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

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DIGEST

Japan's Market Demand And Competition In 1978 (see p. 4). U.S. agricultural exports to Japan in 1978 increased 7.4 percent in volume and 15 percent in value over the previous period. Coarse grains, soybeans, wheat, cotton, meat and poultry, cattle hides, tobacco, and citrus accounted for about 85 percent of the record \$4.44 billion of U.S. agricultural exports to Japan.

U.S. Agricultural Exports Up In Fiscal Year 1978 (see p. 13). U.S. farm product exports totaled \$27.3 billion in fiscal year 1978 (October 1, 1977 through September 30, 1978), 14 percent above the previous year. Increases were registered in almost every commodity group. Every State shared to some extent in the performance, with the exception of Alaska. Ten States accounted for over 60 percent of the total: Illinois, Iowa, Texas, California, Minnesota, Indiana, Kansas, Nebraska, Missouri, and Ohio. There were export declines in dairy products, vegetables and preparations, and lard and tallow.

U.S. Farm Product Exports Up 28 Percent (see p. 22). Export value for October 1978 through February 1979 totaled \$13 billion, more than 28 percent above similar months a year earlier. Increased tonnages for grains, oilseeds, and cotton, combined with higher prices, were mainly responsible. Exports to most regions grew sharply, especially Asia and Latin America.

U.S. Agricultural Imports Increase One-Fifth In First 5 Months (see p. 63). U.S. agricultural imports totaled \$6.6 billion during the first 5 months of fiscal 1979, one-fifth higher than a year ago. Almost all noncompetitive and all major competitive imports, gained in value, except sugar.

World Export And Import Price Levels For Calendar Year 1978 (see p. 100). World export and import unit values averaged about the same for calendar year 1978. Most grains and grain products, tobacco, soybean oil, tallow, and cattle hides were priced higher during 1978, while soybeans, soybean meal, cotton, and nonfat dried milk were priced lower. Among import commodities, declines in import unit values for coffee and tea were offset by higher prices for most other major commodities.

JAPAN'S MARKET DEMAND AND COMPETITION IN 1978

U.S. agricultural exports to Japan in 1978 increased 7.4 percent in volume and 15 percent in value over the previous period. Coarse grains, soybeans, wheat, cotton, meat and poultry, cattle hides, tobacco, and citrus accounted for about 85 percent of the record \$4.44 billion of U.S. agricultural exports to Japan.

Overall food imports were up 4.7 percent as per capita real income increased 4.8 percent over 1977 levels. In addition, increases in retail food prices were slowed to 3.7 percent as real prices of food imports were down 17.6 percent mostly as a result of the appreciation of the yen. Domestic agricultural production was off 1.3 percent.

U.S. agricultural imports from Japan increased 16.6 percent to a value of \$92.4 million. Imports of canned mandarin sections increased 25 percent to \$22.3 million, canned and dried mushrooms increased 52 percent to \$7.4 million, and alcoholic beverages were up 19 percent to \$6.2 million. These three items accounted for almost 40 percent of U.S. agricultural imports from Japan.

The United States increased its share of Japanese imports of beef and veal, pork, coarse grains, raisins, alfalfa meal, soybean meal, tobacco, cattle hides, soybeans, and cotton. Large volume gains were made in beef and veal, corn, oranges, soybeans, and cotton. The United States lost ground in its share of poultry, wheat, corn, sorghum, grapefruit, peanuts, and tallow.

The volume of coarse grain imports increased 6.5 percent with Japanese formula feed production increasing at a similar rate of 6.4 percent. The U.S. supplied 63 percent of the total. Japanese livestock producers enjoyed a profitable year. Product prices dropped an average of 2.3 percent, but commercial feed prices fell at a more rapid rate of 10.4 percent, largely in part to the 22-percent appreciation of the yen (against the U.S. dollar) during the year. The product/feed price ratio jumped 9.0 percent. Production was up in 1978 for pork (9.9 percent); eggs (4.2 percent); chicken (13.4 percent); milk (7.21 percent); and beef (15.8 percent).

