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
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



Digest

Agricultural Exports Totaled \$20.2 Billion During July 1974-May 1975 (see p. 5). The United States exported \$20.2 billion worth of farm products during July 1974-May 1975 compared with \$19.6 billion for the same period a year earlier. Higher prices more than compensated for reduced volume. Commodities showing greatest growth in export volume were pulses, vegetable oils, rice, and dairy products, while cotton, soybean, feed grain, wheat, oilmeal, and slaughter cattle exports declined sharply.

U.S. Agricultural Exports Adjusted for Transshipments (see p. 39). Because of transshipments, U.S. farm product exports are overstated to some destinations and under-reported to others. Statistical reports from intransit locations provide information enabling users to adjust the export data and determine markets more accurately. For example, U.S. wheat, corn, soybeans, and other grains through Canadian ports totaled a record \$750 million in fiscal 1974. These shipments subsequently moved to 40 countries, including the Netherlands, which is a major transit country. Tables in this report show transshipments through Canada, the Netherlands, and Belgium and adjusted export values by country for 7 fiscal years.

U.S. Food Aid Shipments Through March Reach One-Third of Fiscal 1975 Target (see p. 50). During July 1974-March 1975, agricultural exports under Government-financed programs totaled about 1.9 million tons worth \$503 million, compared with 2.5 million tons worth \$566 million a year earlier. The decline in value was largely due to smaller volume for grains, cotton, and soybean oil, since prices for most commodities were above the fiscal 1974 level. U.S. barter transactions during the fiscal 1975 months amounted to \$4.7 million. U.S. credit sales totaled \$246 million, about three-fourths the level financed during July 1973-March 1974.


U.S. Agricultural Imports Slow in July 1974-May 1975 (see p. 58). While U.S. imports of farm products for the first 11 months of fiscal 1975 remained slightly above their year-earlier value, volume declined about 9 percent. Value, at \$8.75 billion, reflected mainly price increases for competitive items such as sugar and vegetable oils. Noncompetitive agricultural imports fell 15 percent to \$2.5 billion, with volume declines for most commodities.

U.S. Agricultural Imports From the European Community Up Slightly in 1974 (see p. 71). Totaling \$1.16 billion in 1974, imports of farm products from the 9 countries of the European Community were only slightly above the year-earlier value. Import demand for many EC-produced farm commodities slackened with the slowdown in U.S. economic activity. The U.S. trade surplus with EC countries widened further, with agricultural items accounting for one-fifth of the increase.

Selected Prices of International Significance (see p. 90). Price of principal agricultural import and export commodities continued to decline in May 1975. The Dow Jones and Reuters commodity spot price indexes were at their lowest levels in nearly 2 years.



Export Highlights

AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS TOTALED \$20.2 BILLION DURING JULY 1974-MAY 1975

U.S. agricultural exports were valued at \$20.2 billion during July 1974-May 1975, up \$604 million from a year earlier. Higher prices more than compensated for reduced export volume. Volume declined for wheat, feed grains, soybeans, cotton, oilmeal, and tobacco, but increased for rice, soybean and cottonseed oil, pulses, and some other commodities. Despite the increase in the overall price level, export unit values dropped for inedible tallow, oilmeal, variety meats, and whole cattle hides.

For the third consecutive month, agricultural exports were below the year-earlier value. May exports of \$1.5 billion were 17 percent below the May 1974 value. The greatest value declines occurred for feed grains, soybeans, cotton, and animal fats.

Soybean exports during July-May were 19 percent below the year-earlier volume. Export value, at \$2.9 billion, was down slightly. Exports declined to all major markets except Spain, where imports of U.S. soybeans increased 31 percent. Sunflowerseed and peanut exports expanded substantially. Cottonseed and soybean oil exports were 130 percent of the year-earlier volume and double the year-earlier value, primarily because of a 121-percent increase in shipments to Egypt and Iran. July-May oilcake and meal exports, at \$682 million, were two-thirds of the year-earlier value. However, volume was down only 11 percent. Exports of other feeds and fodders were up slightly in value. Export volume fell for alfalfa products and corn byproducts, but rose for prepared feeds.

