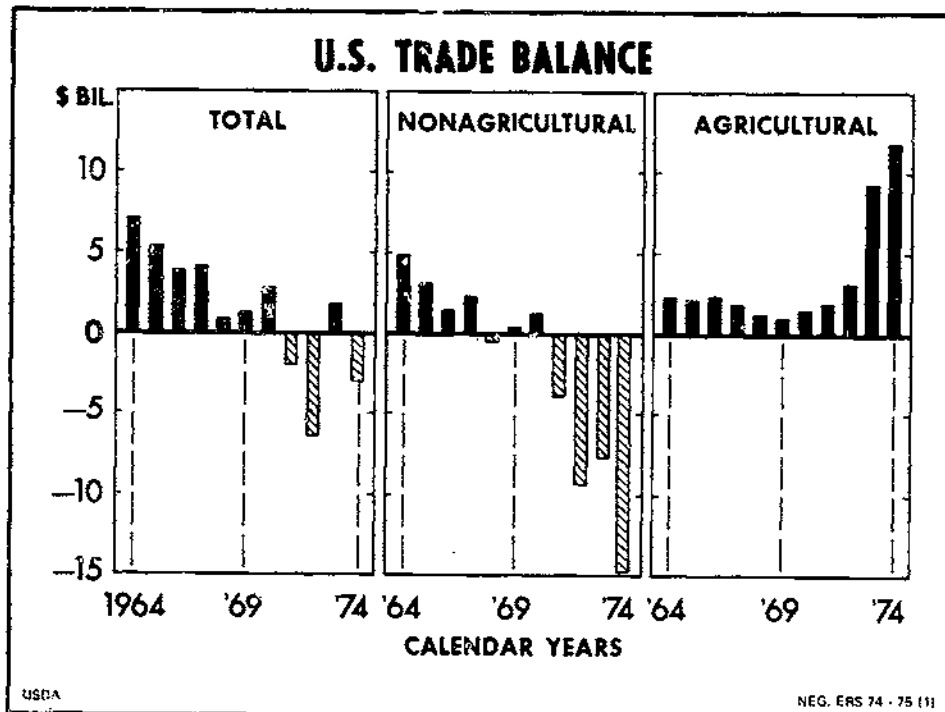

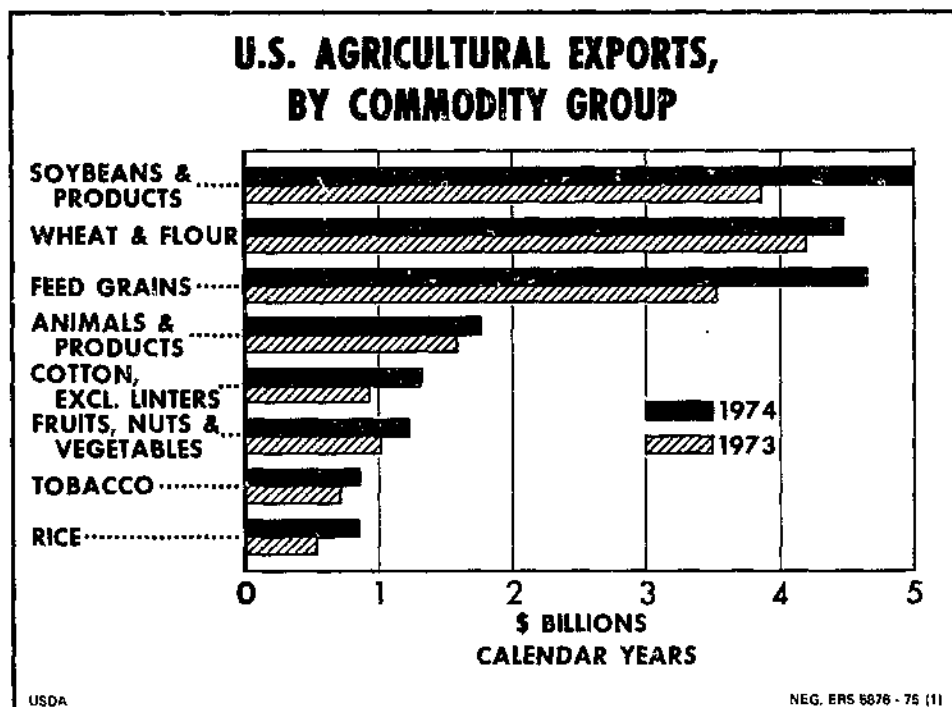

