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
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

U.S. Agricultural Exports To Eastern Europe (see p. 4). Agricultural products account for a large share of U.S. exports to Eastern Europe, averaging about two-thirds of the total during the seventies. U.S. agricultural exports to the area grew from \$270 million in 1970 to a peak of over \$1.4 billion in 1976. Eastern Europe's total agricultural imports meanwhile rose to more than \$9.4 billion in 1977.

Agricultural Exports Up 22 Percent In October-April (see p. 15). Over \$18.5 billion worth of U.S. farm products moved abroad during the first 7 months of fiscal year 1979, compared with \$15.1 billion in similar months the year before. Increased grain and oil-seed shipments and higher prices accounted for most of the gain. Farm product exports to Asia outpaced those to other world regions.

Beef Leads Increase In October-April Agricultural Imports (see p. 49). U.S. agricultural imports totaled \$9.4 billion during the first 7 months of fiscal year 1979, 16 percent higher than a year ago. Beef and veal imports accounted for most of the gain.

Exports Under Concessional Government Programs And Commercial CCC Sales Increase In Calendar Year 1978 (see p. 75). U.S. agricultural exports under concessional Government programs in 1978 totaled \$1,571 million, 7 percent more than a year ago and their highest level since 1964.

Concessional And Commercial U.S. Exports Of Wheat, Rice, And Feedgrains For Fiscal Years 1956-78 (see p. 85). Wheat, rice, and feedgrains continue to be the principal U.S. agricultural exports on a concessional and commercial basis. Over the last 12 years, the share of these commodities exported under Government programs declined considerably as commercial exports rose.

Export And Import Prices Gain In First Quarter Of 1979 (see p. 97). First-quarter prices in 1979 for agricultural exports and imports averaged 4 percent higher over the last quarter of 1978. Increases for soybean and cattle hide export prices more than offset declines for tobacco and rice. Price gains for cattle and beef contributed most to the agricultural import increase.

## U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS TO EASTERN EUROPE

Agricultural trade continues to be important in U.S.-East European relations. Agricultural products accounted for close to two-thirds of total U.S. exports to Eastern Europe during the seventies (table 1). <sup>2/</sup> U.S. exports to the German Democratic Republic (GDR), for example, consisted almost exclusively of agricultural products. However, the share of U.S. agricultural exports to Yugoslavia declined to 13 percent in 1975 and 1976. U.S. agricultural exports to Eastern Europe grew from \$270 million in 1970 to over \$1.4 billion in 1976 and remained near the \$1 billion mark in 1977 and 1978 (table 2).

East European agricultural imports in a given year depend on domestic production and carryover stocks. They also depend on domestic demand for food, feeding efficiency, the export potential for livestock products and processed food, and the ability to pay and/or obtain credit for imports.

The value of total Eastern European agricultural imports increased from \$3.7 billion in 1971 to \$9.4 billion in 1977 (table 3). The share of agricultural imports in Eastern Europe's total imports fluctuated between 13 and 16 percent during this period, depending on domestic production. Poland was the leading agricultural importer throughout 1971-77, followed by the GDR and Czechoslovakia. The growing domestic demand for meats, stimulated by rising per capita income, forced all East European governments to supplement their domestic feed base with imported concentrated feed in quantities which varied according to the annual domestic output.

The U.S. share in East European agricultural imports fluctuated between 7 percent in 1971 and 16 percent in 1976, reaching 10 percent in 1977. Grain and soybean products comprised over 80 percent of total U.S. agricultural exports to Eastern Europe (table 4). The U.S. share in East European grain imports increased from just over one-fifth in 1971 to almost one-half in 1975 and 1976. The U.S. share of East European soybean meal imports ranged between 18 percent in 1972 and 36 percent in 1976. Total U.S. agricultural export value peaked in 1976.

U.S. agricultural sales in the last few years have benefited from Poland's crop shortfalls, reduced U.S.S.R. grain exports to Eastern Europe, and, indirectly, by a shift away from soybean meal imports from Western Europe. Western European soybean meal has been replaced by Brazilian meal, although the United States has maintained its export share (table 5).

Cattle hides stand out in importance among the miscellaneous U.S. exports to Eastern Europe. The U.S. share of the region's total cattle hide imports usually represents a one-quarter share, which will probably be maintained. Hungary's shift to exporting more meats and less live cattle may succeed in increasing domestic hide supplies. However, population growth and improved living standards should increase demand for hides and skins in all countries.

