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

DIGEST

Saudi Arabia - An Expanding Market For U.S. Farm Products (see p. 4). U.S. agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia increased from \$32 million in 1972 to \$165 million in 1976 and should top \$200 million in 1977. Higher petroleum revenues generated an economic boom in Saudi Arabia causing demand for imported food to accelerate. Total agricultural imports by Saudi Arabia from all countries increased from \$370 million in 1973 to nearly \$1 billion in 1976 and might reach \$1.3 billion in 1977. Imports of meat, dairy products, animal feed and processed foods are growing faster than those of cereals which dominated food imports prior to 1974.

- U.S.-Canadian Agricultural Trade in 1976 (see p. 20). U.S. agricultural exports to Canada increased 14 percent to \$1.5 billion while agricultural imports from Canada increased 22 percent to \$600 million. Trade in livestock and livestock products was particularly active in calendar 1976. The largest increases in U.S. exports occurred in beef, veal, and pork. Exports of oilcake and meal were also up. U.S. agricultural imports from Canada consisted mainly of live animals and meats which accounted for 30 percent of total U.S. agricultural imports.

Agricultural Exports Gain 7-1/2 Percent In First 6 Months (see p. 25). A near-record \$2.3 billion in farm products was exported during March, raising the half-year cumulative value to \$12.7 billion. Soybeans, oilcake and meal, vegetable oil, cotton, animal feeds, hides, tallow, poultry meat, fruits, and vegetables registered gains from year-earlier levels.

Record U.S. Agricultural Imports In March 1977 (see p. 62). A record \$1.3 billion in agricultural products was imported in March, raising the October-March 1976/77 total to \$6.4 billion. High coffee prices caused much of the increase as green coffee imports accounted for three-fourths of the total gain. However, the volume of coffee imported declined slightly from the October-March year-earlier period.

International Price Highlights (see p. 93). In March, the Dow Jones commodity spot price index rose 9 percent as prices of soybeans and coffee gained sharply and grain prices moderated.

SAUDI ARABIA: AN EXPANDING MARKET FOR U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS

U.S. agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia reached \$165 million in 1976--up from \$110 million in 1975 and \$33 million in 1972. Saudi Arabia's total agricultural imports from all countries were valued at \$1 billion in 1976, double the 1974 value. Before other countries were attracted to selling farm products in Saudi Arabia, the U.S. share in some earlier years was higher. For example, the United States supplied 23.8 percent of Saudi agricultural imports valued at \$148 million in 1968 and 21.6 percent of the \$509 million for 1974 food imports.

Australia, the European Community, Latin America, Pakistan, Thailand, and India increased deliveries of agricultural commodities to Saudi Arabia in the past 2 years while imports from Lebanon, Iraq, Iran, and nearby African countries declined. Exporters from many countries were attracted to the buoyant Saudi market.

The quadrupling of petroleum prices in 1973 precipitated a boom in Saudi Arabia, the world's leading petroleum exporter. Total Saudi exports increased from \$7.7 billion in 1973 to \$31 billion in 1974, but retreated to \$28 billion in 1975. While some other members of OPEC cut back petroleum output and exports, Saudi Arabia allowed further expansion in petroleum extraction, and total exports reached \$35 billion in 1976. U.S. imports from Saudi Arabia rose from \$515 million in 1973 to \$5.2 billion in 1976--a tenfold increase. U.S. exports to Saudi Arabia were up from \$442 million in 1973 to \$2.7 billion in 1976--a sixfold increase. U.S. agricultural exports during this 3-year period rose from \$65.5 million to \$165 million--a gain of 152 percent. Yet, our agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia have been increasing far below the rate for manufactured products. The ratio of the value of U.S. petroleum imports from Saudi Arabia to the value of U.S. agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia rose from 7.9 in 1973 to 31.5 in 1976.

