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

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


Abstract (Limit: 200 words) During October-February 1981/82, U.S. farm-product exports totaled \$18 billion, \$1.6 billion below the same period a year earlier. U.S. agricultural imports of \$6.3 billion in the first 5 months of 1981/82 were 18 percent less than a year earlier. U.S. corn prices increased in January and February 1982, while wheat and soybean prices declined. The share of U.S. farm production exported during 1980/81 was about the same as in the previous fiscal year. The 10 leading State contributors to U.S. agricultural exports in 1980/81 were Iowa, Illinois, California, Texas, Minnesota, Kansas, Nebraska, Indiana, Ohio, and Missouri. U.S. commercial agricultural exports assisted under Commodity Credit Corporation programs reached a record \$1,849 million in 1980/81, 16 percent higher than the previous record in 1978/79.

Agricultural Exports Down 8 Percent in First 5 Months of Fiscal Year 1982 (see p. 4). During October-February 1981/82, U.S. farm-product exports totaled \$18 billion, \$1.6 billion below the same period a year earlier. Corn shipments continued to be depressed, and prices were well below previous-year levels. Larger wheat and soybean movements somewhat moderated the sharp drop in corn exports.

U.S. Agricultural Imports Decline 18 Percent in First 5 Months of Fiscal Year 1982 (see p. 33). U.S. agricultural imports of \$6.3 billion in the first 5 months of 1981/82 were 18 percent less than a year earlier. Import values were lower for most products except bananas, fruits, vegetables, malt beverages, and wine.

Selected Prices of International Significance (see p. 54). U.S. corn prices increased in January and February, while wheat and soybean prices declined. U.S. agricultural export and import unit values fell in the last quarter of 1981, although the export unit value index for calendar year 1981 was unchanged from the previous year.

Export Shares of U.S. Crops Change Little in Fiscal Year 1981 (see p. 60). The share of U.S. farm production exported during 1980/81 was about the same as in the previous fiscal year. Reduced crop production in 1980 and lower foreign demand resulted in a leveling off in shares of output moving abroad. Wheat and rice shipments continued to increase, however.

U.S. Agricultural Export Shares by Region and State, Fiscal Year 1981 (see p. 63). The 10 leading State contributors to U.S. agricultural exports in 1980/81 were Iowa, Illinois, California, Texas, Minnesota, Kansas, Nebraska, Indiana, Ohio, and Missouri. Although export values continued to climb for most commodities, uneven crop conditions during 1980 boosted shares for some States more than others. Tables present estimates of each State's contribution to exports based on production or sales information.

Commercial Agricultural Exports Assisted by CCC Programs Total Over \$1.8 Billion in Fiscal Year 1981 (see p. 76). U.S. commercial agricultural exports assisted under Commodity Credit Corporation programs reached a record \$1,849 million in 1980/81, 16 percent higher than the previous record in 1978/79. Wheat, corn, cotton, and rice were the main commodities shipped. Poland and Korea were the primary recipients of commercial export assistance.

Agricultural Exports Down 8 Percent in First 5 Months of Fiscal Year 1982

U.S. agricultural exports during October-February 1981/82 amounted to \$18 billion, 8 percent, or \$1.6 billion, below a year earlier. This decline suggests that the current fiscal year estimate of \$42.5 billion reported in the February 1982 Outlook for U.S. Agricultural Exports may be too high.

Corn exports of 21.3 million tons were 26 percent below those of a year earlier, and prices at the farm and at the gulf were more than one-fourth lower. Monthly corn shipments from June 1981 through February 1982 averaged 4.1 million tons, 23 percent below the previous 24-month average. October-February corn shipments declined most to Mexico, Brazil, Japan, and Eastern Europe, with smaller declines to the European Community, Portugal, Taiwan, and Korea. Spain continues to be one of the few growth markets.

Wheat exports, on the other hand, were 11 percent above the record level of October-February 1980/81 and have played a large part in stabilizing wheat prices over the past year. Shipments of Soft Red Winter wheat were up by 63 percent, with China--the largest U.S. wheat market--buying this class almost exclusively. Durum and Hard Red Spring wheat were up 67 and 20 percent, respectively, over the first 5 months of fiscal year 1981. Growth markets in fiscal year 1982 include the USSR, Peru, India, Nigeria, Iran, Italy, Turkey, and Algeria.