Government policy continued to protect the domestic livestock industry with an import quota on beef and veal, a high tariff on poultry (25 percent), and a variable levy on pork. Imports of pork were down 6.4 percent; beef and veal imports were up 19 percent as Japan's import quota was increased from 92,000 tons in Japanese Fiscal Year (JFY) 1977 to 107,000 tons in JFY 1978. Poultry imports increased 24.5 percent as chicken continued to replace fish in the Japanese diet. The Japanese Government in October, 1978 began to enforce a two-and-a-half-year-old regulation placing imports of inside skirts under the beef import quota. Imports of inside skirts reached about 10,000 tons in 1978, according to industry estimates, before quota restrictions were applied.

Retail prices for fresh fish and salted dried fish rose 2.8 and 23.4 percent, respectively, in 1978. Prices of meat and milk products showed a slight decline and egg prices dropped 3.9 percent. A recent Government survey showed increased Japanese household purchases (January-October 1978) of beef (11.4 percent), pork (1.7), and chicken (7.1). Annual per capita consumption of fish began to decline for the first time in 1977 and is expected to continue falling as other meat items and livestock products become relatively less expensive than fish and fish products.

Wheat imports dropped 2 percent in 1978, registering a decline for the second consecutive year. Total domestic consumption was up about 2 percent. Domestic production increased 55 percent to 367,000 tons and was largely responsible for the decline in

imports. Wheat will continue to be a priority crop under the Paddy Land Use Reorganization Program initiated in JFY 1978.

Soybean imports were up an impressive 18 percent in 1978 with 97 percent coming from the United States. Part of the increase was due to increasing stocks that had been adjusted downward in 1977 as well as an increase in the relative proportion of soybean meal in formula feed--from 10.8 percent in 1977 to 11.4 percent in 1978. Soybean meal imports were up 8 percent with 79 percent from the United States and most of the remainder from Brazil. Sluggish demand for soy oil made Japanese crushers reluctant to expand capacity.

Cotton imports were up 10.3 percent. The Japanese cotton spinners had a better year in 1978, as raw cotton prices dropped almost 35 percent in terms of yen. The spinner's production cutback cartel was dissolved in mid-1978, as rationalization efforts continued, and general economic conditions facing the cotton textile and spinning industry improved. The United States improved its share of imports, from 32.3 percent in 1977 to 35.8 in 1978. Other important suppliers were Latin American countries (30 percent) and the Soviet Union (14 percent).

An agricultural agreement between the United States and Japan under the Multilateral Trade Negotiations was concluded on December 5, 1978. The Japanese offered tariff concessions on over 150 agricultural items. Nontariff concessions included expanded import quotas on high-quality beef, fresh oranges, and citrus juice. An earlier agreement signed in January 1978 increased quotas for JFY 1978 (April 1978-March 1979) on high-quality beef (6,000 to 16,800 tons), on fresh oranges (15,000 to 45,000 tons), and citrus juice (2,000 to 4,000 tons). U.S. exports of beef and veal and fresh oranges as a result were up 67 percent and 121 percent, respectively. The value of U.S. citrus juice exports was up 42 percent. The expanded quotas represented about \$50 million in additional U.S. trade in 1978. The December 5 agreement set targets for expanding the quotas on high-quality beef, fresh oranges, and citrus juice even more to 30,800 tons, 82,000 tons, and 12,500 tons, respectively, by 1983.

Japan announced on December 26 its plan to dispose of 4.6 to 4.8 million tons (brown basis) of surplus rice over a 5-year period at a cost of 950 billion yen (\$5 billion) budgeted over 7 years. Japan has had difficulty bringing its rice production and consumption into balance and has reluctantly resorted to this expensive disposal program. Efforts to divert paddy acreage in 1978 were successful but unusually good weather boosted yields. Area was down 7.6 percent but total production was off only 3.9 percent and still well above overall consumption requirements, thus adding to already large surplus stocks. It is hoped that with this disposal program, and a paddy land diversion program which will encourage farmers to shift out of rice production into certain priority crops, that rice production and consumption will be in better balance by 1983.

The surplus disposal schedules for the first 3 years are as follows:

The schedule for 1982 and 1983 will probably be similar although possibly accommodating larger volumes. The producer price is currently about 275,000 yen (\$1.375) per ton. 1/

1/ Calculations assume exchange rate of 200 yen = 1 U.S. dollar.