Cotton, tobacco, and lemons were other U.S. exports to Eastern Europe exceeding \$5 million in 1978, and opportunities exist for even greater product exportation. The U.S. potential to participate as an exporter in East European rice imports is limited to about 300,000 tons annually.

Hungary and Yugoslavia in particular have been importers of U.S. Holstein and other cattle breeds in some years. A continuation of interest in animal breeding, and initiation of imports by other countries, would likely occur if foreign exchange were less scarce or credits more attractive.

Grains and oilmeals will continue, as previously, to comprise the bulk of U.S. exports to Eastern Europe. However, the annual U.S. export share, in relation to East European grain and oilseed product imports, will depend on the availability of products from other suppliers and on U.S. competitiveness in quality, prices, and credits.

Importing countries who have a large supplier selection in years of ample world market supplies of grains and oilseeds, nevertheless, are aware that it is prudent to establish a stable import pattern with the United States, the dominant producer of grains and oilseeds. Should a tight world supply occur, regular customers may enjoy priority access to U.S. products. The GDR and Poland, aware of this eventuality, have an understanding with the United States that permits minimum annual grain imports.

Any eventual slowdown of growth in domestic meat consumption would reduce the demand for feed imports. But, the demand for imported feed would also be influenced by domestic feed production, improvement in feeding efficiency, wider utilization of forages by ruminants, upgrading of livestock breeds, and by any improvement in the quality and composition of feed. More feed would also be fed if the demand for foreign market meat strengthens and the profitability of producing it for export increases.

Agricultural imports would furthermore be influenced by the individual countries' balance of payment situation and debt servicing obligation; that is, the ability to pay for needed imports. The East European countries accumulated close to a \$47-billion trade deficit between 1974 and 1978 (table 6). Agricultural trade contributed to the deficit, with an annual negative balance reaching \$3.8 billion in 1977. The hard currency debt by the end of 1978 had reached approximately \$35 billion.

Poland's feed import situation is critical as both domestic meat and feed production are in short supply. The other chronic grain deficit country is the GDR where meat consumption is at such a high level that no further livestock inventory growth is contemplated; accordingly, GDR grain production has a better opportunity to catch up with domestic demand. Eastern Europe, as a whole, is expected to improve its livestock-feed balance and gradually reduce its net grain imports.

Eastern European prospects for reducing their volume of oilseed and oilseed meal imports are dim. The profitability of domestic soybean production is comparatively low and production of synthetic protein too expensive. The best substitutes for imported protein so far are urea or carbamide-treated straw (suitable for ruminant feeding only) and sunflowerseed, pulses, and alfalfa which are being produced on a gradually expanding area. Protein rich feed ingredients will be gradually used in a larger proportion of feed rations, as feeding efficiency receives more emphasis. More protein feed use would generate greater protein imports. This possible growth, however, may not materialize in the near future because of foreign exchange shortages.

Eastern European imports of vegetable oil--another important U.S. export commodity--are unlikely to expand. Increasing crushing capacity, particularly in the southern countries, has induced a shift from oilmeal to oilseed imports to provide additional raw material for domestic vegetable oil production. This premise is less valid in the northern countries where the dominant oilseed is rapeseed. These countries are expected to continue their trade pattern of selling rapeseed and rapeseed oil and purchasing linseed, sunflowerseed, or other vegetable oil.

Long established trade relationships exist between the United States and Poland and Yugoslavia. Title IV of the 1974 Trade Act (the Jackson-Vanik Amendment) established conditions for trade and credits to countries prohibiting free emigration. U.S. agreements were established with Romania in 1975, and with Hungary in 1978. Presidential waivers for the two countries allow MFN (most-favored nation) treatment. Such waivers, reevaluated annually, create uncertainty for the importing countries needing continuous access to the U.S. market.

The Agricultural Trade Expansion Act of 1978 introduced several new features to further U.S. exports, but Title IV restrictions of the 1974 Trade Act remained intact. This new trade act authorizes intermediate-term Commodity Credit Corporation credits (3-10 years) for purchase of U.S. breeding animals, for building of wheat reserves, and constructing facilities for marketing and handling agricultural commodities. Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, and the GDR remain excluded from these programs. It is unlikely, however, that even the eligible East European countries would consider buying wheat for reserve in the foreseeable future, but they may take advantage of intermediate-term credits for importing breeding animals, or construction of storage facilities.

