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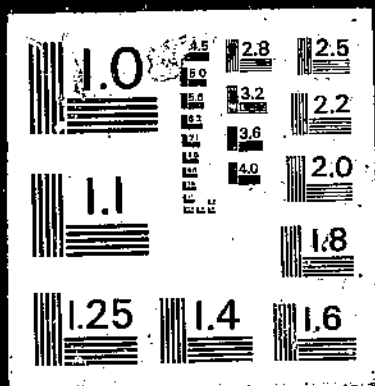

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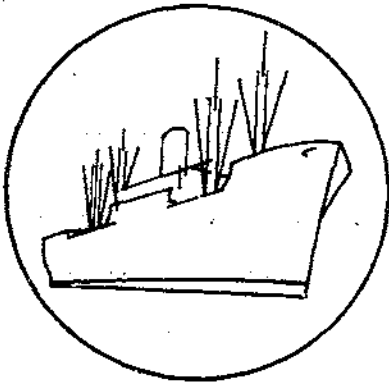

U.S. Agricultural Trade Prospects for Fiscal 1977 (see p. 5). Another record may be set for U.S. agricultural exports in fiscal year 1977 (October 1976-September 1977). If the present forecast of \$23 billion is realized, it will exceed the previous high of \$22.8 billion achieved in fiscal year 1976. Although export volume is expected to be down from that of the previous year, higher prices will likely more than offset the volume decline. The agricultural trade balance (exports minus imports) will total about \$10.8 billion in fiscal 1977, 12 percent below that of the prior 12-month period as a result of higher agricultural imports.

Patterns of World Agricultural Trade and U.S. Agricultural Exports (see p. 10). Rapid growth in demand for U.S. agricultural exports increased the U.S. share of world agricultural exports to 17 percent in 1973-75 from 13.2 percent in 1968-72. Between 1969-71 and 1975-76, the United States accounted for 82 percent of the increase in world grain exports, reflecting a growing dependency of the less developed and centrally planned countries on food imports from developed countries.

U.S. Agricultural Imports From the EC Total \$1.17 Billion in Fiscal 1976 (see p. 20). Imports of farm products from European Community members in 1976 recovered somewhat from fiscal 1975's decline, but did not reach 1974's record \$1.23 billion. Higher prices, floating exchange rates, and depressed consumer demand combined to hold import increases from those countries below overall rates. Purchases from EC members are predominantly commodities competitive with U.S. production.

* * * * *

Selected Prices of International Significance (see p. 30). U.S. export and import commodity prices took divergent directions in October. Wheat, corn, soybean, and soybean meal prices dipped, while rice and cotton prices strengthened. Coffee, cocoa beans and crude rubber made price gains, while cow meat and sugar experienced faltering prices. The quarterly U.S. agricultural export unit value index shows that third quarter U.S. export prices were 1 percent less than a year ago. The sharp rise in the import unit value of raw coffee--our largest import commodity--led the way in increasing the import unit value index 21 percent from a year ago.

October Farm Product Exports Up Sharply (see p. 35). Over \$2.2 billion in agricultural products were exported during October, raising cumulative shipments since January to \$18.8 billion. Strong foreign demand for animal feed materials reflected summer drought effects in Europe, increased feeding rates, and economic recovery in other areas.

* * * * *

Farm Product Imports Increase 15 Percent in January-October (see p. 74). Although agricultural imports fell off to about \$830 million in October, the 10-month total rose 15 percent in value over the year-earlier level. Higher prices for coffee and some other tropical products accounted for most of the gain.

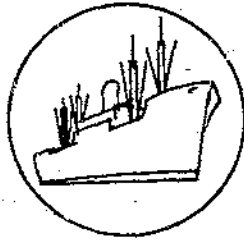

U.S. AGRICULTURAL TRADE PROSPECTS FOR FISCAL 1977

- U.S. agricultural exports are expected to total about \$23 billion during fiscal 1977 (October 1976-September 1977)--which compares with \$22.8 billion during the previous 12-month period and \$21.9 billion during 1974/75. Total export tonnage of 100 million may be 6 percent below the October 1975-September 1976 level, but higher prices for soybeans, oilseed products, and cotton will more than offset the volume decline.

Fiscal 1977 U.S. agricultural imports are expected to increase about 14 percent above October 1975-September 1976 imports of \$10.5 billion. Thus, the surplus of agricultural trade will total \$10.8 billion in fiscal 1977, about 12 percent below the \$12.3 billion recorded during the prior 12-month period.