A record world rice crop was expected to significantly reduce U.S. shipments in fiscal year 1982. However, sales to Italy of 213,000 tons to date (versus 7,000 last fiscal year), plus strong demand for U.S. rice in West Africa and the Middle East, have picked up much of the slack left by Korea's absence. Last fiscal year, Korea purchased 1.2 million tons of U.S. rice, 37 percent of U.S. exports. Through February, rice sales to Korea were only 9 percent of year-earlier levels.

U.S. exports of soybeans and products have recovered from 1980/81's reduced levels, and in fact, soybean exports are presently moving at a record pace. Through February, 12.3 million tons were shipped versus 9.2 million the previous year. Shipments to Western Europe and the USSR are the principal reasons for this increase. Soybean meal shipments, at 3.2 million tons, were 13 percent above 1980/81's level. Western Europe has more than covered the slack left by Eastern Europe, the second largest U.S. soybean meal market. Over a fourth of the 335,000 tons of U.S. soybean oil exported to date have gone to Pakistan. Latin America continues to be a consistent growth area, but prospective soybean oil shipments to India this year remain uncertain.

Cotton shipments since mid-November have been very strong. However, prices averaged \$343 a ton below the previous year, precluding a gain in the total value of cotton exports this fiscal year. While exports to Japan, Korea, and Taiwan are at or above year-earlier levels, those to China are lagging 30 percent behind 1980/81's pace. The forthcoming Chinese crop will be a major determinant of U.S. export levels. That crop is currently estimated at 13.5 million tons, 9 percent above 1980/81's.

U.S. tobacco exports have benefited from a higher quality 1981 tobacco crop; shipments were up 9 percent in the first 5 months of 1981/82. Flue-cured tobacco usually accounts for over two-thirds of total shipments and burley another 15 percent. However, shipments of burley tobacco have nearly doubled in the past 10 years, while flue-cured shipments have shown a slight decline.

Sugar exports have slowed to a virtual halt. Fiscal year 1981 shipments of 935,000 tons were valued at \$597 million, largely the result of high world prices. Shipments through February of 186,000 tons were a third below those of 1980/81, with prospects for the fiscal year totaling 200,000 to 235,000 tons valued at \$80 to \$85 million.

Animal-product exports are enjoying a banner year, with dairy products, animal fats, red meats, and hides and skins showing volume increases. Poultry meat exports, a major growth sector, are presently 2 percent below fiscal year 1981's record pace. Shipments to Egypt, a tenth of the market, have been suspended as the Egyptian government attempts to control food purchases.

U.S. Agricultural Imports Decline 18 Percent in First 5 Months of Fiscal Year 1982

U.S. agricultural imports of \$6.3 billion in the first 5 months of fiscal year 1982 were 18 percent less than the previous year. The decline was caused mainly by the U.S. recession and lower per capita consumption of the major import commodities, coupled with lower import unit values for most products. However, import values were higher for bananas, fruits, vegetables, malt beverages, and wine.

Noncompetitive imports of \$2.2 billion were 21 percent below similar months the previous year. Green coffee--accounting for nearly half of all noncompetitive imports--dropped 28 percent in value and 12 percent in volume. The unit import price fell from \$1.36 per pound during October-February 1980/81 to \$1.12 per pound during the same months in 1981/82. Coffee imports from most Latin American countries dropped below year-earlier rates, while entries from Indonesia and Africa increased.

Rubber, the second major noncompetitive import, increased 17 percent in volume as low stock levels were replenished. However, unit import prices of rubber averaged 26 percent below year-earlier levels. With relatively high interest rates and the automobile industry in a slump, import volume is not expected to continue growing at current rates during the remainder of 1981/82.

Cocoa beans, the third ranking noncompetitive import, dropped 13 percent in value, but volume stayed about the same as prices fell. The price decline was due mainly to adequate U.S. inventories, high interest rates, and anticipation of even lower prices.

