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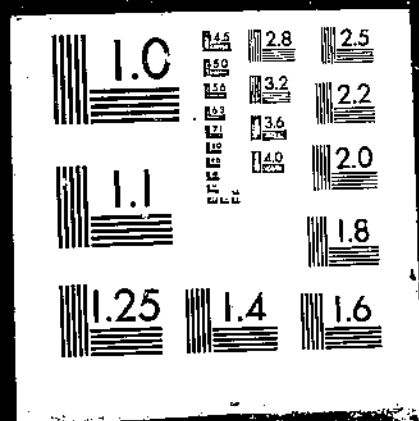

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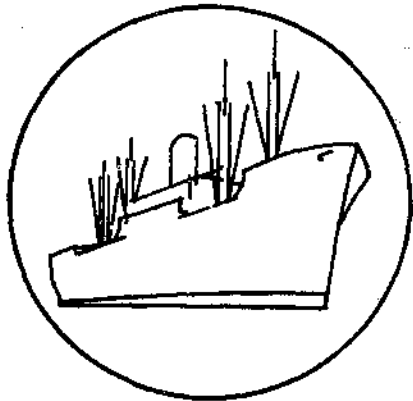

FOREIGN AGRICULTURAL TRADE OF THE UNITED STATES

Digest

U.S. Agricultural Exports Totaled \$4.7 Billion in First Quarter of Fiscal 1976 (see p. 4). Value was 6 percent higher than a year earlier, and volume was up 14 percent. Wheat, corn, cotton, grain sorghum, and soybean exports were up in volume and value, but exports of rice, tobacco, and oilmeal fell below year-earlier levels.

U.S. farm exports to Japan were up 4 percent in value during July-September 1975. Exports to the European Community were up 22 percent in value. Exports to the USSR were valued at \$231 million, compared with \$32 million during the same months last year. No agricultural exports were made to the People's Republic of China during July-September 1975.

Leading Markets for U.S. Agricultural Exports in Fiscal 1975 (see p. 40). Two-thirds of the \$21.6 billion worth of agricultural products exported during fiscal 1975 was shipped to the 15 largest markets. Thirty-eight countries imported \$100 million worth of U.S. farm products in fiscal 1975. The value of U.S. agricultural exports to developing countries was up 17 percent, while shipments fell slightly to developed countries and dropped 36 percent in value to the centrally planned economies.

U.S. Agricultural Trade with Canada, Fiscal 1975: Exports Rise, Imports Decline (see p. 64). U.S. agricultural exports to Canada rose 10 percent over the fiscal 1974 value, reaching \$1.35 billion, and pushing the agricultural trade surplus up 29 percent to \$877 million. Horticultural products remained the major export commodity group. Exports of cattle, beef, and veal declined because of Canadian trade restrictions. Exports of pork to Canada increased substantially during the period. U.S. imports of cattle and meat from Canada were down in every category.

U.S.-PRC Agricultural Trade in Fiscal 1975 (see p. 69). U.S. agricultural exports to the People's Republic of China (PRC) dropped 62 percent in fiscal 1975 to \$335 million as a result of PRC terminations of contracts for U.S. grain, soybeans, and cotton. Exports are expected to decline further in fiscal 1976 because of increased agricultural production in the PRC, foreign exchange problems, and depressed world demand for Chinese textile exports. U.S. agricultural imports from the PRC rose slightly to \$25 million in fiscal 1975.

U.S. Agricultural Exports Adjusted for Transshipments, 1974 (see p. 75). Substantial amounts of U.S. farm products move through ports in Canada, the Netherlands, Belgium, and West Germany to other countries. Final destination may not be known to the exporter when a shipment leaves U.S. ports, thus distorting data on exports by country. This article and accompanying tables report on adjusted data for our 1974 agricultural exports.

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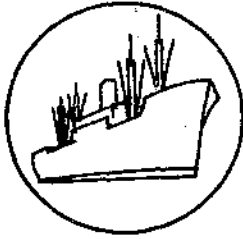

First Quarter Imports Down 13 Percent From Last Year (see p. 92). July-September imports of agricultural products, at almost \$2.4 billion, were 4 percent below the same quarter in 1974. A decline in competitive products, notably sugar, cattle, dairy products, and oilbearing materials, accounted for most of the reduction. Noncompetitive tropical commodity imports, especially coffee, cocoa, and bananas, rose sharply.

Selected Prices of International Significance (see p. 105). During September, the Dow Jones commodity spot price index declined slightly to 315, largely reflecting the uncertainty in the international grain trading arena. Wheat, corn, soybean, and sugar prices declined from August levels. Rice, cotton, and imported cow meat prices strengthened. Brazilian coffee remained steady at its new high price, and cocoa bean prices were not quoted because of the tightness of new supplies in the United States.



Export Highlights

U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS TOTALED \$4.7 BILLION IN FIRST QUARTER OF FISCAL 1976

During the first quarter of fiscal 1976, U.S. agricultural exports were valued at \$4.74 billion, compared with \$4.47 billion during the same months of fiscal 1975. Export volume was up by 14 percent. Significant value and volume increases were recorded for exports of wheat, soybeans, cotton, meat, and feed grains. However, exports of tobacco, rice, and oilmeal were down substantially; and exports of animal fats, oils, and greases and vegetable oils fell below one-half of the July-September 1974 volume.

The leading markets for U.S. farm products maintained strong demand during the first quarter of fiscal 1976. Among the fastest-growing markets were the USSR, Taiwan, Brazil, and Egypt; each of the four more than doubled the value of agricultural imports from the United States from July-September 1974 levels. Iran and Mexico, two of fiscal 1975's expansionary markets, reduced their imports of U.S. farm products to less than half of the year-earlier value. No agricultural exports were made to the People's Republic of China during July-September 1975; exports had totaled \$227 million during July-September 1974.

July-September U.S. agricultural exports to Western Europe were valued at \$1.46 billion, 21 percent above the year-earlier value. Wheat exports totaled 46 million bushels, almost 4 times the July-September 1974 volume. Both corn and soybean exports to Western Europe increased by more than 25 percent. Dried fruit exports doubled in volume. However, Western Europe imported significantly less U.S. oilmeal, tobacco, and tallow.

