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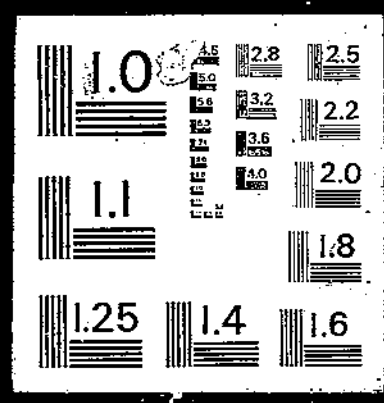

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DIGEST

The Transportation System's Capacity To Meet Agriculture's Short-Term Export Demand (p.5). Projected exports of grain and oilseeds for fiscal year 1978 can be met if throughput capacity exceeds 8.7 million tons per month during the next 6 months. Based on analysis of past performance, that volume should be achievable. Economic growth rates and domestic demand for transportation factors are not expected to inhibit grain flows to port elevators.

U.S. Agricultural Exports To 50 Countries In Calendar Year 1977 (p. 11). Over 93 percent of U.S. agricultural exports went to 50 destinations last year. Tables rank these major destinations and show exports by selected commodity groups for 1972 through 1977.

Calendar Year 1977 Government Program Exports Estimated At \$1.5 Billion (p. 31). In calendar year 1977, preliminary data show U.S. agricultural exports under Government programs were valued at \$1.5 billion, slightly more than the previous year. Estimated exports under Public Law 480 of \$1,074 million were about the same, but due mainly to lower wheat, flour, and corn prices, the quantity shipped rose by 16 percent. Disbursements of farm commodities under AID programs were 15 percent above those of the previous year.

First Quarter Export Prices Strengthen (p. 40). January-March 1978 agricultural export prices averaged above those in the last quarter of 1977. Most commodity prices have not recovered to January-March 1977 levels, however. Import price increases have meanwhile moderated somewhat from the rapid gains experienced in 1977.

Agricultural Exports Continue Strong In April (p. 47). Grain and oilseed export volume moved at well above average monthly rates in April. Total farm product exports in April exceeded \$2.5 billion, bringing the 7 month cumulative dollar value to \$15.1 billion versus \$14.9 billion the previous year. Wheat, rice, poultry products, meat, oilseed meal, and tobacco were above similar months a year earlier.

U.S. Farm Imports Rise 4 Percent During First 7 Months Of Fiscal 1978 (p. 77). During October 1977 to April 1978, U.S. farm imports were valued at \$8.1 billion--4 percent higher than a year ago. Value declines, mainly in imports of green coffee tea, and vegetable oils, were more than offset by value gains, chiefly in cocoa beans, cattle; meat and meat products, dairy products, vegetables, fruits, tobacco, wine, and malt beverages.

THE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM'S CAPACITY TO MEET AGRICULTURE'S SHORT-TERM EXPORT DEMAND

Agricultural exports for 1977/78 are expected to be the largest on record. Total exports of grain and soybeans are projected to exceed 100 million metric tons, with feed grains accounting for more than one-half of the total. Depressed fall and winter shipments of grains and soybeans will require port elevators to continue to load a large volume of grain in the next few months, if the record fiscal year export projections are to be realized. Given past difficulties in transporting grains to and through ports, these projections have raised concern about the adequacy of the capacities of the domestic transport system and of the shiploading facilities at ports.

Currently agriculture's demand for transportation is met by a general purpose transportation system. Agriculture now utilizes about a fifth of the available capacity, mostly for grains and processed foods. Despite growing specialization in transport equipment, specific railcars, barges, and trucks can, and do, carry a variety of products. Thus, agriculture's demands can be met on a timely basis, if this demand is sufficiently urgent to draw capacity from other sectors of the economy.

In the past, agriculture has experienced transport difficulties during times of rapid economic growth in the general economy, when export demand is large for grains and soybeans, and when there is a need for relocation from production areas of large stocks of grain. During 1978, economic growth is expected to be only moderate, which should not generate an excessive demand for transportation capacity.

While the prospective transport demand for grain for feed is unknown, domestic feed demands alone have rarely, if ever, generated difficulties although cattle cycles may have had some minor effects on capacity. Projected 1978 livestock and poultry feeding levels are not expected to put undue pressure on the transportation system.