Growth in U.S. agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia during 1971-75 was primarily because of larger deliveries of cereals and products. Their share of U.S. agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia declined from 79 percent during 1971-75 to only 62 percent in 1976. Some of the big gains in 1976 came from expanding U.S. exports of frozen poultry, beef, animal feed, cooking oil, and various processed foods. U.S. agricultural exports are likely to become more diversified in 1977 as deliveries of meat and processed foods rise faster than deliveries of rice and wheat flour. Competition from other countries will be the major obstacle to large gains for U.S. agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia.

Total agricultural output in Saudi Arabia during 1976 was valued at almost \$1 billion because of higher prices for dates and fresh vegetables. Yields for fruits and vegetables in some irrigated areas are high by world standards. Most of the coarse grains, dates, and fresh vegetables consumed in Saudi Arabia are produced by local farmers, who also supply about half the meat and one-third of the wheat. Inputs are highly subsidized and marketing subsidies and bonus payments are provided by the Saudi Government.

Per capita income in Saudi Arabia now exceeds \$6,000, and continues to rise. Government programs to spur development have resulted in full employment of skilled and semiskilled workers. Saudi Arabia's 1977 population of 7.5 million is about 55 percent urban. Agriculture provided employment for half of Saudi's population in 1976, although it accounted for only 3 percent of the GNP.

Characteristics of food consumption for urban residents are quite different from those for rural families. In urban areas, consumption of meat, imported fruit, bread, milk, vegetables, fruit juices, and processed foods is reported at least one-third higher than in rural areas. Rice, coarse grains, and dates are more important in the rural diet than in the urban diet which includes imported flour, meat, and processed foods.

- Private importers in Jeddah import cereals, livestock, meat, and a wide variety of processed foods. Costs of unloading, storing, and distributing imported processed food for major firms in Jeddah are affected by high costs of equipment, warehouses, and labor. Retail prices for most processed foods are about triple the average price paid by importers, and prices for canned foods are usually higher in inland towns because of high distribution costs.

During 1976, Saudi Arabia spent only 3 percent of its \$35 billion in petroleum revenues for food imports. Wider distribution of income resulting from programs financed with petroleum revenues boost the demand for imported food in many ways.

Large construction projects and contracts for improvements in Saudi Arabia's infrastructure have opened many job opportunities for foreigners. About 1.5 million foreigners now live in Saudi Arabia, including about 1 million from neighboring Yemen.

Opportunities for and constraints on sales of U.S. farm products to Saudi Arabia vary depending on the commodity, the rate of growth in demand, local output, distribution facilities, and competition from foreign suppliers. The United States is Saudi Arabia's leading supplier of wheat flour, rice, vegetable oils, animal feed, and some processed foods.

Competition from European and Asian suppliers of processed food is keen. Since 1974, France, Denmark, and the Netherlands scored great gains in sales of frozen poultry; Australia and Brazil boosted their sales of various meat products. Italy, Spain, and Australia are shipping more canned fruits and vegetables.

Trends and Competition for Imported Commodities

Wheat and Wheat Flour

Imports of wheat and wheat flour are increasing despite rising wheat production. Demand has accelerated because of rising incomes, improved distribution, and immigration. In terms of wheat equivalent, imports of wheat and flour combined increased from 272,031 tons valued at \$64 million in 1974 to a record 640,875 tons in 1976, valued at almost \$109 million.

Australia has dominated wheat imports since 1974. Imports of Australian wheat increased from 33,526 tons in 1974 to about 80,000 tons in 1976. Imports of U.S. wheat declined from 32,347 tons in 1973 to about 5,000 tons in 1976. Canada became a more important wheat supplier in 1976, providing 12,000 of the total import volume of 115,000 tons.

The United States supplied about 60 percent of the 307,863 tons of wheat flour imported in 1975, and nearly 58 percent of the estimated 378,600 tons in 1976. West German shipments of wheat flour to Saudi Arabia in 1976 were more than double the 37,439 tons shipped in 1975. Dutch exports of wheat flour to Saudi Arabia in 1976

were about one-fourth below record deliveries of 66,000 tons recorded in 1975. Imports of flour from Jordan were smaller in 1976 than the 4,720 tons received in 1975.

