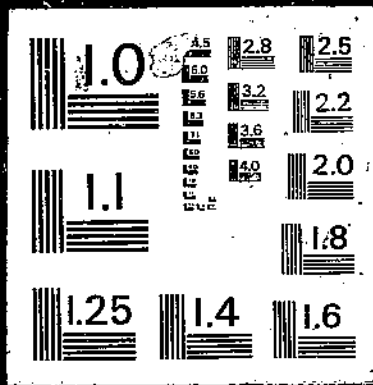

DIGEST

Farm Product Exports Expand 12 Percent In October-August 1977/78 (see p. 5). More than \$25 billion in agricultural commodities were exported during the first 11 months of fiscal year 1977/78. Increased values from year-earlier levels included wheat, corn, oilseeds, cotton, tobacco, rice, fruits, and edible nuts. Export quantities gained 18 percent to 116 million tons. Agricultural exports exceeded imports by \$12.2 billion, up sharply from \$9.9 billion in the October-August 1976/77 period.

U.S. Agricultural Imports Rise 3 Percent During First 11 Months Of Fiscal 1978 (see p. 37). During the first 11 months of fiscal 1978, U.S. farm imports of \$12.8 billion were 3 percent higher than a year ago. Value gains in imports of cocoa beans, cocoa powder, bananas, chocolate preparations, live animals, hides and skins, dairy products, meat and products, fruits, vegetables, tobacco, wine, malt beverages, and cut flowers more than offset substantial value declines in tea, sugar, vegetable oils, and molasses.

Selected Prices Of International Significance (see p. 63). In August, international commodity prices remained steady or moderated. Since July, wheat prices remained steady while prices for corn, grain sorghum, rice, soybeans, soybean meal and coffee declined. Cotton, beef, sugar, cocoa beans and rubber increased, however.

U.S.-Mexican Agricultural Trade Up Sharply In 1977 (see p. 67). Expanded U.S. farm product exports to Mexico reached their second highest level in 1977, and a \$1 billion record for agricultural imports from Mexico contributed to the increase in trade between the two countries. Wheat, coarse grains, and oilseeds are the most important commodities among agricultural exports; coffee, fresh vegetables, and feeder cattle are the largest import items. Prospects for U.S.-Mexican agricultural trade in 1978 are for a leveling off of U.S. farm product exports and declining coffee prices.

Second Quarter Export Prices Higher; Import Prices Decline (see p. 76). Average export unit values for most agricultural products increased between the quarter ending in March and the April-June period. Most import unit values declined, including coffee and cocoa.

FARM PRODUCT EXPORTS EXPAND 12 PERCENT IN OCTOBER-AUGUST 1977/78

During the first 11 months of fiscal year 1978, U.S. agricultural exports amounted to more than \$25 billion, 12 percent above the same months a year earlier. Value gains included wheat, corn, oilseeds and products, cotton, rice, tobacco, fruits, and edible nuts. Export quantities for principal items increased more rapidly than value, rising 18 percent to 116 million tons, reflecting lower prices for some grains and oilseeds.

Increases in exports by region went mainly to the U.S.S.R., Eastern Europe, Latin America, Africa, and Asia.

The agricultural trade surplus widened further to \$12.2 billion from \$10.9 billion in the October-July period and represents a significant gain over October-August 1976/77's \$9.9 billion level. Farm product exports continued to outpace imports, resulting in the larger favorable trade balance.

Five leading export commodities--wheat, coarse grains, soybeans, protein meals, and cotton--accounted for over 90 percent of the export tonnage in October-August 1977/78, and represented nearly two-thirds of the value total.

Wheat exports made the largest percentage gain over year-earlier rates, increasing about 37 percent to more than 28.5 million tons. Larger shipments to Latin America and Western Europe were supplemented by increased import demand in the U.S.S.R., Africa, and the People's Republic of China.