Several factors are maintaining a high level of U.S. agricultural exports. European supplies of grains and other feeds are down sharply because of last summer's drought. At the same time, hog and poultry numbers are expanding in the European Community and Japan. Also, economic recovery is continuing, but the pace has slowed in both the developed and developing countries.

Export Commodity Highlights

Grain and Feed: The value of U.S. grain and feed exports for fiscal 1977 is now forecast at \$10.0 billion, compared with \$12.2 billion during October 1975-September 1976. Projected wheat and feed grain export estimates now stand at about 28 million and 47 million tons, respectively.

At present, the supply of U.S. wheat is plentiful in the face of a continuing tight world supply situation for feedstuffs. Export demand for wheat is somewhat soft at present, with offer prices for U.S. wheat generally higher than offers for wheat from other exporting countries.

The value of U.S. feed grain exports in fiscal 1977 is now put at \$5.2 billion. The forecast for miscellaneous feed and fodder exports stands at over \$400 million, reflecting anticipation of continued strong demand by Western Europe. ^{1/}

Fiscal 1977 U.S. rice exports are estimated at about 2 million tons. The estimated season-average export price is expected to remain low.

Oilseeds and Products: The fiscal 1977 value of U.S. exports of oilseeds and products is projected at \$6.1 billion, up about \$1.4 billion from the previous 12 months.

Animals and Animal Products: U.S. exports of animals and animal products are expected to continue their growth trend. Combined livestock, dairy, and poultry exports are expected to total \$2.2 billion in fiscal 1977, about the same as in the preceding year.

Fruits, Nuts, and Vegetables: During fiscal 1977, U.S. exports of fruit and vegetable products and nuts are expected to increase only slightly from the \$1.46 billion worth exported during October 1975-September 1976. Reduced production of dried fruit will likely more than offset increased exports of potatoes, fresh citrus, canned fruits, and tree nuts.

Cotton: U.S. cotton exports for fiscal 1977 are estimated at close to 1 million tons (4-1/2 million bales) valued at \$1.6 billion. This would be a very strong recovery from the 740,000 tons valued at \$910 million shipped in 1975/76. Fiscal 1977 cotton linter exports are projected at 50,000 tons valued at \$12.7 million. The demand for cotton textile products is still very good in most areas. However, sharply reduced cotton stocks combined with rising domestic consumption will limit cotton supplies available for export in many foreign countries.

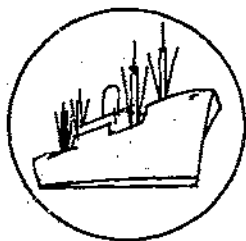
Tobacco: Fiscal 1977 U.S. tobacco exports are projected about 3 percent below October 1975-September 1976 exports of 273,000 tons.

Sugar and Tropical Products: Fiscal 1977 sugar and tropical products exports are expected to be up slightly from a year earlier. Lower sugar exports will likely be offset by the increased value of coffee exports.

Agricultural Imports

Fiscal 1977 U.S. agricultural imports are estimated at \$12 billion, about 14 percent above the \$10.5-billion total for October 1975-September 1976. Most of the increase will result from higher prices for coffee, cocoa, and rubber. Value gains are also forecast for imports of cattle, meat, fruits, vegetables, vegetable oils, and tobacco.

PATTERNS OF WORLD AGRICULTURAL TRADE AND U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS

The U.S. share of world agricultural trade took a significant jump in 1973-75 to more than 17.0 percent, increasing 4 percentage points above the 1968-72 level of 13.2 percent. Continued expansion in our agricultural exports since 1972 has held the U.S. share above 17 percent--a level not attained over the previous two decades (table 7).

During 1951-55, the U.S. share of world agricultural trade was only 12.3 percent. Thus, the increase in the U.S. share in 1973-75 represented a significant departure from previous patterns of trade. These recent trends and growth in U.S. agricultural exports have been highly influenced by the recent world food crisis, world-wide crop shortfalls, droughts, import policy changes in the USSR and China, and economic growth conditions in Western Europe and Japan--major markets for U.S. farm products. These events have not only affected the rate of growth and the level of imports of agricultural products in particular countries but also the patterns of trade between countries.

