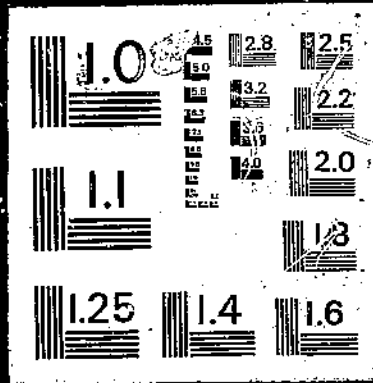

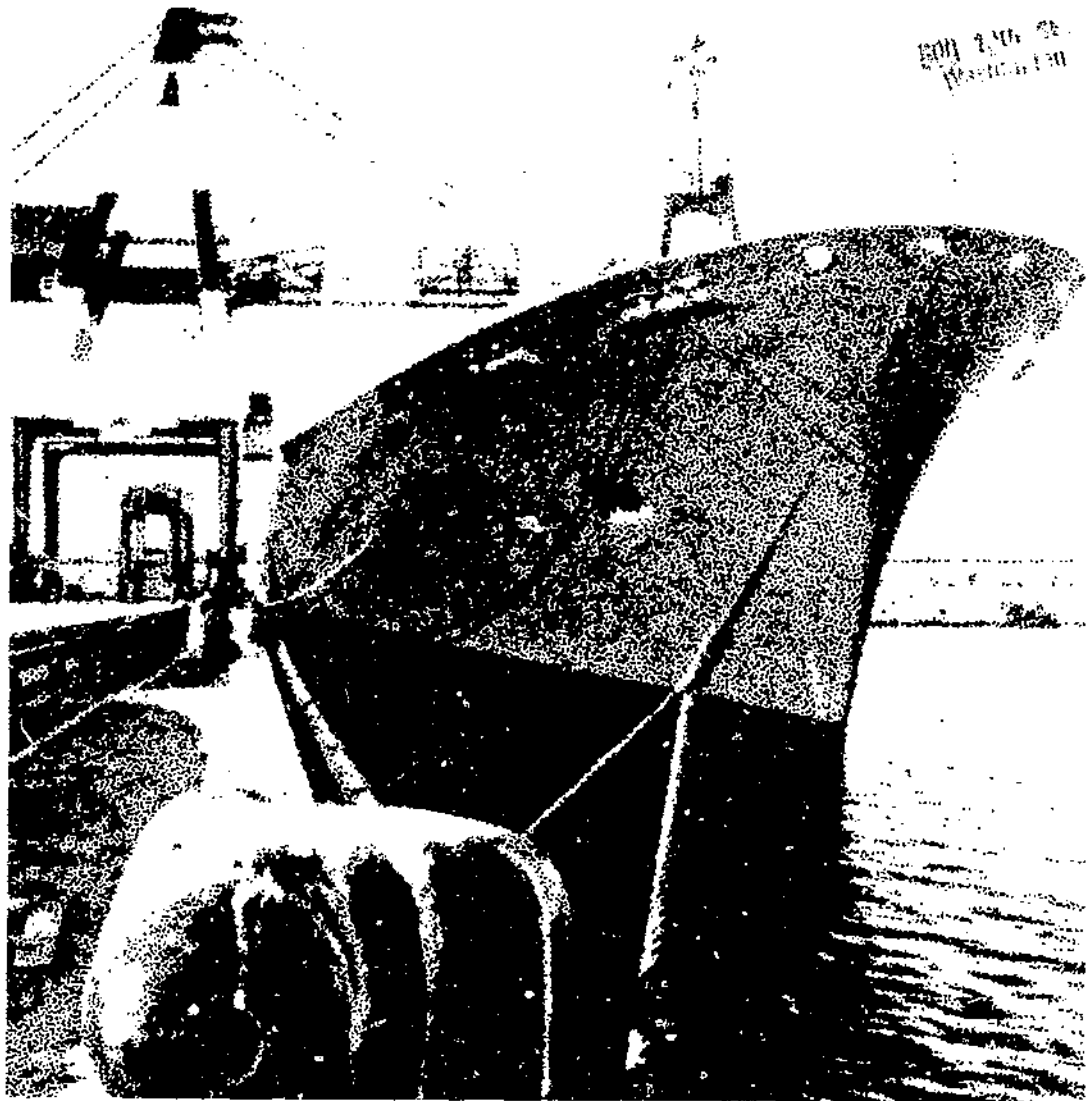

Bilateral and Multilateral Food Aid, 1964-75 (see p. 4). The value of all OECD bilateral net disbursements of food aid declined from \$1.5 billion in 1964 to \$851 million in 1973, but rose to \$1.6 billion in 1975. The quantity of all donors' food aid declined from an annual average of 17.5 million tons in 1961-65 to 8.7 million tons in 1975. The U.S. share of OECD food aid declined from over 90 percent during 1964-68 to 59 percent in 1975. Multilateral and regional food aid programs have increased since the mid-sixties and accounted for 33 percent of all food aid in 1974. While donors and recipients realize that the major effort for increasing food production must come from within the developing countries, additional food aid may be needed to help meet emergencies, support domestic growth activities, and relieve food deficits.

\* \* \* \*

Agricultural Exports In First 11 Months of 1976 Up 5 Percent (see p. 15). Farm product exports during January-November were valued at \$20.9 billion, compared with \$19.9 billion in the same months of 1975. Export volume was substantially larger, but lower prices for grains held value increases down. Advances for feed grains, oilseed products, meat, and poultry accounted for most of the gain. October-November exports totaled \$4.37 billion, slightly more than the year-earlier value.

\* \* \* \*

Farm Product Imports Continue to Increase in November (see p. 60). Imports of agricultural commodities continued to increase in November and during the 11 months of 1976 over the year-earlier period. Most of the gain was in non-competitive products, mainly green coffee.

\* \* \* \*

International Price Highlights (see p. 87). During November, most commodity prices continued along the same trends of preceding months. Wheat, corn, grain sorghum, and sugar prices fell, while coffee, cocoa bean, and crude rubber prices rose. Wheat prices, responding to abundant world supplies, took the largest plunge. At the U.S. Gulf ports, the November export price for U.S. No. 2 Hard Winter wheat declined for the fifth consecutive month to \$109 a ton, three-fourths the level of a year earlier.

