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

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

Value of U.S. Agricultural Exports Expected to Be Lower in Fiscal 1976 (see p. 8). Despite a possible 10-percent increase in volume, U.S. agricultural exports in fiscal year 1976 could drop as much as a fifth in value to approximately \$18 billion. Some of the developments expected to account for the decline are: slow recovery from the recession in most developed countries, expected gains in world agricultural production, and reduced export earnings by major developing countries because of a sharp drop in prices of raw agricultural materials.

The outlook for fiscal 1975 agricultural exports remains the same as reported in March: \$22 billion, which compares with the previous high of \$21.3 billion last fiscal year. Agricultural imports are now expected to total \$9.7 billion in fiscal 1975, only slightly above last year's figure. Slower economic activity and the sharp drop in prices for most imported products are principal reasons for the slower growth rate for imports.

Record Farm Product Exports to European Community in 1974 (see p. 12). U.S. exports of farm products to the enlarged EC totaled over \$5.5 billion in calendar year 1974, up nearly \$1 billion from 1973's record level. Shipments to the original six members accounted for nearly all of the increase. Exports subject to Common Agricultural Policy variable import levies rose nearly one-third, primarily because of higher prices.

Leading Markets for 1974 U.S. Agricultural Exports (see p. 24). Although the United States exported farm products to 161 countries during 1974, 10 countries received almost three-fifths of the total value. Japan, the Netherlands, West Germany, and Canada remained the leading markets. Exports to Mexico and Iran increased markedly. The USSR fell from the fifth-largest market in 1973 to the eighteenth-largest in 1974.

July 1974-April 1975 Agricultural Exports Totaled \$18.7 Billion (see p. 54). U.S. agricultural exports during the first 10 months of fiscal 1975 were valued at \$18.7 billion, which compares with \$17.8 billion a year earlier. Export volume declined for feed grains, wheat, soybeans, cotton, oilmeal, and tobacco. West Asia was the fastest-growing market for U.S. farm products. The centrally planned economies cut back their purchases sharply.

Agricultural Import Value Up, Volume Down Sharply (see p. 89). At nearly \$8.1 billion, U.S. farm product imports for July 1974-April 1975 showed a slight rise over the year-earlier level. Volume declined about 8 percent, however. Competitive commodities accounted for the increase, and higher sugar prices contributed heavily. Most imports dropped significantly in volume, especially cattle, meat, dairy products, and most tropical items.

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
Ad Valorem Equivalent Duty Rates Decline in 1974 (see p. 102). Customs duties on U.S. agricultural imports in 1974 remained near 1973 levels, while the value of imports increased 22 percent. As a result, ad valorem equivalent rates fell from 4.2 to 3.5 percent. The ad valorem equivalent rate for dutiable items dropped from 7 to 5.5 percent. Since most agricultural import duties are assessed on volume basis, ad valorem equivalent rates were less than previous levels. Import volume in 1974 was down 5 percent from the preceeding year.

U.S. Export Unit Values Decline (see p. 110). In the first quarter of 1975, export unit values for agricultural commodities were 4 percent lower than during the previous quarter, reflecting the first quarterly decline since mid-1972. Gains in import unit values that were achieved during the fourth quarter of 1974 were nearly halted during the first quarter of 1975.

The Booming Iraqi Market for U.S. Farm Products (see p. 115). U.S. agricultural exports to Iraq increased from \$32.4 million in 1973 to a record \$114.8 million in 1974, with large gains registered for wheat and rice. Iraq's total agricultural imports are expected to reach \$700 million in 1975—seven times the average annual value of the late 1960's. Iraq is also a growing market for Asian and Latin American exports of sugar, rice, oilseed products, and tea. European deliveries of meat, dairy products, and breeding animals have also increased markedly in the last 2 years.





VALUE OF U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS EXPECTED TO BE LOWER IN FISCAL 1976

Despite the recent drop in world agricultural prices, the value of U.S. farm exports is still expected to reach a record \$22 billion in fiscal 1975, compared with the previous high of \$21.3 billion last fiscal year. While sales prospects to various regions have changed slightly since our last release on February 7, 1975, the overall value remains at \$22 billion. ^{1/} The value for July 1974-March 1975 was \$16.9 billion, which means we need to export an additional \$5.1 billion to attain this year's prediction. This compares favorably with the \$5.5 billion shipped during the last quarter of fiscal 1974. Large increases are occurring this fiscal year over fiscal 1974 in such regional markets as West Asia and South Asia, where exports are more than doubling the value of a year earlier, and other Western Europe outside the EC-9, where sales are up nearly 10 percent. On the other hand, exports are off sharply to the PRC, USSR, and Eastern Europe. Export volume of the principal bulk agricultural commodities is likely to total 86 million metric tons--14 million tons below the record of fiscal 1974.

U.S. farm exports to developed nations in fiscal 1975 are expected to total \$12 billion, about the same as in fiscal 1974. U.S. exports to the non-OPEC developing countries are expected to rise 13 percent in fiscal 1975 over 1974. Exports to OPEC nations will probably total about \$1.8 billion in fiscal 1975, an increase of 70 percent over 1974's total.

Agricultural imports are now expected to total \$9.7 billion in fiscal 1975, slightly above last year's figure. Slower U.S. economic activity and the sharp drop in prices of most imported products are principal reasons for the slowdown in U.S. agricultural import value. Thus, agriculture's contribution to the U.S. trade balance should total close to \$12 billion, slightly better than a year earlier.

U.S. exports of farm products for fiscal year 1976 are now expected to approximate \$18 billion. This represents a decline of almost 20 percent compared with fiscal 1975. Some of the developments expected to reduce exports during fiscal 1976 include slow recovery from the recession in most developed countries, expected gains in world agricultural production, and reduced export earnings by many major developing countries because of the sharp drop in prices of raw materials. Also, export prices have dropped significantly since January 1975 and this, no doubt, will bring total value of U.S. exports down despite a possible increase of 10 percent in overall volume.