Between 1969-71 and 1973-76, the United States accounted for 82 percent of the increase in total world grain exports--90 percent of the increase in world wheat exports, and 78 percent of the increase in coarse grain exports. U.S. grain exports in 1975-76 represented 50 percent of world grain exports. Currently the U.S. share is about 44 percent for wheat and about 55 percent for coarse grains--up from 31 and 40 percent, respectively, in 1969-71 (table 8).

Changes in U.S. agricultural Exports

U.S. agricultural exports rose from \$6.8 to \$19.5 billion between 1969-71 and 1973-76. The commodities largely responsible for the increase were grains and soybeans, with wheat accounting for 25 percent, feed grains for 25 percent, and soybeans for 15 percent of the total gain. The developed countries accounted for the largest part of the growth in feed grains and soybeans, while the less developed and centrally planned countries accounted for most the gain in wheat exports.

Patterns of World Trade

Since the 1950's world trade in agricultural products has been strongly influenced by demand for food and feed products in the developed countries. In 1955, trade

between the developed countries accounted for 39 percent of world agricultural trade. By 1972-73, this share had risen to almost 50 percent. In addition to increased trade between the developed countries, their exports to the less developed and centrally planned countries also rose. Consequently, the share of world exports by the developed countries increased from 49 percent in 1955 to 62 percent in 1971-74.

These patterns of trade reflect a growing dependency of the less developed countries--and, most recently, the centrally planned countries--upon the developed countries for more of their food imports. In 1955 the less developed countries (LDC's) and centrally planned countries got only 48 and 18 percent, respectively, of their agricultural imports from the developed countries. By 1971-74, these percentages had increased to almost 60 percent for the LDC's and 35 percent for the centrally planned countries.

- The growing dependency of the less developed and centrally planned countries upon the food exports of the developed countries has been accompanied by a sharp decline in intratrade in these economic regions. Intraregional trade accounted for 65 percent of the centrally planned countries' agricultural imports in 1955, but for only 35 percent in 1971-74. For the LDC's, the intraregional share dropped from 48 to 32 percent. These trends in imports of all agricultural products have been strongly influenced by an even greater change in the trade flows of all grains since the mid-1950's.

Patterns of World Grain Imports

The central feature of world grain trade for the past two decades has been the decline in relative shares of world grain exports by the less developed and centrally planned countries, and the resulting growth of the grain export share from the developed countries. The LDC's share of world grain exports fell from 23 percent in 1956-60 to 14 percent in 1971-74 (table 10, col. 8). Their share of grain imports from the developed countries increased from 57 to 75 percent. Intraregional trade accounted for 37 percent of LDC grain imports in 1956-60, but for 20 percent by 1971-74 (table 10, col. 4).

Perhaps the most dramatic shift in patterns of grain imports has been in the centrally planned countries. In 1956-60, intraregional trade accounted for 77 percent of their grain imports. By 1971 the share had dropped to only 45 percent, with 49 percent of their grain imports coming from the developed countries. Major grain imports by the USSR in 1972-73 sharply changed these percentages--increasing the grain imports from the developed countries to 82 percent (25 percent for the 1971-74 period). Thus, the centrally planned countries have completely altered their source of grain imports from a high dependency upon intraregional trade to almost complete dependency upon developed countries for their grain imports.

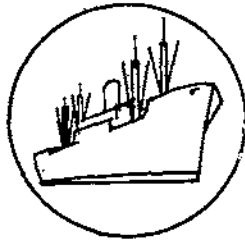

U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS FROM THE EC TOTAL \$1.17 BILLION IN FISCAL 1976

Between fiscal 1971 and 1976, U.S. agricultural imports from European Community members grew almost 62 percent in value to \$1.17 billion. By comparison, imports from all sources rose 73 percent to \$10.1 billion. The EC share declined slightly from over 12 percent during 1971-74 to less than 11 percent in 1975, then recovered somewhat to 11-1/2 percent in 1976.

Record imports in fiscal 1974 of \$1.23 billion were followed by a moderate reduction the succeeding year. Large fiscal 1974 purchases of dairy products from Europe under temporarily expanded quotas for cheese, butter, and butteroil were not repeated in fiscal 1975 or 1976. Floating exchange rates resulted in sharp price increases and reduced U.S. consumer demand for other items such as canned hams and wines.