### BILATERAL AND MULTILATERAL FOOD AID, 1964-75

Most of the world's food aid has been distributed through bilateral programs of the OECD (Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development) countries, chiefly the United States. The quantity of all donor countries' food aid declined from an annual average of 17.5 million tons during 1961-65 to 8.7 million tons in 1975 (table 1). The value of all OECD bilateral net disbursements of food aid also declined from \$1.5 billion in 1964 to \$851 million in 1973 (table 2). However, mainly because of inflation and increased supplies, the value of bilateral food aid rose to almost \$1.6 billion in 1975.

Multilateral and regional food aid programs have increased since the mid-sixties as donors have contributed more of their resources to multinational organizations (table 3). In 1974, multilateral and regional food aid disbursements accounted for about one-third of all food aid, compared with 2 percent in 1965.

#### National Food Aid Programs

Seventeen OECD countries provided food aid (table 4). Except for the United States and Japan, the other OECD donors distribute their food aid entirely as grants. The non-European donors--the United States, Canada, Japan, and Australia--have supplied most of their food aid bilaterally, while European donors have generally contributed the majority of their aid through the World Food Program (WFP) and/or the regional European Community (EC) organization.

In 1975, the United States and Canada each provided about 30 percent of their economic aid disbursements in agricultural commodities; Australia's food aid was 12 percent of its total economic aid; and food aid from the other major OECD donors accounted for less than 10 percent of all their economic aid. The food aid share in the total economic aid programs of the United States and Canada was higher in the mid-sixties than in 1975.

In 1974, slightly over one-half of all bilateral OECD commitments of food aid were allocated to countries with a GNP per capita of \$300 or less. <sup>2/</sup>

#### U.S. The Dominant Supplier--Aid Share Declines

Although the value of U.S. food aid declined during 1964-68, the U.S. share of all OECD disbursements of food aid (including their contributions to multinational

organizations) was maintained at over 90 percent. With the continued decline in U.S. food aid in 1969-74 and an increase in other OECD countries' food aid, the U.S. share dropped to 48 percent in 1974. However, in 1975, rising prices and increased supplies caused the value of U.S. food aid disbursements to jump two-thirds higher than in 1974 and to reach a level near that of the sixties. Other OECD donors' food aid only rose by 6 percent in 1975; thus, the U.S. share reached 59 percent.