A record 2.67 million tons of wheat went to Brazil in October-August 1977/78, compared with only 516,000 tons in the same months a year earlier due to drought and poor crop yields. Brazil has become the third largest destination behind the U.S.S.R. and Japan. Other Latin American countries, which normally purchase wheat from Argentina or Canada, have been importing more from the United States this year, including Chile, Venezuela, and Colombia. Total U.S. wheat exports to Latin America in October-August 1977/78 amounted to 6.2 million tons, compared with 3.2 million tons during the same period in 1976/77.

Asian countries together form the largest regional market for U.S. wheat, taking 10.4 million tons in October-August 1977/78. Within the region, Japan is the main destination, taking 2.8 million tons valued at \$347 million, compared with slightly over 3 million tons and \$363 million in October-August 1976/77. Growth markets in Asia over the past year include Pakistan, the People's Republic of China, the Philippines, Taiwan, and Indonesia.

Exports to the U.S.S.R., the largest single foreign market for U.S. wheat, were 17 percent above like months a year ago and already exceed the amount specified in the U.S.-U.S.S.R. grain agreement. October-August 1977/78 shipments were 3.4 million tons, compared with less than 2.9 million tons during the first 11 months of 1976/77. Value amounted to \$410 million versus \$431 million a year earlier due to lower prices. Export unit values averaged \$125, compared with \$149 in October-August 1976/77. Shipments for August, at 440,000 tons, were more than double the July rate and over four times those in August 1977.

Shipments of U.S. wheat to Africa rose by 40 percent in the first 11 months to 4.5 million tons from 3.2 million tons during October-August 1976/77. North Africa and Nigeria accounted for most of the increase. Movements to Morocco and Algeria were up sharply, reaching 919,000 tons and 697,000 tons, respectively. Nigeria took 748,000 tons, up 13 percent from a year earlier. Shipments to Egypt, the largest North African destination, remained level at 1.4 million tons after adjustment for transshipments through Canada.

Coarse grain exports rose 9 percent to 50.8 million tons in the 11 months ending August 1978. The increase occurred mainly for shipments of corn to the U.S.S.R., Eastern Europe, Japan, Korea, and Taiwan. Direct exports of coarse grains to the EC dropped 40 percent to 10.5 million tons.

Soybean exports were 26 percent above year-earlier levels to 18.6 million tons. Value gains were limited to 7 percent due to lower prices, however. Western Europe, Japan, Taiwan, and Mexico accounted for most of the gains. Export unit values averaged \$240 per ton in October-August 1977/78, compared with \$284 in similar months the previous year.

U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS RISE 3 PERCENT DURING FIRST 11 MONTHS OF FISCAL 1978

U.S. agricultural imports in August of \$1 billion were at their lowest level since last November. Declines occurred mainly in imports of coffee, sugar, and meat.

During the first 11 months of fiscal 1978, U.S. agricultural imports were valued at \$12.8 billion, about 3 percent higher than a year ago. Value gains in imports of cocoa beans, cocoa products, bananas, rubber, live animals, hides and skins, dairy products, meat and products, fruits, vegetables, tobacco, wine, malt beverages, and cut flowers more than offset value declines for tea, sugar, vegetable oils, and molasses.

Imports of noncompetitive products declined by about 5 percent mainly due to the drop in green coffee imports which accounted for about 53 percent of all noncompetitive imports, compared with nearly 60 percent a year earlier. The value of green coffee imports of \$3.2 billion declined by about 15 percent, mainly due to a fall-off in roastings and consumption and relatively favorable inventories. As unit import prices of green coffee dropped from \$1.83 per pound during October 1976 to August 1977 to \$1.68 per pound during the next 11 months, the volume imported declined by a smaller amount than the value.

While monthly tea imports during the first 11 months of fiscal 1978 have not shown a marked decline, the cumulative value of \$106 million was nearly two-fifths less than during the October 1976-August 1977 period. Tea imports rose significantly during several months of fiscal 1977 when coffee prices were high.