Grain (including products) exports were valued at \$10.2 billion during July 1974-May 1975, compared with \$9.6 billion a year earlier. Feed grain exports rose slightly in value to \$4.48 billion, despite a 20-percent drop in volume. Most major markets decreased their imports of U.S. feed grains, but the volume of shipments was up 26 percent to the Netherlands and 36 percent to Mexico. Wheat exports were valued at \$4.46 billion during July-May. Export volume was 12 percent below the year-earlier level. Significant shifts in markets occurred. Exports of wheat to West and South Asia were 191 percent of the July-May 1974 volume. Sharp declines occurred in shipments to Southeast and East Asia (except Japan), Latin America, the USSR, and Africa. Rice exports were up 41 percent in volume and 33 percent in value, at \$907 million. The greater volume increases reflects a shift to less expensive rice. Exports of brown rice were up 267 percent; exports of long-grain parboiled rice fell 31 percent. The two largest markets for U.S. rice during July-May, Korea and Iran, had imported virtually no rice last year. Exports to last year's major markets, South Vietnam, Cambodia, Saudi Arabia, and South Africa, were down significantly. Export of blended food products were down 9 percent in volume. Rye exports have returned to normal level from fiscal 1974's atypically large volume.

Fresh and prepared fruit exports were valued at \$579 million during the first 11 months of fiscal 1975, up \$40 million from a year earlier. Canada and Japan, the leading markets for U.S. fruits, maintained strong demand. Fresh fruit exports were up 24 percent in value, but exports of dried and canned fruits and fruit juices declined significantly. Among the fresh fruit exports, lemons, apples, cherries, oranges, and strawberries had the greatest growth. Exports of vegetables and vegetable preparations were valued at \$507 million, compared with \$372 million a year earlier. Exports of fresh and canned vegetables were up, but the greatest growth occurred in exports of pulses. Nut exports were down slightly in value during July-May. Prices of both almonds and walnuts were lower.

Cotton exports during July 1974-May 1975 were two-thirds of the year-earlier volume. Export value fell 21 percent to \$922 million. All major markets reduced their imports.

The value of tobacco exports rose from \$736 million to \$862 million, although volume fell 3 percent. Exports to the traditional primary market, the United Kingdom, fell below 75 percent of the year-earlier volume. Japan has now become the leading market for U.S. tobacco.

July-May exports of animals and animal products totaled \$1.57 billion, slightly below the year-earlier level. Inedible tallow volume remained at 2.1 billion pounds, but value fell 8 percent to \$368 million. Meat exports were valued at \$309 million for the 11 months. Beef exports fell from \$92 million to \$48 million. Variety meat exports fell in value despite a 20 percent increase in volume. Pork export expanded to 2½ times the year-earlier value. Whole cattle hide exports expanded by one-fourth in volume, but value was down 14 percent. Exports of horses and slaughter cattle were down sharply in value.



U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS ADJUSTED FOR TRANSSHIPMENTS

Shipments of U.S. farm products through Canadian ports totaled a record \$750 million during fiscal 1974, reflecting increased volume and higher prices. Over 5 million metric tons of bulk grains and oilseeds passed through Canadian elevators enroute to 40 countries, compared with about 3 million tons valued at \$272 million in fiscal 1973. Principal commodity transshipments for fiscal 1974 were wheat (2 million tons), corn (1.6 million tons), and soybeans (591,000 tons).

The first complete fiscal year under the new reporting system for U.S. grain exports through Canada excluded some shipments of corn and oats from transfer elevators to Canadian consumers. Before January 1, 1973, transshipments were included in statistics on exports to Canada.^{1/} Since then, transshipments have been designated under the "unidentified" country listing. Major recipients of transshipments through Canada in fiscal 1974 were West European countries, the USSR, Poland, Algeria, Japan, the People's Republic of China, and Brazil.

A substantial part of bulk commodity shipments to the Netherlands subsequently moved to West Germany, the United Kingdom, France, Switzerland, and other West European countries (table 15). Intransit shipments through the Netherland declined slightly in volume decreased to 2.4 million tons from 3 million tons (\$311 million) in fiscal 1973.

Transshipments through the Netherlands are based on the difference between U.S. export volume (including shipments through Canadian ports) and Dutch imports. Values are calculated from average export unit values (f.o.b. port of export). Destinations are determined from Statistics of International Goods Traffic, Transit-trade with Transshipment by Commodities, published by the Netherlands Central Bureau of Statistics.