Rice

Total rice imports increased from 137,350 tons in 1974 valued at \$85.7 million to more than 300,000 tons in 1976 for an estimated value of \$124 million. Imports of Thai rice increased from 76,000 tons in 1975 to about 125,000 tons in 1976. Thai rice was lower in price than U.S. supplies and sold well in rural areas.

U.S. rice exports to Saudi Arabia increased from 80,171 tons in 1975 to 116,700 tons in 1976; the value rose from \$37.1 million to \$49.0 million. U.S.-produced rice is popular in urban areas and along the Red Sea, and Basmati rice from Pakistan is popular in Eastern Province. Pakistan sent 47,540 tons of rice to Saudi Arabia in 1975 valued at \$37.0 million or \$778 per ton through a Government-to-Government arrangement. Government purchases of rice in bulk for sale at subsidized prices to private distributors helped buffer Saudi consumers from the impact of sharp hikes in world rice prices in 1973 and 1974. Government subsidies paid 10 percent of the import cost of rice in those 2 years for all purchases exceeding \$606 per ton, c.i.f., at Saudi ports. Subsidy payments dwindled in 1975 and 1976 as world rice prices declined.

A new mill constructed at Jeddah will polish imported U.S. brown rice. A byproduct of the polishing mill operations, rice bran will be used in animal feed in Saudi Arabia.

Livestock and Meat

Total meat imports soared from only 20,244 tons in 1974 to about 46,000 tons in 1976; the value rose from \$23 million to \$52 million, respectively. Imports of frozen poultry doubled during this 1974-76 period, while imports of beef scored a fivefold increase and imports of mutton and canned meat more than quadrupled.

Booming consumer demand for meat, stagnating domestic output, and declining imports of live animals from traditional nearby African sources caused meat imports to accelerate. Recent immigrants have bolstered the demand for imported meat. Many Saudis prefer meat from local abattoirs where they are confident that the method of slaughter is according to Islamic customs.

Imports of live sheep and goats declined from a peak of 1.46 million head in 1972 to less than 1 million in 1974 and remained below expectations during the two following years. Sheep and goat imports from Somalia fell from 1.3 million head in 1972 to less than 800,000 head in 1974 and further declines were evident in 1975 and 1976.

Imports of live cattle have remained steady in recent years at about 60,000 head annually, coming mainly from the Sudan and Somalia. More than 50,000 camels are imported annually from these same sources.

Imports of frozen poultry increased from 17,991 tons in 1974 to about 36,000 tons in 1976. Imports of French poultry increased from 354 tons in 1974 to about 15,600 tons in 1975 and remained near that level in 1976.

Imports of frozen poultry from a variety of other sources helped offset the drastic decline in Lebanese shipments from a peak of 8,863 tons in 1974 to less than half this volume in 1975. Imports of Danish poultry increased from 332 tons in 1974 to about 2,000 tons in 1976. U.S. shipments of poultry surpassed 1,100 tons in 1976--up from 201 tons in 1974.

Beef and mutton imports have remained small in contrast to poultry imports, although the rate of growth has been faster. Total beef imports increased from 941 tons in 1974 to about 4,800 tons valued at \$10 million in 1976. Deliveries of Australian beef reached 3,482 tons in 1976--up from 519 tons in 1974.

Choice cuts of beef are served in large hotels and restaurants catering to tourists or foreign workers. Hotels and restaurants contributed to a rise in U.S. beef exports to Saudi Arabia from 101 tons in 1975 to 642 tons valued at \$2.3 million in 1976. Denmark is also an important supplier of beef and veal for luxury restaurants.

Australia supplied most of the imports of mutton which exceeded 2,000 tons in 1975 and in 1976. Somalia was the leading supplier of mutton prior to 1974.

- Imports of canned meat increased from 789 tons in 1974 to almost 3,000 tons in 1976. Australian deliveries of canned meat rose from 105 tons to 681 tons during that period. Even larger imports were purchased in Latin America. U.S. exports of canned meat and luncheon meat to Saudi Arabia increased from 224 tons in 1975 to 337 tons in 1976 for a value of \$683,000.