Most U.S. food aid has been given under P.L. 480 programs, with smaller amounts under Mutual Security/AID programs. <sup>3/</sup> Since the late fifties, U.S. grants of food aid have ranged from 15 to 25 percent of total U.S. food aid. Most of the remainder has been sales for local currencies (mainly during 1955-68) and sales for long-term dollar and convertible local currency credits.

About 60 percent of U.S. agricultural commodity aid went to Asia during fiscal years 1955-76. Africa and Latin America each received about 9 percent, and the remainder for the most part went to Europe, generally during the first decade. In fiscal 1976, about 57 percent of all U.S. food aid was exported to countries with a 1974 GNP per capita of \$300 or less.

#### Other OECD Donors' Food Aid Increases

Food aid from OECD countries other than the United States rose from \$267 million in 1969 to \$844 million in 1975, partly because of a buildup of surplus stocks in several major donor countries.

Canada has generally been the second largest donor of food aid. Since the late sixties, grain surpluses have helped Canada increase its food aid in absolute and relative terms. In 1975, Canada's food aid reached a peak of \$264 million--13 percent of all OECD food aid disbursements--compared with less than \$100 million during 1964-68, or about 7 percent of all OECD food aid. Major recipients have been India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh, with increasing amounts for Africa. <sup>4/</sup>

Grain and dairy surpluses helped 7 EC countries increase their combined food aid from only \$9 million, or 1 percent of all OECD food aid, in 1968 to \$443 million, or 29 percent of the total, in 1974. In 1975, the food aid of EC countries fell by about 20 percent. France and Germany supplied most of this aid. Since the early 1970's, the EC countries have distributed most of their aid through multilateral and regional agencies, mainly the EC.

Rice surpluses helped Japan become a major food aid donor in the early seventies. In recent years, however, Japan has not used its surpluses for aid. It has provided aid by financing rice shipments from Thailand or other exporting countries to the recipients. The drastic decline in Japanese food aid in 1975 was primarily due to the country's recession. Japan has extended its aid as concessional loans, repayable in kind and/or currency. Indonesia and the Republic of Korea have been the main recipients.

Australia was the world's third largest food aid donor until 1969. In the last 2 years, its food aid was considerably higher than in other years. Most Australian aid has been provided to South Asia.

#### Commodity Composition

Grains, mainly wheat, have accounted for most OECD food aid. OECD grain aid (including contributions to multilateral agencies) dropped from an average of about 17 million tons annually during fiscal 1961-65 to 12 million tons annually during 1970-72 and to 5.5 million tons in 1974 (table 5). It then rose to 7.6 million tons in 1975 and an estimated 8.7 million tons in 1976. The United States, as the principal supplier, accounted for most of the decline.

During 1970-71, grain aid from OECD countries and the WFP (about 12 percent of the total) accounted for one-half of all grains imported by countries with a 1974 GNP per capita of \$200 or less. These countries contained about 60 percent of the developing countries' population. <sup>5/</sup> In 1972, OECD and WFP grain aid as a share of these countries' grain imports dropped to about 33 percent and to 16 percent in the next 2 years.

There have also been occasional non-OECD donors of grain aid, such as Argentina and OPEC countries. These non-OECD shipments ranged from 23,000 tons in 1968 to 876,000 tons in 1975.

The Food Aid Convention (created through the International Wheat Agreement of 1967) obligates various major producers to provide minimum annual amounts of aid in grains or their products, either bilaterally or as multilateral contributions. This convention was extended through June 30, 1978. <sup>6/</sup> The annual commitment for 9 donors is 4.2 million tons, the same as under the first convention, when there were 12 participants. In both conventions, the U.S. share was 45 percent, but the EC share rose from 25 to 30 percent.

Nongrain food aid of OECD countries has been primarily skim milk powder and soybean oil and small amounts of butter oil. This aid also has declined since the mid-sixties with the United States accounting for most of the decline. Initially, food aid in milk products came largely from the United States. But as EC dairy surpluses began accumulating in the late sixties, it became the major supplier. However, EC milk aid has never approached the previous high U.S. levels. The United States has provided most of the aid in vegetable oils, while the EC has supplied small amounts of aid in butter oil.

