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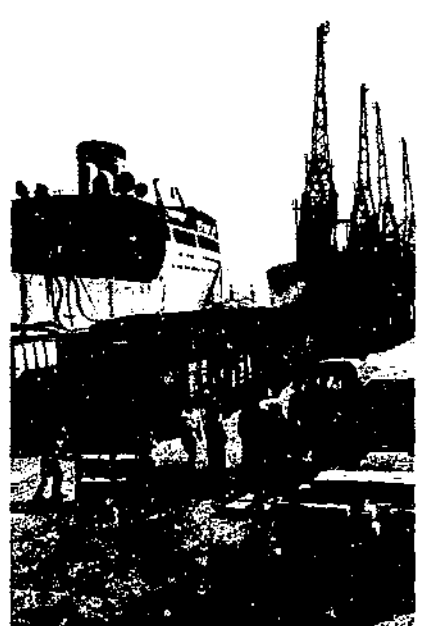
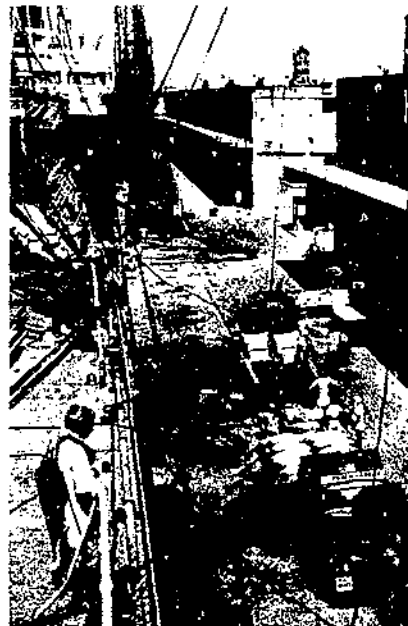
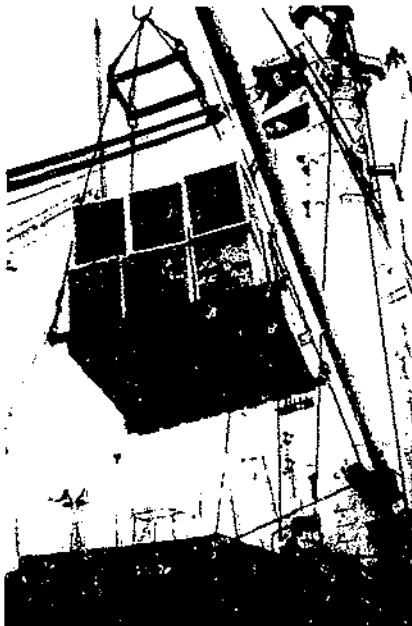
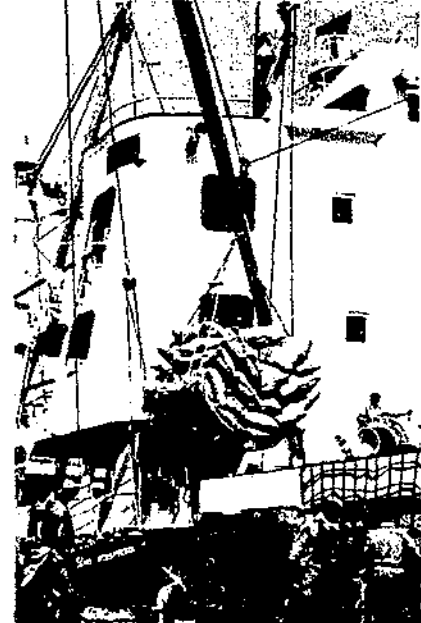
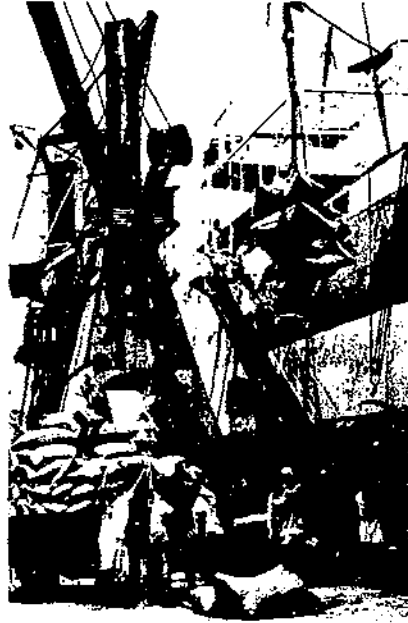
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Foreign Agricultural Trade of the United States