The United States exported \$730 million worth of agricultural products to Japan during the first quarter of fiscal 1976. Export volume increases for soybeans, corn, pork, cattle hides, and wheat more than offset declines in exports of cotton, grain sorghum, citrus fruits, tallow, and vegetable oils. Pork exports to Japan, at 35 million pounds, were more than 3 times the year-earlier volume. Since June 1975, the Japanese import duty on pork has been waived because of high domestic prices. The waiver is scheduled to expire on October 31, 1975.

July-September exports to Latin America totaled \$504 million, 10 percent below the year-earlier value. Wheat exports were valued at \$219 million; volume, at 53 million bushels, was up 20 percent. Exports of live animals, grain sorghum, tallow, and cottonseed oil were also up; but export volume was down for corn, pulses, oilmeal, and soybeans.

Brazil, Mexico, and Venezuela were the largest Latin American markets for U.S. farm products. Exports to Mexico were down 57 percent in value, but exports to Brazil and Venezuela were up 132 and 77 percent, respectively.

U.S. agricultural exports to Southeast and East Asia (excluding Japan and the People's Republic of China) were valued at \$478 million during July-September 1975, 17 percent above the July-September 1974 level. Cotton exports to the region increased to 722,000 bales valued at \$192 million from 387,000 bales valued at \$104 million. Corn, soybean, and wheat exports also increased sharply in volume, while rice exports fell 80 percent in volume.

July-September farm exports to the Republic of Korea were valued at \$172 million, 12 percent below the year-earlier value. Exports to Taiwan increased from \$59 million during July-September 1974 to \$143 million.

July-September U.S. agricultural exports to the USSR were valued at \$231 million, compared with \$32 million during July-September 1974. Wheat exports to the Soviet Union totaled 1.3 million tons valued at \$222 million. Corn exports totaled 49,000 tons valued at \$7 million.

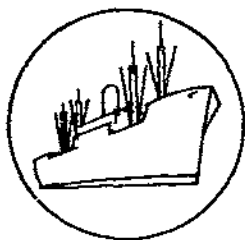

LEADING MARKETS FOR U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS IN FISCAL 1975

Two-thirds of the \$21.6 billion worth of agricultural products exported during fiscal 1975 was shipped to the 15 largest markets. Thirty-eight countries imported over \$100 million worth of U.S. farm products in fiscal 1975, compared with 41 countries last year. Of 1975's 50 leading markets, only half increased the value of their farm imports from the United States between fiscal 1974 and 1975.

The value of U.S. agricultural exports to developing countries (adjusted for transshipments through Canada) was up 16 percent in fiscal 1975, while shipments to developed countries remained at \$12.2 billion, and shipments to the centrally planned economies declined 38 percent in value (table 15). Exports to West Asia, at \$1.6 billion, were double the fiscal 1974 level. Exports to South Asia were up 86 percent to \$1.2 billion. Among developed countries, the decline in exports to Japan, Australia, and South Africa offset the growth in shipments to Western Europe and Canada. The East European countries reduced their imports of U.S. agricultural products by 15 percent, the USSR by 30 percent, and the People's Republic of China (PRC) by 62 percent.

Fiscal 1975 U.S. farm exports to Japan were valued at \$3.2 billion, 5 percent below the fiscal 1974 level. Export volume was down 18 percent. The U.S. share of Japan's agricultural imports fell from 37 to 33 percent (c.i.f. value basis). In fiscal 1975, Japan was the largest market for U.S. feed grains, soybeans, cotton, tobacco, and animal products.

Japanese imports of U.S. wheat remained at 3.1 million tons in fiscal 1975; value increased 16 percent to \$575 million. Japanese feed grain imports declined, and the U.S. share of the total also decreased. U.S. feed grain shipments to Japan fell 30 percent to 7.2 million tons. Japanese imports of U.S. soybeans declined for the second straight year to 87 million bushels, the smallest volume imported since fiscal 1969. ^{1/}

U.S. agricultural exports to the Netherlands were up 11 percent in fiscal 1975, to \$1.6 billion. Feed grain exports rose from 3.9 million to 4.5 million tons, valued at \$601 million. Soybean exports dropped 20 percent in volume and 5 percent in value, to 74.5 million bushels and \$544 million.

U.S. farm exports to West Germany were down 4 percent in fiscal 1975 to \$1.45 billion. Higher prices bolstered aggregate value despite sharp declines in volume. Feed grain shipments to West Germany increased in value to \$457 million, although volume declined 18 percent to 2.9 million tons. Soybean and tobacco export volumes were down 36 and 8 percent, respectively. Oilmeal exports to West Germany remained at 1.1 million short tons in fiscal 1975, but the export value fell 28 percent.

The United States exported \$1.3 billion worth of farm products to Canada in fiscal 1975, 10 percent more than last year. ^{2/} Significant increases occurred in the export value of fruits, vegetables, and soybeans; but Canada reduced its imports of U.S. animals and animal products. During certain parts of the year, quotas were in effect for U.S. slaughter cattle, fresh and frozen beef, eggs, and turkey meat.

The Republic of Korea became the fifth-largest market for U.S. agricultural products in fiscal 1975. Its imports increased 34 percent in value to \$885 million. U.S. wheat and flour exports to Korea rose 9 percent in volume and 15 percent in value to 1.7 million tons and \$330 million. Increases in both commercial and U.S. Government-program exports pushed rice exports to \$183 million and 578,000 tons from none in fiscal 1974. Cotton exports fell 27 percent to 541,000 bales.

U.S. agricultural exports to Mexico were up 40 percent in value in fiscal 1975, to \$851 million. Feed grain exports were up 61 percent in value and 23 percent in volume, to 2.2 million tons. Exports of wheat and flour were up 55 percent in value and 18 percent in volume. Mexico imported \$62 million worth of dried beans in fiscal 1975, compared with \$1.5 million in fiscal 1974. ^{3/}

U.S. farm exports to Italy increased from fiscal 1974's \$754 million to \$804 million in fiscal 1975. Feed grain exports dropped from 2.6 to 2.3 million tons, but export value increased 11 percent to \$312 million. Soybean exports to Italy fell 7 percent in volume to 28 million bushels and rose 15 percent in value to \$206 million.

In fiscal 1975, both volume and unit values increased to push the value of U.S. farm products exported to Spain to \$790 million, 23 percent above the fiscal 1974 value. Feed grain exports rose from 2.57 million tons valued at \$299 million to 2.67 million tons valued at \$353 million. Soybean exports to Spain, at 46 million bushels and \$321 million, were up 19 percent in volume and 31 percent in value.

