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

Government Program Shipments Totaled \$1.5 Billion In Fiscal 1977 (see p. 4). In fiscal 1977, Government program exports, valued at \$1.5 billion, were 3 percent more than those of the year-earlier period because of a gain in AID disbursements. Public Law 480 exports totaled \$1,102 million, about the same as exports during the previous year. Title I sales, valued at \$760 million, declined, mostly because of a large value decline in wheat and rice exports. The value of title II donations increased.

U.S. Agricultural Exports As A Share of Production (see p. 14). During fiscal 1977, exports of U.S. farm products totaled about a fourth of 1976 cash receipts from marketings. About 28 percent of harvested crop acreage was exported. More than half of the soybeans, cattlehides, rice, and almonds moved into export channels.

Fruit and Vegetable Imports Under Quarantine In Fiscal 1977 (see p. 17). More than 160 fruit and vegetable types entered through 47 U.S. ports last year under Plant Protection and Quarantine supervision. These entries totaled over 7 billion pounds and originated from 53 foreign sources. Bananas, tomatoes, melons, cucumbers, onions, berries, and citrus fruits were the principal items.

U.S. Farm Product Exports Up In November (see p. 37). U.S. agricultural exports exceeded \$2 billion during November, the highest level since May. For the 11-month period ending November 30, farm product shipments totaled \$21.3 billion, or 2 percent above the total for the same period during the previous year.

U.S. Farm Import Value Declines 5 Percent (see p. 72). The value of farm imports in November continued its decline of recent months, falling 5 percent below the October value and 16 percent below that of a year ago. Value declines in imports of dry rubber, bananas, cocoa beans, cocoa butter, tea, meat, sugar, dairy products, vegetables, and wine and malt beverages more than offset increases in imports of green coffee, live animals, and vegetable oils.

GOVERNMENT PROGRAM SHIPMENTS TOTALED \$1.5 BILLION IN FISCAL 1977

In fiscal 1977 (October-September), preliminary data show Government program exports totaled \$1.5 billion, 3 percent more than those of the year before, and the highest level since 1965, because of a gain in AID disbursements. Based on preliminary data, Public Law 480 shipments totaled \$1,102 million, nearly the same as shipments the previous year, and about the same as in July 1974-June 1975. Title I sales for long-term dollar credit and convertible foreign currencies declined and title II donations increased.

In fiscal 1977, the value of commercial agricultural exports increased 6 percent to \$22.5 billion. Government programs accounted for 6 percent of all U.S. agricultural shipments in each of the last 2 fiscal years.

Title I sales, valued at \$760 million, were 8 percent below such sales for fiscal 1976, as there were value declines in wheat and rice sales. In fiscal 1976, title I exports included unusually high sales during the fiscal transition period (July-September 1976). The value of title I exports was about the same as in July 1974-June 1975.

In fiscal 1977, the quantity of wheat exported under title I sales remained about the same, but because of a price drop, the value fell by about 30 percent from the previous October-September period and 22 percent from July 1974-June 1975. The share of wheat under title I sales fell from 52 percent to 41 percent. Rice shipped under title I sales fell about 22 percent in both the quantity and the value from the 1976 level.

In fiscal 1977, there were large gains of title I flour shipments mainly to Egypt and Sri Lanka; soybean oil mainly to Pakistan and India; corn chiefly to Portugal and Egypt; tobacco mainly to Egypt and the Philippines; and bulgur mostly to Indonesia.

Egypt was the principal title I recipient in fiscal 1977, importing 26 percent of total title I shipments. Indonesia received 16 percent of the total title I shipments; Republic of Korea, 9 percent; Portugal, 8 percent; Pakistan, 7 percent; and Bangladesh, 6 percent. Title I exports to Portugal, valued at \$61 million, were unusually large. The largest amount previously shipped was valued at \$19 million in 1973. Corn and rice were the chief title I sales to Portugal, followed by wheat, cotton, tobacco, and grain sorghum in smaller amounts.

In fiscal 1977, title II donations, valued at \$342 million, increased 19 percent over those of the previous period, and were about the same as donations, during July 1974-June 1975. Title II exports were 31 percent of all Public Law 480 shipments. Principal increases occurred in donations of nonfat dry milk, blended food products (corn-soya-milk and wheat-soya-flour), wheat, and soybean oil. India, the principal recipient, received 29 percent of all donations.