The new bill also authorizes the Secretary of Agriculture to establish between 6 and 25 agricultural trade offices, to be located in countries or regions considered to be valuable or potentially important agricultural importers. The first locations have not yet been fully agreed upon. A trade office concentrating on agricultural products should provide a better opportunity to service important markets and to improve U.S. sales possibilities.

## AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS UP 22 PERCENT IN OCTOBER-APRIL

Exports of farm products in April eased somewhat from March's record level, but remained relatively high, compared with most recent monthly averages and about even with year-earlier rates. April's agricultural exports totaled \$2.65 billion versus \$2.88 billion, during March. The decline in exports between March and April was the result of reduced soybean shipments, which fell to 1.84 million tons from 2.27 million tons. Wheat and cotton volumes remained near March levels, while feedgrains moved up about 5 percent to nearly 5.1 million tons. Other commodity declines from March to April included tallow, poultry meat, hides and skins, almonds, oilcake, vegetable oils, and tobacco.

Cumulative agricultural exports during the current fiscal year increased sharply from the corresponding months of 1977/78. Over \$18.5 billion worth of exports moved abroad from October 1978 through April 1979, compared with \$15.1 billion in the year earlier. Values were higher for grains, oilseeds, cotton, tobacco, hides, meat, poultry, tallow, fruits, and vegetables. Higher prices accounted for most of the 22 percent value increase.

The agricultural trade surplus continued to grow in October-April 1978/79, with exports outpacing imports by nearly \$9.1 billion. The rate of increase--29 percent over 1977/78--slackened somewhat from October-March's 36-percent pace.

Regionally, agricultural export gains to Asia and Latin America outpaced rate increases to Western Europe for the October-April 1978/79 period. Asia took over 37 percent of total U.S. farm product exports during the first 7 months of 1979, compared with 34.6 percent for similar months in 1977/78. Western Europe's share, meanwhile, remained at 35 percent for both periods.

Exports of grains and grain products for the first 7 months of 1979 totaled \$6.18 billion, up 14 percent from their year-earlier value. Increased shipments of corn, wheat, and rice, at appreciably higher prices, accounted for the gain.

Corn's export volume has advanced 7.6 percent to 27 million tons, and value has risen 14 percent to \$2.85 billion, so far this year. Shipments to Asian countries gained nearly 60 percent, reaching 10.5 million tons versus 6.7 million tons in the 1977/78 period. Japan--the largest U.S. market--took 4.7 million tons, about the same as in the first 7 months of fiscal year 1978.

China emerged as Asia's second largest importer of U.S. corn, taking 2.4 million tons, versus none in October-April 1977/78. Shipments to Korea and Taiwan also increased substantially over the prior period. Increased shipments to Eastern Europe and Latin America also helped offset lower export levels to Western Europe and the U.S.S.R. Transshipments through Canadian ports--which reached a record 1.25 million tons valued at \$118 million--were mainly destined for Spain and the U.S.S.R.

Oilseed and product exports for the first 7 months expanded 30 percent in value to \$5.85 billion. Sharp increases in soybeans, sunflower seeds, oilcake and meal, and soybean oil contributed to the gain. The strong foreign demand for U.S. oilseeds, protein meal, and vegetable oils was caused by shortages in other exporting countries--especially Brazil--and the growing use of protein-based animal feed supplements in many countries. Soybean exports rose almost 16 percent above 1978's level to 14.7 million tons. Average prices advanced 15 percent to \$264 per metric ton.

## BEEF LEADS INCREASE IN OCTOBER-APRIL AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS

U.S. agricultural imports totaled \$9.4 billion for the period October 1978 to April 1979, 16 percent higher than a year ago. Beef and veal imports contributed most of the gain. There were also value increases in imports of all other competitive products, except poultry and sugar, and in all major noncompetitive products, except green and roasted coffee, cocoa powder, and chocolate preparations. April imports reached a record \$1,480 million, slightly higher than the previous record set in January 1979 and 13 percent higher than a year ago, mainly because of increases in green coffee and rubber.