Competitive prices for the use of rice in feed and for industrial uses will be approximately 25,000 yen (\$125) per ton and 143,000 yen (\$715) per ton, respectively. To compete in export markets, the price would have to approach 60,000-70,000 yen (\$300-\$350) per ton. The difference between the producer price and these other prices accounts for the enormous cost of the program.

The Government would like to channel as much of the surplus rice as possible into industrial uses and export and thereby minimize its losses. There seem to be some limitations in both of these alternatives. An average of 745,000 tons of rice has been used for industrial purposes in recent years. An additional 300,000 annually would mean an increase in utilization of 40 percent which seems like an enormous additional amount for the economy to absorb over a short period of time.

Japan has also exported substantial quantities of rice before. Average yearly rice exports were 500,000 tons in the early seventies. These exports were subsidized under a similar disposal program when stocks were even more excessive than they are today. Price and quality competitiveness will be the key in moving 200,000 tons annually into export channels. Some will also be provided as food aid. Likely markets for Japanese rice will be the Southeast Asian countries of Malaysia, Singapore, and Indonesia.

About 100,000 tons of rice are expected to be used in formula feed production in the first year of the program, with rice utilization probably starting in July or August. In the following 4 years, 500,000 tons will probably be subsidized for use in formula feed. Nutritionally, rice is quite similar to corn and sorghum and it is expected that the rice will displace these grains on a one-to-one basis. During the earlier rice disposal program, the use of rice had an adverse impact on U.S. exports of both corn and sorghum. Between 1970 and 1971, the first year of the program, the volume of U.S. corn exports to Japan dropped 39 percent. U.S. sorghum exports also dropped about 28 percent in volume. Overall formula feed production in 1971, however, increased 4.3 percent.

The Japanese surplus rice disposal program will have an adverse effect on U.S. exports of rice and Public Law 480 grants to third countries, particularly in Southeast Asia, depending on quality and price considerations. The impact will be felt in 1979 as well as the following 4 years. Subsidizing the use of rice in formula feed production will have an even greater impact on U.S. trade. About 65 to 70 percent of the total Japanese corn and sorghum imports come from the United States. The United States would, therefore, stand to lose about 350,000 tons a year in corn and/or sorghum exports to Japan from 1980 through 1983. The first year would represent a smaller loss of about 70,000 tons. Since the protein content of rice is slightly less than that of corn or sorghum, there might be a slight increase in demand for high-protein meals in hog and poultry rations.

U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS UP IN FISCAL YEAR 1978

U.S. farm product exports totaled \$27.3 billion in fiscal year 1978 (October 1, 1977 through September 30, 1978), 14 percent above the previous year. Increases were registered in almost every commodity group, including sunflower seeds (up 93 percent), followed by peanuts and peanut oil (40 percent), and wheat and wheat products (35 percent). There were export declines in dairy products, vegetables and preparations, and lard and tallow.

Every State had significant exports except Alaska. Ten States accounted for over 60 percent of the total: Illinois, Iowa, Texas, California, Minnesota, Indiana, Kansas, Nebraska, Missouri, and Ohio.

Soybeans, feedgrains, wheat, cotton, and tobacco comprised 71 percent of the total U.S. agricultural export value in fiscal 1978.

Soybeans and Products

Soybean exports continued their upward trend, moving from second to first place among the principal commodities exported during fiscal year 1978. Corn Belt States such as Illinois, Iowa, Missouri, and Indiana are the largest soybean producers. However, Minnesota gained in importance last year and preceded Ohio and the Delta States. Over 40 percent of U.S. soybean production was exported last year and if soybean products are added, nearly 55 percent of the soybean harvest was exported.

Feedgrains and Products

Feedgrain exports (corn, grain, sorghum, barley and oats, and products) reached nearly \$6 billion during fiscal 1978, ranking second in the national total. The four leading Corn Belt States (Illinois, Iowa, Nebraska, and Indiana) accounted for over half of the U.S. export shares. Feedgrain exports represent about 30 percent of U.S. production.

Wheat and Products

Wheat and flour exports -- recovering from the declining trend of preceding years -- rebounded strongly in fiscal 1978, to total \$4.1 billion, a 35-percent increase from the previous year. Northern Plains States (mainly Kansas and North Dakota) are the largest contributors in wheat exports, accounting for almost one-third of the total, while Oklahoma and Texas increased their importance considerably. Over 60 percent of the U.S. wheat production was exported during fiscal 1978.