#### Regional Food Aid--European Community

The European Community began extending food aid in 1969; its disbursements--all grants--rose from \$20 million in 1969 to \$261 million in 1974, but then dropped some in 1975. In most years, grains accounted for over half of the food aid component. South Asia has been the principal destination, with Africa receiving increasing amounts. Nongrain aid, mostly dairy products and butter oil, has been provided largely to United Nations' agencies.

### Multilateral Food Aid--WFP

In 1975, about 13 percent of all disbursements of food aid were made by the WFP. WFP disbursements (all grants) rose from \$16 million in 1964 to \$263 million in 1975. The volume of WFP shipments rose to a record 900,000 tons in 1975, 50 percent higher than the annual average for 1972-74 and 17 percent above the previous record shipment of 840,000 tons in 1970. <sup>7/</sup>

The WFP target for the 1977-78 biennium was set at \$750 million, 25 percent above the previous pledging period, 1975-76. It is estimated that WFP shipments will reach between 1.1 and 1.3 million tons in 1978. As of October 1976, 75 percent of the target had been met through contributions.

While over 100 countries have pledged resources to the WFP, only a few developed countries have provided most of the contributions (table 6). Approximately three-fourths of the pledges have been in commodities; the remainder have represented cash and services. The United States has been the leading donor. Although U.S. pledges have increased substantially, the U.S. share of total contributions fell from about one-half in the first several pledging periods to around one-fourth in the last two periods. Canada, the second leading donor, increased its share of all pledges from 14 percent for 1966-68 to about 20 percent for 1977-78. The EC began contributing in 1969 and has generally been the third leading contributor.

Over 80 developing countries have also pledged resources. During the first 5 pledging periods, their contributions were generally less than 5 percent of the total. However, pledges by Saudi Arabia of \$50 million in each of the last two pledging periods raised the developing countries' share to about 10 percent.

The bulk of WFP shipments have been grains, mainly wheat and flour. Other principal commodities have been dairy products, about 10 percent of the total; and fats and oils, around 5 percent. The WFP provides about 12 percent of world aid in both grains and fats and oils and two-fifths of all aid in dairy products--mostly milk.

Most WFP disbursements have gone for social and development projects. <sup>8/</sup> All regions have received increased project aid since 1963. The North African and Near East region received the largest share--about two-fifths of the total.

The WFP has allocated about 10 percent of its resources for disaster and emergency relief. Most of the world's emergency relief has been provided through bilateral sources. To help the WFP improve its capacity to provide greater and speedier assistance in emergencies, the United Nations established an International Emergency Food Reserve. Donors earmark commodities and/or cash to be placed at the disposal of the WFP for emergency use. A minimum reserve target was set at 500,000 tons of grain, which should enable the WFP to play a more important role in meeting emergency situations. The highest WFP relief shipment in any year was 100,000 tons. As of September 1976, Norway, Sweden, and Germany had pledged 80,000 tons (mainly in grains) to the reserve.

### Future Needs for Food Aid

Despite a significant gain in food production in developing countries in 1975, their import needs have continued to expand as population growth has outpaced production. Various predictions indicate that the grain deficit in developing countries could

reach between 50 million and 100 million tons by 1985. <sup>9/</sup> Food production in developing countries rose by an annual average of 2.4 percent during 1971-75, compared with 4 percent annually during 1966-70 and 2.2 percent annually during 1961-65. <sup>10/</sup> Because of rapid population growth, per capita food production in developing countries increased little between 1961 and 1975. It will be difficult for many developing countries to obtain sufficient agricultural growth in a short time. Deficit countries with serious balance-of-payments difficulties will have limited ability to meet their import needs commercially.

The 1974 World Food Conference (WFC) set a target for world aid in grains of a minimum of 10 million tons annually beginning in 1975/76, and recommended that a larger share of grain aid be channeled through the WFP. <sup>11/</sup> The WFC target for grain aid represented about two-fifths of total annual wheat exports from donor OECD countries during 1973-75. Preliminary data show that world grain aid (mostly wheat) was 8.9 million tons in fiscal 1976.

The WFC also recommended that donors adopt the concept of "forward planning" or multi-year commitments of grain aid. This will provide greater continuity in the flow of aid to countries whose needs are fairly regular and will also give recipient governments greater flexibility in planning the most rational development of the agricultural sector. As of December 1976, Canada was the only major donor to formally make multi-year commitments for its bilateral food aid. It will provide 1 million tons of grain annually during fiscal years 1976-78--an amount which is at least one-third higher than its grain aid in any other year except 1967, when 1 million tons was supplied.