September/October 1981

Agricultural Exports for 11 Months of Fiscal Year 1981 Approach \$41 Billion (see p. 4). While farm-product exports have slowed in recent months, their October-August 1980/81 value totaled \$40.6 billion, 9 percent above the same months of 1979/80. Wheat and rice exports remained strong, soybean shipments appear to be recovering, but corn exports to many countries are down.

U.S. Agricultural Imports Down Slightly for 11 Months of Fiscal Year 1981 (see p. 33). U.S. agricultural imports of \$15.9 billion during the first 11 months of fiscal year 1981 were slightly lower than those a year earlier. A value decline in noncompetitive imports more than offset the rise in competitive products.

Selected Prices of International Significance (see p. 55). International grain prices averaged lower during the summer months, while prices of soybeans and products were mixed. U.S. import prices of many commodities fell, led by bearish markets in coffee and rubber. Farm prices continued sliding as favorable weather in July and August boosted 1981/82 prospective supplies.

U.S. Food Aid Shipments to Decline Slightly for Fiscal Year 1981 (see p. 59). Preliminary data indicate that U.S. agricultural exports under Government programs totaled \$844 million during the first three quarters of fiscal year 1981. Over 80 percent moved under Public Law 480. Food aid shipments for fiscal year 1981 are estimated at \$1,492 million, slightly less than in fiscal year 1980 due to a decline in Title I exports.

U.S. Agricultural Imports: Principal Commodities and Major Sources, Fiscal Years 1975-80 (see p. 63). U.S. agricultural imports were valued at \$17.3 billion in fiscal year 1980, 83 percent above 1975's value. Values increased each year, mostly in noncompetitive products during fiscal years 1975-77 and competitive products in the next 3 years. Ten countries provided slightly more than half of the value imported in 1980.

World Economic Growth Alters Patterns and Composition of Agricultural Trade (see p. 85). Economic growth since 1956-60 has increased world demand for agricultural imports almost sixfold, from \$35.7 billion to \$207.9 billion in 1976-79, and has greatly altered the composition, pattern, and direction of agricultural exports. The major source of the growth in demand for agricultural products was the developed countries. While the developed countries were responsible for 60 percent of the growth in all food imports, they accounted for only about a fourth of the growth in food grain imports. On the other hand, while the less developed countries accounted for only a fourth of the growth in world import demand for all food they accounted for the major portion of the growth in food grain imports.

Agricultural Exports for 11 Months of Fiscal Year 1981 Approach \$41 Billion

During the first 11 months of fiscal year 1981, total U.S. farm-product exports reached \$40.6 billion, 9 percent above their year-earlier value. While agricultural exports have slowed in recent months, they will still set a record for the year. The recent slowdown reflected sluggish world economic conditions, rising dollar exchange rates against major foreign currencies, and increased European grain supplies.

Some agricultural commodity exports have continued to grow rapidly, however. Wheat exports are at record levels, with strong demand in many areas, including Asia, Latin America, and Africa. U.S. wheat exports during October-August 1980/81 reached 37 million tons, a 14-percent gain over the same months the previous year.

Reduced grain production and increased import demand led to larger imports of U.S. wheat by the People's Republic of China (PRC), Japan, Korea, Egypt, Nigeria, Iran, and Saudi Arabia. Drought damage to grain crops led the PRC to import 7.1 million tons of U.S. wheat, more than double 1979/80's pace. Latin American imports also remained large, especially by Brazil, Mexico, Chile, Venezuela, and Peru. The U.S.S.R. took 3 million tons of U.S. wheat, mostly between October 1980 and April 1981. Wheat exports to African countries during October-August were up almost a fourth, at 4.8 million tons.

Rice exports also held up and prices remained firm. Export tonnage was 10 percent above year-earlier levels, with over 1.1 million tons going to Korea alone. In addition, large increases occurred in shipments to Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, and Peru.