Cotton

Cotton exports registered an 11-percent value gain from last year totaling \$1.7 billion in fiscal 1978. Texas, California, Mississippi, Arizona, and Arkansas are the largest cotton growing States. Approximately 44 percent of all cotton production was exported.

Tobacco

Tobacco, the fifth largest farm commodity export during fiscal 1978 grossed over \$1.1 billion. Although U.S. tobacco shipments declined by 6 percent in volume from last year, export value rose by the same percentage because of higher prices. Shares of four States (North Carolina, Kentucky, South Carolina, and Georgia) accounted for over 80 percent of total exports. About one-third of all tobacco grown was exported in fiscal 1978.

Methodology

The values shown in this report should be regarded as reflecting the States' shares in national exports. To the extent that the Nation benefits from the export of a commodity, benefits accrue to all producers of that commodity even though relatively more of the production or sale of the commodity may be exported from a given (coastal) State than from a noncoastal State.

The values for agricultural exports shown for the States should not be interpreted as actual measurements of State origins of national exports. Most commodities pass through several storage points before being actually exported - losing their place of origin in the process.

Since limited records are available on shipments between States, the statistics on exports by States were based on domestic shares for the identifiable commodities according to each State's share of production or sales (feedgrains). The formula used to determine a State's export share of a commodity or commodity group was as follows:

$$X = A \times \frac{C}{B}$$

X = State export share in dollars.

A = Value of each U.S. commodity or commodity group exported in fiscal 1978.

B = Total U.S. commodity volume produced or sold during calendar year 1977.

C = Commodity volume produced or value of sales in a State during calendar year 1977.

Example: U.S. rice exports in fiscal year 1978 were valued at \$833,378,000 (A). Arkansas' production was 35,396,000 CWT (B); U.S. production in 1977 totaled 99,223,000 CWT (C).

$$\text{Thus: } X = A \times \frac{C}{B} = \$833,378,000 \times \frac{35,396,000}{99,223,000} = \$297,292$$

U.S. FARM PRODUCT EXPORTS UP 28 PERCENT

U.S. farm product exports during the first 5 months of fiscal 1979 continued to outpace last year's level. Export value for October 1978 through February 1979 totaled \$13 billion, more than 28 percent above similar months a year earlier. February's export rate eased somewhat to \$2.36 billion from the \$2.43 billion recorded in January, reflecting lower soybean shipments.

The volume of principal agricultural exports reached 55 million tons during the first 5 months of fiscal 1979 versus 50 million tons in October-February 1977/78. Increases occurred for wheat, corn, soybeans, and cotton.

The U.S. agricultural trade surplus approached \$7.66 billion for the period October 1978 to February 1979, about 29 percent above that of like months the previous year. Asia was the major regional market for U.S. agricultural exports in the October-February 1978/79 period, taking over \$4.8 billion or 37 percent of the total. Asia's share was less than 34 percent the previous year, ranking second behind Western Europe.

Strong growth in exports to all Asian subregions, Japan, and the People's Republic of China made shipments to that area outstrip those to Western Europe. Agricultural exports to Latin America also increased sharply, especially flows to Brazil and Mexico. Demand for U.S. grain in Latin America continued strong through February.

Exports to the U.S.S.R. fell below the 1977/78 pace as coarse grain shipments dropped sharply, in contrast to the uptrends for other regions. Improved crop production in the U.S.S.R. has reduced import demand for U.S. feedgrains.

Total U.S. wheat exports in February were down from year-earlier levels, but October-February volume remained well above similar months last year. Higher prices also resulted in a 41-percent value gain. Feedgrain tonnage rose slightly as increased shipments to China, Korea, Brazil, and Mexico more than offset declines to the U.S.S.R. and Poland.

Soybean export tonnage jumped 18 percent with larger shipments to Japan, Spain, the U.S.S.R., and Taiwan. Value soared 38 percent because of higher prices. Shortages of soybeans in Brazil, coupled with expanded world demand, led to the higher U.S. export levels.

Other commodities showing export increases for the 5-month period included tallow, beef, poultry, hides, cotton, tobacco, rice, alfalfa meal, oilcake and meal, sunflower seeds, soybean oil, pulses, and hops.