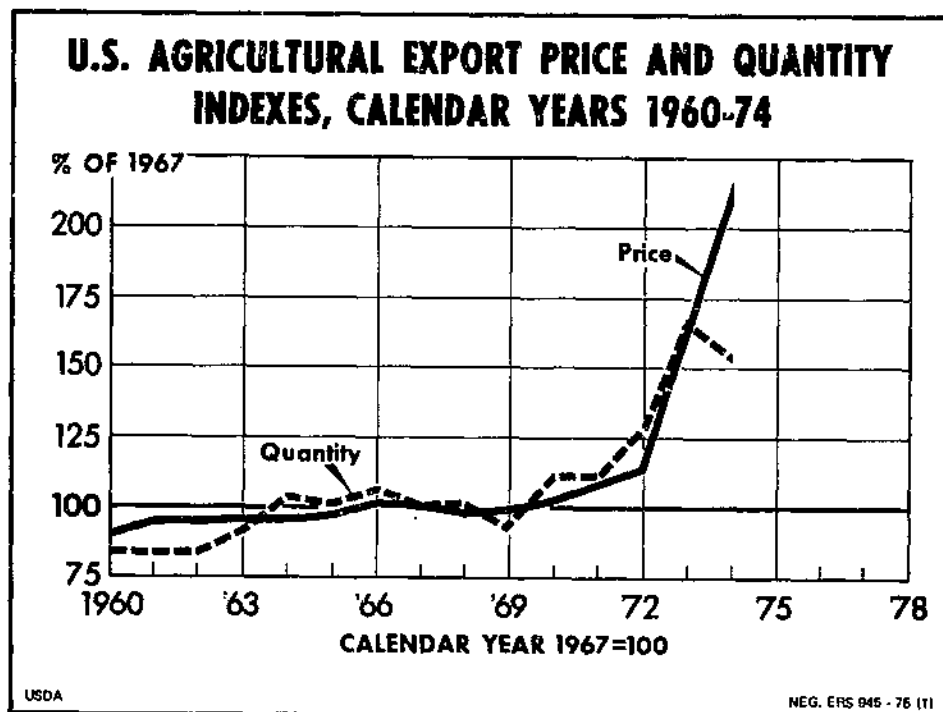
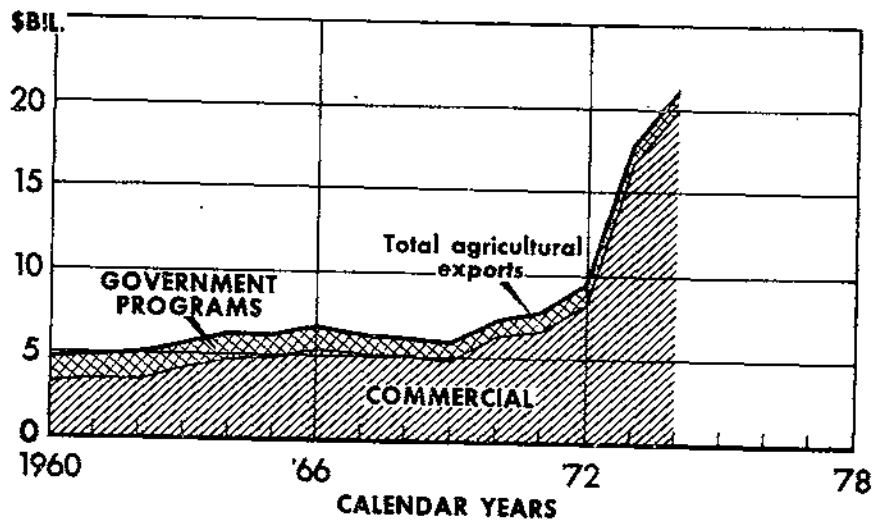