Feed grain export volume through August was down 2 percent from year-earlier levels to 64 million tons. Improved crop production in Europe and slower growth in livestock feeding rates reduced import demand in many countries. Export losses to Europe were largely offset by sharply increased shipments to Latin America and Africa. Mexico, Venezuela, and Peru took significantly more U.S. feed grains in 1980/81. Exports to Africa were up 40 percent because of increased feed grain shipments to Egypt, Algeria, Nigeria, Tanzania, Morocco, and Somalia. U.S. feed grain exports to Asia remained about the same as in 1979/80 as larger shipments to Japan, Korea, and the Philippines compensated for cutbacks in imports by the PRC.

Oilseed and product exports during the first 11 months of fiscal year 1981 declined 5 percent in value to \$8.7 billion, mainly because of a drop in soybean products. Soybean shipments fell 18 percent to 18.6 million tons, soybean meal dropped 12 percent to 5.9 million tons, and soybean oil plunged 39 percent to 690,000 tons. Reduced demand for oilseed and product imports in

Western Europe and competition from South American oilseed exporters in world markets have combined to depress U.S. exports over the last 6 to 8 months. Shipments to Japan, Taiwan, Korea, and Mexico continued to expand, however.

Cotton exports for the October-August 1980/81 period were down 39 percent from the same months the previous year. Asian countries, which take the bulk of U.S. cotton exports, cut back imports sharply. Reduced U.S. production in fiscal year 1980 and shrinking world demand for cotton products were contributing factors.

U.S. Agricultural Imports Down Slightly for 11 Months of Fiscal Year 1981

U.S. agricultural imports of \$15.9 billion during the first 11 months of fiscal year 1981 were slightly lower than those a year earlier. A value decline in noncompetitive imports more than offset the rise in competitive products.

Noncompetitive imports totaled \$5.5 billion, 20 percent less than the previous year as most products except bananas, spices, and cocoa fell in value. Green coffee--accounting for nearly half of all noncompetitive imports--totaled \$2.6 billion, one-third less than the previous year. The quantity imported dropped by a much smaller percentage as unit import prices fell from \$1.72 per pound in the first 11 months of fiscal year 1980 to \$1.30 per pound in fiscal year 1981. Import unit prices averaged \$1.40 per pound during the first third of fiscal year 1981, but have since declined steadily as larger world supplies caused a downward price trend. The decline in U.S. coffee imports occurred mainly because roasters were keeping a low level of stocks to avoid higher interest-rate carrying charges.

Crude rubber, the second leading noncompetitive import, declined 8 percent in value and less in quantity as prices fell. The slump in U.S. automobile sales has discouraged rubber imports. Indonesia, the world's second largest producer, provided about 60 percent of U.S. imports, while Malaysia, the leading world producer, supplied most of the remainder.

Cocoa beans--the third ranking noncompetitive import--rose 16 percent in value and 72 percent in volume. A record world cocoa crop and supplies exceeding estimated world consumption depressed prices. U.S. manufacturers were encouraged to increase their bean and cocoa butter imports and decrease chocolate-product imports as chocolate prices fell by much less than cocoa prices. The Ivory Coast supplied nearly half of U.S. cocoa import volume in fiscal year 1981 compared with over one-fourth in fiscal year 1980. The Ivory Coast held back its exports in 1980 to influence world prices. Brazil and the Dominican Republic have been the other major suppliers in 1980/81. Cocoa imports from Nigeria, generally the fourth-ranking supplier, dropped sharply due to the country's reduced production.

A new International Cocoa Agreement (ICCA) became effective August 1, 1981, despite the absence of the Ivory Coast--the world's largest producer--and the United States, the leading consumer. The ICCA's objective is to stabilize cocoa bean prices through buffer stocks; however, without participation of the Ivory Coast, price stabilization will be difficult.