U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS INCREASE ONE-FIFTH IN FIRST 5 MONTHS

U.S. agricultural imports totaled \$6.6 billion during the first 5 months of fiscal 1979, one-fifth higher than a year ago. Almost all noncompetitive and all major competitive imports gained in value except sugar. Because of substantial increases in cocoa beans, beef and veal, and vegetable oils, January imports totaled nearly \$1.5 billion--a record. February imports dropped 16 percent below January's rate, but were slightly higher than a year ago. Value declines in imports of coffee, sugar, and vegetable oils mainly caused the February downturn.

Noncompetitive product imports totaled about \$3 billion during October 1978 to February 1979, 13 percent higher than a year ago. Substantial value gains in cocoa, cocoa products, and rubber accounted for most of the increase in noncompetitive imports.

Green coffee imports totaled about \$1.5 billion, slightly higher than a year ago; however, the quantity rose by about one-third. Import unit prices of green coffee declined by one-fourth, from \$1.81 per pound during October 1977 to February 1978 to \$1.36 per pound in the first 5 months of fiscal 1979.

Competitive product imports totaled \$3.6 billion, about 30 percent higher than last year. Meat and meat products--over one-fourth of all competitive imports--accounted for the major increase. Imports of fresh and frozen beef and veal, valued at \$648 million, more than doubled in value but rose about one-third in volume imported. Import prices of fresh and frozen beef and veal increased about two-thirds during the first 5 months of fiscal 1979.

Value gains were also substantial for live animals, dairy products, vegetable oils, vegetables, tobacco, wine, and malt beverages. Vegetable oil imports rose by over half in value as the gain in coconut oil (over half of all vegetable oil imports) more than offset the decline in palm oil imports. The quantity of imported vegetable oils declined, while import unit prices increased substantially. Imports of sugar, valued at nearly \$84 million, declined about one-third from a year ago. Sugar imports in December 1977 reached record levels due to the anticipated increase in import fees imposed in January 1978.

Agricultural imports for fiscal 1979 are forecast at a high of \$14.8 billion, about 6 percent higher than last year. 1/ Because of anticipated higher prices, value gains are expected for meats, sugar, fruits, and vegetables. Value gains in meat and meat products represent over three-fourths of the expected total increase in imports. Volume gains are forecast for imports of meat, sugar, green coffee, tea, tobacco, wine, and spices. U.S. beef production is expected to decline for the second year, causing short supplies, higher prices, and increased imports. The voluntary restraint level for meat imports subject to Public Law 88-482 (mainly fresh and frozen beef and veal) in calendar 1979 is 712,000 tons, up from 677,000 in 1978.

An increase in value of approximately 10 percent is anticipated for U.S. sugar imports. World sugar production in fiscal 1979 is estimated to be slightly less than last year's record crop, with world consumption expected to register an alltime high. 2/ U.S. imports are expected to rise 4 percent in volume because of decreased U.S. sugar beet production and prospects that the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) will acquire large quantities of the 1978 crop under loan. To maintain the 15-cent-per-pound domestic price objective, the CCC increased sugar import fees April 1, 1979. The new fees are 3.35 cents per pound for raw sugar and 3.87 cents per pound for refined sugar.

The volume of coconut oil in fiscal 1979 is expected to decline, while U.S. volume imports of palm oil may rise slightly this fiscal year.^{3/} If prices become competitive with domestic soybean oil, a rebound in Malaysian palm oil production could encourage expanded U.S. imports. It is expected that coconut oil prices will continue at a high level with supplies reduced in the Philippines.



WORLD EXPORT AND IMPORT PRICE LEVELS FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1978

World export and import unit values averaged about the same for calendar year 1978 as for the previous year. Wheat, wheat flour, tobacco, corn, corn-based byproducts, rice, soybean oil, and whole cattle hides were priced higher, while grain sorghum, soybeans, soybean oil, soybean meal, cotton, and nonfat dried milk were priced lower. Among import items, declines in import unit values for coffee and tea were offset by higher prices for other major items.

The U.S. export unit value for wheat reached \$127 a ton, up 12 percent from a year ago, and the U.S. export unit value for corn rose 4 percent (to \$105 a ton). Underlying the wheat price situation was an 8-percent decline in 1977/78 world wheat production. The 5-percent decline in 1977/78 U.S. crops, together with strong export demand, buoyed the U.S. export price, but the downturn in production was tempered by the buildups in world wheat stocks.