A slight increase in the volume of grain shipments will not be enough to offset the sharp drop in prices slated for these commodities. Decreases in value will probably occur also in soybeans and soybean products. Fruits, nuts, and vegetables are up slightly. Cotton export volume may be up slightly over this fiscal year's dismal market, but value will remain about the same as last year's. Tobacco quantities will probably increase.

There are many uncertainties involved in the forecast for fiscal 1976. First, much of the prediction assumes improved crop prospects around the world, and many of these crops have not been planted. Also, world grain stocks are low, making prices extremely sensitive to changes in the world production outlook. Many developing countries are still in the process of adjusting their economies to the quadrupling of petroleum prices, to the decline in foreign exchange earnings from the sharp reduction in raw material prices, and the slump in demand for semi-manufactured products in world markets.

For fiscal 1976, agricultural imports may fall to less than \$9 billion, and with the decline in exports, agriculture's favorable trade balance may decrease to around \$9 billion.



RECORD FARM PRODUCT EXPORTS TO EUROPEAN COMMUNITY IN 1974

Continuing a strong upward trend, the value of U.S. agricultural exports to the enlarged European Community (EC) topped \$5.5 billion during calendar year 1974. This was nearly \$1 billion or 21.6 percent greater than the previous year's record. After adjustment for transshipments through Canadian ports, the value was \$5.8 billion for 1974, compared with \$4.8 billion for 1973. The enlarged EC took just under 27 percent of all U.S. agricultural exports in 1974, the same as a year earlier and down from 32 percent in 1972. Most of the 1974 value gain resulted from price increases. Declines in export volume for wheat, feed grains, rice, cotton, vegetable oils, and tallow were not offset by larger soybean, oilcake, and meat product quantities. Export gains to the six original members accounted for nearly all of the 1974 growth. A slight value rise occurred in shipments to the United Kingdom, but declines took place for exports to Denmark and Ireland.

U.S. agricultural exports subject to the EC's variable import levies moved up nearly one-third in value during 1974, mainly because import prices exceeded "target" and "threshold" prices on which import levies are calculated. Feed grain shipments amounted to \$1,338 million, compared with \$976 million in 1973. (After adjustment for transshipments through Canada, feed grain exports totaled \$1,429 million against \$1,031 million a year earlier.) Although feed grain shipments rose in volume and value to West Germany and the Netherlands, volume was down for exports to Italy, the United Kingdom, Belgium, and France. Overall feed grain volume to the EC dropped by about 1 million tons to 10.4 million. U.S. wheat exports to EC destinations approached \$242 million in 1974--13 percent above the 1973 value. Volume dropped by almost 1 million tons to 1.224 million metric tons, mainly because of a good European crop and reduced import demand on the continent. Because of higher rice prices, exports totaled nearly \$76 million, compared with \$51 million a year earlier. West Germany and Belgium imported more U.S. rice, but the United Kingdom took less.

Commodities not subject to variable import levies rose 17 percent to \$3,772 million in 1974. Soybean value gained over one-third to \$1.63 billion, while volume moved up 12 percent to 5.9 million tons. West Germany, the Netherlands, Italy, and France accounted for most of the growth. Tobacco exports declined, however, mainly due to reduced shipments to the United Kingdom.

Oilcake and meal shipments, primarily soybean meal, were up nearly one-fifth at 3.3 million tons; value rose 9 percent to \$615 million. West Germany and Italy accounted for most of the increase.

EC countries took about two-thirds of U.S. oilcake and meal exports, compared with 58 percent in 1973. Nearly one-half of U.S. soybean exports, 43 percent of the tobacco, and 30 percent of the feed grains went to EC members in 1974.



LEADING MARKETS FOR 1974 U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS

The \$22 billion worth of 1974 U.S. agricultural exports reflected shipments to 161 countries. The 10 largest markets purchased almost three-fifths of total U.S. farm exports. The top 50 markets, accounting for 94 percent of the total, ranged from Japan (\$3.5 billion) to the Republic of South Africa (\$81 million). Of the 50 leading markets, 7 more than doubled their imports from the United States over 1973, and 9 decreased their imports. 2/

Exports to Japan were up 16 percent in value, reflecting higher prices, as volume was down 13 percent. Feed grain shipments to Japan fell 15 percent in volume but value rose from \$914 million to \$1.1 billion. The unit value of wheat exports rose from \$113 per ton to \$191, lifting export value to \$572 million, although volume was down 17 percent. In 1974, other suppliers increased their grain exports to Japan from low 1973 levels.

Japanese soybean purchases from the United States were valued at \$748 million in 1974. Volume, at 2.8 million tons, was below 1972 and 1973 levels. Cattle hide and meat exports to Japan declined in both value and volume. Cotton, tobacco, and citrus fruit exports expanded. 3/

U.S. farm exports to the Netherlands totaled \$1.8 billion in 1974, up from \$1.3 billion in 1973. Oilseed exports were valued at \$737 million, 1-1/2 times the 1973 value. Soybean export volume was up 26 percent. Feed grain exports were valued at \$544 million, compared with \$336 million in 1973, and volume rose 10 percent. Wheat exports fell 26 percent in volume, but higher prices pushed the value to \$162 million. Dutch purchases of other U.S. farm commodities--animal feeds, tobacco, and tallow--declined in volume between 1973 and 1974. The volume of oilmeal shipments was up 42 percent, but price declines held the value of exports steady. 4/

The \$1.8-billion figure for 1974 Dutch imports of U.S. agricultural commodities includes goods shipped through Dutch ports destined for other countries. In 1973, these transshipments totaled \$380 million. Between 1970 and 1973, they averaged 27 percent of the unadjusted value of exports to the Netherlands. Soybeans and feed grains are the predominant commodities involved; the primary destinations are West Germany and the United Kingdom.

U.S. farm exports to West Germany were valued at \$1.6 billion in 1974, 34 percent above the prior year's total. Higher prices created most of the increase, but export volume was up for the major commodities. Soybean exports expanded from \$332 million to \$499 million; export volume rose 17 percent. Feed grain exports, up 18 percent in volume, were valued at \$425 million. Oilmeal shipments rose 11 percent in volume and value rose slightly to \$216 million. Tobacco exports were valued at \$110 million in 1974; export volume was down 5 percent from 1973.

