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

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

Agricultural Export Value Up 25 Percent In First 6 Months Of Fiscal Year 1979 (see p. 4). Moderate tonnage growth and higher prices raised U.S. agricultural exports 25 percent over first-half fiscal year 1978's value. The substantial improvement in March exports, and strong performance in October through December 1978 shipments, accounted for the gain.

U.S. Agricultural Imports For First Half Of Fiscal Year 1979 Up 17 Percent (see p. 36). U.S. agricultural imports totaled nearly \$8 billion during the first half of fiscal year 1979, 17 percent above a year ago. There were value gains in imports of all principal noncompetitive imports except green coffee and chocolate, and all major competitive imports except sugar.

U.S. Agricultural Exports To Nigeria Rise Sharply (see p. 63). U.S. agricultural exports to Nigeria reached a record \$300 million in calendar year 1978, more than triple the 1974 level. Sharp increases occurred in exports of wheat, rice, corn, and inedible tallow.

Fruit And Vegetable Imports Under Quarantine (see p. 69). A record 3.4 million tons of imported fruits and vegetables entered the United States under USDA-administered Plant Quarantine regulations in fiscal 1978, about 6 percent above the previous year's level. Most commodities registered gains, as bad weather cut back U.S. production.

Selected Prices Of International Significance (see p. 92). International commodity prices continued to rise in March, with U.S. soybean prices up strongly. U.S. export prices for corn, rice, and soybean meal also rose, but wheat and cotton prices registered slight declines.

AGRICULTURAL EXPORT VALUE UP 25 PERCENT IN FIRST 6 MONTHS OF FISCAL YEAR 1979

Farm product exports in March recovered strongly after 2 months of bad weather. The nearly \$2.9 billion worth of exports shipped during March set a new monthly record, reversing January and February declines. Quarterly exports declined to \$7.66 billion from the \$8.2 billion record set in October-December 1978 because of the relatively lower January and February levels.

Cumulative agricultural exports from October through March totaled nearly \$16 billion, over 25 percent above the previous high of \$12.6 billion in similar months a year ago. Most export commodity groupings advanced, brought about by volume gains as well as increased prices.

The agricultural trade surplus for October-March 1978/79 increased almost 36 percent from its year-earlier pace to \$7.9 billion, as exports rose more rapidly than imports. March exports alone exceeded imports by nearly \$1.5 billion.

Total volume of principal agricultural exports gained 8 percent from 1977/78's rate, reaching almost 63 million metric tons. Most commodity levels increased, led by soybeans, protein meal, wheat, coarse grains, rice, and vegetable oils.

Oilseed and product shipments, 37 percent above last year's value, accounted for a significant part of the export gain. Soybean, soymeal, vegetable oil, and sunflower seed exports were up sharply. Soybean export tonnage advanced one-fifth over the first 6 months of fiscal 1978, with higher prices yielding 40 percent greater value.

Grain export value averaged 16 percent more this year than in October-March 1977/78. Wheat and rice gains outpaced those for corn. Wheat shipments edged moderately higher to 13.9 million tons, but value jumped 28 percent to \$1.9 billion. The People's Republic of China (PRC) took about 1.4 million tons versus none the year before, becoming the second-largest market behind Japan. Heavier shipments to these two markets more than offset reduced export levels to several other important importers, such as the U.S.S.R., Korea, Brazil, Iran, and Morocco.

U.S. rice exports rose 28 percent in value above fiscal year 1978's first half, and approached 1.2 million tons. European, African, and Middle Eastern countries accounted for most of the increase.

Coarse grain export volume continued strong in the October-March 1978/79 period, about 3 percent over similar months a year earlier. Increases in corn more than compensated for lower levels of sorghum, barley, and oats shipments, and higher prices resulted in a 10-percent value gain for total coarse grains. Shifts occurred in major markets with increased exports to the PRC, Korea, Taiwan, Brazil, Mexico, and Italy, and reduced outflows to the U.S.S.R., Japan, Poland, and most Western European countries.