Competitive imports of \$10.4 billion were 14 percent higher than a year earlier, mainly due to substantial gains in sugar prices. Sugar imports of \$2 billion were 39 percent higher than 1979/80

levels because prices increased 50 percent. However, prices dropped after March, and the August price reached the lowest monthly level since March 1980. Lower prices resulted from exporters flooding the market before lower International Sugar Agreement export quotas were set on October 1, 1981. The 7-percent drop in the quantity of U.S. sugar imports in fiscal year 1981 was due to high prices and increased use of high fructose corn sirup, a sugar substitute. U.S. per capita sugar consumption in 1981 is expected to be the lowest since 1946.

Meat and meat-product imports declined 7 percent to \$2 billion. Fresh and frozen beef and veal value, which accounts for almost two-thirds of U.S. meat imports, dropped 12 percent. Lower U.S. beef prices, abundant pork and poultry supplies, and reduced supplies from Australia, the United States' largest supplier, dampened imports. Fresh and frozen pork imports--almost all from Canada--increased 40 percent in value but less in volume due to rising prices. Usually Canadian and U.S. hog cycles are similar, but in 1981 they diverged. U.S. pork production dropped sharply while Canadian output increased. Canned pork, mainly from Europe, increased 5 percent in value because of higher prices.

Other value increases among competitive items occurred chiefly in dairy and poultry products, hides and skins, wool, fruits, vegetables, nuts, oilseeds (mostly peanuts), wine, and malt beverages. Imports of fruits and preparations of \$643 million were 20 percent higher than in fiscal year 1980, largely due to a more than doubling in concentrated orange juice imports from Brazil after a winter freeze in Florida. Imports of vegetables and preparations of \$980 million rose 21 percent over a year earlier, mostly in fresh tomatoes.

Value declines occurred in imports of live animals, vegetable oils, and tobacco. Live animal imports dropped from year-earlier levels because lower U.S. feeder cattle prices discouraged imports from Mexico and importers anticipated reduced export duties on Mexican cattle.

Vegetable oil imports dropped 8 percent in value, mainly in coconut oil which accounts for slightly over half of all vegetable oil imports. However, the quantity of coconut oil rose sharply as import prices fell by about one-third from the previous year due to increased world supplies. Imports of palm oil rose 20 percent in value, but volume rose nearly 50 percent as prices dropped. Tobacco imports dropped somewhat more in value than volume due to lower prices.

Selected Prices of International Significance

International grain prices were pushed lower during the summer months, while soybeans and soybean product prices were mixed. U.S. import prices of many commodities also fell, led by bearish markets in coffee and rubber. Farm prices continued sliding as favorable weather in July and August boosted 1981/82 prospective supplies.

U.S. wheat export prices held steady throughout the summer. The Gulf price steadied during June, July, and August, centering around \$170 a ton, slightly above the previous summer's average. Many factors provided support for the Gulf price. Total beginning wheat stocks of our major competitors--Canada, Australia, Argentina, and the European Community--are down from a season earlier, while U.S. carryin stocks increased for the first time in 3 years. This put the United States in a favorable position to boost its share of an already expanding market. The first sale of U.S. wheat to India since 1977/78 and the continued record buying by China also supported U.S. wheat prices.

The Gulf price of U.S. corn reached a yearly low of \$133 in August, reflecting increasingly favorable harvest prospects. Argentine corn prices, f.o.b. Buenos Aires, were slightly above the U.S. Gulf price, in contrast to the 19-percent premium the summer before when the partial suspension of U.S. grain sales to the U.S.S.R. was in effect.

International prices for soybeans and soybean products were mostly lower during the summer. Slackened domestic demand, South American export competition, and the strengthening dollar contributed to a bearish market. Domestic wholesale soybean prices responded by reaching a 12-month low of \$122 in August. The Dutch soybean oil price dropped to \$509, 21 percent below a year earlier, and Hamburg meal fell to \$252, slightly below the previous year's level. Low soybean oil prices narrowed crushing margins in the United States, South America, and Western Europe. Record world stocks of soybeans and soybean oil are forecast for the end of 1981/82, in spite of stronger oil demand.

Coffee prices were stable the first 5 months of 1981 but at much lower levels than a year earlier. In mid-June, circumstances changed amid expectations of huge coffee crops. Prices had plunged to a 5-year low. During the week of July 20, however, a frost hit Brazil. Estimates of crop damage ranged from 14 to 45 percent. The New York spot price of Brazilian coffee jumped 17 percent in 1 week to \$1.35 a pound. By the end of August, prices returned to pre-frost levels when traders realized that 1980/81's crop was not damaged and current supplies of stocks were ample, even though on August 25 USDA halved its estimate of 1982/83 Brazilian coffee production.