Grain and Soybean Stock Locations

Due to record harvests and large carryover stocks, large supplies of wheat, corn, and soybeans are currently in place at on- and off-farm locations. On-farm stocks on April 1, 1978 were higher for wheat and corn than those of the corresponding period a year ago (table 1). Soybeans, however, were down slightly. This would suggest that much of the available on-farm storage capacity is being utilized. If so, movement of grain off the farm must occur to make space available for 1978 grain harvests.

April 1 off-farm stocks of corn and wheat were also larger than last year. Conversely, off-farm soybean stocks were slightly lower than at this time a year ago.

With a strong export demand, the off-farm stock levels of wheat and corn will continue to be drawn down. This would imply movement of on-farm stocks or new harvest crops to off-farm locations for transport to port facilities. The lower stock levels would provide more space to receive movements from farms.

For soybeans, the still high level of off-farm stocks implies relatively lower transport requirements to meet export commitments. But the 1977 record crop, along with projections of another large crop and carryover stocks, will force relocation of stocks from on-farm to off-farm facilities.

Prospective Grain Export Demand

Exports of grains and soybeans for 1977/78 are expected to approach 102 million metric tons, a fiscal year record (table 2). Through March, grain and soybean exports totaled 49.7 million metric tons.

Because of depressed grain prices last fall, and extremely cold weather this past winter, grain export movements fell behind the monthly rate required to meet export projections for the 1977/78 fiscal year. Only soybean shipments are above the monthly rate needed to reach the forecast. This implies that domestic transport and port elevators must move large volumes of grain and soybeans in the next few months to offset depressed fall and winter shipments. Based on projected exports for the fiscal year, future monthly rates must increase by an average of 17 million bushels or 5 percent above the monthly rate that occurred in March.

Nonprice Actions to Increase Transport Services

For highway movements of unmanufactured agricultural commodities, and waterway movements of bulk commodities, agriculture can express the urgency of its demand for service through price offers, since this transportation is not subject to economic regulation. Rail transport is subject to regulation, so with rates that are inflexible in the short run, other mechanisms for diverting capacities are essential. Since agriculture's demands generate truck and water rate increases, relatively more of these demands are diverted to railroads and nonprice mechanisms used in allocating rail capacities have come under rapidly escalating pressures.

One mechanism employed by the Association of American Railroads (AAR) is the issuance of car service directives. In the past, these directives have required railroads to return railcars to owning railroads, thereby increasing the car supply of railroads serving grain regions.

During 1972-73, railroads were delivering grain to port elevators faster than they could unload them, resulting in congestion and idle cars. This prompted AAR to issue directives which embargoed further movements to congested ports. Railroads were prohibited from billing cars to ports until the car accumulation and congestion were reduced. AAR continues to issue grain embargoes when required. Presently, embargo notices at ports are minimal.

Likewise, the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) has, in the past, exercised its emergency powers to improve car distribution by issuing car service orders to railroads. A recent action required railroads to allocate not more than 20 percent of their covered hopper cars to unit grain trains. This resulted in removal of some cars from unit-train service and slowed turn-around speed. Other orders reduced and/or waived tonnage requirements of multiple-car tariffs, imposed temporary demurrage rates, and lowered free unloading and loading time.

Export Capacity of Port Facilities

To determine if port facilities are capable of meeting agriculture's high short-term demand, the potential U.S. grain export capacity was analyzed. First, port capacities were assessed by accumulating throughputs of port elevators in past periods of peak exports by port area. Second, potential shiploading capacities obtained from individual port elevators were examined.

Port Performance Rates

A peak in exports does not necessarily indicate that exporting facilities were used to their maximum. However, a closer evaluation of exports by port area will give some indication of capacity of ports by regions.

Grain inspections for export for 1973 through March 1978, a period of high grain exports, were studied. Peak volumes of grain exported during two or more monthly periods of this 4-year cycle of high demand were used to indicate a maximum export capacity that is sustainable over the rest of fiscal year 1978.

Maximum levels of monthly grain inspections ranged from 44 million bushels at the Pacific Coast range to 220 million bushels at the Gulf port range (table 3). The frequency of achieving these peak levels ranged from three times at the Atlantic Coast range to six times at the Great Lakes range.

The Gulf area, by far, has handled the majority of grain exported out of the United States. Since 1970, the Gulf has accounted for over 60 percent of the annual U.S. inspections for export. Because of its importance, the Gulf was analyzed on a sub-regional basis.