Higher prices caused most of the 22 percent value gain in imports of cocoa beans and a doubling in value imports of chocolate preparations. The volume of cocoa beans imported actually declined, while the volume of chocolate preparations rose by 36 percent.

Except for vegetable oils, sugar, inedible molasses and nuts, imports of major competitive products rose during the first 11 months of fiscal 1978, compared with a year ago. Imports of live animals of about \$296 million rose by two-fifths. The main value gains were in imports of dutiable cattle--accounting for about 70 percent of all live animal imports--and swine, about 5 percent of the total. Value imports of swine of over \$15 million more than tripled, while the number imported rose from 38,000 to about 145,000. The gain in live animal imports --mostly from Canada-- was due to strong domestic demand and inadequate supplies.

Meat and products accounted for the major increase in imports of noncompetitive imports. Beef and veal imports of \$965 million--over two-thirds of the value of all imports of meat products--rose by 30 percent. As unit import prices of beef and veal rose from \$1.34 per kilogram during October 1976-August 1977 to \$1.53 per kilogram during the next 11 months, the 13 percent rise in the volume of beef and veal imported was considerably less than the value gain. The rise in beef and veal imports was mainly due to inflation, declining U.S. production, and a June increase in imports subject to the Meat Import Law.

Imports of fruits and vegetables each rose by about one-fourth in value from a year ago. Among fruits, the largest increase was in imports of concentrated orange juice which went from \$12 million to over \$57 million. The gain was due to a severe freeze in the winter of 1977 which led to a reduction in stocks, high domestic prices, and an increase in imports from Brazil. Yields increased this year and it is expected that domestic stocks will be higher and imports somewhat lower in fiscal 1979.

Sugar imports, at \$784 million, declined 4 percent from a year ago. The quantity declined by about the same amount mainly due to higher import fees imposed in January.

Vegetable oils imports, at \$423 million, declined by about 15 percent from a year ago. Higher prices have reduced imports of coconut oil, while larger domestic supplies of soybean and cottonseed oils, at prices below palm oil, have reduced palm oil imports.

SELECTED PRICES OF INTERNATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

In August, international commodity prices remained steady or moderated. Since July, wheat prices have remained steady, while prices for corn, grain sorghum, rice, soybeans, soybean meal, and coffee declined. Cotton, beef, sugar, cocoa bean, and rubber prices, however, are higher than they were in July. Most commodity prices are higher than they were a year ago. Coffee and cocoa beans are notable exceptions.

Export commodities

Even though the United States is harvesting a smaller wheat crop, the world wheat crop is larger than last year, with wheat prices generally staying steady. Moreover, U.S. export prices are being influenced by price support loans and reserve stockpiling. U.S. No. 2 Hard Winter and Dark Northern Spring wheat stayed steady at \$352 and \$323 a bushel respectively. In contrast, prices were falling at this time last year.

Despite late planting due to the wet spring, the U.S. corn crop is estimated at a record 6.8 billion bushels. As a result, at the Gulf Ports, U.S. No. 2 Yellow corn is down to \$2.43 a bushel, 12 cents lower than in July.

Due to a drought in Texas, cotton prices are heading up with the Osaka price reaching 71 cents a pound in August; last year it was at 57 cents a pound and going down. To add to the demand, China's cotton crop is experiencing weather problems.

Following last year's trend, New York spot coffee prices declined to \$1.41 a pound, despite claims of frost in Brazil. Colombia is harvesting a record crop of 10.1 million bags, 8.6 million of which are exportable.

The U.S. sorghum crop is expected to be down about 12 percent from last year. Yet, Rotterdam prices for sorghum averaged lower at \$102 per ton because of competition with the large availabilities of corn.

As the United States debates domestic sugar policy, the international price is strengthening. Reasons for this strengthening is a strong feeling that the United States will sign the International Sugar Agreement (ISA) by the December 31, 1978 deadline. The effects of the temporary ISA are starting to be felt as past stocks are depleted.