U.S. Food Aid Shipments to Decline Slightly for Fiscal Year 1981

Preliminary data indicate that U.S. agricultural exports under Government-financed programs totaled \$844 million during the first three quarters of fiscal year 1981, over 80 percent under Public Law 480. Food aid shipments for fiscal year 1981 are presently estimated at \$1,492 million, slightly below the revised 1979/80 figure of \$1,517 million. The decline will be in P.L. 480 Title I exports which account for about one-half of all food aid shipments.

Exports under Title I long-term dollar credit sales totaled \$374 million for October-June 1980/81, including a portion handled under the Title III Food for Development Program added to P.L. 480 in 1977. The Title III program permits multiyear agreements with countries that use local currency proceeds from the sale of commodities provided under Title I for approved development programs. Shipment data for this program are not reported separately from total Title I statistics. This preliminary figure for Title I is probably lower than actual shipments due to reporting time lags.

Principal commodities shipped under Title I during October-June 1980/81 included wheat, 46 percent of the total; rice and wheat flour, each about 20 percent; and corn, 9 percent. Nineteen countries received Title I commodities; however, over two-thirds of the total went to two countries--Egypt, 54 percent of the total, and Indonesia, 13 percent.

Title I exports for fiscal year 1981 are estimated at about \$775 million compared with \$857 million shipped a year earlier. Exports during the last quarter of fiscal year 1981 are expected to be larger than normal due to late signing of agreements and shipment programming. For example, only \$9 million was exported to Bangladesh during October-June 1980/81, but \$43 million was expected to be shipped for the year. Among other major recipients, Title I exports for fiscal year 1981 are estimated at \$275 million for Egypt and \$50 million for Pakistan. In June 1981, \$47.6 million of corn under Title I was allocated to Poland and should be shipped by the end of fiscal year 1981.

Preliminary exports under Title II donations programs totaled \$317 million for October-June 1980/81. However, this figure is believed to be undervalued by about \$70-90 million due to reporting time lags. Fiscal year data will be more complete. The Office of the General Sales Manager, Foreign Agricultural Service, reports that \$480 million was budgeted for shipment during October-June 1980/81, which may be larger than the amount actually shipped. Principal commodities reported under Title II included soybean oil, bulgur wheat, corn-soya-milk blend, rice, and wheat flour. India, the principal recipient, received one-fourth of the total donations. Title II shipments for fiscal

year 1981 are currently estimated at about \$530 million compared with revised fiscal year 1979/80 exports of \$476 million.

Disbursements under Agency for International Development (AID) programs totaled \$153 million for October-June 1980/81, mainly corn, inedible tallow, and tobacco for Egypt. AID disbursements for fiscal year 1981 are estimated at about \$187 million, nearly the same as a year earlier.

U.S. Agricultural Imports: Principal Commodities and Major Sources, Fiscal Years 1975-80

U.S. agricultural imports were valued at \$17.3 billion in fiscal year 1980, 83 percent above fiscal year 1975's value. Values increased each year, mostly in noncompetitive products during fiscal years 1975-77 and competitive products in the next 3 years.

Latin America has been the chief regional supplier. Latin America provided 42 percent of U.S. agricultural imports in fiscal year 1980, about the same share as in fiscal year 1975. Brazil, Mexico, and Colombia accounted for 55 percent of imports from Latin America in 1979/80; their chief export to us was coffee. Asia was the next largest regional supplier, providing 16 percent of the total in fiscal year 1980, largely rubber, oilseeds and products, coffee, fruits, vegetables, and tobacco. Indonesia, the Philippines, and Malaysia are the major East Asian suppliers. The next major area supplier was Western Europe (mostly competitive products from the European Community), with 14 percent of the total in fiscal year 1980. Other principal regional suppliers were Oceania (mainly meat from Australia and New Zealand) and Africa (chiefly coffee and cocoa).