India increased its imports of U.S. agricultural products from \$311 million in fiscal 1974 to a record \$759 million in fiscal 1975. India became the largest market for U.S. wheat and wheat flour with imports of 4.3 million tons valued at \$659 million. Fiscal 1974 wheat and flour imports were 1.6 million tons valued at \$203 million.

U.S. agricultural exports to Iran increased from \$183 million in fiscal 1974 to \$757 million in fiscal 1975. Grains comprised more than three-fourths of the total value. Fiscal 1975 agricultural exports to Iran included 1.7 million tons of wheat and flour valued at \$324 million, 462,000 tons of rice valued at \$227 million, and 312 million pounds of soybean oil valued at \$118 million. ^{4/}

Fiscal 1975 U.S. agricultural exports to the United Kingdom were valued at \$583 million, 85 percent of the fiscal 1974 value. U.K. tobacco imports from the United States fell to three-fourths of the fiscal 1974 volume, and the value of these shipments fell to \$135 million. Exports of feed grains and soybeans to the United Kingdom fell sharply: 46 percent for feed grains and 32 percent for soybeans.

U.S. agricultural exports to France rose slightly in fiscal 1975 to \$454 million. Oilcake and meal remained the major export, increasing slightly in value to \$131 million. Oilmeal export volume was up 23 percent. Oilseed exports fell 15 percent in value to \$94 million. Grain exports to France rose from \$20 million to \$46 million.

Fiscal 1975 U.S. farm exports to Taiwan were valued at \$410 million, compared with \$518 million during fiscal 1974. Soybean exports remained at 22 million bushels and \$155 million. Cotton, wheat, and feed grain exports to Taiwan fell dramatically.

The USSR imported \$396 million worth of U.S. agricultural products during fiscal 1975, compared with \$509 million in fiscal 1974. U.S. wheat exports to the USSR totaled 978,000 tons and \$194 million. Feed grain shipments totaled 1.2 million tons and \$159 million. ^{5/}

Egypt was the fifteenth-largest market for U.S. farm products in fiscal 1975, with imports valued at \$388 million, compared with \$264 million last year. U.S. wheat and flour exports to Egypt fell 11 percent in volume to 699,000 tons and 5 percent in value to \$124 million. Cottonseed oil exports more than doubled in volume to 415 million pounds. Tallow exports to Egypt were up 58 percent in value, and feed grain exports increased slightly.

Fiscal 1975 transshipments of U.S. grains and soybeans through Canadian ports included \$448 million worth reported to "unidentified" destinations and \$28 million worth of corn recorded as Canadian imports. Forty-three million bushels of wheat were transshipped through Canada in fiscal 1975, as well as 39 million bushels of corn and 14 million bushels of soybeans. The European Community received \$228 million worth of these transshipments; Japan, \$31 million worth of soybeans; and Venezuela, \$30 million worth of wheat.

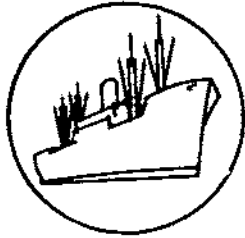

U.S. AGRICULTURAL TRADE WITH CANADA, FISCAL 1975: EXPORTS RISE, IMPORTS DECLINE

Total U.S. imports from Canada in fiscal 1975 were \$22.4 billion, while exports to Canada totaled \$20.7 billion. The \$1.7-billion deficit came from the nonagricultural sector, as an \$877.2-million surplus was registered in agricultural trade. This represented a 29-percent improvement over fiscal 1974's agricultural trade balance of \$677.5 million. U.S. agricultural exports to Canada amounted to \$1.35 billion in fiscal 1975, up 10 percent from 1974's value of \$1.22 billion.

Exports

Live cattle, beef and veal, pork, rice, corn, fruits, nuts, potatoes, vegetables, oilcake and meal, hides and skins, peanuts, soybeans, soybean oil, and cotton have traditionally dominated U.S. agricultural exports to Canada. These commodities represented 71 percent of the total value of U.S. exports to Canada in fiscal 1975, compared with 75 percent a year earlier.

Our exports of live cattle, beef, and veal to Canada dropped substantially in fiscal 1975. Cattle exports were down 66 percent in value, and beef and veal shipments by 39 percent. Canadian-imposed trade restrictions were largely responsible for these declines. During the first few months of the fiscal year, trade in cattle and beef was affected by the Canadian ban imposed in April 1974 on imports of animals and meat which had been fattened or produced with the aid of DES hormones. In August 1974, the U.S. and Canadian Governments reached an agreement whereby U.S. animals and meat certified to have been produced without the use of DES could be exported to Canada. At about the same time, however, the Canadian Government announced that a new beef stabilization program would be implemented August 12, 1974, effective for 1 year. The domestic success of this program required further restrictions on Canadian import of cattle and beef.

The new stabilization program controlled outside influences on the Canadian domestic price by imposing a global quota on imports of live cattle and fresh or frozen beef. This quota restricted U.S. shipments to 83,000 head of slaughter cattle and 18 million pounds of beef and veal, less than one-third of the year-earlier quantity. In response to these Canadian-imposed trade restrictions, the U.S. Government implemented measures to limit imports of Canadian cattle, beef, and pork (see section on imports below).

In August 1975, all restrictions on U.S./Canadian trade in cattle, hogs, and pork were removed. The United States, however, indicated that it could not remove its restrictions on beef and veal imports. Canada, therefore, is maintaining quotas on imports of these products until Canadian access to U.S. markets is restored. The new Canadian quotas, however, are more in keeping with previous import levels from the United States.

The United States remains by far the most important source of cattle imports for Canada. The U.S. share for beef and veal declined. Ranking third after Australia and New Zealand, the U.S. share of the Canadian market for beef was 12 percent, down from 22 percent the year before. Australia, our largest competitor for beef sales to Canada, increased its market share from 43 percent in fiscal 1974 to 51 percent in fiscal 1975. New Zealand, the second-largest source of beef imports to Canada, increased its share of the market from 35 to 37 percent.

Canada was a net importer of U.S. pork in fiscal 1975. Free from the import restrictions placed on beef and veal, U.S. exports of pork to Canada rose 174 percent over the fiscal 1974 value. This increase was due to a widened price spread for slaughter hogs between the U.S. and Canadian markets, combined with a lower level of domestic hog marketing in Canada, which required increased imports to meet consumer demand for pork.