Noncompetitive product imports totaled \$4.2 billion--5 percent higher than a year ago. Imports of green coffee--half of all noncompetitive imports--totaled \$2.1 billion, 4 percent less than during the first 7 months of fiscal year 1978. However, because of a drop in green coffee's unit import price (\$1.77 per pound from October 1977 to April 1978 to \$1.34 per pound throughout the first 7 months of fiscal year 1979), the volume imported actually increased 27 percent. April green coffee imports totaled \$340 million, the highest since a year ago. Green coffee's unit import price of \$1.26 per pound reached its lowest monthly level in 3 years.

Noncompetitive product value declines were recorded for roasted coffee, cocoa powder, and chocolate preparations, partly due to falling prices. Price inflation caused increases in imports of bananas, soluble coffee, cocoa beans, cocoa butter, rubber, and spices. Value and quantity gains in fiscal year 1979 are expected for bananas, cocoa beans, rubber, spices, and tea.

Competitive product imports totaled \$5.2 billion during the first 7 months of fiscal year 1979, 27 percent higher than a year ago. Meat and meat products--28 percent of all competitive imports--accounted for most of the gain. Most of the rise in meat imports was in fresh and frozen beef and veal, which accounted for 68 percent of all meat imports, compared with 57 percent of the total during the first 7 months of fiscal year 1978. Fresh and frozen beef and veal totaled \$989 million from October 1978 to April 1979, more than double the previous period. However, due to a 43-percent gain in unit import prices, the quantity imported rose by about 26 percent. Meat imports in fiscal year 1979 are expected to increase by about 13 percent in volume and 40 percent in value.

Other major competitive product imports that increased during the first 7 months of fiscal year 1979 included live animals, dairy products, hides and skins, fruits, vegetables, nuts, vegetable oils, tobacco, wine, and malt beverages.

It is estimated that coconut and palm oil imports will decline in fiscal year 1979, the result of continued high prices.<sup>1/</sup> Coconut oil unit import price rose slightly over half while palm oil prices rose 27 percent in the first 7 months of fiscal year 1979. Palm oil use decreases when its prices are higher than domestic soybean oil.

Sugar imports totaled \$396 million throughout October 1978 to April 1979--18 percent less than a year ago. U.S. import fees for sugar were reduced to \$2.76 per pound for raw sugar and \$3.28 per pound for refined sugar, effective April 1, 1979. It is expected that sugar import volume and value will rise in fiscal year 1979.

## EXPORTS UNDER CONCESSIONAL GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS AND COMMERCIAL CCC SALES INCREASE IN CALENDAR YEAR 1978

U.S. agricultural exports under concessional Government-financed programs in calendar year 1978 totaled \$1,571 million, 7 percent more than a year ago and their highest level since 1964 (table 25). Exports under Public Law 480 were valued at \$1.1 billion, 9 percent more than the previous year as increased shipments under Title I credit sales more than offset a small decline in Title II donations. Disbursements under Agency for International Development (AID) programs rose to their highest level since the midfifties.

Over 70 countries received concessional exports in calendar years 1977 and 1978; however, 5 countries—Egypt, Israel, Indonesia, India, and Bangladesh—received about two-thirds of the total. Egypt, the leading recipient in both years, took 25 percent of 1978's total concessional exports, a share slightly higher than the previous year. Nearly the entire increase in Government exports to Egypt in 1978 was provided under AID programs and accounted for about one-third of all concessional exports to that country.

Israel, the second leading recipient during the last 2 years, received 16 percent of 1978's total concessional exports, almost all under AID auspices. Indonesia, the third 1978 recipient, was up from fourth place in 1977. India dropped to fourth place in 1978, while Bangladesh, the fifth recipient in both years, received 6 percent of 1978's total concessional exports.

U.S. commercial agricultural exports reached a record of \$27.8 billion in calendar year 1978, about one-fourth higher than the previous year and two-thirds above 5 years ago. Shipments under 1978 concessional programs accounted for only about 5 percent of all U.S. agricultural exports, as in the past 5 years.