In addition to the \$1.6 billion worth of U.S. farm products imported by West Germany directly or through Canada, some U.S. products were received through Dutch and Belgian ports. In 1973, these transshipments were valued at \$202 million; during the 1970's they varied between 8 and 18 percent of the unadjusted total. Soybeans are the main commodity shipped into West Germany through the Netherlands and Belgium; corn and wheat are also involved.

Canadian purchases of U.S. farm products totaled \$1.3 billion in 1974, 23 percent above the 1973 level. Fruit exports rose from \$209 million to \$242 million. Dried and canned fruit exports made the greatest growth, and fresh fruits and fruit juices were up slightly in volume. Exports of vegetables and preparations were up 17 percent to \$165 million. Feed grain exports were 30 percent greater in volume, and value rose from \$91 million to \$153 million. Exports of oilseeds and oilseed products increased from \$172 million to \$257 million, with vegetable oil and oilseeds making striking gains.

U.S. animal and animal products shipments to Canada were hindered by restrictive health regulations and import quotas. Exports dropped to \$219 million in 1974 from \$242 million in 1973, but the 1974 value was still well above the levels of recent years. Export volumes for nonbreeding cattle and fresh and frozen beef and veal were less than half of 1973 levels; turkey meat exports fell 22 percent. During April through September 1974, Canada banned imports of livestock and meat treated with DES. Since August, quotas have been in effect for slaughter cattle and fresh and frozen beef and veal. During May through September, import quotas were in effect for eggs. Since May, turkey meat shipments to Canada have been limited by monthly quotas.

U.S. agricultural exports to Mexico increased from \$181 million in 1972 to \$362 million in 1973 to \$863 million in 1974. Drought and population growth have increased Mexico's demand for imported food. Our feed grain exports to Mexico in 1974 were 2-1/4 times the 1973 volume; value increased from \$85 million to \$276 million. Wheat export volume was up 44 percent, and value rose from \$73 million to \$182 million. Soybean exports, valued at \$96 million in 1974, were up threefold in volume. Exports of pulses, live cattle, animal fats, and whole cattle hides also expanded greatly. ^{5/}

U.S. farm exports to Italy were valued at \$794 million in 1974; volume was below year-earlier levels. The greatest decline occurred in feed grain shipments. Volume fell from 3.2 to 2.1 million tons, and value from \$275 to \$269 million. Soybean exports to Italy were valued at \$211 million in 1974; volume was up 4 percent. Oilcake and meal exports were up 37 percent in volume and 38 percent in value.

The volume of U.S. agricultural exports to the Republic of Korea also declined between 1973 and 1974, but higher prices raised export value to \$743 million. Wheat export volume fell to less than two-thirds of the 1973 level; value, at \$261 million, was down 7 percent. Cotton exports fell 13 percent in volume; higher prices pushed value to \$148 million. Feed grain export value rose from \$83 million to \$140 million, and volume rose 11 percent to almost 1 million tons. Rice exports fell to three-fourths of the 1973 volume, but they increased in value to \$108 million. In 1974, U.S. Government-program exports of \$16.7 million were made to Korea, compared with \$96 million in 1973. Rice, wheat, and cotton had been the main commodities shipped under Government programs in previous years, but no rice or cotton was included in the 1974 program.

The United States exported \$728 million worth of agricultural products to Spain in 1974, 54 percent more than in 1973. Spain's expanding livestock industry has generated increased demand for feeds. Soybean exports rose from \$189 million in 1973 to \$338 million in 1974, and export volume was up 45 percent. Feed grain exports to Spain totaled 2.4 million tons valued at \$296 million in 1974, compared with 1.8 million tons valued at \$165 million in 1973. 6/

U.S. agricultural exports to the United Kingdom were valued at \$692 million in 1974, slightly above the 1973 value. Tobacco remained the leading commodity. Shipments were valued at \$137 million, although volume was less than four-fifths of the 1973 level. The U.K. tobacco industry has been depressed by higher excise taxes and inflation. Demand for U.S. tobacco was further reduced by the European Community's preference system for exports of certain developing countries.

U.S. feed grain exports to the United Kingdom fell 32 percent in volume between 1973 and 1974, but value held steady at \$130 million. Wheat export volume was down 39 percent, and value fell 13 percent to \$72 million. The U.K. livestock industry cut grain feeding significantly in 1974 and had an extraordinarily high slaughter rate. U.K. membership in the European Community has made U.S. grains less competitive in the British market. U.S. soybean exports to the United Kingdom remained at the 1973 volume during 1974, but higher prices raised export value to \$78 million.

During 1970-73, almost one-fifth (by value) of the United Kingdom's imports of U.S. farm products was shipped through the Netherlands or Belgium. These transshipments totaled \$122 million in 1973. Soybeans, feed grains, and wheat are the main commodities involved. During 1970-73, 45 percent of U.S. soybeans, 26 percent of the feed grains, and 11 percent of the wheat shipped to the United Kingdom were recorded as transshipments through Dutch and Belgian ports.

The value of U.S. agricultural exports to the People's Republic of China increased slightly to \$664 million in 1974. Grain shipments fell from 1973's \$439 million to \$330 million. Export volume was down 45 percent for wheat and 43 percent for feed grains. Soybean exports, at \$138 million, were 2-1/2 times the 1973 value and volume. Cotton exports rose from \$101 million to \$186 million, and volume was up 29 percent. 7/

Exports to 7 of the top 50 country markets more than doubled between 1973 and 1974: Iran, Egypt, Iraq, Mexico, Turkey, Romania, and Venezuela. The two principal causes for the striking increases were poor harvests and increased oil revenues which enabled greater expenditures for improvement in domestic food consumption. U.S. farm exports to 9 other countries increased by more than 50 percent between 1973 and 1974: Bangladesh, Portugal, Australia, Algeria, the Dominican Republic, Cambodia, Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, and Spain.