Fruits and Preparations

Saudi farmers produce about 240,000 tons of dates and 100,000 tons of other fruits annually. Imports of fresh fruit increased from 95,249 tons in 1972 to about 136,000 tons in 1976. Imports of apples declined from 28,315 tons in 1972 to 23,305 tons in 1974 because of smaller imports from Lebanon, and remained below the previous peak during the last 2 years.

Imports of oranges increased from 41,122 tons in 1972 to about 60,000 tons in 1976. Larger imports of oranges from Jordan, Egypt, and North Africa more than offset smaller shipments from Lebanon. The United States sent 4,100 tons of oranges to Saudi Arabia in 1975 for a value of \$905,000.

Imports of grapes increased from 2,753 tons in 1973 to about 8,000 tons in 1975 because of larger shipments from Jordan. Imports of pears jumped from 502 tons in 1973 to 1,704 tons in 1974 and remained strong in 1975 and 1976.

The United States, Greece, Australia, and Malaysia supply most of the imports of canned fruit which exceed 4,000 tons annually. U.S. exports of canned peaches to Saudi Arabia now exceed \$100,000 annually. Shipments of U.S. canned pears to Saudi Arabia increased from 41 tons in 1974 to 153 tons in 1976, making it our third major export market for that product. The United States supplied about one-sixth of Saudi Arabia's canned fruit imports in 1976.

Imports of fruit juices reached \$18 million in 1976--double the value in 1973. The United States accounted for about one-fifth of this value. Japan, Taiwan, Egypt, and India were other major suppliers.

U.S. exports of almonds to Saudi Arabia jumped from 45 tons in 1975 to 157 tons in 1976 valued at \$379,000. Prospects for sales of 5 gallon tins of U.S. almonds, walnuts, and pecans are excellent.

Vegetables and Preparations

Saudi Arabia is one of the leading importers of canned and frozen vegetables in the Mideast. Rising domestic production caused a sharp decline in imports of potatoes, onions, and tomatoes. Imports of vegetable preparations in 1976 were almost double the 1973 level of 14,293 tons. Lebanon, Syria, and Spain were larger suppliers than the United States in 1973.

U.S. exports of frozen vegetables to Saudi Arabia increased from 285 tons in 1975 to 445 tons for a value of \$438,000 in 1976. Saudi Arabia ranks among our five major export markets for tomato juice, tomato puree, and pickles.

Imports of pulses averaged 14,000 tons annually during 1971-75 and moved to a higher level in 1976. Ethiopia, Thailand, and the European Community were major suppliers. U.S. exports of pulses to Saudi Arabia were up from 129 tons in 1975 to 431 tons in 1976 for a value of \$326,000.

Sugar and Products

Czechoslovakia, India, and France are important sources of Saudi sugar imports. Total sugar imports from all countries now exceed 120,000 tons annually, compared with only 31,300 tons in 1963. Larger Government purchases of sugar on the international market are likely in the future. New facilities to process bulk sugar into small packages for consumers are under construction.

Supermarkets in Saudi Arabia usually have some packaged sugar and various brands of honey imported from the United States. U.S. exports of honey to Saudi Arabia reached \$109,000 in 1976--double the 1973 value.

The value of U.S. exports of syrup to Saudi Arabia increased from \$103,000 in 1974 to \$1.5 million in 1976.

Oilseeds and Products

The Sudan sent about 20,000 tons of sesame and 500 tons of peanuts to Saudi Arabia annually during 1974-76. U.S. exports of peanut butter to Saudi Arabia increased from 98 tons in 1975 to 429 tons in 1976, raising the value from \$176,000 to \$703,000. U.S. exports of processed peanuts to Saudi Arabia increased from \$27,000 in 1974 to \$226,000 in 1976.

The European Community and United States supply most of Saudi Arabia's imports of vegetable oils. The Netherlands supplied 4,725 of the 11,908 tons of vegetable oils imported in 1974. U.S. exports of corn oil to Saudi Arabia jumped from 1,509 tons in 1974 to 6,447 tons in 1976.