AID disbursements of agricultural commodities, valued at \$419 million, were 18 percent above those of the previous year and the highest since 1955. The value of AID shipments included \$326 million to Israel, mainly in corn, soybeans, wheat, and soybean oil. Egypt received \$88 million worth of AID exports, mostly in inedible tallow, cottonseed oil, and tobacco.

In fiscal 1977, wheat was the chief commodity shipped under all Government programs, mainly under title I sales. Government exports of wheat, valued at \$419 million, were 20 percent below the amount exported a year ago because of a decline in prices. Commercial sales of wheat declined by about 40 percent from the fiscal 1976 level and by slightly more from the level during July 1974-June 1975. About 15 percent of all U.S. wheat exports were under Government programs in fiscal 1977, compared with 9 percent in fiscal 1975.

Corn was the second major commodity shipped under Government programs. About three-fourths of that shipped was under AID disbursements and most of the remainder was shipped under title I sales. The value of Government exports of corn--\$208 million--more than doubled the value of corn exports a year ago, and commercial sales fell by about 16 percent. Only 5 percent of all U.S. exports of corn are under Government programs.

In fiscal 1977, exports of rice under Government programs were less than they were during the previous 2 years. About one-fourth of all U.S. rice exports were under Government programs, compared with 29 percent in 1975.

Soybean oil, valued at \$127 million, ranked fourth under Government programs. About 58 percent was exported under AID disbursements and 23 percent was shipped under title I sales. Government program exports of soybean oil doubled from fiscal 1975, whereas commercial sales declined slightly. Thus, the share of all U.S. soybeans under Government programs rose from 13 percent to 31 percent.

The remaining principal commodities shipped under Government programs were title II donations of blended food products, nonfat dry milk, and bulgur; title I sales of tobacco, and AID disbursements of inedible tallow.

In fiscal 1977, commercial sales financed under the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) totaled \$755 million, 8 percent below sales a year earlier. Increases in CCC sales of corn (mainly to Poland and Greece) were more than offset by smaller sales of cotton, soybeans, and tobacco.

U. S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS AS A SHARE OF PRODUCTION

In fiscal 1977, exports of U.S. farm products totaled \$24 billion, equaling about 25 percent of 1976 cash receipts from farm marketings that amounted to more than \$95 billion. In fiscal 1976, exports reached nearly \$22.8 billion, compared with 25 percent of 1975 cash receipts of just under \$89 billion.

About 28 percent of U.S. harvested acreage was exported in 1976. Crops from 96 million acres were moved to export markets from a total of 338 million harvested acres. Food grains harvested from approximately 32 million acres, coarse grains harvested from 23 million acres, and oilseeds harvested from 30 million acres were exported.

For individual crops, about 60 percent of the soybeans and products, 56 percent of the rice, 52 percent of the almonds, 46 percent of the wheat, 41 percent of the cotton, 32 percent of the tobacco, and 27 percent of the coarse grains moved abroad.

Although exports of animals and animal products account for only 5 percent of cash receipts from farm marketings, foreign markets are extremely important income sources for some items, including tallow, hides, and edible offals. In fiscal 1977, more than half of the cattle hides and mink pelts produced were exported, and about 46 percent of the tallow moved abroad. Approximately 15 percent of the edible offals were exported--primarily livers and kidneys from domestic slaughter operations. Significant proportions of other crops are exported annually, including dry beans and peas, raisins, prunes, citrus products, and hops.

In fiscal 1976, farm commodities totaling nearly \$11 billion were imported. About 40 percent of the total consisted of tropical products such as coffee, cocoa, tea, rubber, and bananas. Large proportions of many other items are supplied by foreign countries, notably coconut oil and palm oil, cashew nuts, olives, dates, pineapple, and sugar.

FRUIT AND VEGETABLE IMPORTS UNDER QUARANTINE IN FISCAL 1977

During fiscal 1977, imports of fruits and vegetables under permits issued by USDA's Plant Protection and Quarantine Programs totaled over 7 billion pounds or nearly 3.2 million metric tons. Data for the new fiscal year extend from October 1, 1976, through September 30, 1977, and are not comparable with data for previous years based on July 1 through June 30. Nevertheless, some comparisons can be made when large increases occur. Shipments of cabbage, citrus, cucumbers, mangoes, cantaloupes, onions, peppers, pineapples, squash, and tomatoes were up from the previous year.