Ten countries provided more than half of the value imported in 1979/80. Brazil, the leader, supplied a record \$1.7 billion, almost four-fifths higher than fiscal year 1975's value, mainly due to rising prices. Almost two-thirds consisted of noncompetitive products, chiefly coffee, and most of the remainder was sugar. Mexico, the second leading supplier in 1979/80, provided almost \$1.2 billion--4 percent below the previous year's record. Coffee, fruits, and vegetables were the main products. The eight other leading suppliers in 1979/80 were Australia, Colombia, Canada, Indonesia, New Zealand, the Philippines, the Dominican Republic, and Guatemala. During fiscal years 1975-80, the largest percentage gain in imports among these countries was from Guatemala, mostly in coffee and sugar. Other large value gains since 1974/75 occurred from Indonesia (rubber and coffee), New Zealand (mainly in meat), and Colombia (mostly in coffee). Rising commodity prices generally caused these increases.

The value of noncompetitive imports rose from \$2.9 billion in fiscal year 1975 (30 percent of all agricultural imports) to a record \$7.4 billion in fiscal year 1980, 43 percent of the total. The value of green coffee imports--57 percent of all noncompetitive imports in 1979/80--rose from \$1.4 billion in 1974/75 to a record \$4.2 billion in 1979/80 due to higher prices. The quantity imported declined 3 percent, as unit import prices jumped from 56 cents per pound in 1974/75 to \$1.71 per pound in 1979/80. Colombia and Brazil were the leading suppliers in fiscal year 1980, providing 20 percent and 14 percent of the total, respectively. Among leading sources during fiscal years 1975-80, there were volume gains from Colombia, Indonesia,

Guatemala, and Peru, and declines from Brazil, Mexico, Ecuador, the Ivory Coast, and Uganda.

Crude rubber, the second leading noncompetitive import, totaled \$818 million in 1979/80, more than double fiscal year 1975's level due to higher prices. The quantity imported rose 28 percent during fiscal years 1975-79 but dropped sharply in 1979/80 to near fiscal year 1975's level due to the slump in the U.S. automobile industry. Indonesia has supplied over half the rubber, with most of the remainder coming from Malaysia.

Cocoa beans, generally the third leading noncompetitive import, totaled \$399 million in 1979/1980, one-third above 1974/75's level but considerably less than imports during fiscal years 1977-79. The quantity imported fell 30 percent during fiscal years 1975-80 as prices climbed. Imports fell noticeably in 1979/80 because the Ivory Coast, the major supplier, held back its exports to influence world prices. Other major suppliers have been Brazil, Nigeria, and the Dominican Republic.

Competitive imports reached a record \$9.9 billion in fiscal year 1980, 51 percent more than in fiscal year 1975, mainly due to value gains in meat and sugar imports. Meat and meat-product imports--the leading competitive import in recent years--reached a record \$2.5 billion in fiscal year 1979, compared with \$1.1 billion in 1974/75. Rising prices caused much of the gain as the volume rose only 33 percent. Meat imports declined in 1979/80, mainly due to reduced beef supplies in some exporting countries, higher world beef prices relative to U.S. prices, and larger supplies and lower prices for pork. Australia and New Zealand have been principal sources for beef and veal, while Canada, Poland, and Denmark have provided most of the pork.

Sugar, the next leading competitive import, totaled \$1.6 billion in 1979/80, considerably above fiscal years 1976-79 levels but 30 percent below fiscal year 1975's value. The volume imported increased during fiscal years 1975-77, while values declined as prices dropped. However, a more than doubling in unit import values between fiscal years 1977/78 and 1979/80 caused value gains as import volumes fell. U.S. sugar use has declined with the shift to more high fructose corn sirup use. Six countries--Brazil, the Dominican Republic, the Philippines, Guatemala, Australia, and South Africa--supplied 58 percent of the total sugar tonnage imported in fiscal year 1980. In 1974/75, about the same share of total sugar imports was provided by four countries--the Dominican Republic, Brazil, Australia, and the Philippines.