During a 62-month period, the north Texas Gulf (Houston, Galveston, Port Arthur, and Beaumont) twice achieved a level of 70 million bushels or more per month, while Corpus Christi, in the south Texas Gulf, three times reached a level of 20 million bushels or more per month (table 4). On five occasions, grain exports from the east Gulf ports of Mobile, Alabama and Pascagoula, Mississippi achieved a level of 16 million bushels or more per month. Finally the Mississippi River ports reached monthly peak levels of 144 million bushels or more per month three times from 1973 through March 1978.

The Gulf port ranges apparently can achieve levels of grain exports totaling 250 million bushels per month, if one aggregates subregional peaks, but taken as a single region, it has achieved past peaks of only 220 million bushels per month. The frequency of achieving maximum levels in three of the four port subregions achieved levels of exports that were significantly above normal "high levels."

The sum of the maximum export levels for each port totaled 384 million bushels per month (table 3). While occurrence of maximum levels among all port areas was not simultaneous, there was a strong correlation of high export levels among most of the ranges. For instance, total inspections for export in April 1978 were 364 million m bushels. Inspections totaled 230 million in the Gulf range, 48 million in the Atlantic,, and 49 million bushels in the Pacific Coast range. On the Great Lakes, grain inspections totaled 37 million bushels. Only the Atlantic and Great Lake ranges were below their indicated maximum level.

Engineering Performance Rates

The second approach in estimating U.S. export capacity is based on an informal survey by the Federal Grain Inspection Service of port elevators concerning their shiploading capacities. Loading rates in bushels per hour were obtained from export elevators in the major port ranges. Assuming an 8-hour day, 5-day week, estimates of monthly rates by region had been previously developed.

The aggregate loading rate per month of the four Gulf port subregions totaled almost 222 million bushels, which is slightly above the indicated maximum sustainable (but below the actual) level of grain exports (table 5). Monthly loading rates totaled 68 million bushels in the Atlantic Coast range, or 10 million more than the indicated maximum sustainable level of grain exports. In the Pacific Coast range, aggregate monthly loading rates approached 137 million bushels, more than three times the maximum exported from the range in any one month.

Under the 8-hour day, 5-day per week assumption, the monthly loading rate in the Great Lakes area totaled almost 224 million bushels. Seventy million bushels was the maximum amount ever exported in one month.

Loading rates are usually based on manufacturer's estimates of equipment under ideal operating conditions. Delays due to congestion, down time for repairs and maintenance, inclement weather, or other adverse situations will significantly reduce the loading capacity of a facility.

Even so, the estimates are still considered conservative given that most elevators can expand shiploading capacity by simply increasing the length and/or number of workshifts. Typical work schedules include single shifts of up to 12 hours; 2 shifts of 7-1/2 to 10 hours each; and 3 shifts of 8 hours each.

With the loss of two export elevators last December, it appears that the Gulf ports range is operating at or near its estimated loading capacity. But the limited extent of embargoes in the range, as well as recent high monthly inspection levels, suggest some expansion potential. Two grain elevators are scheduled to go into operation July 1978, increasing Gulf shiploading capacity by 20 million bushels per month. Also, the April opening of the Great Lakes has provided some partial relief. In addition, the Atlantic and Pacific port ranges have been loading export grain at high rates, and appear capable of much larger shares.

In summary, it appears that the grain logistics system is capable of meeting short-term export demand, if demand is urgent enough to cover modest increased costs. However, any significant interruptions such as a strike at the Pacific or Great Lakes ports or another series of elevator explosions would pose a serious dilemma for the transportation system.

U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS TO 50 COUNTRIES IN CALENDAR YEAR 1977

Since 1972, U.S. agricultural exports have more than doubled in value. The most rapid advance --88 percent-- occurred between 1972 and 1973, when foreign demand increased and commodity prices escalated. In 1973, U.S. farm product exports totaled \$17.7 billion, compared with \$9.4 billion the previous year. During 1974, these exports gained by another 24 percent to \$22 billion, then dipped slightly in 1975 to \$21.9 billion. They resumed an upward course in 1976 and 1977 to \$23 billion and \$23.6 billion, respectively.

Although the United States exports agricultural products to over 160 countries, 93 percent of the total value was shipped to the 50 destinations shown in table 7.