Donors and recipients recognize that the major effort for increasing food production must come from within the developing countries themselves. However, additional food and other agricultural aid from bilateral and multilateral sources may be needed for some time to meet emergencies, provide vital support to national production efforts, and to help cover food needs that cannot be met through internal production or commercial imports.

## EXPORT HIGHLIGHTS

---

### AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS IN FIRST 11 MONTHS OF 1976 UP 5 PERCENT

Exports of farm products in the first 11 months of 1976 amounted to \$20.9 billion, 5 percent above the year-earlier level. Increased volume for feed grains, soybeans, corn byproducts, protein meal, meat, and poultry more than offset lower grain prices.

Grain and feed exports in January-November amounted to \$10.5 billion, 3 percent less than the \$10.9 billion shipped a year earlier. Lower values for wheat, rice, and grain sorghum were somewhat offset by noticeable gains for corn, barley, alfalfa meal, hay, and corn byproducts.

Corn exports for January-November advanced 38 percent to 40.8 million tons. Value rose 22 percent to \$4.82 billion reflecting a 12 percent decline in average unit values to \$118 per ton. Corn replaced wheat as the major agricultural export commodity. Larger exports to the USSR, Japan, EC members, Eastern Europe, Korea, Greece, Taiwan, and Iran more than offset reduced shipments to Spain, Mexico, Peru, and several other countries. Drought conditions in Europe last summer resulted in sharply increased imports of U.S. corn. The USSR took more than 8-1/2 million tons versus 2-1/2 million in January-November 1975.

Oilseed and product exports grossed \$3.14 billion, up 11 percent from their year-earlier value. Although soybean prices were lower, a 24-percent volume increase more than compensated. Sunflowerseed exports more than doubled to 334,000 tons (\$95 million), mostly to West Germany, the Netherlands, and Portugal. Oilcake and meal shipments were up almost a third at 4.6 million tons. The European Community, Eastern Europe, Japan, and Canada were major importers.

U.S. soybean exports totaled 13.8 million tons, compared with 11.1 million a year earlier. Shipments to most destinations increased, including the EC, Japan, the USSR, Romania, Canada, and Mexico.

Livestock products, valued at \$1.8 billion, were 43 percent above their year-earlier level. Beef, variety meats, tallow, and hides accounted for the gain.

Poultry and egg exports rose 63 percent above January-November 1975 to \$226 million. Fresh or frozen chicken shipments more than doubled, reaching 272 million pounds valued at \$112 million. Iraq, Japan, Hong Kong, and Canada were the principal importers.

During the first 2 months of fiscal 1977, agricultural exports were 3 percent above October-November 1975. Gains in oilseed products, feeds and fodders, vegetables, meats, hides, and cotton more than compensated for reduced values for grains and tobacco.

# IMPORT HIGHLIGHTS

## FARM PRODUCT IMPORTS CONTINUE TO INCREASE IN NOVEMBER

Imports of agricultural commodities were valued at \$971.7 million in November 1976, 20-percent higher than in October, and except for June, the largest recorded for any month in 1976 or 1975. Almost the entire gain was in noncompetitive items, mainly green coffee. Noncompetitive commodities accounted for almost one-half of all agricultural imports in November, compared with 35 percent in November 1975.

Both the quantity and value of green coffee imports increased considerably in November. Volume was 99,000 tons, compared with 61,000 tons in October. With the world wide coffee shortage, import prices continued to rise--reaching \$2,982 per ton or 10 percent over October's \$2,712. The value of coffee imported in November at \$295 million was the highest of any month so far in 1976 or 1975 and well above the \$141 million in November 1975.

Imports of competitive agricultural commodities increased slightly in November over the previous month, but were somewhat lower than in November 1975. There were declines in the import value and volume of meat and products and cane sugar in November compared with October 1976, and substantial increases in value and volume of vegetable oils, chiefly coconut and palm oils.

The value of sugar imports at \$52 million was the lowest for any month in 1976 and in 1975. Higher duties imposed in September and the normal fall harvesting of the U.S. crop may have affected import trends. Import prices of sugar have fallen since June; November prices, averaging \$195 per metric tons, were about two-thirds lower than in January 1976.