Japan remains the leading commercial market, purchasing 16 percent of all cash agricultural exports in 1978. The next four top cash markets in 1978 were the Netherlands, the U.S.S.R., Canada, and the Federal Republic of Germany. Korea, a major Public Law 480 recipient, has been among the 10 leading commercial markets for several years. Commercial agricultural exports to Korea reached a record of over \$1 billion in calendar year 1978, 30 percent higher than the previous year and one-half more than 5 years ago. 1/

Exports under Public Law 480 Title I (long-term dollar credit and convertible foreign currency sales) totaled \$794 million in 1978, 12 percent more than a year ago. There were value increases in all commodities exported under Title I, except for bulgur wheat, cotton, and tobacco (table 27). Wheat accounted for about 45 percent of all shipments under Title I in 1978. Wheat's value under Title I rose by 24 percent due to rising prices, while the quantity increased by only 1 percent (table 28). Wheat went to 22 countries; however, 5 countries—Egypt, Bangladesh, Korea, Portugal, and Pakistan—took about 70 percent of the total. Rice accounted for about one-fifth of exports under Title I. Rising prices increased the value of rice shipped 13 percent, while the quantity declined 6 percent. Most of the rice, exported to 10 recipient countries, went to Indonesia.

Donations under Title II programs totaled \$337 million in 1978, 3 percent less than a year earlier. The 1978 figure is somewhat understated due to reporting time lags. Over two-thirds of Title II donations were distributed through voluntary relief agencies and about one-fifth through the World Food Program, with the remainder under direct Government-to-Government arrangements. India, one of the over 70 recipient countries, received nearly 30 percent of the total donations and Bangladesh, the second recipient, 7 percent of the total.

Bulgur wheat, the leading commodity donated in 1978, accounted for nearly 20 percent of all Title II shipments. However, the value of bulgur wheat donated rose more than the volume due to price increases. Other major Title II donations registering value increases included feedgrains and feedgrain products, rice, and soybean oil, and value declines were recorded for nonfat dry milk, wheat, wheat flour, blended food products, sorghum and peanut oil. The quantity of donated blended food products and nonfat dry milk increased in 1978. The decline in the value of blended products was generally due to lower export prices, while dry milk's value was lowered because of a change in the method of charging the Title II budget.

Disbursements for agricultural commodities under AID programs totaled \$440 million in calendar year 1978, 5 percent more than a year earlier and nearly 4 times more than in 1973. Slightly over half of all AID disbursements (mainly wheat, corn and soybeans) went to Israel. The remainder (mostly corn, inedible tallow, cottonseed oil, and tobacco) went to Egypt.

Wheat, valued at \$427 million in calendar year 1978, was the leading agricultural commodity under concessional programs, accounting for about 27 percent of total Government shipments. Inflation caused the value of concessional wheat to rise 14 percent, while the volume exported fell 6 percent. Over four-fifths of the wheat was exported under Title I and the remainder generally divided between Title II and AID programs. About 10 percent of all U.S. wheat exports were under concessional programs in 1978. Commercial wheat exports rose both in quantity and value, but price increases led to a greater value gain.

Corn, valued at \$208 million, was the second leading commodity under concessional aid in calendar year 1978. Its value--about 70 percent under AID programs--declined, while the quantity increased as a result of lower prices. Only about 4 percent of all corn exports were concessional.

Rice, valued at \$176 million, was the next leading concessional export in calendar year 1978. Because of rising prices, rice's value--almost all under Title I--rose by about one-fifth, with the quantity rising by only 1 percent. About 20 percent of all U.S. rice exports were concessional.

Price increases caused soybean oil, the fourth leading concessional product, to rise more in value than in quantity during calendar year 1978. About two-thirds of the soybean oil was shipped under Title I programs. Concessional soybean oil exports accounted for about 27 percent of all soybean oil exports in calendar year 1978.

Six percent of all commercial agricultural exports in calendar year 1978 were financed under the Commodity Credit Corporation's (CCC) commercial Export Credit Sales Program.<sup>2/</sup> CCC credit sales totaled over \$1.6 billion, nearly double the previous year, and they set a record.<sup>3/</sup> There were large increases in CCC credit sales of wheat, corn, soybeans, soybean meal, and cotton (table 31). CCC-financed credit sales in 1978 went to 23 countries in all regions of the world. About 30 percent each of the total went to Korea and Poland, while another 12 percent went to Portugal, and 7 percent went to Pakistan.