Oilseeds and products (mainly vegetable oils) totaled \$617 million in 1979/80, 8 percent less than the previous year and only slightly higher than 1974/75's level. The quantity of vegetable

oils imported in 1979/80 was 13 percent below the previous year and 20 percent less than in 1974/75 as prices increased. Vegetable oil imports consisted mainly of coconut oil from the Philippines and palm oil from Malaysia.

Among other competitive imports, large value gains occurred in fruits and vegetables during fiscal years 1975-80. Fruits and preparations totaled \$573 million in fiscal year 1980, less than 1978/79's record value but much higher than the 4 previous years. A winter freeze led to increased imports of concentrated orange juice from Brazil in 1978/79. In 1979/80, Mexico provided nearly one-fourth of the fruit imports, and the Philippines, Brazil, Thailand, and Chile supplied most of the remainder.

Vegetables and preparations totaled \$852 million in 1979/80, more than double fiscal year 1975's level. Mexico provided 43 percent in 1979/80, with Taiwan and Spain as the other major sources.

World Economic Growth Alters Patterns and Composition of Agricultural Trade

Arthur B. Mackie ^{1/}

Demand changes

The longrun effect of world economic growth has been to alter the pattern, direction, and volume of world trade. This growth has altered the types of consumer products demanded and, thereby, the commodity composition of world trade. With respect to U.S. and world agricultural trade, world economic growth has altered the commodity composition of import demand and thus the composition, pattern, and direction of agricultural exports. These demand changes have caused the flow of some products to increase more rapidly than others. Changes in demand for agricultural exports are related to economic growth and income conditions in countries at different stages of economic development.

Patterns of World Agricultural Trade Flows

The central feature of international trade is trade between economically advanced countries. This fact is not entirely surprising since the principal determinant of trade appears to be income. The higher the level of per capita incomes, the greater the likelihood that trade will expand between countries.

World trade in agricultural products since the fifties has been strongly influenced by the demand for more food and feed products in the developed countries. During 1956-60, average trade between the developed countries accounted for \$14.4 billion, or 40 percent of the \$35.7 billion of world trade in agricultural products (table 19). During 1976-79, this share rose to \$95.3 billion, or 46 percent of the \$207.9 billion total world agricultural trade. In addition to increased trade between the developed countries, their exports to the less developed and centrally planned countries also rose. Consequently, the average share of world agricultural exports by the developed countries increased from 51 percent during 1956-60 to 61 percent during 1976-79.

These patterns of trade reflect a growing dependency of the less developed countries--and, most recently, the centrally planned countries--upon the developed countries for more of their food imports. During 1956-60, the less developed countries (LDC's) and centrally planned countries (CPC's) received only 54 and 18 percent, respectively, of their agricultural imports from the developed countries (DC's) (table 20). During 1976-79, these percentages increased to 56 percent for the LDC's and 36 percent for the CPC's. Similar changes occurred in these regions in their demand for U.S. agricultural exports. However, demand changes for U.S. exports were not as drastic in the LDC's as they were in the CPC's.

The growing dependency of the less developed and centrally planned countries upon the food exports of the developed countries (including the United States) has been accompanied by a sharp decline in intraregional trade in these regions. Intraregional trade accounted for 62 percent of the CPC's agricultural imports

during 1956-60 but for only 28 percent during 1976-79. The intraregional share of LDC's dropped from 40 to 35 percent. These trends in imports of all agricultural products have been strongly influenced by an even greater change in the trade flows of all grains since 1956-60.

World Economic
Growth and
Composition of
World Trade

The changing nature of world import demand for agricultural products induced by economic growth and increased incomes has greatly altered the commodity composition of world agricultural trade, market potentials for some products, and market shares of exporting countries.

The most significant change in the commodity composition of world agricultural exports since the fifties has been the relative increase in importance of food and feed exports at the expense of agricultural raw material exports. For example, the value of world exports in food products (primarily animal products and food grains) increased \$94.1 billion from 1955 to 1979, while the value of trade in agricultural raw materials increased only \$24.4 billion (table 21). The most dramatic change was in feed products during this period--from \$2.1 to \$25.7 billion. As a result of these growth disparities, the relative importance of food and feed exports (primarily feed) in world agricultural trade increased from 44 and 7 percent, respectively, in 1955 to 54 and 13 percent, respectively, in 1979.