Iran was the fastest-growing of America's 50 major farm product markets in 1974, increasing its imports to \$534 million from \$112 million in 1973. Greatly expanded oil revenues have enabled Iran to import more food for consumers. The increase in food imports has not been confined to commodities from the United States. In 1974, U.S. wheat export volume to Iran was 2-1/3 times the 1973 level. Value of wheat exports was \$257 million in 1974. Rice exports to Iran were valued at \$105 million in 1974, compared with \$3,000 in 1973. Vegetable oil export volume increased 318 percent; 1974 export value was \$114 million.

The value of U.S. agricultural exports to 9 of the top 50 markets declined between 1973 and 1974: Argentina, the USSR, Czechoslovakia, Indonesia, Singapore, Denmark, Brazil, Greece, and Poland.

Our agricultural exports to the USSR dropped from \$1 billion in 1973 to \$324 million. Wheat shipments to the USSR declined from 8.7 million to 1.1 million tons; feed grain shipments from 4.9 million to 2.2 million tons. No U.S. soybeans were exported to the USSR in 1974, compared with almost half a million tons in 1973. 8/



Export Highlights

JULY 1974-APRIL 1975 AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS TOTALED \$18.7 BILLION

U.S. agricultural exports during the first 10 months of fiscal 1975 were valued at \$18.7 billion, compared with \$17.8 billion during the same period a year earlier. Volume was down about 15 percent. Cotton exports fell 34 percent from the year-earlier volume. Export volume also declined for feed grains, wheat, soybeans, oilmeal, and tobacco. Increases occurred in the volume of animal fat and oil, meat, and whole cattle hide exports. The greatest expansion occurred in shipments of pulses (52 percent), soybean and cottonseed oil (37 percent), and rice (38 percent).

Prices of principal export commodities have fallen in recent months. The wheat export unit value for April was \$4.68 per bushel, compared with \$5.32 during April 1974. The April export unit value for corn was down to \$3.49 per bushel from the January high of \$3.94. The soybean unit value dropped from \$7.99 per bushel last fall to \$6.58 in April.

U.S. farm exports during April were valued at \$1.8 billion, 13 percent below the April 1974 level. Declines occurred in the value of exports of feed grains, soybeans, rice, cotton, oilmeal, animal fats, and cattle hides.

U.S. agricultural exports to Western Europe were valued at \$6.2 billion during July-April, 9 percent above the year-earlier level. Exports to the European Community were up slightly, to \$4.7 billion. Feed grain exports to Western Europe increased in value to \$1.9 billion; export volume was slightly above the year-earlier level. Higher prices caused the value of soybean shipments to remain at \$1.6 billion, despite a 17-percent drop in volume.

Western Europe remained the leading market for several commodities during July-April. Tobacco exports rose to \$419 million, although volume declined by 9 percent. Oilcake and meal exports increased 9 percent in volume, but value fell to \$477 million. Exports of other prepared animal feeds and fodders were down about 10 percent. Exports to Western Europe of fresh and frozen variety meats were 10 percent above the volume of a year earlier, but lower prices caused value to fall 21 percent. West European purchases of U.S. nuts were up almost 20 percent, with the greatest increase occurring in purchases of shelled almonds.

During July-April, U.S. agricultural exports to Japan retained the year-earlier value of \$2.8 billion, with higher prices compensating for decreased volume. Feed grain exports to Japan fell 29 percent in volume, and value fell from \$973 million to \$871 million. Soybean exports were valued at \$574 million, compared with \$577 million a year earlier, but volume was down 13 percent. Wheat exports expanded both in value and volume.

U.S. farm exports to Canada were 11 percent above year-earlier value during July-April and exceeded \$1 billion. However, exports of slaughter cattle, fresh and frozen beef, and turkey meat--the commodities under Canadian import quotas--were valued at less than one-third of the July 1973-April 1974 level, and export volume was down even more. Cotton exports were about three-fourths of the year-earlier level. Fruit and vegetable exports increased in value. Both soybean and corn exports to Canada were up substantially in value and volume.

During the first 10 months of fiscal 1975, U.S. agricultural exports to Latin America were valued at \$2.1 billion, compared with \$1.9 billion a year earlier. Wheat export volume fell to less than three-fourths of last year's drought-induced high. Wheat remained the major commodity exported to Latin America; the July-April value was \$641 million. Feed grain exports to the region were 179 percent of the year-earlier value. Mexico accounted for \$298 million worth, or about two-thirds, of the feed grain exports to Latin America.

U.S. agricultural exports to Southeast and East Asia, excluding Japan and the People's Republic of China (PRC), were valued at \$1.66 billion during July-April, 12 percent below the level of a year earlier. Wheat remained the leading commodity, with exports valued at \$451 million, despite a 28-percent drop in value and a 22-percent drop in volume. Rice exports were up 15 percent in volume, but value fell 7 percent to \$298 million. Cotton shipments to the region during July-April were 55 percent of the year-earlier volume. The value of cotton exports fell from \$395 million to \$275 million. Feed grain exports, at \$123 million, were three-fifths of the year-earlier volume.

West Asia was the fastest growing market for U.S. farm exports during the first 10 months of fiscal 1975. Exports of \$1.4 billion were 2.1 times the value for the same months a year earlier. Exports to Iran increased from \$134 million to \$647 million, accounting for about 70 percent of the increase in exports to West Asia. Wheat was the major commodity exported to West Asia during July-April. Wheat exports were valued at \$561 million and were 186 percent of the year-earlier volume. Rice exports to the region increased by almost 300 percent to total \$276 million.

U.S. farm exports to South Asia increased from \$548 million during July 1973-April 1974 to \$979 million during July 1974-April 1975. Wheat exports increased from \$370 million to \$777 million. Export volume was up 92 percent. The poor 1974 monsoon sharply reduced grain production in South Asia.