Dairy Products

Shipments of dry milk by the Netherlands, Denmark, West Germany, and France tripled between 1972 and 1976. Imports of dairy products might reach \$60 million in 1977--up from \$42 million in 1976.

U.S. exports of fresh milk to Saudi Arabia totaled \$789,000 in 1976--down from \$1.3 million in 1975. Exports of U.S. cheese to Saudi Arabia reached 94 tons for \$264,000 in 1976, a relatively small volume in contrast to Australian deliveries of about 6,000 tons of cheese.

Processed Foods

Saudi Arabia is a major and rapidly growing market for a long list of U.S. processed foods. For example, U.S. exports of tomato catsup to Saudi Arabia increased from 84 tons in 1975 to 511 tons in 1976 for a value of \$511,000. The value for U.S. exports of soup, mayonnaise, cream milk substitutes, mustard, potato and corn chips, and various snack foods in 1976 was more than double the 1974 value.

Outlook

The rapid rise in Saudi Arabia's food imports presents some highly favorable opportunities for developing new markets for U.S. farm exports. This is particularly true for exports of rice, many processed foods, frozen poultry, animal feed, and vegetable oils. Saudi Arabia is likely to remain one of the five major markets for U.S. wheat flour, rice, corn oil, fruit juices, and snack foods in 1977.

Further gains in U.S. exports of rice are likely to add about \$20 million to the value of our agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia in 1977. Spectacular gains for exports of many processed foods are also underway, but from a low base level. The total value for U.S. agricultural exports to Saudi Arabia is likely to surpass \$200 million in 1977 if no new breakthrough occurs in a major commodity. Large new sales of poultry, beef, coarse grains, wheat, or peanuts could push the value considerably higher.

U.S.-CANADIAN AGRICULTURAL TRADE IN 1976

In calendar year 1976, two-thirds of Canadian total trade was with the United States. U.S. imports from Canada reached \$26.7 billion in calendar 1976, and U.S. exports to Canada amounted to \$23.6 billion. Six percent of U.S. exports to Canada and 2 percent of Canadian exports to the United States were agricultural commodities. Over half of Canada's total agricultural imports came from the United States. Canadian imports of live animals, almost all from the United States, increased 44 percent in value from 1975 to 1976. Canadian fresh and frozen meat and fruits and vegetable imports rose 78 percent and 11 percent in value, respectively, with about 66 percent of each commodity coming from the United States.

U.S. agricultural exports to Canada in 1976 reached \$1.5 billion--a 14-percent increase over the previous year's level. U.S. agricultural imports from Canada increased 22 percent to \$600 million. Seventy-one percent of U.S. exports to Canada were made up of live cattle, beef and veal, pork, rice, corn, horticultural products, oilcake and meal, hides, skins and furs, soybeans, soybean and cottonseed oil, and cotton. U.S. agricultural imports from Canada consisted mainly of live animals and meat.

Cattle and Beef

U.S.-Canadian trade in live cattle and beef and veal remained free of trade restrictions from January to October 1976. U.S. exports of these commodities increased over 1975 levels. Live cattle exports were up 61 percent in quantity and 71 percent in value, and beef and veal exports were up 135 percent in quantity and 99 percent in value. Almost all Canadian cattle imports came from the United States.

U.S. imports of live cattle increased 149 percent in quantity and 110 percent in value. Beef and veal imports rose 296 percent in quantity and 335 percent in value. Part of the increase in U.S. beef imports from Canada was because of increased Canadian imports of boneless beef from Australia and New Zealand, which along with the United States are the major sources of Canadian beef imports. In 1976, Canadian global imports of beef and veal increased approximately 90 percent in value. The Australian and U.S. share of the market increased from 49 to 51 percent, and from 9 to 12 percent, respectively. The share of the market held by New Zealand decreased from 42 to 37 percent.