CALENDAR YEAR IMPORTS OF FARM PRODUCTS TOTAL \$10.2 BILLION

U.S. agricultural imports totaled a record \$10.2 billion during 1974, up 22 percent from the previous year's \$8.4 billion level. Increased prices accounted for the gain, as the volume was down for most items. Competitive agricultural imports advanced 26 percent in value to \$7.01 billion, and noncompetitive items rose 13 percent to \$3.24 billion. The rate of increase in farm imports began to diminish during the October-December quarter because of apparent declining demand and price reductions.

Although import unit values remained well above year-earlier levels, some declined in 1974, especially during the last quarter. Feeder cattle, beef, pork, fresh vegetables, and wine were among the principal items indicating price reductions.

Supplementary agricultural imports made up 68 percent of the total value in 1974 against 66 percent in 1973. In 1974, volume declined for a number of competitive agricultural imports, principally cattle, beef, pork, nonfat dry milk, butter, wool, copra, coconut oil, certain fruits and vegetables, edible nuts, and wines. However, increases occurred for inflows of swine, cheese, barley and wheat, cotton, tobacco, sugar, sesame and flaxseed, castor oil, palm oil, palm kernel oil, babassu oil, and gelatin.

Sugar import volume rose 10 percent to nearly 5.8 million short tons, but soaring prices drove value up 144 percent to \$2.26 billion. In value terms, sugar was the largest single agricultural commodity imported in 1974, whereas in 1973, coffee and beef inflows surpassed sugar by substantial margins. The average import unit value for sugar more than doubled, reaching \$390 per short ton in 1974, compared with \$175 in 1973.

Dutiable cattle entries dropped sharply in 1974 to 556,000 head from 1,023,000 a year earlier. Mexico shipped 435,000, compared with 673,000 in 1973, and Canada shipped only 121,000 against 348,000 in 1973. Increased U.S. slaughter rates significantly reduced the demand for foreign cattle to supplement domestic feedlot numbers this past year.

Expanded domestic meat production also resulted in smaller beef imports. Beef imports fell 18 percent to 1.2 billion pounds during 1974, with Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua shipping less beef to U.S. importers (table 13).

Pork imports declined 9 percent to 362 million pounds, primarily because of lower import demand. In addition, import restrictions were imposed on Canadian pork exports in mid-November.

Some dairy product imports fell in 1974. Nonfat dry milk entries dropped to 115 million pounds (\$47 million) from nearly 267 million pounds (\$87 million) in 1973. However, cheese imports gained 37 percent in volume to over 315 million pounds, and 60 percent in value to \$238 million. Canada, Norway, Austria, the European Community, New Zealand, Australia, and East European countries exported more cheese to the United States during 1974.

U.S. imports of fruits and vegetables, increasing slightly from their year-earlier level, reached \$650 million in 1974. Among the fruits, which were 10 percent above the 1973 level, increases were limited to strawberries, melons, figs, mangoes, dried apricots, canned apples, oranges, and pineapples. Offsetting declines occurred for many fruit imports, notably blueberries, fresh apples, orange juice concentrate, grapefruit, pears, and grape juice.

Vegetable imports, in contrast, dropped 4 percent behind their 1973 value to \$410 million. Domestic production increased markedly in 1974, reducing import demand for many fresh vegetables, such as tomatoes and onions. Import value for cucumbers, eggplant, peppers, and squash was down because of lower prices. Conversely, imports gained for carrots, potatoes, dried beans, canned pimientos, and hops.

U.S. oilbearing material imports nearly doubled in value during 1974 because of short world supplies and high prices. Imports of oilseeds, vegetable oils, and waxes reached \$585 million, compared with \$313 million in 1973. Copra imports totaled less than 59 million pounds against over 438 million pounds in 1973. Copra crushing facilities in the United States ceased operations in April 1974 because of reduced raw material availabilities. Coconut oil import volume fell 25 percent to 542 million pounds, while value skyrocketed 148 percent to \$235 million.