Competitive-product imports of \$4.2 billion dropped 15 percent below a year earlier as large value declines in meat and sugar failed to offset sharp gains in fruits and vegetables. Meat and product imports, at \$677 million, declined one-third from the previous year. Beef and veal imports fell 34 percent as domestic supplies increased. Value fell more rapidly as unit prices dropped 14 percent. Most of the decline in beef imports occurred in boneless beef from Australia.

Sugar imports of \$749 million declined 31 percent from a year earlier, while the volume rose 32 percent as prices dropped sharply. February sugar imports fell to their lowest monthly level since 1978, partly because of high import volume during October-December 1981 in anticipation of higher duties and fees.

Fruit and vegetable imports increased sharply, mainly due to the Florida winter freeze. Concentrated orange juice volume, mainly from Brazil, jumped 61 percent, and February's vegetable imports of \$152 million were more than double those during December 1981.

Selected Prices of International Significance

During January and February, price changes in world commodity markets were caused by a number of factors, including:

- o sluggish demand, especially in feed grain markets,
- o freezing weather in the United States,
- o lower-than-expected June to December 1981 wheat feeding,
- o increases in projected U.S. grain ending stocks,
- o lower-than-expected U.S. wheat exports,
- o financial constraints in Eastern Europe, and
- o the announcement of a reduced acreage program in the United States.

Lower Demand Drives Prices Downward

Reduced global demand replaced the huge U.S. harvests as the dominant factor depressing commodity markets. A heightening of tension between the United States and the USSR over Poland increased concern about the magnitude of trade between the United States and the USSR and Eastern Europe. The USSR purchased no U.S. wheat during January and February. Recent events in Eastern Europe point toward less U.S. exports to that area. Credit constraints, large debts, and other economic as well as political factors will restrict grain use. Elsewhere, a deepening and prolonged recession continues to reduce worldwide demand. Forecasts of U.S. wheat and coarse grain exports for 1981/82 dropped 10 million tons from the October estimate.

In late January, USDA announced a 15-percent reduced acreage program for wheat, rice, and cotton, and a 10-percent reduced acreage program for feed grains. The actual level of participation in the programs remains a question, but the program should help reverse the decline in grain prices next season.

Cold Temperatures Give Temporary Boost to Prices

Extremely cold temperatures during January in the United States pushed domestic grain and soybean prices higher because of shipping constraints and increased grain feeding. The freezing weather posed numerous transportation problems including ice on the Mississippi River that hindered grain movement to the gulf ports. Prices also increased in Rotterdam as apprehension set in that U.S. grain shipments to that port might slow. In February, extreme temperatures abated and prices dropped.

Wheat Prices Weaken

After increasing throughout most of the marketing year, wheat prices fell in January and February. With this year's supply mostly determined, attention focused on ending stocks, the prospects of a favorable winter crop, and worldwide demand. U.S.

wheat exports were below levels needed to reach the export forecast of 50.3 million metric tons. Domestic wheat feeding during June through December 1981 was lower than expected, and increased supplies from the other major exporters heightened competition for available markets. These factors pushed U.S. and world wheat ending stock forecasts above earlier estimates. World wheat consumption probably will fall below production for the first time since 1977/78. The likelihood of another winter wheat harvest of over 2 billion bushels also weighed heavily on prices.

Corn Prices Strengthen

Corn prices generally increased during January and February, even though some fundamentals were not price-supportive. On the negative side, domestic feed grain use and export estimates were reduced. Corn carryover stocks are expected to be double the previous year's. However, other factors lent some strength to feed grain prices. Foremost, feed grains entered the farmer-owned reserve at a fast pace, leaving less corn than expected available to the market. The USSR's resumption of feed grain purchases from the United States also supported prices.

Soybean Prices Firm, Then Drop

Domestic and foreign soybean and product prices increased in January, but settled lower in February. In January, cold, dry weather caused prices to increase slightly by slowing transportation and temporarily restricting availabilities of feedstuffs. Estimates of the 1981/82 U.S. soybean crop were lowered from previous estimates. At about the same time, a drought damaged the Brazilian soybean crop. In February, the weather in both the United States and Brazil moderated, and prices dropped.

Export and Import Unit Values Drop

The index for U.S. export unit values fell 17 percent for the quarter ending December 1981 compared with the same quarter the previous year. Unit values declined the most for soybeans, soybean meal, soybean oil, wheat flour, corn, and cotton. Unit values for nonfat dry milk, tobacco, rice, and cattle hides increased.