U.S. agricultural exports adjusted for transshipments to 40 countries are shown in table 14. Unadjusted exports by country appeared in the November 1974 issue of Foreign Agricultural Trade of the United States. Differences in exports by country for the 25 leading destinations in fiscal 1974 are listed in table 17. These differences ranged upward to 30 percent for some countries. For example, adjusted U.S. farm product exports to the United Kingdom were 30 percent above shipments not corrected for intransit movements through Canada, the Netherlands, and Belgium. Adjusted exports to West Germany were 16 percent above unadjusted data. Conversely, agricultural exports to the Netherlands were overstated by 27 percent because of transshipments.



U.S. FOOD AID SHIPMENTS THROUGH MARCH REACH ONE-THIRD OF FISCAL 1975 TARGET

U.S. food aid shipments during the first 9 months of fiscal 1975 totaled \$503 million, down 11 percent from the year-earlier level. The \$64-million decline was mainly attributable to smaller export volume for feed grains, cotton, and soybean oil. Total export volume for Government-financed commodities amounted to about 1.9 million tons, compared with 2.5 million tons a year earlier.

By volume, Government-financed exports through March represented about one-third of the 5.6 million tons (\$1.4 billion) expected for fiscal 1975. Government-financed shipments of farm products are normally heaviest in the final months of a fiscal year, so target shipments could still be reached. Title I, P.L. 480 concessional sales agreements and amendments as of June 2, 1975, were for slightly over 3.1 million tons of wheat valued at \$524 million, and about 745,000 tons of rice worth \$302 million.

Despite large volume declines for most of our major Government-financed commodities, higher prices during July-March resulted in moderate value increases for wheat and wheat products, soybean oil, inedible tallow, blended food products, and tobacco. Volume of Government-financed rice exports dropped about 6 percent, but lower prices resulted in a \$52-million decrease in the value of those shipments.

Title I, P.L. 480

During the first three quarters of fiscal 1975, U.S. food exports under Title I of Public Law 480 were valued at \$317 million, which compares with \$374 million a year earlier. Principal commodities exported under long-term dollar credit sales and convertible local currency programs included wheat, rice, tobacco, soybean oil, and cotton. All Government-financed shipments of tobacco, cotton, and rice moved under Title I of P.L. 480. Title I shipments of soybean oil, cotton, and rice dropped, but wheat and tobacco registered moderate increases. Title I soybean oil shipments, at \$10 million, were down 38 percent from the year-earlier level. Export volume, at 24 million pounds, amounted to less than one-third the volume shipped a year earlier. Four-fifths of all Title I soybean oil exports went to Pakistan. Guinea received the remaining portion. Rice exports under Title I totaled \$150 million against \$201 million a year earlier. Major markets were Bangladesh, the Khmer Republic (Cambodia), and the Republic of Korea.

Cotton shipped under the Title I program during the first 9 months of fiscal 1975, valued at \$8 million, amounted to 46 percent of the year-earlier value. Volume, at 28,000 running bales, was down 65 percent. Indonesia and South Vietnam received all Government-financed cotton shipments during the period. Tobacco shipments under Title I, at \$16 million (12.6 million pounds), went to Egypt and South Vietnam. Feed grain exports under the Title I program dropped to \$2 million from \$36 million a year earlier. The \$34-million drop in feed grain shipments accounted for three-fifths of fiscal 1975. Cambodia and Guinea received all Title I feed grains. Wheat shipments under the program rose 43 percent to \$129 million in July-March. Major wheat markets were Bangladesh, Egypt, Chile, Pakistan, Israel, and Jordan.

Title II, P.L. 480

Direct donations of U.S. farm products for disaster relief and economic development rose 22 percent to \$176 million in the first 9 months of fiscal 1975. These exports, Government-to-government, through U.S. voluntary relief agencies, and the multi-lateral World Food Program, accounted for 35 percent of all shipments under Government-financed programs, compared with 25 percent a year earlier. Food donations through March represented about 45 percent of the program's \$395 million budget for fiscal 1975.