Import unit values for coconut oil averaged 43 cents per pound in 1974, compared with 12 cents during 1973. Virtually all U.S. copra and coconut oil imports came from the Philippines, where the marketing was centralized by the Government in 1974. Export taxes were imposed on coconut products in February and minimum prices established.

Palm oil imports rose 13 percent to 442 million pounds, while value more than doubled to \$96 million. Malaysia and Indonesia, by far the principal suppliers, instituted export taxes on palm oil in 1974. Castor oil entries--primarily from Brazil--increased by over one-fifth between 1973 and 1974, to 123 million pounds. Value rose 6 percent to nearly \$44 million. Palm kernel oil imports amounted to 146 million pounds, up 45 percent from a year earlier; value more than tripled to \$53 million as unit values increased to 37 cents per pound from 15 cents. High vegetable oil prices and scarce supplies attracted more flaxseed, babassu oil, rapeseed oil, and sesame oil in 1974 than previously.

Noncompetitive agricultural imports totaled \$3.24 billion in 1974 against less than \$2.9 billion a year earlier. Although the volume of bananas, tea, rubber, cocoa butter, crude drugs, abaca, and essential oils was slightly higher, price increases accounted for the 12-percent overall gain. Coffee, cocoa beans, sisal, vanilla beans, silk, and carpet wool volumes were down from 1973 levels.

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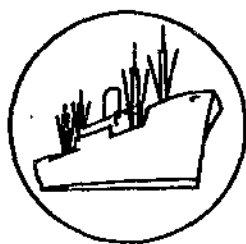

U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS FROM EC MORE THAN DOUBLE IN 5 YEARS

During fiscal year 1974, U.S. imports of farm products from members of the European Community (EC) totaled over \$1.2 billion compared with less than \$559 million 5 years earlier. The value of imports rose steadily over the period, with much of the increase occurring after the 1972 dollar devaluation. Volume also climbed for many products because of strong demand growth. The sharpest annual value gain, 39 percent, took place between fiscal years 1973 and 1974, with the rate averaging 24 percent between fiscal years 1969 and 1974. When Denmark, Ireland, and the United Kingdom joined the original six EC members in January 1973, this area became the second largest regional source of U.S. agricultural imports, behind the Latin American Free Trade Area.

Wines, cheeses, hams, skim milk powder, flower bulbs, beer, olive oil, canned tomatoes, and edible nuts are leading import items from the European Community. These and other competitive farm products make up about 90 percent of total U.S. agricultural imports from the EC.

All EC member countries shared in the increased farm exports to the United States during the last 5 fiscal years. Denmark shipped \$266 million in fiscal 1974, up sharply from \$125 million in fiscal 1969. Canned hams and cheese have been the largest items. The Netherlands exported \$252 million against \$128 million 5 years ago, with gains for hams, cheese, skim milk powder, flower bulbs, and beer. Fiscal 1974 imports of French agricultural products jumped to \$234 million from \$182 million a year earlier and \$88 million 5 years ago. France shipped substantially more cheese, skim milk powder, essential oils, and soluble coffee. Wine exports fell to \$96 million in fiscal 1974 from the record \$99 million a year earlier, but still were well above those in fiscal 1969.

Larger movements of cheese, wine, beer, hops, sausage casings, and other crude animal products boosted U.S. agricultural imports from West Germany to \$134 million from over \$53 million in fiscal 1969. Italy shipped more wine, cheese, olive oil, chestnuts, and other specialty items, and imports rose to \$123 million, compared with \$77 million in fiscal 1969. U.S. agricultural imports from the United Kingdom rose to nearly \$96 million in fiscal 1974 from \$35 million in fiscal 1969. Ireland stepped up shipments of beef and dairy products to raise the agricultural total to \$87 million from \$38 million in fiscal 1969. Belgium and Luxembourg exported over \$40 million against \$14 million 5 years earlier. Dairy products, including skim milk powder, butteroil, and cheese were major items in fiscal 1974.