Africa imported \$930 million worth of U.S. agricultural products during the first 10 months of fiscal 1975, 17 percent more than in the same months a year earlier. The bulk of the increase occurred in shipments to Egypt. Wheat exports to Africa declined 9 percent to \$360 million; export volume declined 21 percent. Rice export volume fell about two-fifths. Exports of vegetable oils, feed grains, inedible tallow, and tobacco expanded.

U.S. agricultural exports to Eastern Europe were valued at \$533 million during July-April, compared with \$585 million a year earlier and \$351 million 2 years earlier. Oilcake and meal exports, at \$90 million, were about two-fifths of the year-earlier value. Wheat exports fell from \$100 million to less than \$20 million. Corn exports to Eastern Europe were 2.4 times the year-earlier volume and 3.3 times the year-earlier value.

The Soviet Union's purchases of U.S. farm products totaled \$327 million during July-April--down 27 percent from a year earlier and more than 50 percent below the level of 2 years earlier. July-April wheat exports were down 69 percent in volume, and value fell from \$199 million to \$153 million. Corn shipments to the USSR also fell to three-tenths of the July 1973-April 1974 volume. Value dropped 32 percent to \$139 million.

U.S. farm exports to the PRC dropped from the high of \$752 million in July 1973-April 1974 to \$296 million during July 1974-April 1975. Wheat exports declined from \$317 million to \$189 million. Corn exports dropped to \$2.6 million from \$169 million. Cotton and soybean exports were down sharply. The PRC decreased or discontinued purchases of U.S. farm products due to a good crop year in 1974 and foreign exchange problems. Since January 1975, cotton has been the only farm commodity exported to the PRC.



Import Highlights

AGRICULTURAL IMPORT VALUE UP, VOLUME DOWN SHARPLY

U.S. agricultural imports during July 1974-April 1975 edged up to just under \$8.1 billion from the \$7.8 billion worth of a year earlier. Import volume for many farm products declined, however, especially entries of cattle, meat, dairy products, sugar, and most tropical items. In April, imports moved up slightly from the March value, but remained well below year-earlier levels. The quantity index declined 8 percent to 108 (1967 = 100).

Competitive, or supplementary, imports amounted to \$5.74 billion in July-April, compared with \$5.16 billion a year earlier. Most of this 11-percent increase resulted from substantially higher sugar prices. While sugar import tonnage fell 15 percent to 3.85 million short tons, value more than doubled to \$2.15 billion. April sugar imports totaled only 303,000 tons against 509,000 tons in April 1974, continuing the sharp decline that has occurred since January (table 36).

Vegetable oil imports have remained strong in contrast to most other agricultural purchases. July-April volume was up 30 percent from year-earlier levels, while higher prices resulted in a nearly doubling of value. Coconut, palm, palm kernel, and tung oil imports reflected larger volumes, and substantially higher values.

Grain and preparations imports surged by one-half to \$149 million in July-April. Barley import volume more than doubled to 14.4 million bushels and value tripled to \$56.6 million. The unit value of imported barley--all from Canada--averaged \$3.97 per bushel in April and \$3.93 during July-April. A year earlier, barley imports averaged \$3.69 in April and \$3.08 in July-April.

Tobacco imports rose 12 percent in volume in July-April to 274 million pounds; price increases resulted in a value gain of over 20 percent to \$188 million. Flue-cured and burley leaf imports, which were mostly from South Korea, the Philippines, Argentina, Brazil, Mexico, and Venezuela, tripled to 31 million pounds.

Noncompetitive agricultural imports in July-April dropped more than 12 percent from the year-earlier level to \$2.32 billion. Volume declines occurred for bananas, coffee, cocoa, tea, spices, carpet wool, and essential oils. Higher prices kept values from falling as much as volume, however. The quantity index for noncompetitive items dropped 16 percent to 90 (1967 = 100).

Fresh banana imports in April were considerably lower than a year earlier, principally because of reduced shipments from Honduras. Hurricane damage last fall cut Honduran output sharply. Imports from other Central and South American sources have increased, but not enough to offset the decline from Honduras. Total banana import volume in July-April was 8 percent below similar months last year. Value equaled last year's \$164 million, however, as prices moved up.

Export taxes on bananas were raised recently in Costa Rica and Honduras. On May 1, the Costa Rican tax was increased from 25 to 45 cents per 40-pound box. The Honduran export tax rose to 30 cents per box in January from 25 cents. Panama's export tax remains at 35 cents. These three countries formed the Union of Banana Exporters in April 1974. Their export taxes are not reflected in the U.S. import value, defined as the market value in the exporting country or free-alongside vessel (f.a.s.), port of export.

Green coffee entries in July-April, at less than 1.8 billion pounds, were down nearly 28 percent. Imports from most major exporting countries--including Brazil, Colombia, Angola, the Ivory Coast, Uganda, and Ethiopia--were lower.

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



AD VALOREM EQUIVALENT DUTY RATES DECLINE IN 1974

Customs duties on imported agricultural products in 1974 amounted to less than \$352 million, about the same as those a year earlier. However, since the value of farm product imports rose to \$10.2 billion from nearly \$8.4 billion, ad valorem equivalent duty rates declined from 4.2 to 3.5 percent. For dutiable items, the ad valorem equivalent rate fell from 7 to 5.5 percent.

Most U.S. agricultural import duties are "specific"--that is, in cents per pound or dollars per gallon and are based on Tariff Act of 1930 rates, as amended by reductions agreed upon by member countries of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade. About 459 U.S. farm commodity Tariff Schedule numbers call for specific duty rates. Ad valorem or compound rates apply on 280 others, and 283 are duty-free. In 1974, specific duties were collected on over half of the value of agricultural imports, while 37 percent of the value reflected duty-free items. As a result, U.S. import duties did not increase along with import value. In addition, import volume declines occurred for many agricultural commodities between 1973 and 1974. The overall volume index declined by 5 percent to 115 (1967 = 100).

Table 43 summarizes U.S. agricultural imports and customs duties since 1966. For 1974, commodity groupings are shown in table 44, followed by additional commodity details in table 45. Comparable 1973 data appeared in the May 1974 issue of Foreign Agricultural Trade of the United States, pp. 73-82.