Meat imports were the lowest since February 1976, but higher than all but 2 months of 1975. Almost all the November decline was in fresh or frozen beef and veal, partly because of increased U.S. production and the 1976 import quota imposed in late fall.

The value of vegetable oil imports in November was much higher than in any other month of 1976, but was close to the high level imported in November 1975. Traditionally, vegetable oil imports are high near the end of the year, as firms plan large imports before the cold weather. A low U.S. soybean crop may have contributed to increased imports.

Also, October data for coconut oil was included with the November data, causing the month's statistics to be overstated.

January-November agricultural imports totaled \$9.9 billion--15 percent above the year-earlier period. The entire gain was in noncompetitive imports, mainly green coffee, rubber, and cocoa. Tonnage of green coffee imports fell, but rising prices caused a large value increase.

Imports of competitive commodities (accounting for 58 percent of all agricultural imports for 11 months) were about the same during January-November as the earlier period, with lower sugar and vegetable oil values offset by value gains in meat and other commodities. Sugar and vegetable oil import volume actually increased as price declined. The average import price of sugar for January-November 1976 was about one-half the average year-earlier price.

## INTERNATIONAL PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

---

During November, most commodity prices continued along the same trends of preceding months. Wheat, corn, grain sorghum, and sugar prices fell, while coffee, cocoa bean, and crude rubber prices rose.

Wheat prices, responding to abundant world supplies, took the largest plunge. At the U.S. Gulf ports, the November export price for U.S. No. 2 Hard Winter wheat declined for the fifth consecutive month to \$109 a ton, three-fourths the level of a year earlier. Similar declines occurred in the Rotterdam market for U.S. and Canadian wheats. The price for Canadian Western Red Spring wheat at Thunder Bay fell the most--by 31 percent from the November 1975 level.

Since domestic and foreign prices have been declining more wheat is going under U.S. Government loans as a result of the Federal loan rate increase to \$2.25 a bushel from \$1.50. Currently, farm prices are very close to or below the \$2.25 a bushel loan rate. On the international scene, the Canadian Wheat Board made an agreement in early November to sell 1.4 million tons of wheat and 900,000 tons of barley to Japan during 1977. In late November, the USDA reported that the Soviets had bought 300,000 tons of wheat and cancelled an order for 400,000 tons of corn that was to have been shipped by next September.

Corn and sorghum prices also began to slip in November. At the Gulf ports, corn, at \$100 a ton, was 10 percent lower than it was a year earlier. In Rotterdam, Argentine corn and U.S. sorghum prices were 14 percent lower than a year earlier, while U.S. corn prices declined 10 percent.

After a temporary decline in October, soybean and soybean meal prices strengthened in November, reflecting the developing tight situation for soybeans during the 1976-77 marketing year.

Soybeans, at \$251 a ton at the Gulf ports, were nearly back up to their high level mark of July and were 38 percent higher than in November 1975. In Rotterdam, the import price for U.S. soybean meal, at \$218 a ton, was up 43 percent.

Even though the 1976 world rice crop is reportedly lower than a year ago, the Bangkok price for rice in November, at \$259 a ton, was 22 percent lower than in November 1975.

In November, the Osaka price for U.S. cotton remained steady at 83 cents a pound. Opposing economic forces are operating on cotton prices--the U.S. crop is smaller than anticipated, but domestic demand for raw cotton has weakened. Foreign purchases have been strong, but any weakening of foreign economic activity could cut into U.S. cotton exports.

Because of short crops, coffee and cocoa bean prices continued to soar in November reaching \$1.72 and \$1.54 a pound, respectively.

Crude rubber prices also strengthened, reaching 43 cents a pound at New York. According to the November 19, 1976, Wall Street Journal, this year's world production of natural rubber is about 3 million tons, about 150,000 tons short of the quantity demanded. Synthetic rubber production amounts to 6 million tons, 100,000 tons below the quantity demanded. The price outlook for rubber is strong since Americans, Japanese, and Europeans are buying automobiles again. Moreover, there is no longer a cost advantage in using synthetic rubber in comparison to natural rubber.

Raw cane sugar prices were 30 percent lower than in November 1975 because of abundant supplies. The November New York spot price for sugar was 10.46 cents a pound.

Imported cow meat, at 64 cents a pound, was priced slightly lower than it was a year earlier.

## Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

**EXPORTS** The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at the time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

**IMPORTS** Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.