In 1977, U.S. farm product exports to Western Europe, Asia, Latin America, and Africa increased in value. However, U.S. farm product exports to Eastern Europe and the U.S.S.R. fell from previous year levels.

Western Europe

Most European countries increased their imports of U.S. farm products during 1977. European Community (EC) members as a group-- the largest market for U.S. agricultural exports-- took just under \$6.4 billion in 1977, 5-1/2 percent more than the previous year.

Two years of disruptive weather reduced crop yields in most EC countries. Shipments to West Germany, the largest European market, rose about 8 percent, and to the United Kingdom, about 22 percent. Farm product exports to Italy, Belgium, and France were lower. Other Western European countries took about 19 percent more U.S. farm products, led by Spain, Portugal, and Switzerland.

Eastern Europe and the U.S.S.R

Eastern European members of the Council for Mutual Economic Cooperation (Comecon) sharply reduced their imports of U.S. agricultural products during 1977 from 1976 values. A marked decline in coarse grains more than offset value gains for other commodities, including live animals, poultry meat, hides, wheat, rice, soybeans, cotton and tobacco. For the region as a whole, the value dropped 37 percent to \$1.87 billion. Farm product exports to the U.S.S.R. fell about one-third to just over \$1 billion because of improved grain crops in 1976. Substantially lower corn exports more than offset larger values for wheat, soybeans, poultry meat, almonds, and hops.

Following poor crops in the U.S.S.R. during 1977, farm product exports to that country in 1978 are now expected to resume an upward direction and probably exceed their 1976 record of \$1.6 billion. Shipments to Poland, East Germany, and other Eastern European destinations will also expand from 1977 levels.

Asia

U.S. agricultural exports to Asia topped \$8 billion in 1977, up 6 percent from 1976. Principal destinations were Japan, Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Iran, and Israel. Soybeans, coarse grains, cotton, wheat, and tobacco were the largest commodities. All commodity values to Asian countries increased in 1977, except wheat.

Africa

Over \$1.36 billion in U.S. farm products went to Africa last year, 16 percent above those in 1976. North African countries took \$802 million, 14 percent more than during 1976. Poultry meat, dried beans, soybeans, soymeal, tobacco, cotton, tallow, cottonseed oil, and soybean oil accounted for most of the increase. Egypt, Algeria, Tunisia, and Libya stepped up imports of U.S. agricultural commodities from 1976 levels.

Nigeria was the leading African market for farm products outside the North African area. Over \$221 million went to Nigeria in 1977, 47 percent more than the previous year. Poultry meat, rice, corn, and tallow exports advanced from 1976, while the value for wheat remained the same at \$92 million.

Latin America

The Latin American Free Trade Area (LAFTA) members raised imports of U.S. farm products to about \$1.54 billion, 16 percent greater than their previous year's level. Larger exports to Mexico, Venezuela, Colombia, and Peru more than offset reductions to Brazil and Chile. Coarse grains, fruit, soymeal, hides, tallow, and soybean oil accounted for most of the increase.

In calendar year 1977, preliminary data show that U.S. agricultural exports under specified Government-financed programs (Public Law 480 and Agency for International Development--AID) were valued at \$1.5 billion, slightly more than the previous year.

The value of exports under Public Law 480, estimated at \$1,074 million, was about the same as a year ago. However, due mainly to lower wheat, flour, and corn prices, the quantity shipped under Public Law 480 rose by 16 percent. Disbursements of farm commodities under AID programs, valued at \$419 million, were 15 percent above those of the previous year.

The value of commercial agricultural exports in calendar 1977 reached a record \$22.2 billion--3 percent higher than a year earlier. Exports under Government programs accounted for about 6 percent of all U.S. farm exports in each of the last 3 years.

Under Public Law 480, Title I credit sales (long term dollar and convertible foreign currency) were valued at \$706 million, 8 percent below 1976, mainly due to lower wheat, flour, and corn prices. The quantity shipped under Title I rose by 6 percent.

Wheat, the principal commodity under this program, declined by 25 percent in value, but due mainly to lower export prices, the quantity shipped fell by only 2 percent. No wheat under Title I was exported to India or Pakistan--formerly important recipients of wheat under this program--due mainly to increased production in those countries.