U.S. EXPORT UNIT VALUES DECLINE

The 1975 winter quarter was the first quarter since mid-1972 that U.S. export unit values for agricultural commodities registered a decline. As figure illustrates, the turnaround was consistent with changes in the index of prices received by farmers and in the food component of the Consumer Price Index. The index of export unit values reached a plateau during November 1974-January 1975, while the index of prices received by farmers peaked in October 1974 and the food component of the CPI reached an alltime high in February 1975.

A buildup of stocks in importing countries, the worldwide slowdown in economic activity, and the outlook for improved 1975 crops were affecting most farm commodity prices during the first quarter of 1975. Export unit values were 4 percent lower than in the previous quarter (table 46). Soybean oil experienced the sharpest price decline, slipping to 39 cents a pound. Corn, grain sorghum, soybeans, and nonfat dried milk export unit values declined slightly. The export unit value of wheat, at \$5.11 a bushel, was up only 1 percent.

Still, U.S. agricultural exports were priced 20 percent higher than during the first quarter of 1974. Corn prices, which had leveled off from the previous quarter, were nearly double the year-earlier level. Soybean meal prices halted their quarter-to-quarter declines and were 78 percent of the first-quarter 1974 level.

Fourth-quarter 1974 gains in import unit values were nearly halted during the first quarter of 1975. Sugar import unit values rose less dramatically, and the import unit value of cocoa beans, which had been rising, began to decline.

In the livestock complex, import unit values for canned hams and shoulders started to pick up, but those for beef and veal continued their quarter-to-quarter declines. The January-March 1975 import unit value for beef and veal was only 55 percent of the year-earlier value. The import unit value of apparel wool continued to fall.

From February to March 1975, export and import unit values slackened nearly across the board. In March, only the import unit value of sugar, at 34 cents a pound, was slightly higher than in February--but was 17 percent lower than the January peak.

How were the first-quarter 1975 changes in prices related to the quantity of U.S. agricultural exports and imports? Export volume, when measured by indexes, was 5 percent lower during the first quarter of 1975 than it was a year earlier, but 6.5 percent higher than fourth-quarter 1974 volume. Import volume was down 17 percent from the first quarter of 1974 and down 29 percent from the fourth quarter of 1974.

April Export and Import Commodity Prices

In April, commodity markets demonstrated a large degree of sluggishness. The Dow-Jones commodity spot price index drifted slightly downward to 305. The Reuters commodity spot price index (which includes other items in addition to agricultural commodities) drifted upward to 1,092, compared with 1,079 in March.

April international wheat prices stayed at their March levels. With the U.S. Gulf export price of Hard Winter wheat at \$144 a ton, the price spread between Rotterdam and U.S. Gulf ports widened to \$7 a ton. Ocean freight rates between U.S. Gulf ports and Rotterdam are currently less than \$5 a ton.

The Duluth price of Dark Northern Spring wheat, at \$161 a ton, allowed a \$21-a-ton price spread between the U.S. and Rotterdam ports, about the same as in March. In contrast, the Rotterdam-Canadian ports spread for No. 1 Canadian Western Red Spring wheat reached \$3 a ton, a return from the inverted price relationship of March.

International wheat prices have been maintained as a result of the high level of U.S. P.L. 480 sales, including an agreement for an 800,000-ton sale to India. A Canadian 1.1-million-ton wheat sale to China and Japan's late-month return to the international wheat market all buoyed prices, despite the overall bearish influences of forecasts for good crops and the European Community's accumulation of wheat stocks.

International corn prices weakened slightly, with the U.S. Gulf ports price declining to \$122 a ton. The Gulf ports-Rotterdam price spread for U.S. corn narrowed to \$8 a ton as the Rotterdam price declined 4 percent from March to April. In the Rotterdam market, the premium paid for Argentine corn compared to U.S. corn widened to \$27 a ton.

Soybean prices were buoyed by a 6-percent rise in soybean meal prices in Rotterdam. Brazil's active presence in the international soybean market was countered by the increased drawdown of accumulated soybean meal stocks in Western Europe and by inquiries from Yugoslavia, Israel, Greece, Venezuela, and Egypt.

After being in the doldrums, the North European ports price for U.S. strict middling cotton showed some signs of recovery, reaching its highest level of 5 months. An anticipated gradual pickup in textile activity during the balance of the crop year is triggering the turnaround. Lower prices, however, for the 1974 crop are encouraging producers to reduce cotton acreage in 1975.

Imported cow meat prices made a 12-percent gain in April as domestic U.S. cattle prices rose. Other import prices continued to slide, with sugar and cocoa bean spot prices showing the biggest drops.




THE BOOMING IRAQI MARKET FOR U.S. FARM PRODUCTS

U.S. agricultural exports to Iraq increased from only \$1.6 million in 1972 to \$32.4 million in 1973 and \$114.8 million in 1974. During July-March of fiscal 1975, the value reached \$114.4 million--double the year-earlier level. Marked gains in U.S. sales of wheat and rice to Iraq are expected to be followed by lesser gains for feed grains, animal feed, tallow, and various processed foods.

Other countries are also providing a wide variety of agricultural products for state trading firms in Baghdad. The European Community is increasing its exports of dairy products and frozen poultry to Iraq. Pakistan, Thailand, and Brazil have shared in the rapid gains in Iraq's rice imports. Brazil, Cuba, and India are supplying more sugar, and Lebanon is sending more fruits and processed foods. Iraq has become Bulgaria's second-largest market for egg exports, following the USSR.

Iraq's total agricultural imports in 1975 are expected to reach a record \$700 million--more than double the 1973 level of about \$300 million and one-fifth above the 1974 level.

Cereals accounted for about 44 percent of Iraq's agricultural import value in 1974, but lower prices for wheat and rice are likely to cause the share for cereals to fall below 38 percent in 1975. A marked diversification in Iraq's agricultural imports is underway. Imports of frozen poultry, corn, breeding animals, animal feed, dairy products, sugar, and tea are expected to reach record values in 1975.