During July-March, the bulk of Title II food shipments--\$102 million worth--moved through voluntary relief agencies--which compares with \$63 million worth a year earlier. Wheat flour, bulgur wheat, blended food products, and soybean oil made up better than four-fifths of the fiscal 1975 shipments. Major markets for bulgur wheat were India and Indonesia. About 70 percent of the wheat flour went to Morocco, Egypt, Turkey, the Philippines, Colombia, and India. Blended food products and soybean oil, accounting for nearly one-half of all shipments, went mainly to India, the Philippines, Egypt, Morocco, Colombia, and the Dominican Republic.

Food donated through the World Food Program totaled \$43 million during July-March against \$33 million a year earlier, primarily because of larger shipments of soybean oil and bulgur wheat. India, Tunisia, Sudan, Lebanon, and Jordan were prime markets for wheat and soybean oil. Wheat flour shipments under the World Food program went mainly to Algeria and the Republic of Korea.

U.S. food donations under the Government-to-government program totaled \$31 million during July-March, compared with \$48 million a year earlier. Most of value decline was due to smaller sorghum and wheat flour shipments. Grain sorghums, at \$9 million, amounted to less than one-half the previous year's level. Wheat flour shipments totaled \$3 million, one-fifth the 1974 level. Government-to-government shipments of soybean oil declined some \$2 million by value, but export volume, at 2.3 million pounds, was down 83 percent. A plus factor for Government-to-government shipments was evident in shipments of bulgur wheat, corn-soya-blend, and grain sorghum grits. Export volume of bulgur wheat increased five-fold to 39 million pounds. Major recipients of this commodity were Tanzania, Laos, Brazil, and Peru. Shipments of corn-soya-blend, at 40 million pounds, 10 percent above the year-earlier level, moved mainly to Brazil, Mali, Mauritania, and Guinea. Government-to-government shipments of grain sorghum grits, moving exclusively to the African countries, totaled 30 million pounds during July-March. Grain sorghum grits, a product of continued research on improving nutritive quality and palatability of cereals available under P.L. 480, has had its widest appeal among the African nations. This new product, soy-fortified sorghum grits, is 85-percent sorghum grits and 15-percent defatted soy grits.

Mutual Security (AID) Program

U.S. food aid shipments under the auspices of the Agency for International Development (AID) totaled \$10 million for the first half of fiscal 1975, compared with \$49 million for July-December 1974. Inedible tallow worth \$7 million accounted for the major portion of the fiscal 1975 exports.

Exports Under Barter Contracts

During July-March, agricultural commodities bartered for overseas procurement totaled \$5 million against \$268 million a year earlier. The sharp decline was a direct result of the suspension of the barter program on July 1, 1973. Cotton shipments made up nearly all barter transactions during the phase-out period of the program.

U.S. Credit Sales 1/

Total credit sales of U.S. farm products during July-March totaled \$246 million, down 25 percent from the year-earlier level. Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) credit sales, at \$177 million, accounted for 72 percent of all credit-sale transactions. Major farm products financed under the CCC program were cotton, tobacco, wheat, rice, barley, and corn. Over the past year, CCC credit has been sharply reduced because of limited supply availabilities. However, the program has remained a means of helping traditional customers through adverse circumstances brought on by high-priced oil imports. On May 1, 1974, the list of eligible commodities for export financing was extended to include dry edible beans; frozen and canned poultry; dried, frozen, and canned eggs; hog grease; raisins; and wheat flour.

Export-Import Bank loans and medium-term guarantees consisted of \$61 million worth of cotton and nearly \$8 million worth of tobacco during July-March. A year earlier, disbursements of cotton and tobacco under Export-Import Bank loans amounted to \$47 million and \$3 million, respectively.



Import Highlights

U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS SLOW IN JULY 1974-MAY 1975

U.S. farm product imports continued their recent slower monthly pace in May, totaling \$688 million against \$890 million for the same month last year. During the first 11 months of 1974/75, agricultural imports amounted to \$8.75 billion, up from \$8.7 billion a year earlier. Volume was down about 9 percent.

The slight increase in import value occurred for competitive items such as sugar, vegetable oils, tobacco, grains, fruit, and malt beverages, which more than offset widespread declines for other commodities. Import value declines included cattle, meat, dairy products, hides, wool, cotton, vegetables, edible nuts, and wine. Competitive farm product imports rose 9 percent above the year-earlier level to \$6.23 billion.

