
Agricultural Exports Reach New Record During Fiscal 1976 (see p. 4). Larger volume more than offset lower prices for major farm commodities and produced a record export value during fiscal 1976. The \$22.1 billion in agricultural exports exceeded fiscal year 1975's by 3 percent. Overall volume also set a new record of 108 million tons.

Fiscal 1976 Imports Total \$10.1 Billion (see p. 42). June imports of agricultural commodities set a monthly record exceeding \$1 billion and raised the fiscal year total to \$10.1 billion. Arrivals of noncompetitive items accounted for the increase. Competitive farm product imports declined in value, mainly because of lower prices for sugar and vegetable oils.

Selected Prices of International Significance (see p. 65). During June, prices of many agricultural commodities made wide swings. Soybean and soybean meal prices continued to surge upward, cotton and cocoa bean prices made large gains, while imported cow meat and sugar prices dropped sharply. Other commodities fluctuated slightly.



Export Highlights

AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS REACH NEW RECORD DURING FISCAL 1976

U.S. farm product exports in fiscal 1976 totaled \$22.1 billion, a 3-percent increase over fiscal 1975's \$21.6 billion. Despite lower prices for some important items, volume growth was sufficient to set a new record. Export tonnage for principal agricultural items surged 22 percent above the year-earlier level to 108 million.

Wheat exports neared 31 million tons, up 13 percent from fiscal year 1975's 27.2 million tons. Principal markets this year were India (4.1 million tons), the USSR (4 million), Japan (3.3 million), Brazil (2.6 million), Korea (1.5 million), and Egypt (nearly 1 million). In fiscal 1975, the major destination were India (4.3 million tons), Japan (3.1 million), Iran and Korea (1.7 million tons each), the Peoples' Republic of China (1.5 million), and the USSR (less than 1 million tons). Brisk foreign demand for U.S. wheat stemmed primarily from lower yields during the 1975 harvest. Excessive rains in Brazil and drought in the USSR reduced crops sharply, leading to increased imports. The average export unit value for wheat fell to about \$157 per ton in fiscal 1976 from over \$176 in fiscal 1975.

Feed grain export volume expanded sharply in fiscal 1976 to nearly 46.4 million tons, 35 percent higher than last year's level and 6 percent above the previous peak of 43.7 million tons recorded in fiscal 1974. Demand for feed grains--corn, grain sorghums, barley, and oats--was particularly large in Eastern Europe and the USSR. Shipments to the USSR neared 9.3 million tons, compared with less than 1.2 million in fiscal 1975. Eastern European members of the Council for Mutual Economic Assistance took over 4 million tons (including an estimated 1.5 million tons shipped through West Germany to East Germany) against 1.9 million in fiscal 1975. Other growth areas for feed grains were Japan, the United Kingdom, Italy, Belgium, and Taiwan. Export unit values for feed grains fell to \$120 per ton from nearly \$139 a year earlier.

Soybean exports jumped 40 percent in fiscal 1976 to 15.4 million tons because of lower prices and increased protein feeding abroad. Exports to Japan, Taiwan, Spain, the European Community (EC), the USSR, and Romania all showed strong growth. Average unit values in fiscal 1976 fell to \$200 per ton from \$268 a year earlier.

Overall animal product exports moved up to \$2 billion from \$1.7 billion in fiscal 1975, mainly on the strength of meat, poultry, and hides. Fresh beef and veal volume gained 82 percent to 65.8 million pounds, while higher prices raised value 90 percent to \$98 million. The largest increase occurred in shipments to Japan, with the volume of shipments more than quadrupling. Pork exports, at 260 million pounds, more than doubled their year-earlier rate with Japan taking most of the increase.

Chilled or frozen chicken exports increased 60 percent to 278 million pounds, going primarily to Japan, Hong Kong, Canada, and the OPEC countries. Shipments to Iraq gained significantly because of a recent 35,000-ton sale to that country. Turkey meat exports jumped sharply to 63 million pounds, with most going to Germany, the United Kingdom, Italy, and Canada.

Fruit exports rose 13 percent in value to \$730 million. Fresh citrus shipments edged up 2 percent to 916,000 tons, but higher prices boosted values by 9 percent to \$254 million. Japan, Canada, Hong Kong, and Western Europe took most of the additional citrus. Dried fruit shipments increased 54 percent to 139,000 tons, mainly reflecting gains for prunes and raisins to EC members and Japan.