Petroleum revenues, increasing from \$1.5 billion in 1973 to about \$6.8 billion in 1974, have greatly enlarged Iraq's role in world trade, both as an exporter and an importer. Total 1974 exports, at an estimated \$8 billion, were quadruple the 1973 level, while imports staged an even sharper gain, increasing from \$1 billion to \$4.56 billion. Farm products accounted for 13 percent of total 1974 imports, compared with 25 percent in 1973.

Crop production in Iraq fell sharply in 1973 because of poor winter rainfall. A slight recovery occurred in 1974, but total food output was still far below consumer demand. New economic policies and income distribution arrangements have led to a marked increase in consumer demand for food, particularly in Baghdad, Basra, and about 10 smaller cities.

Urban population growth is about double the national growth rate of 3 percent. About half of Iraq's 10.5 million people now live in urban areas. New shops are opening for distribution of bakery products, rice, meat, and produce at subsidized prices. The average annual income now exceeds \$900--more than double the 1973 level. Fixed prices for basic food items have led to a strong rise in consumer demand.

The United States has been a major supplier of wheat and rice to Iraq in recent years. Our wheat exports to Iraq in 1974 totaled 575,000 tons (\$96.3 million)--up from 210,000 tons (\$24.7 million) in 1973. U.S. wheat exports to Iraq during the first 9 months of fiscal 1975 reached 417,000 tons (\$72.4 million)--up from 332,000 tons (\$44.6 million) a year earlier.

U.S. rice exports to Iraq increased from 9,000 tons (\$5.2 million) in July-March 1973/74 to 89,000 tons (\$40 million) during the comparable part of fiscal 1975. The average price for the rice in the fiscal 1975 period was \$448 per ton--down from \$573 per ton in fiscal 1974. Our rice exports to Iraq during calendar year 1974 totaled 31,000 tons (\$14 million) (table 47).

Our exports of soybean meal and tallow to Iraq in the first 9 months of fiscal 1975 were below the year-earlier volume, but shipments of vegetable seeds and various gums were higher.

Next to the United States, Brazil and Thailand have scored the most dramatic gains in agricultural exports to Iraq. Pakistan, India, Lebanon, France, Hungary, and Bulgaria have also increased their sales to Iraq recently. Australia, Canada, and the USSR were more important suppliers in the late 1960's and early 1970's than they were in 1974 or early 1975.

Commodity Review

Sugar

Iraq's leading agricultural import in value terms in 1973 and 1974 was sugar (table 48). Brazil was the leading supplier, shipping more than 200,000 tons in both years. The average price for sugar imports increased from \$235 per ton in 1973 to over \$450 per ton in 1974, for a total value of about \$175 million.

Soviet sugar exports to Iraq increased from 105,000 tons in 1970 to 154,000 tons (about \$19 million) in 1971, but ceased after 1972. This caused Iraq to search for new sugar suppliers. Thailand and India each sent over 25,000 tons of sugar to Iraq in 1974/75. Contracts signed with India and Mauritius for sugar in late 1974 at high prices were not cancelled as sugar prices declined. Iraq has various economic agreements with these countries to help them cushion the adverse impact of higher oil prices.

Wheat

Wheat was the second major agricultural import by Iraq in 1974. Imports were valued at about \$140 million. The United States was the major supplier, providing about three-fourths of the 950,000 tons (\$140 million) imported. Supplies from Australia totaled 210,000 tons (\$37 million).

Iraq's wheat production in 1975 is expected to be about one-fifth higher than the 1.3 million tons harvested in 1974. Yet, rising consumer demand is expected to cause imports to remain about the same.

Iraq's wheat imports fluctuate widely. In 1969, following a 1.4-million-ton wheat harvest in 1968, wheat imports were less than 5,000 tons. They reached 954,000 tons in 1971, when Australia and Canada each supplied about one-third of the total. Imports in 1972 fell sharply because of prospects for a bumper harvest. In 1973, imports were again low--154,000 tons--but a poor crop that year led to a rapid reduction in stocks. The United States sent 210,000 tons of wheat to Iraq in 1973 (including 57,000 tons in December which didn't arrive until January 1974) and 575,000 tons in 1974. The 1974 shipments were a record--almost triple the 1973 level and 5 times the 1964 shipment of 100,000 tons.

Soviet deliveries of wheat were considerable in the 1960's, but the last exports of Russian wheat to Iraq were reported in 1971, consisting of 117,100 tons.

Wheat production is concentrated in northern Iraq, where rainfall during the winter varies widely from year to year, causing great fluctuations in wheat yields. Expanded use of high-yielding varieties in irrigated areas and excellent winter rainfall caused Iraq's wheat production to reach a record in 1972--reported at 2.6 million tons--more than double the 1965-71 average of about 1.0 million tons. However, inadequate storage facilities and losses to rodents, birds, and insects prevented much of that crop from reaching urban consumers. Iraq began building large modern grain warehouses in late 1972 to help solve these storage problems. Concern about losses in harvesting grain by traditional methods caused Iraq to purchase over 1,000 combines from American and European firms recently.

Demand for wheat was increasing considerably during the late 1960's and through 1973, but new distribution policies in 1974 caused an additional upward thrust in demand. The demand is still rising for traditional types of bread sold in villages, but the most striking gains are occurring in the sales of modern types of bread prepared by baking equipment recently imported from Europe. Demand for macaroni, spaghetti, and fine bakery products is also increasing rapidly.

Rice

Salinity problems caused Iraq's rice production to decline about 33 percent in 1973 to only 157,000 tons. In 1974, the average water level of the Euphrates was 7 feet below normal, and rice output failed to show much recovery. These declines occurred at the very time that consumer demand was increasing markedly. Rice is a favorite food during special occasions in Iraq. Some of the leading Iraqi dishes contain rice, cooked with eggs and spices. Income elasticity for rice is high, possibly 0.6 to 0.8, and recent programs to bolster per capita income have caused a rapid expansion in rice consumption.

