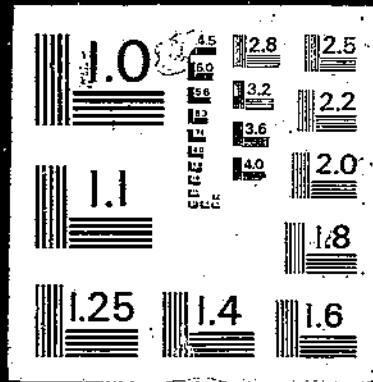

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at the time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

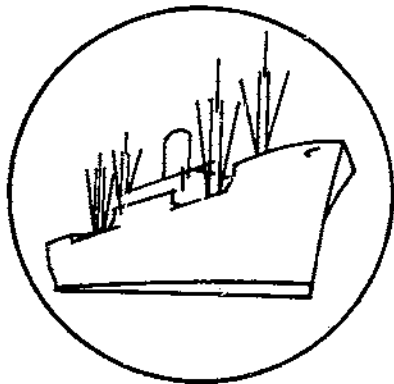

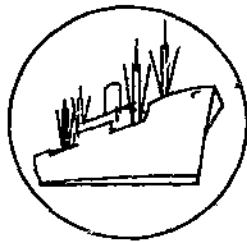
Increased Export Volume Offset by Lower Prices (see p. 7). A 17-percent increase in U.S. agricultural export tonnage over July-April 1974/75 was offset by lower commodity prices. Total farm product exports amounted to nearly \$18.5 billion against the record \$18.7 billion of a year earlier. Export prices for wheat, feed grains, soybeans, tallow, and vegetable oils were lower. Major markets for U.S. agricultural exports in July-April 1975/76 were Japan, the USSR, Holland, West Germany, and Canada.

U.S. Agricultural Imports From the European Community Decline in Calendar Year 1975 (see p. 40). U.S. farm imports from the EC declined by 8 percent in calendar 1975, reversing the upward trend of the last 3 years. Major declines occurred in imports of dairy products and beef.

First Quarter Export and Import Unit Values Continue to Moderate (see p. 50). The unit value index for principal U.S. agricultural export commodities in January-March 1976 fell to 201, 4 percent below its fourth-quarter 1975 level and 18 percent lower than a year earlier. Export unit values for wheat, soybeans and soybean oil declined. The first quarter index for agricultural imports remained at its previous quarter level, but 5 percent below January-March 1975.

Customs Duties on U.S. Agricultural Imports Decline in 1975 (see p. 56). Customs duties collected on imported farm products fell below \$315 million in 1975. A decline in the volume of dutiable farm products--principally sugar and cheese--caused this decline. Overall, *ad valorem* equivalent duty rates remained near their 1974 levels. Further reductions in import duties under the Generalized System of Preferences became effective in January 1976.

Farm Product Import Value Up 2 Percent in July-April (see p. 58). Over \$8.2 billion worth of agricultural commodities were imported during the first 10 months of fiscal 1976. A sharp increase in noncompetitive items--especially coffee--accounted for most of this gain. Competitive farm product imports declined, primarily because sugar arrivals fell and vegetable oil prices dropped.

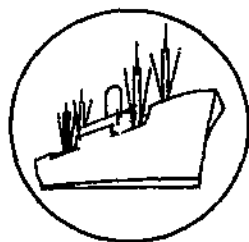

Export Highlights

INCREASED EXPORT VOLUME OFFSET BY LOWER PRICES

U.S. agricultural exports during the first 10 months of fiscal 1976 amounted to almost \$18.5 billion, compared with the \$18.7-billion record achieved a year earlier. Shipments in April, at \$1.9 billion, were significantly above the same month last year. Export volume of major commodities reached 90 million tons against 76.5 million tons in July-April 1974/75, but this 17-percent increase was offset by lower prices for several important export commodities.

The largest markets for U.S. farm products during July-April 1975/76 were Japan (\$2.7 billion), the USSR (\$1.6 billion), Holland and West Germany (\$1.4 billion each), and Canada (\$1.1 billion). European Community (EC) members together took about \$4.8 billion.