Regionally, U.S. exports to Asia grew faster than shipments to other areas. Exports to Japan--the largest single market--rose 25 percent to \$2.6 billion. Shipments to Korea, the second-ranked Asian market, increased 40 percent to \$665 million. The PRC moved up to third place among Asian destinations as exports increased more than fourfold to \$539 million. Agricultural exports to Western Europe--formerly the principal regional importer of U.S. farm products -- slipped to second place because the 21-percent rate of increase was well below gains to Asian countries. Yet, shipments to Western Europe of over \$5.4 billion equaled 34 percent of the world total.

Agricultural exports to Latin America increased by one-half to \$1.6 billion. Shipments to Mexico jumped 87 percent to \$487 million; exports to Brazil climbed 79 percent to \$235 million, and Venezuela took 54 percent more at \$219 million.

Shipments of farm products to Eastern Europe increased 41 percent to \$549 million, offsetting the 22-percent decline in exports to the U.S.S.R. Demand for imported feed-stuffs in Eastern Europe continues brisk, whereas Russia's large grain crop this past year apparently reduced import demand.

U.S. AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS FOR FIRST HALF OF FISCAL YEAR 1979 UP 17 PERCENT

U.S. agricultural imports totaled nearly \$8 billion during the first 6 months of fiscal year 1979, 17 percent higher than a year ago. There were value gains in imports of all principal noncompetitive imports except green coffee and chocolate, and all major competitive imports except sugar.

Imports of noncompetitive products totaled \$3.6 billion, 6 percent higher than a year ago, due to increases in imports of bananas, soluble coffee, cocoa beans, and rubber.

U.S. green coffee imports totaled nearly \$1,787 million or half of all noncompetitive imports, a decline from the \$1,869 million or 55 percent of the noncompetitive total experienced in the first 6 months of fiscal year 1978. The volume of green coffee imports actually increased by 26 percent, because unit import prices of green coffee declined from \$1.79 per pound during October-March 1977/78 to \$1.36 in the first 6 months of fiscal year 1979.

The principal suppliers of green coffee during the first 6 months of fiscal year 1979 were Colombia, 20 percent of the total; Brazil, 15 percent; and Mexico, 10 percent of the total. The quantity imported increased from all major suppliers except Uganda and the Dominican Republic. No green coffee was imported from Uganda, compared with over 24,000 metric tons during the first 6 months of fiscal year 1978. Only about 9,000 metric tons were imported from the Dominican Republic, compared with over 32,000 metric tons in the previous period.

Competitive product imports totaled \$4.4 billion, about 28 percent higher than a year ago. Meat and meat products--over one-fourth of all competitive imports--accounted for the major increase. Imports of fresh and frozen beef and veal (the chief meat import) totaled \$822 million, more than double the previous period. March imports of beef and veal reached a record \$174 million, 29 percent higher than the previous month. Unit import prices of beef and veal rose by more than half, but the quantity rose by only about one-third. Most of the imported beef is boneless manufacturing beef, which is in short supply because of the large slaughter of cows during the liquidation phase of the cattle cycle that began in 1975 and continued through 1978. Meat imports may increase by as much as 30 percent in 1979.

Higher U.S. prices--caused by smaller supplies of slaughter and feeder cattle--attracted larger imports of live cattle from Mexico. The value of Mexican cattle imports rose by over half, accounting for about 60 percent of all such imports during the first half of fiscal year 1979, compared with less than half of that total during the previous period. Live cattle imports from Mexico in 1979 are expected to decline because of high beef prices and pressures on the Mexican Government to provide more beef domestically. 1/

Other major competitive product imports that increased during the first half of fiscal year 1979 included live animals, dairy products, fruits, vegetables, vegetable oils, tobacco, wine, and malt beverages.

Imports of fruits and preparations rose over 50 percent during the first half of fiscal year 1979. However, vegetable imports increased only 2 percent. Concentrated orange juice--which went from \$32 million to \$92 million--accounted for the major gain in fruit imports. The gain was due to a severe freeze in the winter of 1977 which led to reduced stocks, higher domestic prices, and increased imports from Brazil.

Vegetable oil imports rose 5 percent in value as the gain in coconut oil imports (nearly two-thirds of all vegetable oil imports) more than offset the decline in palm oil imports. The quantity of imported vegetable oils declined about 9 percent because substantial increases occurred in coconut oil import prices. Imports of sugar, valued at about \$33 million, fell nearly 28 percent from last year. Sugar imports in December 1977 reached a record level because of anticipated increases in import fees imposed in January 1978.