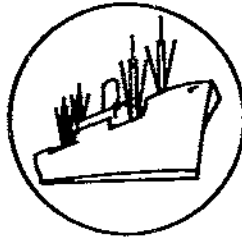

SELECTED PRICES OF INTERNATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

December was a month of weakened commodity prices nearly across the board. The Dow-Jones commodity spot price index declined 29 points to 391 and the Reuters index declined 43 points to 1197. In the United Kingdom, the newspaper Public Ledger commented that the grain market was "Akin to an end-of-year clearance sale...."

International prices for wheat, rice, soybeans, soybean meal, cotton, cow meat, sugar, and cocoa beans all weakened during December, but there were only a few buyers. International markets may have overreacted earlier in the season to news of lower 1974 grain crops and a tight sugar situation. Also, the United States and Western Europe are looking forward to larger 1975 winter-sown grain harvests. Thus, foreign buyers have cancelled bookings or held back purchases in anticipation of future price breaks. Finally, the American recession and the general slowdown of money lending economies and the tolls of inflation apparently added impetus to price declines.

Export commodity prices

The f.o.b. Gulf ports price of U.S. No. 2 Hard Winter Wheat slid for the second month to \$186 a metric ton, 3 percent lower than the November average. The c.i.f. Rotterdam price for U.S. No. 2 Hard Winter Wheat dropped to \$228 a ton. The c.i.f. U.K. price for U.S. Hard Winter Wheat also weakened slightly in terms of British pounds sterling, but because of a shifting dollar-pound exchange rate it was valued at \$237 a ton (slightly higher than in November).

The f.o.b. Duluth and c.i.f. Rotterdam prices for U.S. No. 2 Dark Northern Spring (DNS) Wheat also weakened to \$206 and \$228 a ton, respectively. While the in-store Thunder Bay price for No. 1 Canadian Western Red Spring (CWRS) Wheat steadied at \$226 a ton, the c.i.f. Rotterdam price for No. 1 CWRS declined slightly to \$232 a ton. Thus, the bearish influences discussed above were overriding the bullish influences of the short 1974 world wheat crop.

Corn and sorghum prices also slackened in the Rotterdam market. The Rotterdam prices for U.S. No. 3 Yellow and Argentine corn dropped 3 percent to \$159 and \$171 a ton, respectively. The f.o.b. Gulf ports price of No. 2 Yellow corn, however, made a comeback, advancing 3 percent from the November price.

With the f.o.b. Gulf ports corn price advancing to \$149 a metric ton, the Gulf port-Rotterdam price spread narrowed to \$10 a ton. In the Rotterdam market, the Argentina-U.S. corn price spread remained at \$13 a ton. U.S. No. 2 grain sorghum and U.S. No. 3 Yellow corn were priced the same in Rotterdam. (In early January 1975, corn prices also began to weaken.)

U.S. domestic demand for feed grains and protein meal has slackened this fiscal year. With a record inventory of cattle on hand, and with high grain prices making grain-fattening unusually costly, U.S. livestock producers have been forced to slaughter large numbers of cattle directly off pasture and range. Similar economic predicaments have beset other sectors of the U.S. livestock industry as well as those of other major livestock nations.

Even though the 1974 world rice crop was 3 percent lower than the 1973 crop, the f.o.b. Bangkok price for 5-percent broken white rice continued to fall for the eighth month--to \$430 a ton.

Bearish influences have also overtaken the soybean market. According to Oil World, "the expectation of larger than hitherto expected soybean stocks in the United States and Brazil, a disappointingly small world consumption of meal, the probability of declining prices for corn and other grains next spring or early summer, and the likelihood of the general economic recession" are weakening soybean prices. At the Gulf ports, the price for U.S. No. 1 Yellow soybeans floated down to \$279 a metric ton, \$5 a ton less than in November. The c.i.f. U.K. and c.i.f. Rotterdam prices declined more sharply to \$306 and \$288 a ton, respectively, thus closing the Gulf port-U.K. and Gulf port-Rotterdam differentials to \$27 and \$10 a ton. The c.i.f. Rotterdam prices for U.S. soybean meal dropped slightly to \$173 a ton.