Recent estimates indicate that Canadian hog production may continue to decline through the last months of the calendar year, resulting in relatively higher prices on the Canadian market. U.S. exports to Canada may increase, depending on U.S. response to prices in Canada and the Canadian consumer's response to higher pork prices in a market which should have larger supplies of beef.

Traditionally, horticultural products as a group have dominated U.S. agricultural exports to Canada, accounting for the largest value of all major commodity groups exported. Their share of total export value, however, has decreased in recent years, from 42 percent in fiscal 1972 to 30 percent in fiscal 1974. In 1975, the share rose slightly to 33 percent. In fiscal 1975, horticultural exports to Canada amounted to \$431.1 million, 17 percent over the 1974 value.

U.S. exports of rice to Canada rose from \$26.8 million in fiscal 1974 to \$27.5 million in fiscal 1975. Although the volume of rice exported to Canada decreased 24 percent, the U.S. share of the Canadian market increased from 89 to 98 percent. While Canada cut back on rice imports, it relied on the United States more than on residual suppliers. Mexico, the second-largest source of rice imports in fiscal 1974, maintaining a 10-percent market share, dropped out of the market in 1975.

U.S. corn exports to Canada increased about 4 percent in fiscal 1975 to nearly 40 million bushels. (This figure could be subject to change after Census Bureau adjustments are made for errors in recorded transshipments.) The favorable coarse grain harvest this fall in Canada, however, may dampen the possibilities of increased sales in fiscal 1976.

Imports

U.S. agricultural imports from Canada amounted to \$469 million in fiscal 1975, down 14 percent from the year-earlier value.

Live animals (cattle) and meat products generally have been the major commodities imported from Canada, accounting for 36 percent of total agricultural import value in fiscal 1973 and 29 percent in 1974. During fiscal 1975, however, the share dropped to 14 percent. Imports of meat and livestock were down in every category. Live cattle imports decreased 69 percent in value, swine imports were down 39 percent, imports of beef and veal were down 72 percent, and pork imports dropped 32 percent.

These declines were due to several factors. In November 1974, President Ford imposed quotas on the imports of Canadian cattle, hogs, beef, veal, and pork, made retroactive to August 1974 when the Canadian quotas on cattle and beef had been instituted. Although pork had not been included in the Canadian quotas, it was included in the U.S. restrictions to equalize the overall losses that the livestock sector in each country was likely to suffer as a result of each other's quotas. Restrictions on Canadian imports of cattle and beef alone, it was felt, would not affect the Canadian livestock sector to the same extent that the U.S. livestock sectors would be affected by the Canadian trade restrictions.

Higher prices on the Canadian market for livestock, combined with increased U.S. production to satisfy U.S. demand, was another factor responsible for the drop-off in imports of livestock and meat from Canada.

Other major agricultural imports from Canada in fiscal 1975 were barley, biscuits and wafers, fruits and vegetables (primarily apples and potatoes), and animal feeds. These commodity groups, combined with imports of livestock and meat, accounted for 45 percent of the total value of agricultural imports from Canada in fiscal 1975, compared with 49 percent last year, when imports of meat and cattle were larger.

U.S. imports of dried cream and milk from Canada decreased 99 percent in quantity and 98 percent in value from the 1974 levels. This decrease resulted from the reimposition of U.S. import quotas, which had temporarily been lifted in fiscal years 1973 and 1974. The lower 1975 levels represent a return to the import levels characteristic of the period prior to the 1973-74 suspension of quotas on these commodities.

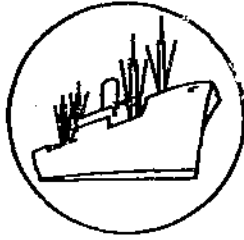

U.S.-PRC AGRICULTURAL TRADE IN FISCAL 1975

Fiscal 1975 brought a sharp reversal of the rapid expansion of U.S. agricultural exports to the People's Republic of China which had characterized fiscal 1972-74. U.S. agricultural exports to the People's Republic of China (PRC) amounted to \$334.6 million in fiscal 1975, 2/ down 62 percent from the fiscal 1974 level. Since nonagricultural exports to the PRC also fell in fiscal 1975, agriculture's share of total exports dropped only slightly, from 80 to 73 percent.

Our agricultural imports from the PRC were up 6 percent in fiscal 1975, rising from \$23.6 million in fiscal 1974 to \$25.0 million. Because of a more rapid expansion of nonagricultural imports, the share of agricultural imports in total imports from China fell from 29 percent in fiscal 1974 to 19 percent in fiscal 1975. 3/

In fiscal 1976, it appears that our imports of Chinese agricultural products will hold steady, while U.S. exports of agricultural products to China will decline drastically to about \$40 million.

U.S. wheat exports to the PRC declined by 53 percent from 3.190 million tons in fiscal 1974 to 1.496 million tons in fiscal 1975, largely because of PRC terminations of U.S. contracts, totaling about 1 million tons, in January and February 1975 (tables 21 and 22). China's total wheat imports during U.S. fiscal years 1974 and 1975 were 5.5 million and 5.7 million metric tons, respectively. Our share dropped from 58 to 26 percent, and China's share of total U.S. wheat exports dropped from 10 to 5.5 percent.

U.S. corn and soybean shipments to the PRC also declined sharply in fiscal 1975. Corn exports, totaling only 23,000 tons, were down 99 percent from the fiscal 1974 level of 1.806 million tons. Total PRC corn imports during July 1974-June 1975 were down sharply to 456,000 tons, 23 percent of the year-earlier level. The reduction in imports of U.S. corn was partially offset by a 63-percent increase in imports from Argentina.

For the past several years, the United States has been the sole supplier of soybeans to the PRC. With the termination of a U.S. contract for about 680,000 tons in September 1974, PRC soybean imports during U.S. fiscal 1975 virtually ceased. U.S. soybean exports to China were only 155,000 tons for the fiscal year, a 76-percent drop from the fiscal 1974 level of 659,000 tons.

The reduction of U.S. sales of wheat, corn, and soybeans in fiscal 1975 resulted from the interplay of a number of factors. First, 1974 was a very good year for China's agriculture, with grain production a record, exceeding that of 1973 by slightly less than 4 percent.^{4/} This was a considerably better performance than had occurred during 1971-73 and may have been partially unanticipated by the Chinese leadership, resulting in some overbuying on world grain markets in the first half of 1974. The termination of contracts and postponement of shipments which occurred in fiscal 1975 are, therefore, partially the result of the PRC having contracted for more grain than it needed. China has been operating under long-term grain agreements with Canada, Australia, and Argentina. The United States has served as a residual supplier and thus absorbed the brunt of the reduced purchases by the PRC.