Rice imports were reported at 265,000 tons in 1974, and further gains are expected in 1975. This is far above previous peaks for rice imports by Iraq--95,000 tons in 1964 and 97,000 tons in 1971. Thailand supplied about one-third of Iraq's rice imports last year, and the United States, the People's Republic of China, Brazil, and Peru each supplied about 30,000 tons. The United States is expected to supply about two-fifths of Iraq's rice imports in 1975.

An impressive upward trend is underway in Iraq's rice imports. Higher petroleum revenues have eliminated the concern for sparing foreign exchange, which once hindered rice imports. Also, rice is a popular and convenient item to subsidize in sales to consumers. Iraq was our second-largest commercial market for long grain rice in early 1975, following Iran.

Coarse Grains

Programs in Iraq to greatly expand commercial poultry operations and dairies are based partly on much larger imports of feed grains, possibly 1 million tons annually in the late 1970's. Barley production reached a peak of 1 million tons in 1972--more than double the 1971 level. Barley imports exceeded 400,000 tons in 1971, mostly from Canada and France. Corn production remains below 25,000 tons annually. Imports of corn from Thailand and Africa are rising. Grain sorghums have also been imported in small quantities from Sudan and Thailand.

Exports of barley to Kuwait and Saudi Arabia exceeded 50,000 tons in 1972, but fell below 20,000 tons in 1973 because of a 32-percent decline in production.

Oilseeds and Products

The United States exported about 5,000 tons of soybean meal to Iraq in 1973 for \$1 million, but no shipments were reported in 1974. However, ambitious plans to expand poultry output and establish modern dairies and beef cattle feed lots will greatly expand the demand for imports of soybean and peanut meal in the future. These projects will also cause imports of live breeding animals to rise. The country has become one of the fastest growing markets for Malaysian palm oil, importing about 100,000 tons annually. Imports of soybeans and peanuts from Thailand are also rising.

Tobacco

Cigarette output in Iraq has more than tripled in the last decade, exceeding 16,000 tons in 1974. Gains in tobacco production supplied most of the expanding needs of cigarette factories, although output has declined in the last 2 years. Tobacco exports exceeded 1,000 tons in 1972 and 1973. Egypt and Kuwait were the major markets.

The United States sent about 1,500 tons of flue-cured and burley tobacco to Iraq under P.L. 480 a decade ago. Iraqi workers and shoppers in Kuwait can purchase imported American cigarettes for less than 20 cents per pack. Imports of U.S. tobacco for blending could again occur.

Fruits and Vegetables

Imports of apples from Lebanon and dried fruits from Syria and Afghanistan have shown an upward trend in the last decade. Seasonal imports of tomatoes and melons from Jordan and Saudi Arabia have also gained importance. Iraq's imports of fruits and vegetables increased from \$6.8 million in 1964 to about \$16 million in 1974. New plans for state produce centers might push imports of fruits and vegetables to \$30 million in 1975.

Iraq is the world's leading exporter of dried dates. Annual exports range between 200,000 and 220,000 tons. Exports of dates have exceeded \$30 million annually since 1972. The People's Republic of China, India, the Soviet Union, Czechoslovakia, and the United States are major markets. Iraq exports a wide variety of fruits and vegetables to Kuwait for more than \$5 million annually.

Miscellaneous Products

Expanding soap output in Iraq has spurred demand for imported tallow, most of which has come from Europe in recent years. However, U.S. tallow exports to Iraq have increased from 2,300 tons in 1973 to 5,600 tons (\$2.6 million) in 1974.

Iraq was a market for almost \$1 million worth of U.S. seed in 1974 (\$719,000, vegetable seed; \$96,000, hybrid corn seed; and \$62,000, sweet corn seed).

U.S. sales to Iraq of baby food and corn-soya-milk blends under relief programs ended in 1973. Cash sales of some U.S. processed foods began in 1974, and new import policies could bring dramatic gains in such sales, particularly for items providing improved nutrition for school children. Gains in U.S. sales of peanut butter, fruit juices, and almonds to neighboring Kuwait have enabled many Iraqi's working there to become familiar with these products.

U.S. exports of ingredients for Iraqi food and beverage industries doubled in 1974, nearing \$900,000. This included \$527,000 for 50,000 gallons of liquid beverage base ingredients for the local bottling industries and \$324,000 for various gums used in Iraq's expanding bakeries and candy factories.

Outlook

Iraq plans to invest several billion dollars in dams, irrigation projects, fertilizer factories, and food storage facilities. Contracts with Yugoslav firms alone for projects related to agriculture total \$1 billion. Increasing salinity and dwindling supplies of irrigation water from the Euphrates have hampered productivity in eastern Iraq in recent years. Land reform programs have not been helpful in bolstering supplies of grain for urban centers, although many new landowners have increased their output of vegetables.

Iraq plans to bolster agricultural development through increased use of irrigation water from the Tabqua Dam and greater use of fertilizer and improved varieties. Also, foreign technicians will be contracted for various tasks in accelerating agricultural development. Projects will include efforts to combat salinity, increase mechanization and the use of high-yielding seeds, modernize livestock feeding operations, improve supplies of high-yielding varieties, and streamline food processing and distribution systems. These projects will bolster the demand for agricultural imports, especially the programs to expand livestock enterprises. Iraq is now seeking to import 10,000 Freisian heifers for use in dairies being developed by the Ministry of Agriculture and Agrarian Reform.

U.S. agricultural exports to Iraq are expected to continue upward during 1975. Following large shipments of wheat and rice during January-March, deliveries tapered off in April-June. The commodity mix is likely to become more diversified. Large shipments of U.S. wheat, rice, feed grains, and oilseed products are likely in late 1975. Wheat's share of our farm exports to Iraq is likely to fall below 60 percent in 1975--down from 84 percent in 1974. Recent sales of jet aircraft, farm machinery, and industrial equipment should push our annual exports to Iraq above \$600 million--with farm products accounting for about one-fourth.









Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at the time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