Freezes in Florida growing areas during late winter and early spring months resulted in larger imports of most fruit and vegetable items. Mexico was the major source of these products, especially for tomatoes, cucumbers, melons, onions, and peppers. Bananas accounted for more than 4 billion pounds, or 58 percent of entries under permit, and were imported mainly from Costa Rica, Honduras, and Ecuador.

More than 160 separate import commodity listings are shown in the accompanying tables, along with the respective countries of origin and ports of entry. The data are not exactly comparable with Census Bureau data because of differences in commodity definitions and variations in reporting periods. Also, no imports under permit are required for articles from Canada.

Entries under plant quarantine regulations into the U.S. Virgin Islands and Guam, and transshipments through U.S. ports to other countries are shown at the end of the statistical section.

U.S. FARM PRODUCT EXPORTS UP IN NOVEMBER

Agricultural exports during November rebounded from strike-depressed October shipments and exceeded \$2 billion, the highest level since May.

During the 11-month period (January-November), U.S. farm product exports totaled \$21.3 billion, 2 percent above those of the previous year. Increased values for oilseeds and products, cotton, animal feeds, animal fats, hides, and tobacco more than offset reductions in exports of wheat, coarse grains, live cattle, pork, turkey meat, and fresh vegetables.

Oilseed exports expanded 8 percent to 15.5 million metric tons as Japan, the U.S.S.R., West Germany, France, the United Kingdom, Mexico, and Denmark stepped up imports. The value of oilseed shipments were up 39 percent to nearly \$4.4 billion. Soybeans, sunflower, peanuts, and safflower showed strong gains.

Cotton export tonnage was up 29 percent and the value rose 50 percent. Shipments to Korea, Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Thailand, and most West European countries were higher.

Shipments of animal feed grew 8 percent in volume and 19 percent in value over January-November volume and value a year earlier. Major markets were the Netherlands, West Germany, Canada, and Japan. Corn gluten feed shipments jumped 61 percent to 1.5 million metric tons and corn byproduct tonnage leaped 133 percent to 417,000 metric tons.

Wheat exports dropped 14 percent during January-November to just under 21.5 million metric tons. Lower prices resulted in a 34-percent value decline to \$2.4 billion. Reduced shipments to India, Brazil, West Germany, Italy, Japan, and Korea were not offset by substantially larger outflows to the U.S.S.R., Iran, Nigeria, Portugal, Bangladesh, Venezuela, and Mexico.

U.S. FARM IMPORT VALUE DECLINES 5 PERCENT

In November, the value of farm imports, which was \$814 million, continued its recent decline, partly because of the dock strike, falling 5 percent below the October value and 16 percent below that of a year ago.

Imports of noncompetitive items, which accounted for almost half of all agricultural imports, increased slightly from the October level, but were 18 percent below the level of a year earlier. After declining since June, the value of green coffee imports in November was \$221 million, up 44 percent from the October value, although it was one-fourth below what it amounted to a year ago. The import unit price of green coffee in November, which was \$1.72 per pound, continued its decline since July, although it was higher than the \$1.35 per pound import price of a year ago.

The value of other major noncompetitive imports, such as dry rubber, bananas, cocoa beans, cocoa butter, and tea, declined in November. The value of dry rubber fell 52 percent below the October level, and was the lowest in 2 years.

The value of competitive agricultural imports was 11 percent below that of a month ago, as declines in imports of meat and meat products, sugar, dairy products, vegetables, wine and malt beverages more than offset increases in live animals and vegetable oils. The dock strike was the major cause for the drop in imports of beef, veal, and pork.

The value of live animals imported in November more than doubled the October level, following the seasonal pattern of large imports at the end of each year. The quantity of coconut oil and palm oil imported in November was up more than their respective values over the previous month, as unit import prices fell by 12 percent because of increased world production and lower soybean oil prices.

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

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and in transit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and aircraft engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters. USDA payments are excluded from the export value. Separate statistics on Government Program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country known to him at the time of shipment from the United States. Shipments of certain U.S. grain from Great Lakes ports to Canadian ports are designated as exports to "unidentified countries." Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
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