Additionally, because of declining terms of trade and slackening foreign demand for Chinese exports, the PRC found itself under balance-of-payments pressure. The reduced purchase of foreign grains and soybeans are partially in response to these pressures. Finally, quality problems, including the presence of disease and impurities in some U.S. shipments, have also been cited by the Chinese as grounds for termination of orders from the United States.

Along with food grains and soybeans, cotton has been a major U.S. export to the PRC in recent years. In fiscal 1975, exports totaled 359,000 running bales, down 58 percent from the 846,000 running bales of fiscal 1974. Despite the decline, the U.S. share of China's total cotton imports in fiscal 1975 did not change appreciably, remaining at about 90 percent. The drop in the PRC's total cotton imports and those from the United States in fiscal 1975 was largely due to the recession in the developed countries and the reduced world demand for China's cotton textile exports.

With the exception of \$72,000 worth of hides and skins, there were no U.S. exports of agricultural products other than wheat, corn, soybeans, and cotton to the PRC in fiscal 1975. A year earlier, exports of other products, the most significant of which were tallow, soybean oil, and tobacco, totaled \$15.4 million (about 2 percent of total fiscal 1974 agricultural exports to the PRC).

Prospects for substantial exports of agricultural products to the PRC in fiscal 1976 are poor. The 1975 harvest in China will be at record levels and the Chinese trade deficit, a factor holding down imports last year, has increased substantially. Furthermore, Chinese cotton textile exports remain depressed. China's agricultural imports will therefore remain at levels considerably below those of the past few years. Most of our fiscal 1975 agricultural exports to the PRC occurred during the last 6 months of 1974. At present, there are no outstanding sales awaiting delivery. Barring unforeseen developments, U.S. farm product exports to the PRC are projected to be about \$40 million in fiscal 1976.

U.S. agricultural imports from the PRC in fiscal 1975 remained at relatively low levels and, as in past years, were spread throughout a wide range of commodity categories. As shown in table , the largest import categories in fiscal 1975 were feathers, down, bristles, and hair; essential oils; spices; raw silk; vegetable oils; and tea. Bristle imports in fiscal 1975 amounted to \$3.7 million, a drop from \$6.5 million in fiscal 1974. Imports of feathers and down in fiscal 1975 were slightly below the fiscal 1974 value. The major essential oils imported by the United States from the PRC were, in order of importance, other essential oils, cassia oil, citronella oil, and lemon grass oil. Spice imports consisted mainly of unground red pepper, cassia, and ginger root. Vegetable oil imports consisted mainly of tung oil and unspecified nut oils. U.S. agricultural imports from the PRC are not expected to increase substantially in fiscal 1976.

U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS ADJUSTED FOR TRANSSHIPMENTS, 1974

Bulk grain and oilseed transshipments through Canadian, Dutch, Belgian, and West German ports distort data on U.S. agricultural exports to many countries. Sizable differences between U.S. export figures and foreign countries' import figures are evident when comparisons are made for wheat, corn, soybeans, and other commodities. Also as a result of transshipments, U.S. exporters of bulk commodities, such as grains and oilseeds, may not know final destinations when the shipment departs. Canada and the Netherlands are the principal foreign transshipment points for U.S. agricultural products. Ports in these countries are fairly close to many of our major foreign markets, and can accommodate large vessels that lower shipping costs.

Since January 1, 1973, transshipments of U.S. grains from Great Lakes locations through Canadian St. Lawrence River ports have been designated as exports to "unidentified countries." Over 3.3 million tons of wheat, feed grain, and oilseed exports valued at \$551 million were so designated in 1974. Subsequent reports by Canadian grain inspectors indicate that these commodities went to 24 countries (table 24).

Since some U.S. feed grain shipments through lower St. Lawrence elevators move into Canadian consumption channels, additions have been made to U.S. corn exports to Canada since 1973. Our 1974 farm exports to Canada adjusted for such movements amount to \$1,327 million, which compares with an unadjusted figure of \$1,280 million. ^{1/}

Our initial data on exports to the Netherlands also include transshipments to other countries. Adjusted for differences between U.S. export and Dutch import tonnages, U.S. agricultural exports to the Netherlands in 1974 were \$1,292 million, or 20 percent less than the unadjusted figure of \$1,604 million. The distribution of transshipments by country reported in Netherlands' Transit Statistics showed West Germany, the United Kingdom, Belgium-Luxembourg, Switzerland, and France as principal destinations (table 25).

U.S. agricultural exports to Belgium-Luxembourg, adjusted for transshipments, were \$330 million in 1974, 27 percent above the unadjusted total. France was the largest recipient of U.S. farm commodity movements through Antwerp (table 26).

Adjusted U.S. agricultural exports to West Germany in 1974 were \$1,668 million, 5 percent above the unadjusted shipments. West Germany was therefore the second-largest foreign market for U.S. farm products, behind Japan. A significant volume of U.S. grain and oilseeds move through West Germany to East Germany, mostly via Hamburg and the Elbe River. Such movements were estimated at \$187 million in 1974, resulting in a total of \$214 million to East Germany (table 27). Comparative transshipments from West to East Germany since 1968 are shown in table

The adjustment of U.S. agricultural exports for transshipments takes into account U.S. export levels and recipient countries' reported import volumes where available. Value estimates are based on U.S. export unit values, which are generally defined as free-on-board (f.o.b.) or free-along-side (f.a.s.) vessel at the port of export.

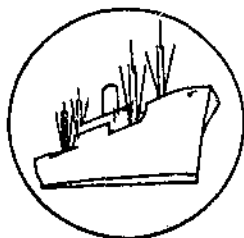

U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS, FISCAL 1975

U.S. agricultural exports totaled \$21.6 billion during fiscal 1975, up from \$21.3 billion in fiscal 1974: Export volume was down 15 percent. Wheat, feed grain, and tobacco exports rose in value despite volume declines. Soybean, cotton, and oilmeal exports were smaller in both value and volume. Rice and vegetable oil exports were up substantially. Fruit and vegetable exports showed value increases. Despite volume increases, export value fell for animal and animal product exports.