Cocoa production, down 5 percent from a year ago, caused prices to rise in August. Also, the weakness of the U.S. dollar on currency markets helped strengthen cocoa prices. Last year prices were on a general downswing.

Soybeans prices are declining, but not quite as much as last year. August Gulf port prices for No. 2 Yellow U.S. soybeans dropped 27 cents to \$6.81 per bushel. Last August prices dropped 50 cents as U.S. soybean production recovered from the previous year's low level. Even though the United States is harvesting a record 1978 soybean crop, demand for soybeans and soybean products is expected to remain strong.

Domestic U.S. beef prices have been going down ever since farmers increased their slaughter in reaction to President Carter's allowing more foreign beef into the country. In contrast, the price of imported beef increased to 92 cents a pound, whereas last year the trend from February to August was down.

Rice prices are generally headed down this year, reaching \$366 a ton in August. The record U.S. crop is having a major effect on the price.

The New York spot price for rubber rose 4 percent in August as a result of recent strong demand by Japan, the United States, and the U.S.S.R.

U.S.-MEXICAN AGRICULTURAL TRADE UP SHARPLY IN 1977

In 1977, U.S. agricultural exports to Mexico jumped nearly 80 percent over the previous year to almost \$645 million, second in value only to 1974's record \$863 million. Farm product imports from Mexico continued to expand, after a decline in 1975, to a record 1977 high of \$1,013 million, up 42 percent from 1976. In 1977, Mexico again had a favorable balance of agricultural trade with the United States. At the same time, the United States maintained its traditional favorable balance of total trade with Mexico, but not by much (fig.1). Mexico continues to be an important trading partner of the United States, purchasing a total of \$4.7 billion worth of goods last year and supplying the U.S. market with products valued at \$4.6 billion.

Crop shortfalls and continued population pressure increased Mexican demand for coarse grains, oilseeds, and wheat from the United States in 1977. Grains and oilseeds accounted for about 60 percent of total U.S. agricultural exports to Mexico in 1977. U.S. imports of Mexican cattle, tomatoes, and strawberries increased 73 percent to \$255 million. Coffee imports were up 48 percent in value, although volume declined by nearly a quarter.

Maintaining basic food supplies and an expanding feed industry continued to increase Mexican demand for U.S. exports during 1977. U.S. wheat exports to Mexico were up sharply, after 2 years of scarcely any trade, to 452.6 thousand tons valued at \$41.2 million, and corn soared to a new record of 1.72 million tons valued at \$176.3 million. Continued growth in the Mexican feed industry increased demand for U.S. exports of sorghum, soybeans, and soybean meal. Sorghum exports to Mexico were up to 669.4 thousand tons valued at \$66.8 million and soybeans reached an alltime high of 413.5 thousand tons valued at \$108.3 million. Soybean meal and soybean oil exports were both sharply higher than the previous year. Lard, tallow, and cattle hides were also higher in 1977.

U.S. imports of Mexican cattle and meat were higher as consumer demand and prices strengthened. Fresh vegetables and fruit imports continued to advance. Strawberry imports were 84 percent higher reaching 52.5 thousand tons valued at \$27.6 million, as prices declined slightly from 1976 levels. Fresh cantaloupe imports were 30 percent higher, as value increased 46 percent to \$20.4 million. Cucumber import volume was up 20 percent; peppers gained 28 percent; and tomatoes climbed 21 percent. Tomatoes, the largest item in this group, were valued at \$149.4 million, with volume expanding from 294 thousand tons in 1976 to 356 thousand tons in 1977. Higher coffee prices more than offset the decline in quantity imported, as the value jumped 46 percent to \$370 million.