The c.i.f. North European ports price of Memphis Territory strict middling cotton slid for the fifth consecutive month to 52 cents a pound.

Import commodity prices

Sugar prices broke from their November peak, and cocoa bean prices fell to the lowest level in 10 months. There is a pervasive feeling that sugar prices peaked in November. The New York spot price for cane sugar declined 10 cents a pound from its November heights to 47 cents in December. At the Caribbean ports, raw cane sugar, f.o.b. and stowed, was priced at 45.16 cents a pound, when destined for the U.S. market, and 44.97 cents a pound when destined for the world market.

The New York spot price for cocoa beans from Accra plummeted 19 cents to 85 cents a pound. World cocoa bean production increased from 1,444,600 tons in 1973/74 to 1,466,300 tons in 1974/75.

The New York spot price and the f.o.b. Santos price for Santos No. 4 coffee strengthened for the third consecutive month, reaching 70 cents and 67 cents a pound, respectively. These price gains occurred despite the 1974/75 near record world green coffee harvest of 79 million bags (of 60 kg)--probably because a large number of buyers have been in the market for coffee, replenishing their drawn-down stocks.

The New York spot price for No. 1 rubber in ribbed smoked sheets strengthened slightly to 31 cents a pound, but the f.o.b. U.S. port-of-entry price of imported cow meat continued its decline.

Many of these commodities are also included in the Economist price index, whose 1974 weekly activities are given in figure 5.

Export and import unit values

During November, the index of unit values of U.S. agricultural exports reached 251 (calendar year 1967=100), 24 percent higher than November 1973. The export unit value of cotton continued to climb to \$295 a running bale, despite the turnaround that occurred in spot prices in July 1974. The export unit values of wheat and corn were at alltime highs of \$5.27 and \$3.81 a bushel, respectively.

The export unit value of soybean meal gained 9 percent from the October value, but was only 77 percent of the November'1973 unit value.

On the import side, the November unit value index of 231 was 33 percent higher than that of a year earlier. The import unit values of sugar, at 30 cents a pound, and cocoa beans, at 76 cents a pound, were tempered by the declines in the unit values of beef and veal, coffee, and rubber.