Rice, the next leading commodity under Title I, fell 40 percent in value and by a slightly larger amount in quantity, as prices increased. No rice under this program was exported to India and considerably less was exported to Korea, mainly due to increased production in these countries. The value of rice exports under Title I to Indonesia fell by nearly half, as that country increased its rice imports from Thailand and other Asian suppliers.

Among other commodities exported under Title I in 1977, there were substantial value increases in corn, soybean oil, tobacco, and bulgur wheat. Due to lower export prices, the quantity of corn exported under this title rose by much more than the value shipped. Conversely, due to higher export prices, the value of soybean oil exported under Title I rose by much more than the quantity shipped. Cotton exports under this title declined in 1977.

In 1977, Egypt was the principal recipient, receiving 28 percent of all Title I exports. Indonesia received another 12 percent, and other major recipients were Korea, Portugal, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, and India.

Title II donations, based on preliminary data, were valued at \$368 million, 20 percent higher than a year ago and only slightly below the previous record value of 1972. The quantity exported under Title II rose 61 percent from the previous year, mainly because of lower export prices for wheat, flour, and grain sorghum. In 1977, about one-third of all Public Law 480 exports were under donations--mainly moved through private voluntary relief agencies. About 30 percent of the donations were shipped under the World Food Program.

In 1977, there were mainly increases in Title II shipments of nonfat dry milk, wheat flour, wheat, and bulgur wheat. India, the principal recipient, received 25 percent of all donations.

In 1977, AID disbursements of farm commodities accounted for about 28 percent of all Government programs, compared with less than 10 percent during 1962-72. Shipments under AID programs in 1977 included \$285 million to Israel, mainly in corn, soybeans, and wheat, and \$137 million to Egypt--chiefly cottonseed oil, inedible tallow, corn, and tobacco.

Wheat has been the chief commodity shipped under all Government programs, mainly under Title I credit sales. In 1977, Government exports of wheat, valued at \$385 million, were 20 percent below the value exported a year ago, mainly because of a decline in prices, as the quantity shipped rose by 5 percent. The value of commercial sales of wheat declined by 31 percent, partly due to the fall in prices and increased supplies in some foreign markets. In 1977, 14 percent of all U.S. wheat exports were under Government programs, a slightly higher share than in 1975 and 1976.

Corn was the second major commodity shipped under Government programs in 1977. About three-fourths was under AID programs and most of the remainder was under the Title I program. Due to a fall in prices, the quantity exported under Government programs increased by much more than the value exported. The value and quantity of commercial exports of corn declined, partly because of increased supplies in some foreign markets.

In 1977, rice--valued at \$144 million--ranked third under Government programs. Almost all the rice was under Title I credit sales. Government program exports of rice declined--mainly due to increased production in some recipient countries and a shift to other suppliers. However, commercial exports of rice rose by 37 percent in value. Thus, the share of all U.S. rice exports under Government programs dropped from 36 percent in 1976 to 21 percent in 1977.

Wheat flour--valued at \$111 million--ranked fourth under Government programs. About two-thirds was under Title I, exported to Egypt and Sri Lanka. Government exports of flour rose 17 percent in value, but because of a fall in prices, the quantity shipped increased by almost half.

Soybean oil, valued at \$99 million, ranked fifth under Government programs. Almost all was under Title I sales, compared with about 42 percent in 1976. The value of Government-program exports of soybean oil declined slightly, while commercial exports of soybean oil more than doubled in 1977.

The remaining principal commodities shipped under Government programs in 1977 included Title I credit sales of tobacco and cotton; Title II donations of nonfat dry milk, blended food products, and bulgur; and AID disbursements of soybeans, inedible tallow, and cottonseed oil.

In calendar 1977, about 4 percent of commercial sales were financed under the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) and Export-Import Bank loans and medium-term guarantees. CCC credit sales of \$831 million were 8 percent higher than a year ago. There were mainly increases in CCC credit sales of wheat, barley, corn, and grain sorghum. Declines occurred in CCC credit sales of rice, cotton, and soybean oil.

FIRST QUARTER EXPORT PRICES STRENGTHEN

Throughout the first quarter of 1978, export prices strengthened, after the downturn in 1977; however they have not rebounded to their year-earlier levels. Prices of the major grains and the soybean complex have especially followed this pattern. In contrast, cotton and nonfat dried milk have been on the downslide for several quarters, while rice prices have been on the upswing for well over a year.