The U.S. import unit value index dropped 26 percent for the quarter ending December 1981 compared with the corresponding quarter a year earlier. Unit values for bananas, wool, tobacco, and tea increased, while those for coffee, sugar, beef, crude rubber, canned mushrooms, and cocoa beans dropped.

For calendar year 1981, the export unit value index rose slightly from 1980, while the import unit value declined 14 percent.

Export Shares of U.S. Crops Change Little in Fiscal Year 1981

U.S. EXPORT SHARE OF PRODUCTION

Export markets provide a significant source of income for U.S. farmers, representing about 30 percent or more of cash receipts in 1980. Production from 138 million acres was exported, equivalent to 2 out of every 5 acres harvested. Over one-half of U.S. wheat, rice, soybeans, sunflower seed, and cotton moved abroad. Between one-third and one-half of the coarse grain, tobacco, and some fruits and vegetables was sold in foreign countries.

The share of 1980 U.S. agricultural production exported during 1980/81 remained about the same as the share for the previous year (table 13). The drought-induced falloff in production, particularly for corn and soybeans, paralleled the decline in U.S. exports. A slowdown in world economic growth dampened consumption and, subsequently, foreign demand for feedstuffs. Cotton and tobacco shipments were also adversely affected by the slowdown and high interest rates, with lower quality tobacco an additional factor.

Record food grain (wheat and rice) exports highlighted an otherwise disappointing export performance in fiscal year 1981. With production down 9 percent in major competitor countries and record U.S. supplies, the share of the U.S. wheat crop exported rose to 68 percent, up from 65 percent in fiscal year 1980. Although the increase was evident in all classes of wheat, Soft Red Winter wheat showed the largest increase as China, the major U.S. wheat market, purchased this class almost exclusively. Rice exports continued to depend on sales to Korea. The primary U.S. growth markets for rice, West Africa and the Middle East, experienced mixed results in 1980/81, with the Middle East down from 1979/80 levels.

Competition from Brazil was unusually heavy in fiscal year 1981, particularly during the first 3 months. Brazilian soybean meal and oil were more price competitive in many instances, with France and India, major U.S. markets for meal and oil, respectively, buying Brazilian soybean products instead. Economic conditions also affected U.S. oilseed exports. Low crushing margins and high interest rates in Europe generally discouraged soybean crushing (for meal and oil) and inventory buildup. It was also to the advantage of U.S. crushers to crush sunflower seed and export the oil. A record 301,000 tons of sunflower oil was exported, primarily to Venezuela, Algeria, Egypt, and the European Community (EC).

Technological gains in agriculture have been accompanied by pressures on the U.S. farm sector--pressures alleviated by growing exports. Some of the pressures that have been building, particularly over the past 5 to 10 years, include the declining ratio of prices received to prices paid by farmers, inflated land values, and the growing concern over soil conservation. Since 1970, the quantity index of U.S. farm exports has risen at an annual rate of 8 percent, while the production index has increased by only 2 percent. Yield increases, however, have expanded U.S. supply without the need to bring in more land (table 14). Corn, at constant (1970) acreage, yielded an additional 33 million tons by 1980.

U.S. Agricultural Export Shares by Region and State, Fiscal Year 1981

U.S. agricultural exports reached record levels in 1980/81 of 163 million tons and a value of \$43.8 billion. Based on 1980 farm production and sales, 10 States--Iowa, Illinois, California, Texas, Minnesota, Kansas, Nebraska, Indiana, Ohio, and Missouri--accounted for 58 percent of the total agricultural export value. Estimated exports from three States--Iowa, Illinois, and California--exceeded \$3.5 billion each.

Increased soybean production during 1980 boosted Iowa's export share, while Illinois' share dropped because soybean output declined. Both States experienced reduced corn crops, but Illinois' production fell more sharply. Exports from California benefited from increased shipments of fruits, vegetables, rice, poultry, seeds, and hay, particularly to Japan and other Asian countries.