Like the changes in world agricultural trade, the structure of U.S. agricultural exports has undergone a major transformation in the commodity composition since 1951-55 with the rapid increase in feed exports, the steady increase in food exports, and the rapid decline in exports of agricultural raw materials (tables 22 and 23). These changes in the commodity composition of U.S. exports have, in effect, acted as a mirror image of the various changes in the world demand for agricultural imports during the past 25 years.

In summary, the rapid growth in U.S. exports of feeds and feed grains, combined with continued growth in food grain exports, has vastly altered the pre-World War II position of the United States as a raw material exporter. Future changes in world demand should continue to accentuate U.S. exports of food products to the LDC's and feed products to the DC's, but the export share of feed products relative to food products may increase. These changes portend increased market potentials for grains and oilseeds and, thus, increased income opportunities for grain farmers relative to cotton and tobacco farmers.

Source of Changes
in World Trade

The value of world agricultural imports grew rapidly during 1965-79, increasing \$177 billion--49 percent of which was due to increases in food imports. The remaining 51 percent was due to

larger feed imports (13 percent), agricultural raw materials (14 percent), and a group of commodities not separately identified (24 percent).

The source of the changes in demand for agricultural products was primarily the DC's--accounting for 68 percent of the growth in world import demand. While the DC's were the primary source of growth in import demand for all food products (60 percent) between 1965 and 1979, they were responsible for only 23 percent of the growth in food grain imports. On the other hand, while the LDC's accounted for only 25 percent of the growth in world import demand for all food products, they accounted for 50 percent of the growth in world imports of food grains (table 24).

A comparison of the origin of import and export growth in world agricultural trade since 1965 shows that whereas the LDC's were responsible for 50 percent of the growth in food grain imports, they accounted for only 12 percent of the growth in food grain exports. Since the CPC's accounted for 26 percent of the growth in world import demand for food grains and only 11 percent of the growth in world food grain exports, these two regions have had to turn increasingly to the developed countries for food grains. And, indeed they did, because the DC's were responsible for 77 percent of the growth in world food grain exports during this period. An even larger proportion (89 percent) of the growth in feed grain exports was accounted for by the DC's during 1965-79 (table 25).

Implications for
Future Economic
Growth and Trade

The complementary relationship between economic growth and trade has been well established. ^{2/} That is, economic growth increases the actual and potential level of trade between countries as consumers achieve more purchasing power and begin to demand more products not widely produced in their countries. Under the impact of sustained economic growth in Japan and Western Europe during this past decade, consumption has become more diversified and specialization of production has increased. The net effect of these developments has been to increase trade between countries.

The changing nature of the demand for and supply of food associated with postwar economic growth of two regions in particular, Japan and Western Europe, has affected the level and commodity composition of actual and potential trade between most countries, and especially trade with the United States.

The ability of a country to satisfy rapid growth in demand for food and feed products depends on its agricultural resource

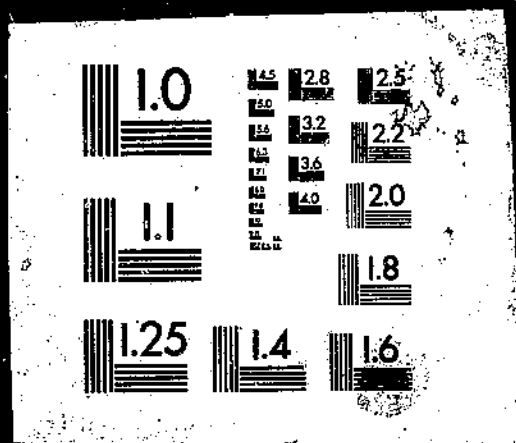

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endowments. Japan, with a limited supply of agricultural land available for production of feed grains and feeds, has relied heavily upon imports to meet growing demand. Reliance on Japanese imports has increased almost in direct proportion to increasing feed demand. In Western Europe, on the other hand, available land resources for feeds and feed grain production are relatively more abundant, making possible a greater reliance on domestic supplies for a large proportion of total feed consumption. These differences have strongly influenced the changing patterns of world agricultural trade in the postwar period and will continue to do so in the years ahead.

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