Outlook for U.S.-Mexican Trade During 1978

Improved economic conditions both in the United States and Mexico should continue to improve agricultural trade between the two countries, although Mexican concern about their food supply situation could dampen U.S. imports from Mexico. U.S. exports to Mexico for the first seven months of 1978 were 4 percent above the same period in 1977. Wheat exports were up sharply because of the short 1977 crop. Corn exports were off slightly, while sorghum was about half of what it was during the first of 1977. Part of the decline in corn and sorghum exports was due to a shortage of rail transportation in Mexico to move imported grain. First priority for rail transportation was given for the

movement of wheat and sorghum from the northern part of the country. This situation should improve during the last half of 1978. The outlook for Mexico's 1978 corn and sorghum crops remains optimistic at this time. Exports of most U.S. agricultural products to Mexico were higher for the first half of 1978 when compared to 1977.

Agricultural imports from Mexico for the first half of 1978 were valued at \$698 million, down 7 percent from the same period in 1977. The main factor in this decline was coffee, which fell nearly 50 percent to \$163.6 million. Strawberries, honey, and cocoa were down 15 to 23 percent. Cattle, beef, cucumber, tomato, and melon exports were higher.

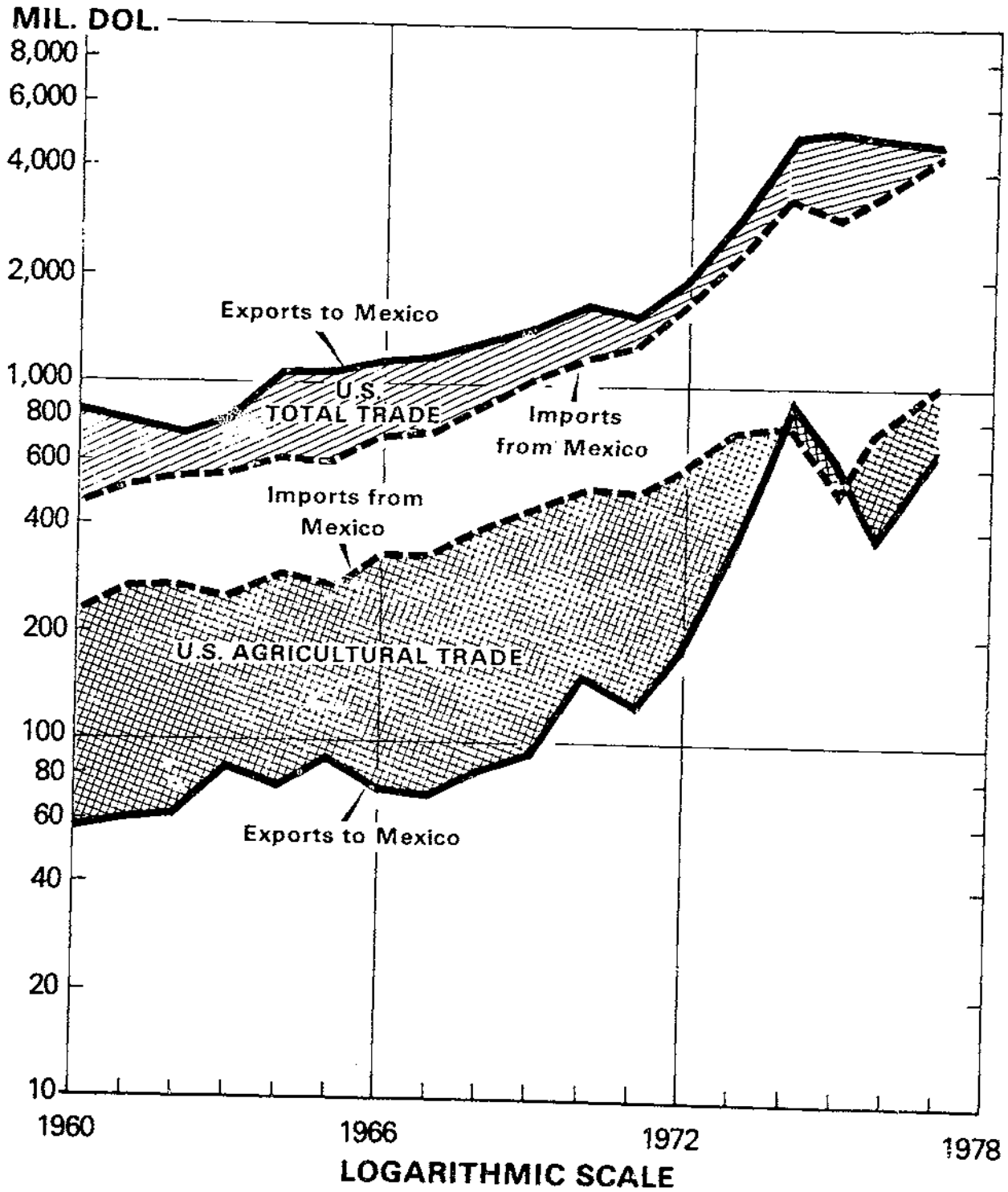

SECOND QUARTER EXPORT PRICES HIGHER; IMPORT PRICES DECLINE

During the second quarter of 1978, export unit values of most major agricultural commodities were on the upswing--particularly major grains, the soybean complex, tallow, and cattle hides. However, cotton and tobacco export unit values declined. While most commodity prices have continued upward since the fourth quarter of 1977, soybean and soybean product export unit values are lower than they were a year ago, when prices were bid up as a result of the short U.S. soybean crop. Recent strength in soybean export unit values stemmed from heavy export demand. While the price of flue-cured tobacco declined in the second quarter of 1978, it was still 10 percent higher than a year earlier.

Export Commodities

As evidenced by the larger volume of exports, the major grains have experienced rising prices because of this year's increased export demand. Underlying this strong demand was the 8 percent decline in 1977 world wheat production and a slight decline in world coarse grain production. Moreover, farmers' participation in the U.S. loan and reserve program provided strength to export prices for wheat and corn. The second quarter U.S. export unit value for wheat was 7 percent higher than it was a year ago, while corn moved up slightly to \$110 per ton. Rice prices strengthened through the crop year because of poor Indonesian and Malaysian crops and export limitations by Thailand. The second quarter export unit value for rice was 29 percent higher than last year.