U.S. AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS TO NIGERIA RISE SHARPLY

Nigeria, the most heavily populated country in Africa, is a major oil exporter, and a member of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC). Petroleum exports since 1974 have accounted for over 90 percent of Nigeria's total exports and a large influx of oil revenues. These revenues have increased the country's wealth, economic growth, consumption, and demand for imports.

Nigeria's per capita gross national product of \$500 in 1977 places it among the low-income countries as classified by the International Development Association. This belies the fact that this level was nearly double the 1973 amount (table 17). However, Nigeria's real per capita income rose by an appreciably smaller amount due to inflation.

Nigeria's total exports rose from \$3.5 billion in 1973 to \$11.5 billion in 1977, while total imports jumped from \$1.9 billion to \$11 billion. Nigeria's agricultural imports increased more than 300 percent between 1973-77, totaling over \$1 billion in 1977. Agricultural exports were \$717 million in 1977, slightly over half the 1973 level.

The United States has substantially increased its trade with Nigeria (table 18). U.S. imports from Nigeria (almost all oil) have far exceeded U.S. exports to that country since 1973. Nigeria was the second leading supplier (following Saudi Arabia) of U.S. crude oil imports in calendar 1978. 1/ Large oil imports and rising oil prices have caused the United States to have substantial overall trade deficits with Nigeria since 1974. These trade deficits were the largest held by the United States with any country during 2 of the last 5 years. 2/ The trade deficit with Nigeria ranked behind only those with Japan and Canada in calendar year 1978.

Despite these overall trade deficits, the United States has had increasing agricultural trade surpluses with Nigeria since 1974. U.S. agricultural exports to Nigeria reached a record of \$300 million in calendar year 1978, more than triple the 1974 level. Agricultural imports (almost all cocoa beans) from Nigeria totaled \$112 million in 1978, about double the value of 4 years earlier. Agricultural commodities accounted for about 30 percent of all U.S. exports to Nigeria in 1978, a much larger share than in most other years.

Nigeria, which experienced little or no agricultural production growth from 1973-77, needs more agricultural imports to meet increased demand from an annual population growth rate of about 2.7 percent and rising incomes. Milk, wheat, rice, sugar, and beer accounted for about two-thirds of Nigeria's total agricultural imports in 1977 (table 19). Other major agricultural imports included cattle, beef, corn, malt, vegetables, inedible tallow, and vegetable oils.

Nigeria's major supplier of agricultural commodities has been the European Community (EC) which exported \$524 million to the country in 1977, compared with \$93 million in 1973. 3/ Major EC exports include dairy products, sugar, and beer, products which are not directly competitive with major U.S.-supplied commodities.

Nigeria's second leading agricultural supplier has been the United States. Wheat had been accounting for more than 60 percent of all agricultural exports to Nigeria until the last 2 years (table 20). U.S.-supplied wheat is needed to meet most of Nigeria's domestic needs.

Bread is now becoming part of the daily Nigerian diet, and increased wheat imports have been needed to meet expansion in flour mill capacity, mill construction, population growth, and rising incomes. Future U.S. wheat exports should remain high as domestic production supplies less than 1 percent of Nigeria's wheat requirements.

Rice, another major U.S. agricultural commodity exported to Nigeria, jumped from 5,600 metric tons (\$3.7 million) in 1975 (when Nigeria's import duties were lowered) to 256,000 metric tons (\$138 million) in calendar year 1978. Rice replaced wheat in 1978 as the leading valued U.S. agricultural commodity exported to Nigeria. The United States and Thailand are major rice suppliers to Nigeria.

Rice imports in the last 2 years provided about 50 to 60 percent of Nigeria's total supply, compared with less than 10 percent in previous years. The Nigerian Government, in an effort to encourage domestic production and conserve foreign exchange, in early 1979 began requiring licenses to import rice. The licenses, currently being freely granted, could become restrictive, and affect future U.S. rice shipments.

Corn imports have increased substantially since Nigeria lowered import duties in 1975. While Nigeria's corn crop supplies most of its requirements, more imported grain has been needed for the growing poultry and livestock industries.