Five States--Texas, Minnesota, Kansas, Nebraska, and Indiana--derived more than \$2 billion each from farm products exported 1980/81. Texas, for example, ranked first in exports of cotton, grain sorghum, tallow, cattle hides, beef, and live animals, and third in rice and winter wheat. Minnesota's share increased from the previous year as its wheat and corn production grew, and export prices for oilseeds increased. Ohio, Missouri, North Carolina, Arkansas, North Dakota, and Washington each had between \$1 billion and \$1.6 billion in agricultural exports.

Export shares by State are estimated from various data bases, primarily from the volume of production by State. Off-farm sales were used for coarse grains, since a large part of the crop is used on farms within some States. Export values were obtained by multiplying the units of production or sales for each commodity from each State by the national average export unit value for each of the respective commodities. In cases where annual production series are not available, the 1978 Census of Agriculture data were used.

Since few States collect or publish information on exports, State shares were estimated from data sources such as USDA's Crop Reports or the Census of Agriculture. A major premise is that each State's share of exports equals its contribution to U.S. farm output. While this premise may not always be valid, producers in each State do obtain additional income indirectly from exports through their price-enhancing effect.

New items were included in the 18 commodity groups used for State export shares. Some of these were citrus pulp pellets, cranberries, macadamia nuts, horses, horsemeat, and ducks and geese. A "residual" commodity group contains primarily

miscellaneous animal products (wool, mohair, sausage casings, and other items), hay and other animal feeds, seeds, nursery stock, mint oils, and rye. Comparable data for 1979/80, including revised 1979 production statistics, are shown in table 17.

A number of exported agricultural products were not allocated to the States. These products included refined sugar, coffee, tea, cocoa products, spices, coconut and castor oils, and crude drugs which were imported, processed, and reexported.

Commercial Agricultural Exports Assisted by CCC Programs

Total Over \$1.8 Billion in Fiscal Year 1981

U.S. commercial agricultural exports assisted under Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) programs in fiscal year 1981 reached a record \$1,849 million, 16 percent higher than the previous peak of \$1,591 million set in fiscal year 1979. Only 4 percent of all commercial agricultural exports in fiscal year 1981 were aided by CCC programs. However, the proportion was considerably higher for exports to some countries.

Exports assisted under the Noncommercial Risk Assurance Program (GSM-101) of \$119 million in 1981 were considerably below those of a year earlier, because that program was replaced by the Export Credit Guarantee Program (GSM-102). This new program is designed to increase U.S. commercial agricultural exports by enabling foreign buyers to obtain commercial credit at U.S. banks for periods up to 3 years. The CCC covers payment defaults due to commercial or noncommercial reasons. The GSM-101 program guaranteed against default only for noncommercial conditions. Under the old CCC Export Credit Sales Program (GSM-5), which expired in fiscal year 1980, the Government provided credit at commercial bank terms. Under GSM-102, the Government is financially involved only if there is a payment default.

Principal commodity exports assisted by CCC programs in fiscal year 1981 were wheat, 30 percent of the total value of assisted exports; corn, 28 percent; cotton, 12 percent; rice, 11 percent; and soybean meal, 7 percent. CCC-assisted exports of wheat, corn, and rice were larger than in fiscal year 1980. CCC programs assisted exports to 18 countries. As in the previous fiscal year, major financing was provided to Poland, accounting for 35 percent of all CCC-aided exports, and Korea, 25 percent of the total. The largest gain was in assisted exports to Brazil, rising nearly 5 times. There were also large gains to Portugal, Poland, Morocco, Thailand, Jamaica, and El Salvador. Declines occurred mainly to Pakistan, Greece, and Yugoslavia. CCC programs provided financing for almost all commercial agricultural exports to Poland in fiscal year 1981; 42 percent to Morocco; 33 percent to Peru; and about 20 percent each to Brazil, the Dominican Republic, Jamaica, Korea, and Portugal.

An intermediate credit export program (GSM-301) was announced in 1980 to promote long-term market development for agricultural commodities. Under this program, CCC financed exports at commercial interest rates for 3 to 10 years. Local currency generated from the sale of CCC-financed commodities would be used in the foreign country to improve handling, marketing, processing, and storage facilities for imported commodities. This program financed \$11 million of grain sorghum and soybean exports to Israel in fiscal year 1981.