The \$21.6 billion in U.S. farm exports in fiscal 1975 was equivalent to 23 percent of calendar 1974 farm cash receipts of \$95 billion: Exports of crop products, at \$19.9 billion, were 38 percent of farm cash receipts for crops. During 1974, 96 million acres--3 out of every 10 harvested--were used for the production of crops for export. Well over half of the wheat, rice, and cattle hides produced in calendar 1974 were exported in fiscal 1975. In addition, exports included almost half of the U.S. soybean and mink pelt production, one-third of the cotton and tobacco output, 30 percent of grain sorghum production, and 24 percent of U.S. corn production.

Fiscal 1975 commercial exports remained at \$20.4 billion, and U.S. Government-program exports increased to \$1.2 billion from \$939 million in fiscal 1974.

Eleven countries received three-fifths of U.S. agricultural exports in fiscal 1975: Thirty-eight markets each imported over \$100 million worth of U.S. farm products in fiscal 1975. For 17 of these, imports were below the fiscal 1974 value. Shipments to Brazil, the People's Republic of China (PRC), Greece, Hong Kong, and Colombia had the sharpest drops in value. The greatest proportionate increases occurred in exports to Iran, India, Iraq, Turkey, Portugal, and Bangladesh.

Fiscal 1975 U.S. agricultural exports to the European Community were valued at \$5.3 billion: Higher prices offset reduced export volume. Corn, soybean, tobacco, and wheat shipments fell below fiscal 1974 volume levels. Corn exports totaled \$1.46 billion and 10.2 million tons, compared with \$1.12 billion and 10.3 million tons in fiscal 1974. Fiscal 1975 soybean exports, at 4.8 million tons and \$1.3 billion, were 28 percent below the year-earlier volume and 14 percent below the year-earlier value.

Fiscal 1975 U.S. agricultural exports to Japan were valued at \$3.2 billion: Value fell only 5 percent despite an 18-percent drop in volume. The U.S. share of the Japanese market for agricultural products fell from 37 to 35 percent (c.i.f. value basis). Corn exports fell sharply in volume. Wheat exports remained at the fiscal 1974 level. Soybean exports fell for the second straight year, dropping to 87 million bushels, the smallest volume since fiscal 1969. In fiscal 1975, Japan was the largest market for U.S. feed grains, soybeans, cotton, tobacco, and animal products.

Fiscal 1975 U.S. agricultural exports to OPEC were valued at \$1.7 billion, compared with \$1.0 billion in fiscal 1974: wheat and soybean product exports totaled 4.1 million tons valued at \$789 million. Other leading commodities were rice, valued at \$350 million, and vegetable oils, valued at \$206 million.

Leading OPEC customers for U.S. agricultural exports were Iran, Venezuela, Algeria, Iraq, and Saudi Arabia. The value of exports to these countries ranged from \$124 million for Iraq and Saudi Arabia to \$757 million for Iran. Iran was fiscal 1975's fastest-growing OPEC market for U.S. farm products; the value of shipments to Iran was up 314 percent. Exports were up substantially to most other OPEC countries, especially Libya, Kuwait, and Iraq.

A voluntary, prior approval system for exports of certain farm commodities was in effect for 5 months of fiscal 1975: On October 7, 1974, the USDA established a voluntary system for prior approval of exports of large quantities of U.S. wheat, feed grains, soybeans, and soybean meal. Exporters were to obtain prior approval for export sales exceeding 50,000 tons of any one commodity to any one country, for cumulative 1-week totals exceeding 100,000 tons, and for changes in destination that would cause these levels to be exceeded. On March 7, 1975, the prior approval system was terminated. Exporters must still report within 24 hours the sale of a commodity to one destination or a change in destination totaling 100,000 tons in 1 day or 200,000 tons in 1 week.

U.S. agricultural exports to the centrally planned economies were 36 percent below the fiscal 1974 value in fiscal 1975: Exports to Eastern Europe, at \$587 million, were down 15 percent. Corn exports doubled in volume, but soybean and wheat exports fell sharply. The USSR reduced its agricultural imports from the United States from \$509 million to \$396 million. Corn and wheat continued to comprise almost 90 percent of the total value of U.S. exports to the USSR, despite volume declines of 71 and 64 percent, respectively. During fiscal 1975, 1.2 million tons of corn and 978,000 tons of wheat were exported to the Soviet Union. U.S. exports to the People's Republic of China were valued at \$326 million in fiscal 1975, compared with \$848 million in fiscal 1974. Shipments of all commodities dropped dramatically through the year. Over half of fiscal 1975 exports to the PRC were shipped during July and August.

Exports by Commodities, Fiscal 1975

WHEAT AND WHEAT PRODUCTS Exports of wheat and wheat products totaled 1,049 million bushels (grain equivalent) valued at \$5.0 billion. This total included 164 million bushels exported to India and 113 million bushels exported to Japan. Wheat exports comprised 58 percent of 1974's record U.S. wheat crop.

FEED GRAINS Feed grain exports totaled 34.3 million tons valued at \$4.76 billion. Of this total, 7.2 million tons went to Japan and 10.9 million to the European Community (EC). Exports comprised 24 percent of 1974 corn production and 30 percent of grain sorghum production.

SOYBEANS Exports were valued at \$2.95 billion. The 405 million-ton export volume was the lowest since fiscal 1969. Soybean exports equaled 33 percent of U.S. soybean production, and an additional 15 percent of the 1974 output was exported in the form of oil or meal.

COTTON Exports totaled 4.0 million bales, down from 5.7 million bales in fiscal 1974. Exports declined to all major markets for U.S. cotton. Even so, cotton exports comprised 32 percent of U.S. production. Export value was \$1.0 billion.

RICE Exports totaled a record 5.1 million hundredweight valued at \$1.0 billion. Korea, Iran, and Bangladesh greatly expanded their imports of rice from very low 1974 levels. Shipments to these countries were 12.7, 13.2, and 5.7 million hundredweight, respectively. The United States exported 56 percent of its 1974 output.

TOBACCO Exports of 639 million pounds were valued at \$919 million and comprised 34 percent of 1974 production. Exports to the EC of 293 million pounds were 14 percent below the fiscal 1973 volume.

GILMEAL Exports totaled \$732 million and 4.7 million short tons, with 2.8 million going to the EC.

SOYBEAN AND COTTONSEED OIL Exports totaled 2.9 million pounds and \$704 million. Egypt and Iran were the major growth markets. Egypt imported 415 million pounds of cottonseed oil, and Iran took 312 million pounds of soybean oil.