In an effort to stem the effect on domestic producers of low-priced Australian and New Zealand beef on the Canadian market, the Canadian Government negotiated a price agreement with Australia and New Zealand in July 1976. Canada would import their beef at no more than 6 cents per pound below the price of U.S. boneless beef. The agreement did not significantly reduce Canadian imports of Oceanian beef, however, and Canadian beef continued to move into the U.S. market. The increase in U.S. imports of Canadian beef was a factor contributing to the implementation of the U.S. Meat Import Law in October 1976, when the U.S. Government imposed quotas on U.S. imports of beef from Canada.

The quota for Canada amounted to 80.4 million pounds and was filled by early November. In response to the U.S. quota, the Canadian Government announced an import permit plan limiting total Canadian beef and veal imports for the fourth quarter of 1976 to 17.5 million pounds, with 8.2 million pounds allocated to Australia, 4.8 million pounds to New Zealand, and 4.5 million pounds to the United States.

In December 1976, the United States and Canada reached an agreement whereby Canadian exports of beef and veal to the United States would be restricted to 75 million pounds in 1977. U.S. exports of beef and veal to Canada will be held at 24.75 million pounds, while Australian and New Zealand imports will be restricted to 59.35 and 60.65 million pounds, respectively, under a global Canadian quota of 144.75 million pounds. The Canadian quota will permit a 32-percent increase in U.S. exports of beef and veal to Canada in 1977 over 1976 levels.

Pork

Canadian pork imports, mainly from the United States, continued upward in 1976. Canadian hog prices have averaged well above U.S. prices during the year because of reduced domestic slaughter and high levels of pork exports to Japan. In 1976, 80 percent of Canadian pork exports went to Japan, and 18 percent went to the United States. The increase in exports to Japan is due to the development of programs under which Canadian provincial hog marketing boards contract to supply pork to Japan. Canada granted duty-free status to imports of fresh pork and reduced tariffs on many processed pork products from the United States during 1976 (these duties and tariffs were reimposed in March 1977).

U.S. exports of pork to Canada during 1976 increased 97 percent in value. U.S. imports of pork, however, continued to decline in 1976. The value of U.S. pork imports equaled \$18 million, which was a 29-percent decrease from the 1975 value.

Fruit and Vegetables

Canadian imports of fresh fruits and vegetables in 1976 accounted for approximately 26 percent of total Canadian agricultural imports. About 69 percent of Canadian fruit and vegetable imports were supplied by the United States in 1976. In 1976, about 32 percent of U.S. agricultural exports to Canada were fresh fruits and vegetables. Fresh citrus fruits and citrus fruit juices accounted for 42 percent of U.S. fresh and prepared fruit exports to Canada in 1976, compared with 44 percent in 1975. The value of fresh citrus fruit exports reached \$71 million in 1976--up 6 percent from the previous year's level, and juice exports reached \$47 million--a 7-percent increase over 1975 levels.

Tomatoes, onions, and lettuce accounted for 44 percent of U.S. fresh vegetable exports to Canada in 1976, equaling \$68 million in 1976--a 6-percent increase over 1975 values.

Corn

The value of U.S. corn exports to Canada decreased in 1976. Canadian corn production of 3.4 million tons was only slightly below the record crop of 1975. Increased domestic corn production, combined with the introduction of a new feed grain policy in August 1976, probably affected U.S. exports. Under the new policy, western Canadian feed grains are competitively priced with U.S. corn in the eastern Canadian market, where most U.S. imported corn is used for feeding purposes.

Oilseeds

Exports of oilseeds and products accounted for 15 percent of the total value of U.S. agricultural exports to Canada in 1976. Virtually all soybeans imported by Canada

come from the United States. Although the volume of soybeans exported decreased 9 percent, the value of soybean exports increased 2 percent.

Rice

U.S. exports of rice to Canada increased 15 percent in 1976, and the total value of Canadian rice imports increased 13 percent. The U.S. share of Canadian rice imports increased 1 percentage point from 1975 to 98 percent in 1976.

AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS GAIN 7½ PERCENT IN FIRST 6 MONTHS

Farm product exports, valued at \$12.7 billion in the first 6 months of fiscal year 1977 (October-March), exceeded their year-earlier level by \$900 million, or 7.6 percent. The agricultural trade balance was in surplus by nearly \$3.3 billion, compared with almost \$6.9 billion during October-March 1975/76, reflecting a more rapid gain in imports.

Commodity values increased for soybeans, protein meal, vegetable oils, cotton, animal feeds, hides, tallow, poultry meat, fruits, edible nuts, vegetables, and dried skim milk. Grain exports fell in value because of lower prices. Although tobacco shipments were down 5 percent, higher prices raised their export value slightly.

Agricultural exports in March reached a near-record \$2.3 billion. Large shipments of feed grains, soybeans, cotton, protein meal, vegetable oils, rice, tallow, corn byproducts, alfalfa meal, and tobacco were recorded. Continued high demand for animal feed in Europe, limited world supplies of vegetable oils, and increased textile production were contributing factors.

Feed grain exports during March, mainly to Western Europe, the USSR, and Japan, surged 17 percent above March 1976 to over 4-1/2 million tons. Average unit values fell about \$8 to \$112 per ton, resulting in a total value gain of 9 percent to \$504 million.

Rice exports in March totaled 214,000 tons, 58 percent greater than the year-earlier volume. Iran, Iraq, and Nigeria accounted for most of the increase.

Nearly 1.6 million tons of soybeans were exported in March, compared with 1.4 million tons last March. Value jumped 70 percent to \$455 million as prices averaged \$7.80 per bushel against \$5.12 a year ago. Japan, Spain, the USSR, and Mexico took larger volumes.

Cotton export volume reached 536,000 bales (480 pounds average weight) in March, up 40 percent from last year's level. Value soared 80 percent to \$189 million. Main recipients were Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Thailand, Egypt, Canada, and Western Europe.

RECORD U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS IN MARCH 1977

U.S. agricultural imports totaled a record \$1.3 billion in March 1977, about one-third higher than a year earlier. Most of the increase was in noncompetitive items, chiefly green coffee. U.S. agricultural imports totaled almost \$6.4 billion for the first half of fiscal 1977 (October-March), compared with \$4.9 billion a year earlier. A more than doubling in coffee prices caused much of the increase.

Green coffee imports reached a record \$478 million in March after declining in February, more than double the year-earlier period. Sharply rising prices caused the increase as the quantity of green coffee imported in March 1977 declined by 26 percent from the year-earlier period. Green coffee import prices hit a high of \$1.97 per pound in March, compared with 77 cents per pound last March.

The quantity of imported green coffee declined slightly during October-March 1976/77 from a year earlier, while the value rose substantially and accounted for about three-fourths of the total increase in agricultural imports. Green coffee accounted for 32 percent of all agricultural imports during October-March 1976/77, compared with 19 percent of the total during the year-earlier period.

Other main noncompetitive products increasing during the last 6 months were crude rubber, bananas, cocoa beans, soluble and roasted coffee, and tea.

Competitive agricultural imports during October-March increased slightly from a year earlier, but their share in total agricultural imports fell from 62 percent to 48 percent. Of the main products, there were value increases in imports of live animals, dairy and poultry products, fruits and vegetables, nuts, tobacco, and beer and wine. Declines occurred in value imports of cane sugar and meat and meat products.

Falling prices caused the value decline in sugar imports as the quantity imported increased by one-fourth from October-March 1975/76 to the same period for 1976/77. Import prices of sugar in October-March 1976/77 were \$184.40 per short ton, compared with \$316.80 per ton during the year-earlier period.

Volume imports of fresh and frozen beef and veal during October-March 1976/77 (68 percent of the total quantity of meat and product imports) declined from a year earlier, while the import value remained about the same as prices rose slightly. Tobacco and vegetable oils were other product imports that declined in volume but increased in value because of price increases.