Export Commodities

The U.S. export unit value for wheat strengthened to \$119 a metric ton during the first quarter, recovering from its depressed July-September quarter. Recent price strength has come from strong export demand, generated in part, by Public Law 480 sales. Severe weather conditions restricted farm movement, slowed Mississippi river traffic, hampered grain loading at the Gulf, and buoyed first quarter wheat prices. Nevertheless, world wheat supplies are plentiful, since the 1976 world crop was a record and the 1977 crop a near record. Thus, the first quarter 1978 U.S. export unit value for wheat was 7 percent lower than it was a year ago.

The corn price situation is similar. First quarter U.S. corn export unit value, at \$103 a metric ton, while 8 percent lower than a year earlier, has picked up from last summer's low point. New price strength has come from the pickup in livestock feeding, recent U.S. sales of corn to the U.S.S.R., and the general difficulty of getting corn to an export position at the Gulf ports, despite the bearish influences of plentiful worldwide corn supplies from the 1976 and 1977 crops.

Rice has surged in price, having experienced a 25 percent increase in unit value from the first quarter of 1977 to the first quarter of 1978. Just from the previous quarter, the rice export unit value rose 19 percent to 41 cents a kilogram. Poor crops in Indonesia and West Malaysia, which created unusually strong import demand, and in Thailand and Burma (major exporters) have buoyed the U.S. rice export unit value. The 1977 U.S. crop was also off slightly from 1976.

The soybean complex is ending a year of record prices resulting from the 1976 U.S. soybean crop shortfall. Yet, the oilseed complex, which was expected to experience a lull, has shown considerable excitement, as Brazil--the second major soybean producer--harvested a short crop in early 1978. Short supplies of peanuts and palm oil have also caused the soybean export unit value to post a 5-percent gain from the previous quarter. Nevertheless, the January-March export unit value for soybeans was 15 percent lower than for the same quarter a year ago.

Soybean oil and soybean meal export unit values made 6-percent and 11-percent quarter-to-quarter gains respectively, having enjoyed strong export demand during the first quarter of 1978. Soybean meal was priced about 10 percent lower than it

was a year ago, when a strong price runup occurred. Conversely, soybean oil was priced higher.

Cotton is also in the midst of a year of abundant supplies. World cotton output is estimated to be at a record level. As a result, the first quarter 1978 export unit value of cotton is 17 percent lower than a year earlier and 6 percent lower than it was the previous quarter. During the first quarter, raw cotton was exported at a unit value of \$294 a standard running bale.

Import Commodities

Import commodity prices were rising through the first quarter of 1978 but not at the galloping rates experienced in 1977. Coffee and cocoa bean prices, the driving force behind the import commodity price index runup, have subsided.

Green coffee was imported at a price of \$3.96 a kilogram during the first quarter of 1978, 4 percent higher than a year earlier and 2 percent higher than the previous quarter. The international coffee supply has undergone a dramatic turnaround from the tight situation of just a year ago, when the U.S. import unit value reached record high levels during the second and third quarters.

The import value of cocoa beans, at \$3.33 a kilogram, fell nearly one fourth from the previous quarter, but is still 63 percent higher than it was a year ago. Because of short crops, cocoa beans have been in a particularly volatile price situation during the past crop season. New crop supplies, which are responsible for the first quarter price hike, are only now coming to market in such large consuming areas as the United States and Western Europe. World cocoa bean production for 1977/78 is now estimated at 1.46 million metric tons, 8 percent above the 1976/77 outturn.

Sugar import unit values, which had been slipping since their runup in late 1975, had a spark of activity during the first quarter of 1978, rising 9 percent from the previous quarter. Even though world sugar supplies are plentiful, the quarterly price rise resulted from technical corrections after the long and sustained price decline, as well as renewed U.S. refiner's buying interest in the world market.

Prices in the livestock complex reflect the price runup that is currently occurring in both the beef and hog sectors. Imported frozen beef and canned hams rose 9 percent and 5 percent, respectively, from the fourth quarter of 1977 to the first quarter of 1978.

Among other commodities, imported rubber, wines, tobacco, and tomatoes were all priced higher during the January-March quarter than they were a year ago.

April Price Developments

In April, Soviet purchases of wheat, corn, and soybeans, combined with Chinese purchases of wheat, added to the bullish factors that had been buoying prices through the first quarter of 1978. In April, the price spread between U.S. Gulf ports and Rotterdam reached \$12 a ton, the widest that it has been in over a year.