Vegetable exports, totaling \$557 million, were only 1 percent above their year-earlier level. Increases for fresh vegetables--primarily potatoes, onions, lettuce, and celery--more than offset sharp declines in dried beans and peas. Fresh potato shipments more than doubled to 423,000 tons (\$55 million), with large movements to Western Europe, where the potato crop was seriously damaged by excessive rain in 1975. Sweden took 48,000 tons and the EC members, 70,000 tons.

Reduced exports occurred in fiscal 1976 for live animals, dairy products, fats and oils, cotton, rice, and vegetable oils. Tobacco volume declined 6 percent to 600 million pounds, but higher prices resulted in a value increase.



Import Highlights

FISCAL 1976 IMPORTS TOTAL \$10.1 BILLION

U.S. imports of farm products in fiscal 1976 amounted to \$10.1 billion, more than 5 percent above the previous year's \$9.58 billion. Gains in noncompetitive commodities--mainly tropical products such as coffee, cocoa, rubber, and bananas--accounted for the increase. During June, agricultural imports set a new record in value terms by passing the \$1 billion mark. Heavy arrivals of feeder cattle, meat, cheese, sugar, tobacco, coffee, rubber, and bananas combined with escalating coffee prices to raise imports well above month-earlier and year-earlier rates.

Noncompetitive items surged 38 percent ahead of the fiscal 1975 level to \$3.8 billion. Green coffee imports jumped 30 percent in volume and 65 percent in value because of sharply higher prices. Coffee prices began to escalate last July after a freeze in Brazil, which will cut this season's production substantially. Brazil, the world's largest coffee producer, is expected to harvest about 23 million 132-pound bags in 1975/76, 16 percent less than the large 1974/75 crop. Colombia, El Salvador, Angola, and Indonesia are also expected to produce less in 1975/76.

Cocoa bean imports in fiscal 1976 were 46 percent above year-earlier levels at 586 million pounds. Brazil shipped 30 percent of U.S. cocoa bean imports in fiscal 1976 versus 21 percent a year earlier. Imports from Ghana, Nigeria, and the Ivory Coast increased, while the share of imports from the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, and Papua New Guinea declined.

Crude dry rubber imports gained 12 percent in fiscal 1976, rising to 682,000 tons valued at \$402 million. Indonesia, Malaysia, and Thailand shipped more to U.S. importers. Average unit values remained near year-earlier levels at almost 27 cents per pound.

Fresh banana imports rose 10 percent to 2 million tons, while higher prices pushed value up 28 percent to \$256 million. Import unit values averaged almost 6 cents per pound, up 16 percent from fiscal 1975. Costa Rica replaced Ecuador as the leading supplier, shipping 670,000 tons. Sharp increases in imports from Honduras--to 423,000 tons--made that country the second largest source. Ecuador, supplying 375,000 tons, dropped to third place.

Competitive farm product imports fell 8 percent to \$6.29 billion in fiscal 1976, reflecting a 20-percent drop in vegetable product value--due mainly to lower sugar and vegetable oil prices. Import value for most other supplementary items increased, including live animals, meat, hides, dairy products, wool, cotton, tree nuts, tobacco, wines, and malt beverages.

Beef and veal imports went up a fifth to 661,000 tons, primarily because of additional foreign supplies. Average import prices for fresh-frozen boneless beef nevertheless

rose 5 cents per pound to 55 cents. Entries from Australia, Canada, and Central America were higher. Feeder and slaughter cattle from Canada and Mexico were also substantially larger than year-earlier rates.

At 195 million pounds, U.S. cheese imports were 9 percent above the fiscal 1975 volume. Price increases resulted in a 20-percent value rise.

Fruit and vegetable imports, at \$668 million, advanced only 7 percent in value. Fruit imports, totaling \$256 million, reflected increases for pineapples, melons, apples, dates, and orange juice concentrate. Reductions in strawberries, oranges, and certain other prepared fruits almost offset the gains. Frosts in Mexican producing areas cut exports of strawberries by more than a third. Vegetable imports gained 10 percent to \$412 million, mainly because of increases for fresh winter vegetables.

Vegetable oil import volume gained 54 percent in fiscal 1976, increasing to 1.1 million tons. Coconut and palm oil accounted for most of this growth. Because of sharply reduced prices, however, import value fell 21 percent to \$459 million. Increased foreign production and lower prices attracted larger U.S. imports from the Philippines, Malaysia, Ivory Coast, and Nigeria.