Wheat exports during July-April totaled nearly 27 million tons, a 16-percent increase over those last year. Value, at \$4.2 billion, was up only 2 percent, however, because of lower prices. Major destinations for U.S. wheat in the 10-month period included the USSR, India, Japan, and Brazil. Increases over last year's tonnages went mainly to Brazil, the USSR, Poland, East Germany, Indonesia, India, Italy, and a number of other importing countries.

Feed grain export tonnage rose 27 percent above July-April 1974/75 to 38 million tons, but a \$20-per-ton reduction in prices resulted in value increasing only 9 percent to \$4.6 billion. The USSR moved ahead of Japan as the principal destination, taking nearly 7.2 million tons of corn and oats valued at \$901 million. Over 1.1 million tons of corn moved to the USSR in April, compared with 986,000 tons in March and 120,000 tons in April 1975.

Soybean exports in July-April 1975/76 approached 12.8 million tons, a 28-percent gain over the year-earlier volume. Because of reduced prices, value dropped 6 percent to \$2.56 billion. The export unit value averaged \$200 per ton against over \$272 in the same period the previous year. Larger tonnages went to Western Europe, Japan, Taiwan, the USSR, and Romania.

Animal and animal product exports rose 14 percent in value to \$1.6 billion owing to larger shipments of meat (primarily beef and pork to Japan), poultry (frozen chicken and turkey meat, mostly to Canada, Western Europe, Japan, and Hong Kong). Dairy products, tallow, and lard shipments were down sharply. Dried bean export volume and value fell sharply from their 1974/75 levels. Vegetable oil shipments declined substantially.

Fresh potato exports in July-April 1975/76 almost doubled their year-earlier rate, totaling 599 million pounds; value nearly tripled to \$36 million. April potato shipments totaled 120 million pounds, down somewhat from the 156-million pound March record, but nevertheless well above historical monthly averages. Major markets included Canada, Sweden, Portugal, Belgium, Chile, Holland, and Norway.

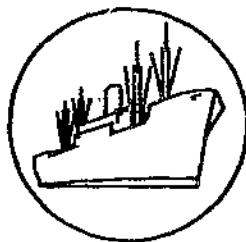

U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS FROM THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY DECLINE IN CALENDAR YEAR 1975

Farm product imports from the European Community (EC) decreased 8 percent in value during calendar year 1975, reversing the upward trend of the previous 3 years. Overall imports totaled just over \$1.06 billion, compared with \$1.16 billion in 1974. Imports were lower from all nine EC members except the Netherlands and Italy. The Netherlands has been the leading EC supplier of agricultural commodities to the United States.

Almost all agricultural imports from EC countries are products competitive or partially competitive with U.S. farm commodities. Among the leading imports, major declines occurred for cheeses and other dairy products. The possibility of imposing countervailing duty measures caused reluctance of U.S. importers to order certain cheese types from countries with export subsidy programs. Imports of beef from Ireland fell well below voluntary restraint agreement levels because Irish shipments went primarily to European countries, where prices were more favorable. Declines also occurred in U.S. imports of canned pork from Denmark, olive oil from Italy, prepared vegetables from Italy and the Netherlands, and soluble coffee from the United Kingdom, West Germany, and France. Wine from West Germany, France, and Italy, and beer from Holland and the United Kingdom were the major farm product import increases in 1975.

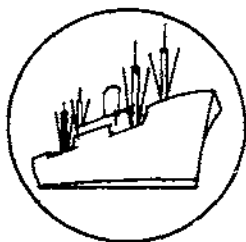

International Price Highlights

FIRST QUARTER EXPORT AND IMPORT UNIT VALUES CONTINUE TO MODERATE

During the first quarter of 1976, unit values of major U.S. agricultural export commodities moderated to an index level of 201 (1967=100), 4 percent lower than the previous quarter and 18 percent lower than the first quarter of 1975. The export unit value of wheat, at \$4.24 a bushel, was 4 percent less than during the previous quarter and 18 percent lower than a year earlier. The export unit value for corn, at \$3.14 a bushel, was slightly higher than during the previous quarter but was 16 percent lower than during January-March 1975. Soybeans were priced 30 percent lower than a year ago and 6 percent lower than during the October-December 1975 quarter. Whole cattle hides were the only major export commodity to make significant price gains from the first and fourth quarters of 1975.