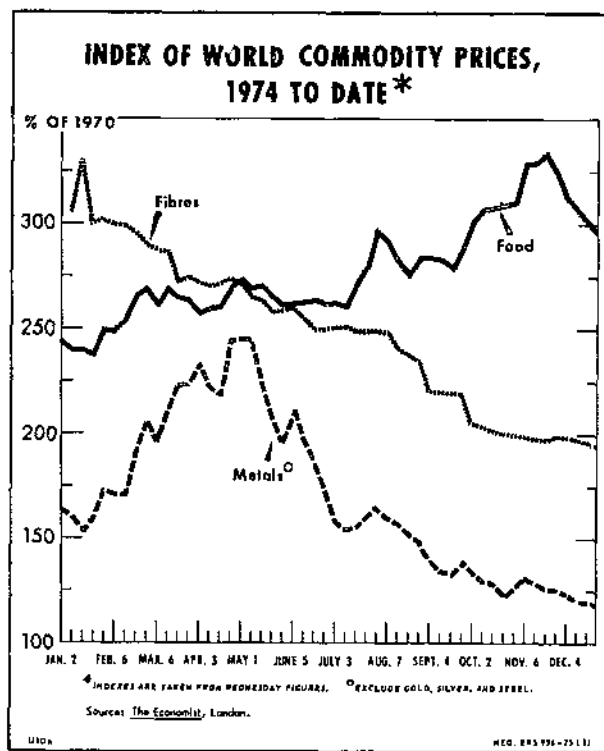

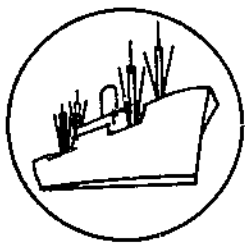

Export Highlights

U.S. FARM EXPORTS REACHED A 6-MONTH RECORD OF \$10.6 BILLION IN JULY-DECEMBER

During the first half of fiscal year 1975, U.S. agricultural exports advanced 7 percent over the year-earlier level to reach \$10.6 billion. Exports of oilseeds and products were up nearly one-fourth and accounted for over two-thirds of the value gain. Other value increases occurred for animal fats and oils, cotton, fruits, vegetables, and tobacco. The value of feed grain and wheat exports was near the year-earlier level. However, volume of feed grain exports, at 15.6 million tons, was down from 22.3 million a year earlier. Wheat export volume was down nearly 200 million bushels to 552 million bushels.

All of the increase in July-December occurred because of higher prices, especially for grains, soybeans, soybean oil, dried beans, and tobacco. Export volume measured by the quantity index dropped by nearly one-fifth during the first half of fiscal 1975. In addition to feed grain and wheat volume, that of cotton, cattle, soybeans, and canned fruits also fell during July-December. Export volume of most animals and animal products was up, especially for inedible tallow, variety meats, pork, poultry meat, and cattle hides.

December 1974 exports of \$2.12 billion were slightly above the \$1.97 billion in December 1973, but somewhat below the record \$2.35 billion in November 1974. Again, higher prices accounted for nearly all of the increase. Exports of animal fats, feed grains, wheat, rice, and soybean oil were very strong but below the levels in December 1973.

For the first 6 months of the current fiscal year, U.S. agricultural products had a favorable trade balance of \$5.6 billion, marginally better than the balance for the first half of fiscal 1974.

The trade balance for nonagricultural products deteriorated sharply during July-December 1974 to a deficit of \$9.5 billion, which compares with a \$3.9-billion deficit a year earlier. The substantial increase in the cost of petroleum imports was responsible for the fall in the nonagricultural trade balance. The increase in agricultural export value was about offset by the 16-percent increase in agricultural import value. Higher prices, especially for sugar, were the principal reason for the gain in value of agricultural imports.

With the exception of the USSR, Eastern Europe, and the People's Republic of China, our agricultural exports during July-December 1974 gained to nearly every country and area. The largest increases were in exports to Asia, Latin America, Western Europe, and Africa. Exports to the USSR of \$127 million were 62 percent below the

level for the comparable period in 1973. The decline to the USSR occurred mainly for wheat and feed grains. In addition, most other commodities were below the levels of a year earlier. Exports to the People's Republic of China fell 42 percent to \$251 million. The People's Republic of China took less wheat, corn, soybeans, and cotton. Agricultural exports to Japan, our major country market, increased 8 percent to \$1,673 million. The increase reflects higher prices as the quantity of most commodities was down slightly. Exports to the enlarged European Community also were up 8 percent to a record \$2,630 million, with soybeans and grains showing the biggest value gains.

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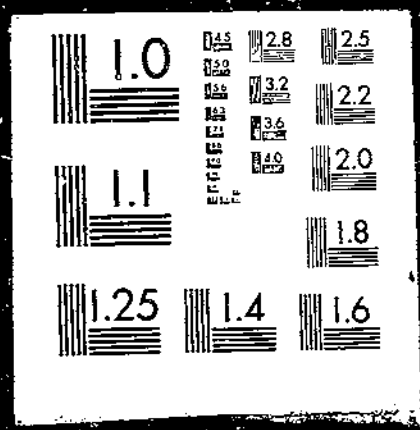

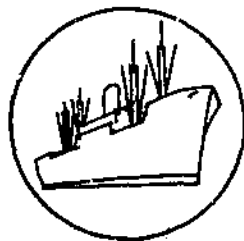

Import Highlights

SUGAR LEADS 16-PERCENT RISE IN AGRICULTURAL IMPORT VALUE

Led by a tripling in the value of imported sugar, July-December 1974 U.S. farm product imports totaled almost \$5.05 billion, 16 percent above the level of a year earlier. Competitive or supplementary agricultural imports amounted to \$3.7 billion, compared with slightly less than \$3.0 billion in July-December 1973. Noncompetitive items were fractionally below the year-earlier level at about \$1.34 billion.