From the second quarter of 1977 to the second quarter of 1978, the 10-percent increase in world cotton production brought a 20-percent drop in the U.S. export unit value for cotton.

Import Commodities

The index of agricultural import unit values had been declining over the last four quarters as coffee prices--the prime mover of the index--declined. Among import commodities, the second quarter coffee import unit value was 30 percent lower than a year ago as foreign supplies improved, and U.S. users, reacting to the high prices of a year ago, cut back on consumption and imports.

Second quarter cocoa bean import unit values continued downward from the peak reached in the fourth quarter of 1977. However, they were still 6 percent higher than they were a year ago as effects of the 1977/78 short crop in African producing countries remained.

The import unit value of raw sugar strengthened in the second quarter to a level 5 percent higher than the year-earlier quarter, largely reflecting added transportation costs. London Daily Price quotations on raw cane sugar in Caribbean ports averaged lower in the second quarter than a year earlier, but transportation costs from Caribbean ports to New York put the New York spot price at a level higher than it was a year ago.

Import unit values of products in the livestock complex are reflecting the recent price strength that has affected domestic U.S. beef and pork prices because of tight supplies.

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and intransit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS: The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces and diplomatic missions abroad for their own use and supplies for vessels and aircraft engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in non-agricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development); and involving Government payments to exporters through 1974. USDA payments are excluded from the export value. Separate statistics on Government Program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country known to him at the time of shipment from the United States. Shipments of certain U.S. grain from Great Lakes ports to Canadian ports are designated as exports to "unidentified countries." Except for Canada, export shipments valued at \$251-\$999 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued at \$251-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS: Imports for consumption are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Data on shipments valued at less than \$251 are estimated on the basis of a 1-percent sample and are not compiled by commodity. They are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. When the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.