The index of unit values for U.S. agricultural imports, in contrast, stayed at the same level as during the October-December 1975 quarter, and was only 5 percent less than its year-earlier level. While import unit values of sugar declined sharply, import unit values for coffee began their upward spiral. In the livestock complex, both fresh and frozen beef and canned hams had higher import unit values than they had during the first and fourth quarters of 1975.

Because of the faster decline in U.S. agricultural export prices relative to import prices, terms of trade between U.S. agricultural export and imports declined from the first and fourth quarters of 1975.

The export unit value of wheat gained on the export unit value for flour during January-March.

U.S. export unit values for corn and soybean meal had about the same relationship as they did a year earlier, but corn was a better buy relative to soybean meal than it had been in the previous quarter.

In the EC, where threshold prices apply to corn imports, corn was higher priced in relation to soybean meal than it was in the October-December 1975 quarter.

In the soybean complex, crushing margins narrowed from their fourth quarter 1975 level, encouraging U.S. exporters to export soybeans rather than export soybean

oil and meal. Soybean oil export unit values were 50 percent of a year earlier and 72 percent of the level of last quarter of 1975. Soybean meal export unit values declined only slightly.

April Price Developments

During April, the Dow Jones commodity spot price index rose 8 points in response to strengthening coffee, cocoa bean, sugar, and rubber prices, rather than in response to grain prices. Wheat prices slid, and corn and soybean prices remained steady compared to a month ago. Despite the bad weather that threatened a lowered 1976 wheat crop, bearish influences dominated the market, since supplies remaining from last year's record crop pointed to a large wheat carryover. Moreover, U.S. wheat exports had not developed to the level that had earlier been anticipated.

At the Gulf, the winter wheat price dropped 5 percent to \$147 a ton. Duluth prices for spring wheat also declined 5 percent. In Rotterdam, the import prices of these two market classes of wheat fell 5 and 10 percent, respectively.

Corn prices were influenced by opposing forces, and thus steadied at \$112 a ton at the Gulf. A pickup in livestock prices improved feed prices, but the USDA projection of a record corn harvest dampened prices.

In Rotterdam, the import price of U.S. corn also remained steady, but Argentine corn declined 2 percent and U.S. sorghum declined 6 percent. U.S. market prices were buoyed in the latter part of the month, when it was announced that the USSR had purchased 3.4 million tons of corn and wheat. (Australia and Canada also announced that they had sold nearly 1 million and 2 million tons of wheat, respectively, to the USSR.)

The Thai rice price, which had been declining steadily for 7 months, stabilized at \$246 a ton in April. Strong U.S. P.L. 480 sales were a contributing factor.

Soybean prices remained steady, largely because of the steadiness of soybean meal prices (soybean oil prices weakened slightly in April.) The Gulf port and Rotterdam prices of soybeans, at \$182 and \$190 a ton, respectively, were the same as they were in March. The Rotterdam soybean meal price, at \$163 a ton, was also nearly steady. In late April, the soybean market in Europe became more active, since potential demand for soybeans was building up. News of a possible decline in 1976 plantings of U.S. soybeans also strengthened soybean prices.

While U.S. cotton prices were steady in the international market, the April 15 USDA planting intentions report provided a bullish note, since it indicated that U.S. farmers intended to plant 11.3 million acres of cotton this year--below the level anticipated by most analysts.

In April, the North European price for U.S. cotton was 70 cents a pound. All of the major import commodities in this price series except sugar registered gains in April. Imported cow meat prices, at 82 cents a pound, were 41 percent higher than they were a year earlier.

Raw coffee prices continued their upward spiral, reaching \$1.24 a pound. The market conditions that have brought about the prolonged price climb since last July still prevail.

Like coffee, cocoa beans are also caught in a shortage of nearby supplies. Moreover, the U.S. cocoa bean crush during the first quarter of 1976 was larger than expected. In April, cocoa beans reached 88 cents a pound, their highest level since February 1975.