Agricultural imports from EC countries are predominantly competitive commodities such as canned hams, dairy products, wines, and beer. Other important entries in recent years included candy and confectionery products (mostly from the United Kingdom and Italy), filler tobaccos (from Italy), and live horses (mainly from the United Kingdom, France, and Ireland).

Given the importance of canned hams, cheeses, and wines in EC farm production, major suppliers in fiscal 1971 were the Netherlands, Denmark, France, Italy, and West Germany, in that order. In addition to these commodities, Holland also exported significant amounts of beer and flower bulbs; Denmark was a leading source of mink furskins; and West Germany also shipped hops and various animal byproducts.

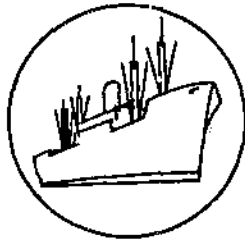

SELECTED PRICES OF INTERNATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

U.S. export and import commodity prices took divergent directions in October. Wheat, corn, soybeans, and soybean meal prices dropped, while rice and cotton prices strengthened. Coffee, cocoa beans, and crude rubber were the leading import commodities making price gains, while cow meat and sugar generally experienced faltering prices. The Dow Jones commodity spot price index reflecting these price movements gained 2 percent, reaching an index of 347.

Plentiful supplies of wheat and the current harvest of corn and soybeans have dampened grain and soybean prices. At Gulf ports, the U.S. export price of hard winter wheat (HRW) declined 7 percent. The Rotterdam import price of Canadian Western Red Spring Wheat (CWRS) also declined by the same magnitude, while the Duluth export price for Dark Northern Spring Wheat and the Thunder Bay export price for CWRS declined 13-14 percent.

U.S. export corn prices declined 7 percent in October. In Rotterdam, the price for imported U.S. corn declined 7 percent, while imported Argentine corn rose slightly. Plentiful supplies overrode the price strengthening influence of the recent Soviet purchase of U.S. corn and wheat. The recent soybean harvest temporarily weakened soybean prices slightly, bringing the U.S. export price to \$240 a ton. In Rotterdam, the import prices for U.S. soybeans and soybean meal declined 3 percent. The price of white Thai rice made a slight gain, reaching \$270 a ton. The 1976/77 cotton situation has been portrayed as one of relatively strong demand in the face of tightening supplies. Based on October 1 indications, the 1976 U.S. crop was estimated at slightly over 10 million bales, sharply above last year's abnormally small crop, but below earlier expectations. Sharply larger cotton exports are expected to draw down stocks to the lowest level since 1952. In October, the c.i.f. Osaka price for U.S. cotton rose 5 percent to 83 cents a pound.

Among imported commodities, cow meat was 65 cents a pound in October, 8 percent below the September level.

Coffee prices strengthened in October, continuing their expected upward price trend based on short crop supplies through this crop year. The New York spot price for coffee reached \$1.56 a pound, 67 percent higher than a year earlier. The Brazilian Government placed a 12-million-bag limit on its coffee exports, which compares with usual exports of about 17 million bags.

Cocoa bean prices continued their upward drive as the New York spot price for beans from Accra reached \$1.38 a pound. The continued speculation that the West African cocoa bean crop is smaller than anticipated and the strong U.S. demand for beans are interacting to strengthen prices.

The New York spot price for imported raw cane sugar rose slightly to 10.65 cents a pound, responding to modifications in the President's earlier announcement of increased tariffs on raw sugar. In the original announcement, sugar shipped before September 21 was exempt from the higher tariff. The modification will increase the tariff on sugar that was shipped before September 21, unless it enters U.S. warehouses "in a reasonable time." This temporary strengthening of prices in the New York spot market was not shared by the Caribbean markets since Caribbean prices for raw sugar destined for both the world market and the U.S. market slipped.

Crude rubber prices also continued to strengthen, gaining 4 percent to reach 42 cents a pound in New York.

Third Quarter Export and Import Unit Values

The July-September 1976 export unit values, reflecting the continued moderation of prices, were 3 percent higher than the April-June 1975 level and 1 percent less than the level of a year earlier.

Since the second quarter, export unit values of wheat, wheat flour, grain sorghum, rice, inedible tallow, and nonfat dried milk have declined. Those for soybeans, soybean oil, soybean meal, cotton, flue cured tobacco, and whole cattle hides have increased. Because corn and soybean prices had dropped off sharply and then rebounded from quarter-to-quarter, these commodities were priced lower in the third quarter of 1976 than during the third quarter of 1975. Wheat flour was priced higher than a year earlier.