China, purchasing wheat from the United States for the first time since 1974, has large import requirements because of drought. Its usual suppliers, Australia, Argentina, and Canada, have smaller than usual exportable supplies available. In April, the Gulf ports price of U.S. hard winter wheat rose 7 percent to \$3.67 a bushel. Similar price hikes occurred for U.S. hard winter wheat and other market classes in the United States and West European markets.

The Soviet flurry of buying also strengthened corn prices. The Gulf ports price of corn rose 9 percent to \$3.04 a bushel. Rotterdam prices for U.S. corn, soybeans, and Argentine corn also posted substantial gains.

The 5-percent gain in soybean prices is a continuation of the price hikes of recent months, resulting from short Brazilian soybean crops and a poor Indian peanut crop, which strengthened demand for soybean products. While U.S. soybean export prices have made dramatic gains in recent months, they are still well below the \$10 a bushel price in April 1977.

The Thai rice price and the Osaka price for U.S. Arizona cotton also increased slightly in April. Among import commodities, imported beef posted a 12-percent gain, reflecting the price hikes that are occurring throughout the international beef market. In contrast, the New York futures price for cocoa beans has leveled off at \$1.53 a pound, and coffee and sugar prices have continued their downward slide.

AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS CONTINUE STRONG IN APRIL

During April, U.S. agricultural exports totaled \$2.5 billion, slightly less than March's \$2.52 billion, but well above the \$2.2 billion shipped in April 1977. Grain and oilseed export volume in April continued large at over 9.6 million tons, compared with 9.3 million in March and 7.8 million for April 1977.

In the first 7 months of this fiscal year, farm product exports amounted to \$15.1 billion, up from the \$14.9 billion recorded during similar months a year earlier. Value increases for wheat, rice, poultry products, fruits and nuts, high protein meal, sunflower seeds, vegetable oils, and tobacco were almost offset by reductions for most animal byproducts, cotton, coarse grains, animal feeds, and vegetables.

The positive U.S. agricultural trade balance for October 1977 through April 1978 nearly equaled last year's level of \$7.06 billion. The trade surplus had been running behind its previous year rate through March 1978.

Regionally, October-April exports were higher to Latin America, Africa, Asia, and the Centrally Planned Countries, while values were lower to the European Community, Japan, and Canada. Within the Latin America area, U.S. agricultural exports to Mexico were up more than one-fifth in value to \$295 million, those to Brazil more than tripled, reaching \$174 million.

North African countries took about \$506 million--21 percent more than a year earlier. Significantly larger amounts of wheat and coarse grains went to Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, and Libya.

Increased farm product exports to Asia occurred in October-April, especially to East Asian countries, including Korea, Hong Kong, Indonesia, the Philippines, Singapore, and Malaysia. West Asian destinations such as Saudi Arabia, Iraq, and Lebanon also took increased values over year-earlier levels.

Soybean export tonnage was 14 percent above a year earlier, but lower prices resulted in a slight value decline. Export unit values in April averaged \$259 per ton, compared with the unusually high \$334 in April 1977. For the October 1977-April 1978 period, soybean export unit values averaged just under \$224 per ton, against almost \$270 during the same months in 1976/77.

Principal sources of the higher export demand this season include Japan, Taiwan, Korea, the European Community, and Spain. While shipments to the U.S.S.R. through April were less than half the previous year's level of 777,000 tons, about 591,000 tons in outstanding sales remain to be shipped before August 31.

Wheat exports remained strong in April at over 2.8 million tons, reflecting its strong demand in the U.S.S.R., Brazil, Pakistan, Morocco, Portugal and many other countries. With Mexico, Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador, and Brazil taking significantly larger quantities of wheat, October through April exports totaled 15.8 million tons-- up 32 percent from similar months a year earlier.

Over 5.7 million tons of U.S. wheat went to Asian countries, up slightly from the 5.6 million sent during October-April 1976/77. West Asia (chiefly Iraq, Lebanon, and Saudi Arabia), South Asia (Pakistan, Bangladesh, and Afghanistan), and East Asia (mainly the Philippines, Taiwan, and Singapore) were the leading gainers.