Sugar prices declined, mostly because of the low level of market activity. Moreover, the long-term agreement between the Philippine Government and two U.S. sugar refining

companies had a bearish effect on sugar prices. Apparently, the fact that one of the world's major outlets has been partially filled for a number of years overshadowed the fact that one large potential seller was removed from the market.

In April, the New York spot price for rubber was 38 cents a pound, a price increase for a fifth consecutive month. Rubber prices increased in all the major world markets because of active trading. Imports by nearly all of the major importing countries, including the United States and Japan, recovered from the low levels of recent years.

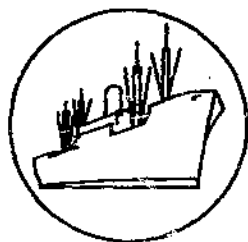

CUSTOMS DUTIES ON U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS DECLINE IN 1975

Customs duties collected on imported farm products in 1975 declined to less than \$315 million from just under \$352 million the previous year, reflecting primarily the decline in volume entering U.S. ports. Import value was also less than the record \$10.2 billion reported in 1974. Smaller volume resulted in lower "specific" duty receipts, which apply to about 460 import tariff classifications, while reductions in value affected ad valorem duties covering another 240 items. There are more than 1,000 farm product import tariff schedules, of which over 280 items enter duty-free.

The ad valorem equivalent duty rate in 1975 remained near last year's level at 3.4 percent for all agricultural items and 5.6 percent for dutiable commodities. Dutiable commodities accounted for 60 percent of total agricultural imports, a decline from 1974's 63 percent. A more pronounced drop occurred for imports of dutiable items than was the case for duty-free commodities. Imports of livestock, dairy products, sugar and molasses, and certain fruits and vegetables were down noticeably from 1974 levels.

Duty receipts on imported sugar dropped more than \$20 million between 1974 and 1975 as demand fell. A sharp decline in cheese imports accounted for a \$10-million drop in duties. In contrast, tropical products--which are mostly duty-free--indicated little change in volume. Lower prices accounted for a reduction in value.

Trends in agricultural duty rates since 1966 are shown in table 25. Ad valorem equivalent rates declined steadily from 1966 to 1974. The ratio of duties to total farm product imports fell to 3.5 percent from 5.7 percent, while rates for dutiable items dropped to 5.5 percent from 10.8 percent. Reciprocal tariff concessions negotiated under the Trade Expansion Act lowered duty rates on over 400 tariff classifications between 1968 and 1972. ^{1/} Further reductions on about 250 tariff classifications became effective in January 1976 under the Generalized System of Preferences authorized by the Trade Act of 1974. Specified beneficiaries--98 independent countries and 39 dependent territories--receive duty-free preferences within limits established by the Trade Act. ^{2/}

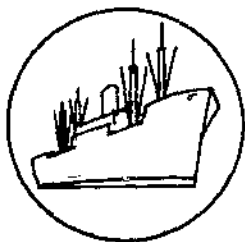

Import Highlights

FARM PRODUCT IMPORT VALUE UP 2 PERCENT IN JULY-APRIL

Agricultural imports during the first 10 months of fiscal 1976 totaled \$8.2 billion, up 2 percent from a year earlier. April's imports, at \$896 million, were down from March's \$960 million, but remained well above the April 1975 level.

A substantial increase in noncompetitive agricultural imports occurred during July-April, mainly because of larger coffee imports. Noncompetitive commodities advanced nearly one-third to over \$3 billion. Green coffee arrivals were 35 percent greater, while higher prices drove value up 59 percent to \$1.6 billion. Most other noncompetitive items also exceeded year-earlier levels.

The value of competitive farm product imports, in contrast, fell short of their 1974/75 level owing primarily to a sharp drop in sugar and vegetable oil prices. Raw and refined sugar import volume declined 9 percent to 3.5 million short tons, but value plunged 44 percent to \$1.2 billion. Despite the more than three-fifths rise in vegetable oil arrivals, consisting mostly of coconut and palm oils, value declined 20 percent to \$410 million.

Increases in competitive imports were recorded for feeder and slaughter cattle, cheese, hides and skins, beef, wool, cotton, certain fruits (dates, pineapples, melons, and orange juice), edible nuts, vegetables, wines, and beer.