FRUITS AND PREPARATIONS Exports were valued at \$648 million, including fresh fruits, \$382 million; dried, \$209 million; juices, \$87 million; and canned, \$75 million. The leading fruits exported (in fresh and processed form) were oranges, \$15 million; grapes and raisins, \$94 million; lemons and limes, \$72 million; and grapefruit, \$65 million. Exports included 34 percent of U.S. lemon and lime production, 29 percent of dried prune output, and 21 percent of raisin production.

VEGETABLES AND PREPARATIONS

The \$549 million in vegetable exports included \$194 million worth of pulses and \$145 million worth of fresh vegetables. Exports of tomatoes and tomato products were valued at \$56 million. Pinto bean exports totaled \$52 million, and navy pea bean exports, \$31 million. Exports comprised 108 percent of 1974 lentil production and 35 percent of U.S. production of other pulses.

TALLOW

Inedible tallow exports totaled 2.25 billion pounds and \$392 million. Tallow exports equaled 37 percent of U.S. production.

MEATS AND PREPARATIONS

Exports were valued at \$342 million. Beef exports totaled \$52 million and 37 million pounds; pork exports, \$115 million and 149 million pounds; and variety meats, \$110 million and 319 million pounds. Exports comprised 12 percent of U.S. variety meat production.

WHOLE CATTLE HIDES

A record 20.5 million whole cattle hides were exported in fiscal 1975, 56 percent of U.S. production of cattle hides. Exports were valued at \$255 million.

Import Fact Sheet

U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS, FISCAL YEAR 1975

Imports of farm products totaled \$9.58 billion in fiscal 1975: These purchases were slightly above the previous year's \$9.55-billion level. Volume dropped about 8 percent, however. The overall volume index fell to 111 from 121 (1967 = 100).

Per capita imports of agricultural products averaged \$45: The annual average of \$45 in imported farm products established in fiscal 1974 was maintained, as population and import value both rose less than 1 percent between July 1974 and 1975. Meanwhile, per capita imports of nonagricultural commodities advanced sharply to \$428, which compares with \$344 in fiscal 1974.

Farm products accounted for less than 10 percent of total U.S. imports: The long-term declining trend for agricultural commodities as a share of total imports continued in fiscal 1975. Only 9.5 percent of all imports consisted of farm products, down from 11.6 percent the previous year, 14 percent 5 years ago, and 20 percent 10 years earlier. Nonagricultural imports totaled \$91.5 billion in fiscal 1975, up from \$73 billion the previous year.

More than three-fourths of U.S. agricultural imports came from 24 countries: While more than 150 foreign political entities ship farm commodities to U.S. importers, 24 countries accounted for 76 percent of the total in fiscal 1975. Brazil remained the largest source by a wide margin. The Philippines moved ahead of previously second-ranked Mexico, and the Dominican Republic jumped to fifth position. Malaysia, Peru, Ecuador, and Taiwan improved their relative positions, while Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Denmark, Argentina, Spain, and West Germany slipped.

Competitive (supplementary) products accounted for a larger share of U.S. agricultural imports: The value of competitive agricultural imports moved up nearly 9 percent in fiscal year 1975 to \$6.82 billion, representing 71 percent of total U.S. farm product imports. This compares with a 66-percent share in fiscal 1974, and continues a long-term trend. Price increases for sugar and vegetable oils accounted for most of the competitive import value rise. The volume index for competitive items, meanwhile, declined 2 percent to 125 (1967 = 100).

Noncompetitive (complementary) commodities made up less than 29 percent of total agricultural imports: The value of noncompetitive farm product imports fell 16 percent to \$2.76 billion in fiscal 1975, contributing to the decline in the share of these tropical commodities. In fiscal 1974, noncompetitive agricultural items represented 34 percent of the total value. The volume index dropped to 91 from 109 (1967 = 100).

Import duties on agricultural products decline further: In calendar year 1974, U.S. agricultural imports totaled almost \$10.2 billion, of which 63 percent required payment of customs' duties. Most agricultural tariff rates are "specific"--that is, in cents per pound or per gallon. About 23 percent of U.S. tariff descriptions stipulate ad valorem rates, and a few have "compound" rates--that is, a specific plus an ad valorem rate. One measure of the overall customs' duties is an ad valorem equivalent approach. Customs' duties averaged 3.5 percent ad valorem during calendar year 1974 versus 4.2 percent a year earlier. For dutiable items the ad valorem equivalent rate averaged 5.5 percent, against 7.0 percent the previous year.

Some agricultural imports are subject to quantitative restrictions: Certain imported agricultural commodities are limited by quotas set forth under Section 22 of the Agricultural Adjustment Act. Wheat, wheat products, cotton, cotton products, peanuts, and some dairy products are regulated by annual import quotas under Section 22. Import quotas on wheat and wheat products were suspended for an indefinite time period in June 1974 by Presidential Proclamation. This suspension remains in effect.

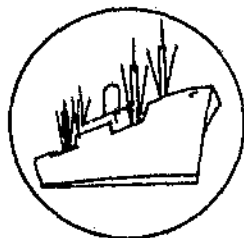
Dairy import quotas under Section 22 include cows' milk-type cheeses, butter, dried and canned milks, dried buttermilk, chocolate crumb, butteroil, frozen cream, condensed milk, canned evaporated milk, ice cream, animal feeds containing milk, and articles containing between 5.5 and 45 percent butterfat. Countervailing duties on dairy products from countries with export subsidy programs were contemplated, especially in the latter months of fiscal 1975, resulting in a reluctance by importers to order some types of European cheeses.

Provisions to restrict certain meat imports are set forth in Public Law 88-482. If imports of these meats (fresh, chilled, or frozen beef, veal, mutton, and goat meat) exceed 1,181.7 million pounds in calendar year 1975, the Meat Import Act requires the imposition of quotas. Voluntary export restraint agreements under Section 204 of the Agricultural Adjustment Act of 1956 between the United States and 12 countries were negotiated to prevent imports from exceeding the quota level.

During most of fiscal 1975, the United States restricted imports of Canadian cattle, beef and veal, hogs, and pork in response to Canadian restrictions on imports of U.S. cattle and beef. The U.S. quota on Canadian livestock products extended from August 12, 1974, until August 7, 1975, limiting annual imports to 17,000 head of beef cattle, 17 million pounds of beef and veal, 50,000 swine, and 36 million pounds of pork. On August 7, 1975, these quotas were removed, except for the 17 million pounds of beef and veal.