The U.S. corn situation was affected by the bumper 1977/78 U.S. corn crop and the slight decline in world coarse grain production. The export unit value for corn byproducts used for feed increased 14 percent in response to strong foreign demand.

Prices in the soybean complex declined as U.S. soybean production recovered from the downturn of the 1976/77 marketing year. The export unit value for soybean meal declined 12 percent, while the U.S. export unit value for soybeans declined 7 percent. Strong foreign buying of soybean oil was sufficient to drive the U.S. export unit value 6 percent higher than a year ago, however.

A 9-percent increase in the 1977/78 world cotton crop, coupled with a record U.S. outturn, dampened the U.S. cotton export unit value, causing a 31-percent price decline.

Coffee and tea were the only major import commodities facing declining import unit values from 1977 to 1978. The 21-percent price decline (to \$3.43 a kilogram) resulted from the 1977/78 recovery in coffee production. The import unit value for cocoa beans responded to a tight supply situation by increasing 13 percent. The import unit value for sugar showed surprising strength by rising 19 percent to \$233 a ton, after two seasons of record production.

Import prices for meat and livestock have strengthened along with domestic U.S. meat prices. Imported beef and veal was priced 35 percent higher in 1978 than in 1977, while canned hams were 9 percent higher.

Fourth-quarter export and import unit values are often harbingers of the new year's price developments, since the new crop year situations have been set. Among export commodities, fourth-quarter export unit values for grains and grain products, soybeans and soybean products, tallow, and whole cattle hides were all higher than they were during the fourth quarter of 1977. Tobacco and nonfat dried milk in contrast were priced lower. Among import commodities, coffee, cocoa beans, and tea were all priced lower than they were a year earlier, while most other import commodity prices were priced higher.

January Price Developments

International grain, soybean, and beef prices strengthened during January, although prices for most other major agricultural commodities stayed at about the same levels. Market strength in grains reflected tight supplies as winter storms restricted rail, truck, and barge movements.

The Gulf ports price for wheat strengthened slightly to \$3.81 a bushel because of transportation difficulties. Reported buying by a major grain export firm buoyed U.S. export wheat prices.

The price-dampened effects of a record Australian wheat crop and an improved crop in Argentina had not yet been felt in international wheat markets in January.

The restrictions brought on by inclement weather overrode the influence of the record U.S. corn crop to boost the U.S. Gulf ports price of corn 7 percent to \$2.76 a bushel by January. Ships waiting in ports could not be loaded as ice-clogged rivers delayed barge movement.

News of dry conditions in the soybean producing area of Brazil, the major U.S. competitor has caused the recent upturn in the U.S. Gulf ports price for soybeans. A 4-percent jump (to \$7.40 a bushel) was recorded in the Gulf ports price for January.

The Osaka price for U.S. Arizona cotton took a slight dip to 78 cents a pound, despite the overall outlook for strong cotton prices resulting from the short crop in the United States.

Among other major U.S. exports, the Thai rice price strengthened slightly to \$300 a ton. For import commodities, coffee, cocoa beans, and sugar (at the Caribbean ports) were marked with price declines, while the imported beef price continued to escalate. The New York spot price for sugar rose slightly.

The Dow Jones commodity spot price index, reflecting overall farm commodity prices, declined slightly to 379.

Coffee, sugar (at the Caribbean ports), and rice were the only major agricultural commodities whose prices declined from January 1978 to January 1979. Imported beef in contrast, was 50 percent higher, compared to a year ago.

February Price Developments

International commodity prices for wheat, corn, and soybeans strengthened during February, but declined slightly for cotton. Prices for imported beef, rubber, and sugar continued their upward climb, while coffee and cocoa bean prices took a downturn. Soybean prices continued to strengthen because of drought damage to Brazil's spring soybean crop. India's large soybean oil purchases added another bullish factor to the soybean market. The Gulf Ports price for soybeans reached \$7.77 a bushel. The Gulf Ports price for wheat strengthened to \$3.93 a bushel and corn to \$2.78 a bushel because of strong export demand.

Wheat, imported beef, cocoa beans, soybeans, soybean meal, cotton, and rubber were priced higher than they were a year ago, while prices for coffee and rice were lower. Corn and sugar remain at about the same level.