## CONCESSIONAL AND COMMERCIAL U.S. EXPORTS OF WHEAT, RICE, AND FEEDGRAINS FOR FISCAL YEARS 1956-78

Wheat, rice, and feedgrains continue to be the principal U.S. agricultural exports on a concessional and commercial basis. The share of these commodities exported under concessional Government programs during the last 12 years declined as commercial exports rose (fig. 1). While over two-thirds of all wheat exports were under Government programs during fiscal years 1956-65, this share dropped to an annual average of 46 percent for fiscal years 1966-70, and to 15 percent or less for 1973-78. The annual average for feedgrains exports under concessional programs was about one-third throughout fiscal years 1956-60, but, since fiscal 1965, has fallen to less than 10 percent of the total. Rice exports under Government programs annually averaged around 44 percent or more throughout 1956-73; however, the concessional share for rice declined to 24 percent during the next 4 years.

### Wheat

U.S. wheat exports rose from an annual average of \$644 million throughout 1956-60 to a high of \$4.8 billion in 1976, but totaled only \$3.9 billion in 1978 as a result of lower prices (table 32). The quantity of wheat exported rose from nearly 10 million metric tons annually from 1956 to 1960 to 30.6 million tons in 1976, reaching a high of 31.8 million tons in fiscal 1978.

Wheat was the leading commodity exported under Government programs from 1956 to 1978. Its value amounted to \$11.4 billion (166 million metric tons), and its share accounted for nearly two-fifths of all exports under concessional programs. 1/ The share was considerably higher in some years. Most of the concessional wheat exports moved under Public Law 480 programs, primarily Title I credit sales for local currencies and long-term dollar or convertible foreign currencies. 2/ About 60 percent of all concessional wheat exports were Title I sales for local currencies which ended in 1972.

Government program wheat exports reached a \$869-million peak (13.4 million metric tons) in fiscal 1965, declining to a \$182-million low (1.2 million metric tons) in 1974, mainly due to short supplies. Concessional wheat exports totaled \$406 million in fiscal 1978, somewhat less than during the 3 previous years. The quantity of wheat under Government programs in 1978 was 3.4 million tons, less than the previous year but still higher than in 1975 and 1976.

Of all wheat under concessional programs, about 85 percent was shipped to some 70 developing countries. Eleven developing countries took nearly three-fourths of all wheat under Government programs during fiscal years 1956-78. India, the principal recipient, received nearly 30 percent of all concessional wheat exports for the 1956-78 period, followed by Pakistan, with 11 percent of the total.

Commercial sales of wheat have risen to most developing country recipients, particularly Brazil, Chile, India, Korea, Pakistan, Taiwan, and Morocco. All wheat exports to Brazil, Taiwan, and Iran have been commercial since fiscal year 1972. For nearly 5 years, Brazil, Korea, and Iran have generally been among the top 10 cash markets for U.S. wheat. U.S. commercial wheat exports to India—the principal aid recipient—increased from annual average of \$8 million during fiscal 1966-70 to over \$500 million in 1975 and 1976. India, in those 2 years, was the second leading cash market for U.S. wheat. Wheat exports to India declined considerably in 1977 and 1978 because of the country's increased domestic production.

Rice

U.S. rice exports rose from an annual average of \$120 million (759,000 metric tons) during fiscal years 1956-60 to a record \$1 billion or 2.3 million tons in fiscal 1975 (tables 35 and 36). However, by fiscal year 1978, rice exports were down to \$833 million (2.1 million tons).

Government program rice exports totaled \$3.2 billion during 1956-78. Concessional rice rose from an annual average of about \$70 million during fiscal 1956-65 to a \$234-million high in 1974, declining to \$168 million in 1978. The quantity exported under Government programs reached a 1.2-million-metric-ton peak in 1972 then dropped to 520,000 tons in fiscal 1978, lower than the amount shipped annually during 1961-65. Almost all concessional rice was shipped under Public Law 480 Title I sales.

Concessional rice exports went to over 100 countries during the 1956-78 period; however, more than two-thirds of the total went to only four countries—South Vietnam (until 1975), Indonesia, Korea, and India. Bangladesh, since fiscal year 1975, has generally been a major recipient of Title I rice exports; and during 1973-75, Cambodia also received substantial amounts. Approximately 20 African countries were recipients of concessional rice exports in the last 2 years (table 37). With the exception of Korea during fiscal years 1973-75, commercial rice sales to major aid recipients were generally small over the last 20 years.