Sugar imports, at 4.26 million short tons, fell 6 percent below fiscal 1975's depressed 4.5-million-ton level. Import unit values averaged \$335.00 per ton, or 41 percent lower than in fiscal 1975, when prices reached record highs. Increased arrivals from Australia, Peru, India, South Africa, Thailand, Colombia, and Guatemala were more than offset by sharply lower entries from the Philippines, the Dominican Republic, Brazil, and Mexico.

Malt beverage imports, including beer, ale, and stout, rose 27 percent in volume and 35 percent in value in fiscal 1976. Holland, Canada, Australia, and Britain accounted for most of the gain.



SELECTED PRICES OF INTERNATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

During June, commodity markets were extremely nervous as prices of many agricultural commodities made wide swings. Soybean and soybean meal prices continued to surge upward, cotton and cocoa bean prices made large gains, while imported cow meat and sugar prices dropped sharply. Rice prices declined slightly. Prices for wheat, corn, sorghum, soybean, soybean meal, cotton, coffee, cocoa beans, and rubber were all higher than they were a year earlier, while rice and sugar prices were lower.

The Dow Jones commodity spot price index jumped 18 points (5 percent) to 355 following the 17-point rise that occurred in May, reflecting the price hikes that occurred in the international commodity markets.

Soybean prices, which have been surging since early May, rose 16 percent at the Gulf ports to \$236 a ton in June. Price gains reflected a number of developments: China's early June purchase of 100,000 tons of Brazilian soybeans, the USSR's late June purchase of 1 million tons of U.S. soybeans, the tightening U.S. soybean situation, and rumors that Brazil had about finished its export sales. As with corn and wheat, speculation that Europe's drought would lead to increased U.S. feed exports also strengthened prices.

Soybean prices may be subjected to speculative forces since the length and strength of the price rise for soybeans was beginning to receive attention outside the trade. The spread between U.S. Gulf ports and Rotterdam prices widened in June to \$12 a ton (table 29), even though in late June there were days when the two prices were nearly the same (fig. 1). The Gulf ports-Rotterdam ocean freight rate was \$6.93 a ton in June. In May, the Gulf ports-Rotterdam price spread for U.S. soybeans barely covered the ocean freight rate. U.S. soybean meal was priced at \$224 a ton in the Rotterdam market in June, 19 percent higher than in May.

In June, the North European market price for cotton increased 10 percent to 83 cents a pound. As the 1975/76 cotton marketing year draws to a close in July, the cotton situation has tightened because of a 15-percent decline in 1975/76 world cotton output coupled with record world consumption. While the outlook is for a large 1976 U.S. cotton crop, supplies are expected to tighten because of the increased domestic and foreign demand for cotton in 1976/77.

Corn prices rose 3 percent at the Gulf to \$124 a ton and 3 percent to \$133 a ton in Rotterdam. The Gulf ports price for wheat also continued to strengthen in June. The Gulf ports price for wheat, at \$147 a ton, was 3 percent higher than a month earlier and 15 percent

higher than a year earlier. Rotterdam prices for U.S. Hard Winter wheat (HRW) and Dark Northern spring (DNS) wheat rose by about the same magnitude. The U.S. Gulf ports-Rotterdam price spread for U.S. HRW was slightly higher than a month earlier, having recovered from the sluggish levels that had prevailed earlier in the year.

International rice prices weakened slightly to \$241 a ton in Bangkok.

Among imported commodities, coffee, cocoa beans, and rubber continued to show strengthening prices, while imported cow meat and raw cane sugar prices slid.

The New York spot price for Brazilian coffee rose 4 percent to \$1.48 a pound. The Santos price rose 1 percent. In Brazil, unseasonably cool temperatures gave some jitters to the market. The Colombian Government increased taxes on coffee exports, which caused some rise in the Colombian coffee prices. The secondary coffee suppliers of Central America saw their product prices rise as coffee dealers switched to substitute grades as a result of the Colombian action.


The New York spot price for cocoa beans rose 11 percent to \$1.07 a pound, primarily because of shortages of spot market supplies.

Despite the lengthy strike against the major U.S. tire manufacturers--which would have expectedly caused a slackening in demand for rubber--New York spot prices for rubber rose 5 percent to 42.7 cents a pound in June. During the month, however, daily prices appeared to have plateaued.

Cane sugar prices dropped precipitously because of the sluggishness of the market. The New York spot price fell 10 percent to 14.4 cents a pound. The f.o.b. Caribbean ports price to both the U.S. and world markets fell 11 percent. In June, the Caribbean ports price for sugar destined for the U.S. market was lower than the price for sugar destined for the world market.

The price of imported cow meat declined 10 percent in June.

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at the time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are compiled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