In October-April 1977/78, U.S. coarse grain export volume dropped to 29 million tons, 7 percent below year-earlier levels; value fell 17 percent due to lower prices. Almost 4.6 million tons were shipped in April, about the same volume as in March but well above the 3.6 million in April 1977. With the recent large shipment volume, exports came nearer their previous year's tonnage which had been running 12 percent behind through February and 10 percent through March. Corn exports to the U.S.S.R. for October-April more than doubled year-earlier rates, reaching 5.6 million tons. Over 1 million tons each month moved to the U.S.S.R. in March and April. Other large markets in October-April included Japan, Spain, Portugal, Poland, Korea, Taiwan, and Greece.

Oilcake and meal exports surged 22 percent ahead of the first 7 months in 1976/77, and exceeded 3.5 million tons. Large current markets are Germany, Italy, Japan, and Spain. Eastern European countries are also becoming more important, especially Yugoslavia and Hungary.

U.S. FARM IMPORTS RISE 4 PERCENT DURING FIRST SEVEN MONTHS OF FISCAL 1978

During October 1977 to April 1978, U.S. agricultural imports were valued at \$8.1 billion--4 percent higher than a year earlier. Value declines, mainly in imports of green coffee, tea, soluble and roasted coffee, sugar, and vegetable oils, were more than offset by value gains chiefly in cocoa beans, cocoa powder, chocolate preparations, cattle, meat and meat products, dairy products, vegetables, fruits, tobacco, wine, and malt beverages.

Throughout the first 7 months of fiscal 1978, green coffee imports were valued at \$2.2 billion--28 percent of all farm product imports--compared with nearly \$2.6 billion or 33 percent of agricultural imports a year ago. As unit prices of green coffee rose from \$1.65 per pound to \$1.77 per pound, the quantity of imported coffee declined by more than the value drop.

For the period October 1977 to April 1978, sugar imports, valued at \$484 million, were 2 percent lower than a year earlier despite record December imports of \$185 million. April imports of sugar of \$14 million--a record low--compared with \$85 million in April 1977. U.S. sugar imports in 1978 are expected to be down sharply from the 1977 level, partly because of higher import fees and duties. ^{1/}

On April 17, 1978, the U.S. International Trade Commission reported to the President that sugar imports are interfering with the U.S. sugar price support program. ^{2/} The majority on the Commission recommended raising current fees on sugar imports and imposing quotas if the fees are not sufficient to sustain the price support level. The Administration is reviewing the proposals.

In the first 7 months of fiscal 1978, the value of imports of vegetable oils (mainly coconut and palm oils) declined by 18 percent from a year earlier. Throughout fiscal 1978, imports of coconut oil are expected to decline 15 percent below last year's level. ^{3/} A rise in the unit import prices of coconut oil from \$427 per metric ton to \$472 per metric ton, and increased supplies of other vegetable oils, has reduced the incentive to import. Imports of palm oil are also expected to fall sharply 1978.

The United Nations Conference on Trade and Development in Geneva, Switzerland, has been discussing details for an international tea agreement. ^{4/} Tea is considered one of the most depressed agricultural commodities in international trade. Full agreement among participants is not expected for at least a year.

During October 1977 to April 1978, imports of beef and veal were valued at \$545 million, 17 percent higher than a year ago. Meat imports are expected to rise in 1978, because of declining U.S. production.

There were also significant increases in imports of fruits and vegetables. Fruits and preparations, valued at \$245 million, were one-fourth higher than during October 1976 to April 1977. Vegetables and preparations imports of \$515 million increased by almost two-fifths, mainly tomatoes, cucumbers, and peppers.

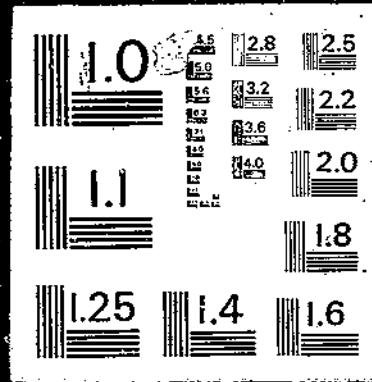

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and aircraft engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters through 1974. USDA payments are excluded from the export value. Separate statistics on Government Program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country known to him at the time of shipment from the United States. Shipments of certain U.S. grain from Great Lakes ports to Canadian ports are designated as exports to "unidentified countries." Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