While live animals, meat, certain dairy products, fruit juices, wine, oilseeds, animal feeds, and wool imports fell below last year's values, there were more than offsetting gains for sugar and related products, cheese, fruits, vegetables, edible nuts, grains, beer, tobacco, vegetable oils, seeds, flower bulbs, cotton, and crude animal materials.

Most of the gain in farm product imports was due to price increases. The volume index dropped 10 percent to 103 (1967=100) from 114 in July-December 1973.

Sugar imports amounted to 494,000 short tons, actual weight, in December 1974, bringing the half-year total to just under 3 million tons (table 41). In July-December 1973, U.S. sugar imports were nearly 2.7 million short tons. Import unit values for sugar zoomed to \$682 per ton in December from \$388 in July and \$188 in December 1973. During July-December 1974, sugar import values more than tripled their year-earlier level, totaling \$1.535 billion against \$497 million in July-December 1973.

By volume, sugar imports increased from Guatemala, Belize, Honduras, Panama, Jamaica, Haiti, Trinidad and Tobago, Guyana, Peru, Brazil, Paraguay, Argentina, India, Taiwan, Australia, Mauritius, Mozambique, Malagasy, South Africa, and Swaziland. Reductions from July-December 1973 volume levels occurred in sugar imports from the Philippines, Thailand, Fiji, Mexico, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Colombia, Venezuela, Bolivia, Malawi, the United Kingdom, and Ireland.

Meat imports in July-December fell 28 percent below year-earlier totals to 767 million pounds with declines for beef, veal, pork, mutton, and lamb. Boneless beef (fresh, chilled, or frozen) imports dropped nearly one-third in volume to 502 million pounds; value plunged over one-half to \$285 million because of lower prices.

Dairy product imports fell in volume from the year-earlier level. Cheese, butter, casein, nonfat dry milk, and butteroil quantities were lower. Cheese and casein values increased, however, because of higher prices.

Imports of most animal products gained in July-December, notably for gelatin, sausage casings, bones, and ossein.

Fruit imports were up 12 percent in value to \$101.8 million. Leading gainers were canned pineapples, canned oranges, fresh and frozen strawberries, prepared apples, fresh grapes, and dried apricots.

Sharply higher prices for edible nuts raised the value of imports about 8 percent in July-December to \$83 million. Volume was down for most types, however, including Brazil nuts, cashew nuts, chestnuts, coconuts, coconut meat, filberts, almonds, pignolia nuts, and walnuts.

Imports of grains and preparations totaled \$104 million, compared with \$62 million a year earlier. Barley, malt, corn, wheat, wheat flour, wheat gluten, bread crumbs, and pastas were higher in both volume and value terms.

Imports of oilbearing materials and products, at almost \$360 million, were nearly double the year-earlier value. While copra imports completely ceased, those of flax, sunflower, and mustard seed gained sharply. Most vegetable oil entries also expanded and prices escalated. Imports of coconut, palm, palm kernel, tung, babassu, and rapeseed oils were higher.

Green coffee import volume declined 28 percent from the year-earlier level to 915 million pounds. Brazil, Colombia, and most African countries shipped less coffee to U.S. importers in July-December than last year.

Cocoa bean entries declined 9 percent to 147 million pounds, with reduced purchases from Brazil, Ghana, Nigeria, and the Ivory Coast. Value climbed one-third to \$108 million because of higher prices, however, and increased imports were recorded from Ecuador, Papua-New Guinea, the Dominican Republic, Costa Rica, and Haiti.

Value increases occurred for bananas, soluble coffee, rubber, tea, cocoa products, crude drugs, essential oils, spices, hard fibers, and raw silk.

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at the time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$499 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