Import Highlights

FIRST QUARTER IMPORTS DOWN 4 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR

During the first quarter of fiscal 1976, U.S. farm product imports totaled \$2.4 billion, 4 percent below similar months a year earlier. However, noncompetitive imports amounted to \$816 million in July-September, compared with \$713 million a year earlier. Rapid price increases for coffee, because of freeze damage in Brazil, accounted for most of the increase. Import unit values for green coffee in September averaged 63 cents per pound, compared with 57 cents in August 1975 and 61 cents in September 1974. Green coffee import volume also increased sharply as a result of low stock levels. Over 335 million pounds entered in September against 108 million pounds a year earlier. Imports of bananas and cocoa were also well above year-earlier levels, while most other noncompetitive commodities declined.

Competitive agricultural imports totaled only \$1.58 billion in July-September, nearly 12 percent below the preceding year's level. Reductions occurred for animals and animal products (primarily dairy products, cattle, and swine), vegetable oils, oilbearing materials, and sugar. Sugar imports fell 20 percent in volume to 1.3 million short tons, while lower prices reduced value by 26 percent to \$521 million. However, the September 1975 tonnage, at 605,000, was the highest since June 1972, when imports reached 629,000 short tons. Lower sugar imports from the Philippines, Mexico, Brazil, and Peru in July-September were partly offset by larger volumes from the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Australia, and African countries.

Fresh, chilled, or frozen boneless beef imports in July-September amounted to 324 million pounds, 32 percent above the same quarter last year. Value rose 9 percent to \$159 million. Boneless beef from Australia totaled 202.7 million pounds, up 92 percent from the 105.6 million pounds imported in July-September 1974. Australia's share of U.S. frozen boneless beef imports in July-September was 62.5 percent by volume, compared with 43 percent the same quarter last year. 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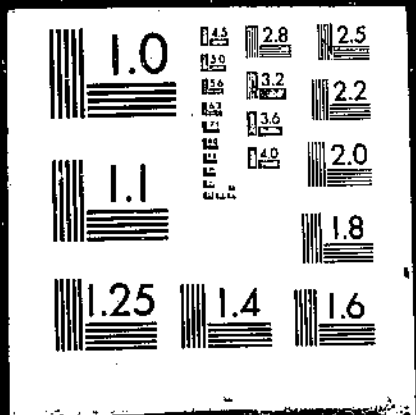

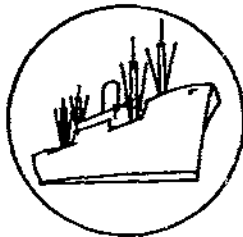

SELECTED PRICES OF INTERNATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

During September, the Dow Jones commodity spot price index declined slightly to 315, largely reflecting the uncertainty in the international grain trading arena.

While the Gulf Ports price for Hard Winter wheat and the Duluth price for Dark Northern Spring wheat moderated in September, the Rotterdam price for these two market classes of wheat continued to climb. Consequently, the Gulf Ports-Rotterdam and Duluth-Rotterdam price differentials widened to \$14 and \$21 a ton, respectively.

World market prices for corn declined, despite the bullish September crop report of 5.69 billion bushels (which was lower than the August estimate, but above predictions by the trade) and sales of U.S. corn to Brazil and Mexico. The export price for U.S. corn dropped 10 percent, reaching \$123 a ton. Because of a smaller price decline in the Rotterdam market, the Rotterdam-Gulf Ports price spread increased to \$16 a ton. Nevertheless, the price differential between U.S. and Argentine corn remained wide at \$20 a ton in Rotterdam. U.S. sorghum was priced \$7 a ton less than U.S. corn--a narrower differential than during August.

In late September, heavy sales of Brazilian soybeans were made to a number of international grain trading houses--at a premium over U.S. beans. In Rotterdam, Brazilian soybeans were priced at \$235 a ton, while U.S. beans were priced at \$227 a ton. Reports indicated that these international companies, anxious to do business with the USSR, were buying Brazilian beans to satisfy Soviet needs until the U.S. moratorium on sales of grain and feedstuffs was lifted.

During September, the U.S. Gulf Ports price for soybeans fell 10 percent to \$209 a ton, largely because of the moratorium. In Rotterdam, U.S. soybean meal remained steady at \$174 a ton.

Despite record rice crop prospects for 1975, the Thai price for rice strengthened in September for the second consecutive month.

Cotton prices continued to climb, reaching 65 cents a pound in September.

Among import commodities, the imported cow meat price made a turnabout, climbing to 64 cents a pound, its highest price in over a year. The price increase occurred when domestic U.S. prices of beef rebounded.

In the New York spot market, Brazilian coffee remained steady at its new high price of 93.5 cents a pound.

International sugar prices plunged, with world prices at the Caribbean ports falling nearly 20 percent. The late September news that Japan and Australia had agreed to postpone the shipment to Japan of 90,000 tons of raw sugar until next year followed suit with other generally weakening influences on prices.

In the United States, the Louisiana and Florida crops are almost upon us, and Central America is reaching its harvest time. Moreover, demand for sugar has been slow, particularly since last month's rumored Russian sales by the Philippines have so far not proven to be true.

In September, spot market prices for cocoa beans from Accra were not quoted due to port congestion in Lagos, Nigeria, and resulting tightness in West African supplies even though Ghana is in the midst of harvest. Moreover, the cocoa beans from Brazil, the other major source, will not appear until late in the season, since harvest occurs later.

The New York spot price for rubber remained steady at 30 cents a pound.

Export and Import Unit Values

In August, export unit values of agricultural commodities remained at an index of 209 (1967 = 100) for the third month, which is 4 percent lower than in August 1974.

The export unit value of wheat, at \$4.12 a bushel, has not yet taken an upturn as one would expect from the recent price quotations for new crop wheat. Corn, at \$2.65, had a higher unit value than in preceding months. Soybeans, at \$6.00 a bushel, were at the same export unit value as they were in June.

Among import commodities, coffee was imported at a unit value of 57 cents a pound, an upturn from recent months.

Cocoa beans, at 54 cents a pound, have continued to decline. Sugar, at 19 cents a pound, was imported at about the same import unit value as in August a year ago. The August index of import unit values for agricultural commodities, at 200 (1967 = 100), was also lower than in recent months and than in August 1974.

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at the time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