The sharp rise in the import unit value of raw coffee--our largest import commodity--was responsible for most of the 11-percent increase in the index from the second to the third quarter. Agricultural import prices rose 21 percent from the third quarter of 1975 to the third quarter of 1976.

Since the second quarter, import unit values of rubber, cocoa beans, bananas, wine, cattle, tomatoes, tobacco and dutiable wool have risen, while sugar, beef and veal, and canned hams have moderated.

In contrast to the quarter-to-quarter changes, beef and veal, and canned hams were priced higher than a year ago, while wines and dutiable cattle were priced lower.

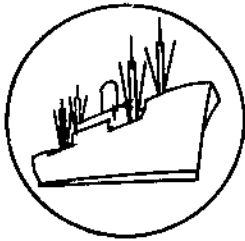

Export Highlights

OCTOBER FARM PRODUCT EXPORTS UP SHARPLY

Over \$2.2 billion in agricultural products were exported during October, bringing the cumulative total since January to \$18.8 billion. The 6-percent value increase over January-October 1975 represented large tonnage gains which more than offset lower grain prices.

Feed grain exports for the 10-month period totaled 41.7 million tons, 36 percent above the year-earlier level. Because of lower prices, value rose only 20 percent to \$4.95 billion. European Community (EC) members took about 12 million tons against some 9.3 million tons a year earlier. Feed grain shipments to Japan, Korea, the USSR, Poland, and East Germany also increased. October feed grain exports to some EC countries such as West Germany, Holland, France, and the United Kingdom were more than double October 1975 rates, reflecting severe summer drought effects on forage crops.

Soybean exports rose 26 percent above the January-October 1975 shipments to 12 million tons, while earlier decreases in unit values held the value gain to 10 percent. Late drought reduced U.S. crops, however, and export prices have recently gone back up from mid-summer levels. Economic recovery, increased use of soy protein in feed rations, and drought in Western Europe are contributing to the export increase.

In addition to larger export shipments to Western Europe, Eastern Europe, and the USSR--primarily because of drought--sales to Japan and Korea were also above 1975 levels.

Strong gains in the first 10 months of 1976 were also posted for meat, poultry, hides, fruits, vegetables, sunflower seeds, oilcake and meal, and other animal feeding items such as corn byproducts, alfalfa, and hay.

Import Highlights

FARM PRODUCT IMPORTS INCREASE 15 PERCENT IN JANUARY-OCTOBER

Imports of agricultural products in October are estimated to have totaled about \$830 million, a substantial reduction from the \$914 million recorded in September and the lowest level since February. This estimate is based on \$811 million for all commodities except coconut oil, which did not appear in the Census Bureau import data because of technical problems. Revised statistics will be published next month.

During the January through October period, farm product imports amounted to \$8.9 billion or 15 percent more than year-earlier imports. Most of the gain was concentrated in noncompetitive commodities such as coffee, cocoa, rubber, bananas, and carpet wools. The value of noncompetitive agricultural imports rose 45 percent to \$3.68 billion with higher prices accounting for much of the increase. Green coffee poundage dipped 6 percent to 2.2 billion pounds while value escalated by 53 percent to \$2 billion owing to frost damaged crops in Brazil.

Competitive commodities remained near this year-earlier value of \$5.2 billion as lower sugar and vegetable oil prices offset gains among most other items. Beef and veal volume rose 20 percent to over 1.3 billion pounds; value jumped 50 percent to \$809 million. Meat Import Act volume--applicable to fresh or frozen beef, veal, mutton, and goat meat--totalled 1.15 billion pounds in January-October against 1.02 billion a year earlier. Sugar entries totalled 3.82 million tons compared with 3.33 million a year earlier, but, because of lower prices value dropped 40 percent to just over \$1 billion.

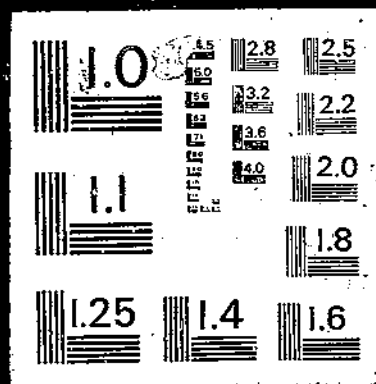

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at the time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