Feedgrains

U.S. feedgrain exports increased from an annual average of \$433 million (8.6 million metric tons) throughout fiscal years 1956-60 to a record \$5.7 billion (55.5 million tons) in 1978. Concessional feedgrain exports, since fiscal 1965, have accounted for less than 10 percent of all feedgrain exports, the share being less than 5 percent for the last 5 years.

From 1956 to 1978, feedgrains (mostly corn) under Government programs totaled nearly \$2.7 billion, or 43 million metric tons. Of this amount, 45 percent was under Public Law 480 Title I sales, about 20 percent each were under Public Law 480 barter sales (mainly from 1955-63) and Agency for International Development programs. The remainder was shipped under Public Law 480 Title II donations.<sup>4/</sup>

Even though over 50 countries received concessional feedgrain exports, almost the entire amount went to four—Israel, Korea, Greece, and Spain. Substantial amounts of concessional feedgrain exports also went to various developed countries, such as the European Community, Austria, Poland, and Japan during fiscal 1955-62. <sup>5/</sup> Portugal, in recent years, has also been a major recipient. Over 20 African countries have been recipients of small amounts of concessional feedgrain exports in the last several years.


Commercial exports of feedgrains have increased considerably to such major aid recipients as Korea, India, and Israel. With the exception of Portugal, in the last 10 years only commercial feedgrain exports have gone to developed countries. Japan is the leading cash market for U.S. feedgrains. All feedgrain exports to Korea were commercial for fiscal years 1975-77. Commercial feedgrain exports to Korea in 1978 reached a record \$174 million, compared with an annual average <sup>^1</sup> \$1 million from 1966 to 1970.


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## EXPORT AND IMPORT PRICES GAIN IN FIRST QUARTER OF 1979

First-quarter 1979 prices of both U.S. agricultural exports and imports rose 4 percent from the previous quarter. Prices for nearly every major commodity were on the upswing, with cattle hides and soybeans registering the largest gains. Flue-cured tobacco and milled rice were the only major export commodities with declining quarter-to-quarter prices. Compared to the first quarter a year ago, export prices have made a more noticeable upturn of 8 percent with wheat and soybeans making substantial gains.

Import commodity prices jumped 4 percent from the fourth quarter of 1978 to first-quarter 1979 and, overall, were steady when compared to a year earlier. First-quarter coffee prices continued their downward trend.

Sugar prices experienced a recent upturn, but they were still lower than a year earlier. Beef and cattle continued to show considerable strength, while canned ham prices made moderate gains. Coffee, wine, tobacco, tomatoes, mushrooms, wool, and tea were the only major import commodities experiencing any price decline from the fourth quarter of 1978 to the first quarter of 1979. All price developments are following the fundamental situations that have developed in the current crop year.

A smaller U.S. wheat crop, coupled with strong export demand and the price support effect of the U.S. farmer owned reserve program, has buoyed wheat's export price.

The 1978 U.S. corn crop set a record. However, the same strong export demand and the price support effect of the U.S. farmer owned reserve program kept corn's export unit value at \$107 a metric ton, 4 percent higher than a year earlier.

Soybean's export unit value, at \$274 a metric ton, was 19 percent higher than last year's. Short crops in Brazil boosted U.S. soybean prices.

Larger coffee supplies generally dampened coffee prices among imports. The import unit value of coffee, at \$2.94 a kilogram, was one-fourth less than it was a year ago.

Cocoa bean prices, formerly strong because of crop shortages, were dampened by the new crop. Its first-quarter import unit value, at \$3.53 a kilogram, is due to earlier crop conditions. The current sugar outlook is one of plentiful supplies brought about by the slight decline in sugar's year-earlier import unit value.

### April 1979 Price Developments

U.S. export prices for major commodities experienced a lull during April. U.S. Gulf Port prices for wheat and corn stayed within 3 cents a bushel of March levels and soybeans registered a 13-cent decline. Rice and cotton prices at Bangkok and Osaka, respectively, moved only slightly.

Wider price swings occurred in the major import commodities. Plentiful supplies caused the New York price for sugar and cocoa beans to decline 8 percent and 5 percent, respectively. Imported beef and crude rubber prices, in contrast, continued to climb because of tight world situations. April 1979 price quotations for wheat, soybeans, cotton, beef, and rubber were all higher than a year ago, while prices for corn, rice, sugar, and coffee were lower.