The United States is Nigeria's main corn supplier. U.S. corn exports to Nigeria totaled 83,000 metric tons (\$8 million) in 1978, compared with 200 metric tons in 1975. The January 1979 ban on U.S. corn imports will likely reduce U.S. corn exports in 1979.

Poultry, vegetables, tobacco, and inedible tallow have accounted for most of the other U.S. agricultural commodities exported to Nigeria. Exports of these products generally increased during 1974-78. The United States is Nigeria's major supplier of inedible tallow and tobacco. The Nigerian Government, in an effort to save foreign exchange and stimulate growth in domestic industries, has required licenses to import poultry and beef since mid-1978. This restrictive action reduced imports of U.S. poultry in 1978 and will probably reduce them again in 1979.

Nigeria's economic growth slowed considerably and its foreign exchange reserves deteriorated further in 1978. ^{4/} A decline in oil exports, attributed to excessive prices during a period of glut, caused Nigeria's total exports and revenues to fall. Imports also declined, but, for the first time in several years, they exceeded exports. Foreign exchange reserves dropped to \$1.3 billion, about two-thirds less than the previous year.

The outlook for 1979 is for increased demand for Nigerian oil and this, coupled with OPEC price increases, will likely raise Nigeria's revenues and exports. Higher earnings and continued population growth should stimulate more consumption and demand for imports. Thus, agricultural imports could continue rising, although imposition of restrictive trade measures may slow growth. The United States should continue to find the country a receptive market for its agricultural commodities.

FRUIT AND VEGETABLE IMPORTS UNDER QUARANTINE

A record 3.4 million tons of imported fruits and vegetables entered the United States under USDA's Plant Protection and Quarantine regulations in the fiscal year ending September 30, 1978. Inspections increased about 6 percent from the previous year's level. 1/

Extremely cold weather and excessive moisture, which adversely affected U.S. winter fruit and vegetable production areas in 1977/78, resulted in higher import levels. Mexico was the major source for most fresh vegetables and many fruit items. Central American countries were leading exporters of bananas and plantains. An increasing share of imported cucumbers, papayas, peppers, and other vegetables came from the Bahamas and Central American countries last year.

Tables in this report show more commodity detail than Census Bureau data. However, the statistics are not always exactly comparable because of commodity classification differences and variations in reporting periods. These tables do not include entries from Canada, since quarantine permits are not required for imports from that country.

Supplementary information, at the end of the main table, appears separately for transshipments to Guam and the Virgin Islands.

Quarantine inspections were reported in kilogram units during 1978. Kilograms can be converted to pounds by multiplying by the factor 2.204622.

SELECTED PRICES OF INTERNATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

International farm commodity prices continued to rise in March, as U.S. soybean prices showed considerable strength. U.S. export prices for corn, rice, and soybean meal rose, but wheat and cotton prices registered slight declines.

The U.S. Gulf ports price for hard winter wheat declined slightly in March to \$3.88 a bushel from \$3.93 in February. Wheat's strong export demand and the 12-percent smaller crop have been bullish factors in the wheat market, but these factors did not have enough strength to overcome the bearish influence of confusion over the future status of Iran's wheat purchases. Iran had been one of the top 10 importers of U.S. wheat. The price-dampening effects of a record Australian wheat crop and an improved Argentinian crop have also affected international wheat markets.

The Gulf ports average March price for corn rose to \$2.84 a bushel due to heavy export sales and fairly good processor feed demand. These factors, together with large quantities of grain under Government loan and in farmer-owned reserves, are giving some strength to prices.

Soybean prices continued to rise in March, reaching \$7.87 a bushel. Continued large inspections for export, resulting partly from Brazil's curtailment of soybean export authorizations, have sustained record-high U.S. supplies being used because of exceptionally strong demand.

Prices for such major U.S. commodities as soybean meal and rice have also increased. Cotton prices declined in March with prospects of a large 1979 world cotton crop. Beef prices continued their upward drive, following the trend of domestic U.S. beef prices. The average March price for imported beef reached \$1.37 a pound.

Crude rubber prices continued to show considerable strength. Coffee, sugar, and cocoa bean prices, in contrast, remain depressed by plentiful supplies.