Dutiable cattle entries fell sharply to 137,000 head (\$40 million) from 822,000 head (\$165 million). Low domestic prices and increased availability of U.S. feeders reduced purchases from Mexico and Canada. Only 79,000 head of Mexican feeders (200-700 pounds) entered, compared with 593,000 the previous year. Imports of Canadian feeders (200-700 pounds) dropped from 73,000 to 4,000 head, and those of feeder calves fell from 89,000 to 11,000 head. Temporary U.S. import quotas on Canadian cattle, which became effective August 12, 1974, limit entries to 17,000.

Beef and veal import volume in July-May 1974/75 fell 20 percent to 1.1 billion pounds; value dropped 49 percent to \$606 million because of sharply lower prices in recent months. Fresh, chilled, or frozen boneless beef, which accounts for about 90 percent of the total, declined to under 1 billion pounds from 1.2 billion a year ago. Australia, Ireland, Canada, Mexico, and most Central American countries shipped less.

July-May cheese imports were down 48 percent in volume and 35 percent in value from year-earlier levels. Cheddar cheese imports, which were unusually large in fiscal 1974 because an additional 100-million-pound quota was allowed, fell to 8.8 million pounds in July-May 1974/75 from 109 million pounds a year earlier. Emmenthaler, Gruyere, and other quota types also declined. Nonfat dry milk and butter imports were sharply below 1973/74 volumes entering under temporary emergency quotas. Only 3.3 million pounds of nonfat dry milk was imported through May of fiscal 1975, compared with 285 million pounds a year earlier. Butter imports dropped from 54.6 million to 489,000 pounds.

Fruit imports rose 9 percent in value to \$221 million, mainly because of increases for canned pineapple. Canned pineapple volume in July-May jumped 56 percent above the year-earlier level, while value more than doubled with higher prices. Most of the import growth was accounted for by the Philippines, Thailand, Malaysia, and South Africa. Fresh grape imports surged ahead to 39 million pounds from 24 million pounds a year earlier, as Chile more than doubled its shipments to U.S. importers.

Imports of grains and preparations increased 45 percent in value to \$167 million, dominated by larger barley purchases at sharply higher prices. Barley entries rose from 7 million to nearly 17 million bushels, and value tripled to \$66 million, because of price increases. Wheat flour, wheat gluten, corn, and pasta product purchases were also above year-earlier levels.

Among oilbearing materials, vegetable oils were up nearly one-third in volume, and value rose 84 percent. Coconut oil, palm and palm kernel oil, and tung oil led the increases, supplied primarily by the Philippines, Malaysia, and Argentina, respectively. Sharply higher vegetable oil prices on world markets accounted for the value gain.

Continuing a 5-month trend, sugar import quantities in May remained below the year-earlier level. The May 1975 tonnage totaled 226,000, well under the 512,000 recorded in May 1974 (table 25). For July-May 1974/75, sugar imports, at 4 million short tons, were 19 percent below the volume of a year earlier, reflecting record high prices and reduced consumer demand. Despite the lower volume, value of sugar imports more than doubled. Volume declines in the 11-month total occurred for entries from the Philippines (down 37 percent), the Dominican Republic (down 27 percent), Peru (down 27 percent), and Mexico (down 57 percent). Partly offsetting these losses were increases from Brazil, Argentina, Australia, Jamaica, and some Central American, Asian and African countries (table 26).

Noncompetitive agricultural imports during July-May fell 15 percent in value to \$2.5 billion. Volume dropped about 17 percent, with reductions for bananas, coffee, cocoa, essential oils, crude rubber, spices, tea, and carpet wool.



U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS FROM THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY UP SLIGHTLY IN 1974

U.S. agricultural imports from the European Community (EC) in 1974 totaled \$1.16 billion, slightly above the previous year's record \$1.11 billion and more than double 1969's \$569 million. U.S. demand for many competitive farm product imports, however, slackened during 1974 with the downturn in economic activity. U.S. agricultural exports to the EC rose 22 percent in 1974, reaching over \$5.8 billion. Our agricultural trade surplus with the EC widened further in 1974 to \$4.68 billion from \$3.67 billion in 1973, accounting for one-fifth of the improved overall trade balance.