It is estimated that U.S. imports of fresh or frozen beef and veal in 1977 will be slightly less than the 589,000 tons (product weight) imported in 1976, despite the greater quantities permitted under this year's voluntary import restraint program. 1/ The lower estimated value is mainly a result of a U.S. requirement that meat subject to the Meat Import Law that passes through U.S. Foreign Trade Zones, trust territories, and possessions will be counted against the quota for the supplying country. Last year suppliers, such as Australia, circumvented their quota by shipping to the United States through U.S. Foreign Trade Zones.

INTERNATIONAL PRICE HIGHLIGHTS

In March, the Dow Jones commodity spot price index rose 9 percent as prices of soybeans and coffee made sharp gains and grain prices moderated.

- Speculation about scarce soybean supplies took hold in March as the Gulf ports price for soybeans soared to \$8.65 a bushel, 11 percent higher than February's prices. Large export sales of U.S. soybeans and soybean oil at nearly the season's highest prices sparked the soybean market. Anticipated large demands for soybean products by India, sales of soybeans to Taiwan, and soybean oil to Mexico, Iran, Yugoslavia, and Pakistan provided the spark. Soybean oil prices have recently made faster gains than soybean meal prices, catching up with meal price gains made earlier in the year.

The New York spot price for Brazilian coffee made its largest month-to-month jump in March, increasing nearly one-third to \$3.16 a pound--reflecting the prevailing tight supply situation.

Cocoa beans rose 6 percent to \$2.06 a pound between February and March, continuing their year-long upward drive. The skyrocketing of cocoa bean prices may be slowing since a large summer crop of Brazilian cocoa beans is on the horizon. Moreover, the margins required for future trading in the London Cocoa Terminal Market were raised in mid-March to curb speculation--also potentially dampening future cocoa bean prices. As the threat of drought subsided in the Midwest in March, U.S. wheat and corn export prices weakened slightly. The f.o.b. Gulf ports price for wheat declined 2 percent to \$2.97 a bushel, and corn declined 5 percent to \$2.78 a bushel.

The bullish effect of Australia's 2-million-ton sale of wheat to China was not sufficient to overcome the bearish effects of large wheat offerings on the international wheat market and improved weather in the Midwest. Standard White wheat was offered at Australian ports at \$110 a ton, the same as in February.

In Rotterdam, Argentine wheat was being offered at \$115 a ton, and U.S. Hard Winter wheat was offered at \$118.50. Canadian Western Red Spring wheat was offered at \$135 a ton, whereas U.S. Dark Northern Spring wheat was offered at \$133 a ton, all slightly less than in February.

Importing countries took advantage of the lowered corn prices in March, causing a pickup in U.S. corn export activity. Egypt, Mexico, Greece, Taiwan, and South Korea were among the purchasing nations.

- * In Rotterdam, premiums were being paid for spot deliveries of corn in early March. On 30-day delivery contracts, U.S. corn was being offered at \$117 a ton and Argentine corn at \$127 a ton. Among export commodities, the Osaka price of Arizona cotton rebounded to 85 cents a pound, as traders speculated that the drought in the southwestern United States could cut into 1977 spring plantings of cotton. Cotton supplies are already at a low level, and the earlier expected larger 1977 plantings would have alleviated the current tight cotton situation. India's 105,000-bale purchase in mid-March also buoyed international cotton prices.

The Thai white rice price has remained nearly steady for 5 months, and was \$260 a metric ton in March.

Among import commodities, the ban on saccharin in the United States and Canada helped boost sugar prices. The New York spot price for raw cane sugar reached 11.67 cents a pound, the highest level in 6 months. In early March, China's purchase of 150,000 tons of raw sugar from Thailand and the Philippines also buoyed international sugar prices. Crude rubber prices remained nearly the same at 41.5 cents a pound, and imported cow meat declined slightly to 73.6 cents a pound.



Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

- 4 The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and in transit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

7 EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and aircraft engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. USDA payments are excluded from the export value. Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country known to him at the time of shipment from the United States. Shipments of certain U.S. grain from Great Lakes ports to Canadian ports are designated as exports to "unidentified countries". Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

- 8 The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.
- Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.