Nearly 90 percent of U.S. agricultural imports from EC sources are competitive with domestic production, such as meat, dairy products, fruit, and wine. Between 1973 and 1974, increased imports of beef, cheese, casein, hides, olives, olive oil, hops, beer, and confectionery products offset declines for canned hams, nonfat dry milk, butter, butteroil, flower bulbs, potato starch, edible nuts (mainly chestnuts), and wine.

Among the noncompetitive imports, gains were registered for cocoa products, licorice extract, crude drugs, and certain essential oils from the EC.

West Germany, Italy, the United Kingdom, and Ireland shipped more to U.S. importers in 1974, while inflows slowed from Denmark, France, and Belgium. Denmark, the Netherlands, and France were the largest EC sources for U.S. farm product imports.

In 1974, EC countries accounted for two-thirds of total U.S. canned ham imports, 56 percent of the wine, 46 percent of the cheese, 65 percent of the beer and ale, 73 percent of the hops, 45 percent of the olive oil, and 44 percent of the nursery and greenhouse stock. About 15 percent of competitive agricultural imports were from EC suppliers.



SELECTED PRICES OF INTERNATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

Prices of most principal agricultural import and export commodities continued to decline in May 1975. Most prices, including sugar prices, were below May 1974 levels, reflecting the current favorable outlook for worldwide harvests. The Dow Jones and Reuters commodity spot price indexes, at 277 and 1,077, respectively, were at their lowest levels in nearly two years.

Export Commodity Prices

Wheat and feed grain prices continued downward during May. Good corn and wheat crop prospects, improved pastures, the announcement of a decline in U.S. feed grain exports during the second quarter, and some export contract cancellations all exerted a weakening influence on prices. A slight mid-month rally occurred with speculation that export sales would expand, particularly when the president of Export-Khleb--the Soviet grain trading agency--planned a trip to the United States. Slow buying also prevailed in the soybean market in May. With competition from Brazil and declining domestic demand, soybean oil and meal prices also dropped.

Cotton prices increased 2 percent in May. Major factors were settlement of contract disputes with Far East buyers and poor weather conditions during the current U.S. planting season. U.S. cotton exports and domestic cotton consumption improved slightly.

Thai white rice prices declined slightly during May, partly in response to the changed political situation in Southeast Asia. The United States has prospects for a large rice crop.

Import Commodity Prices

International sugar prices continued their downward trend that began last November. The depressed market was a result of the general economic situation and a sharp reduction in world consumption. A severe decline in demand coupled with a surplus supply in India and other exporting countries created a carryover stock of both raw and white sugar, causing world prices to fall further--despite an attempt by producing nations to shore up prices by restricting the flow of sugar onto the international market.

A sharp decline occurred in world cocoa bean prices. Sagging demand, expectations of a large Brazilian cocoa bean crop, and reports of a substantial supply of unsold cocoa beans in Africa prompted the decline.

Rubber prices increased slightly in May, reflecting a cutback in production, according to the International Rubber Study Group. It was reported that stocks of natural rubber at the end of May were low in most industrialized countries.

Import prices for coffee increased during May. For a number of months, several importing countries, including the United States, have been drawing down inventories. The current low level of U.S. coffee stocks has generated new buyer interest in coffee.

Imported cow meat prices rose 8 percent in May, reflecting the general upturn in livestock prices.

April Export and Import Unit Values

April export unit values, at an index of 222 (1967 = 100), reflected the recent downturn in agricultural commodity prices, and were at the same level as in April 1974. The export unit value for wheat, at \$4.68 a bushel, was 12 percent lower than a year earlier. Export unit values for corn, at \$3.49 a bushel, and soybeans at \$6.58 a bushel, were still 14 and 2 percent higher than a year earlier.

U.S. agricultural import commodities, at a unit value index of 226 (1967 = 100), were priced about 25 percent more than in April 1974, but leveled off from their January 1975 peak. Sugar and cocoa bean export unit values, which drove up the index, have since moderated.



1/ Supplementary agricultural imports consist of all imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States together with all other agricultural imports interchangeable to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities. Complementary agricultural imports include all others, about 98 percent of which consist of rubber, coffee, raw silk, cacao beans, wool for carpets, bananas, tea, and vegetable fibers.

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and in transit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at the time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
