Digest

Farm Exports One-Tenth Lower for First Half of 1981/82 (see p. 3). Sluggish prices for many key farm products continued to depress export values during the first half of 1981/82. Total value dropped 10 percent below 1980/81's level to \$21.8 billion, while volume declined about 3 percent. Most of the decline occurred in corn and cotton.

U.S. Agricultural Imports Down 17 Percent in the First Half of Fiscal Year 1982 (see p. 33). U.S. agricultural imports totaled \$7.7 billion during the first half of fiscal year 1982, 17 percent less than those a year earlier. Import values declined for most products except bananas, tea, dairy products, wool, fruits, vegetables, malt beverages, and wine.

International Commodity Prices Decline in March (see p. 55). Most grain prices in world markets averaged lower again in March. Depressed global demand and stock buildups were major factors in the continued slide in prices. Wheat, corn, and soybean prices averaged below levels a year earlier. U.S. export and import unit value indexes for key farm commodities during the January-March quarter fell 12 percent from the same period a year ago.

U.S. Agricultural Exports to 25 Major Markets, Fiscal Years 1976-81 (see p. 61). U.S. agricultural exports reached a record \$43.8 billion in fiscal year 1981, compared with \$40.5 billion in 1978/80 and \$22.7 billion 5 years earlier. Japan continued to be by far the largest market, purchasing over \$6.7 billion worth, or 15 percent of U.S. exports of farm products. Mexico jumped to the second position in 1980/81. Among the top 15 countries with increases were China, Korea, the USSR, Egypt, Venezuela, and Brazil.

Concessional Agricultural Exports Decline in Calendar Year 1981 (see p. 79). U.S. agricultural exports under Government-financed programs totaled \$1.3 billion in calendar year 1981, 6 percent less than a year earlier as P.L. 480 Title I sales and AID disbursements fell. Government program exports accounted for only 3 percent of all U.S. agricultural exports in 1981.

Farm Exports One-Tenth Lower for First Half of 1981/82

Although continued sluggish prices in fiscal year 1982 have relieved some of the pressure caused by an appreciating dollar and have helped maintain export volume, these prices lowered the dollar value of U.S. agricultural exports by a tenth for the first half of fiscal year 1982 to \$21.8 billion. Export volume, at 84.9 million tons, was 3 percent lower. Corn exports alone were more than 8 million tons less; value decreased by \$2 billion. Precarious economic and financial conditions drove export prices down, warranting a further downward revision in the fiscal year 1982 export forecast to \$42 billion (see May 1982 Outlook for U.S. Agricultural Exports).

Heavy Soviet purchases in March enhanced the prospects for a third consecutive year of record wheat exports. Wheat exports through the first half of fiscal year 1982 reached 23 million tons, 13 percent ahead of last year. The USSR had purchased 4.9 million tons of wheat through March (all Hard Red Winter), replacing China as the largest U.S. market. Shipments to China have slowed somewhat from last year's pace to 3.7 million tons through March.

South America continued to grow as a U.S. wheat market. Shipments of 2.7 million tons during October-March--primarily to Brazil, Peru, and Venezuela--maintained last year's record pace when 6.3 million tons were exported to the region. These shipments account for 15 percent of U.S. wheat exports and approximately three-fourths of the South American wheat import market.

Another 2.1 million tons of wheat and flour were shipped to North Africa, an increase of one-fourth over last year. Egypt became the fifth largest wheat market for the United States in fiscal year 1981 and, thus far, is ahead of last year's pace. Drought in many areas of North Africa over the past 2 years has boosted imports by Morocco, Algeria, and Tunisia.

Turkey, which is normally an exporter, and India, which has been self-sufficient in recent years, imported 1.4 million tons of U.S. wheat in the first 6 months of fiscal year 1982. Whether any more wheat will be shipped to either of these two countries this year is uncertain.

The outlook for U.S. wheat exports in fiscal year 1983 hinges mainly on crops that are now in the ground or yet to be planted, the effectiveness of the set-aside and grazing program in the United States, and economic conditions worldwide.

The decline in corn movements accounted for the 20-percent decrease in feed grain shipments during October-March. There

are many reasons for the decline in corn exports. In the European Community (EC), more feeding of domestic wheat and imported nongrain feeds (soybean meal, corn gluten, and manioc) is slowing corn use and consequently imports. Imports by Poland and Romania, the largest U.S. customers in Eastern Europe, have been constrained by a lack of credit, including CCC credit guarantees which are important in determining the level of imports from the United States. The U.S. market share for corn exports to Japan has fallen from 91 percent to 77 percent, with the shift to more South African corn. Following the bumper 1981 corn harvest in Mexico, stocks at the end of fiscal year 1981 were 3 to 4 times larger than stocks of the previous 5 years. Some other markets such as Venezuela and Korea have diverted some of their feed grain purchases away from corn and into grain sorghum. U.S. corn shipments this fiscal year have gone primarily to the USSR and Spain as a result of poor harvests in these countries.

Sorghum and barley continue to move out at near-record levels. Exports of feed grains during October-March totaled 31.1 million tons or 48 percent of the fiscal year estimate, compared with 56 percent a year ago.

Exports of U.S. soybeans have benefited from good crushing margins in Europe and elsewhere. Shipments are running 21 percent ahead of last year and 3 percent ahead of the 1979/80 record. In addition to gains in Western Europe, the USSR has purchased 655,000 tons to date after a 2-year absence from the market. In the first 6 months, 14.4 million tons were exported.

The EC also has played a large role in near-record shipments of soybean meal. Through March, 3.8 million tons were exported, three-fifths of which went to the EC, compared with less than half a year ago. Export gains in the EC, in parts of the Far East, and in Venezuela offset declines to Eastern Europe, Japan, and Mexico.

Soybean oil exports are expected to recover from last year's very low level of 739,000 tons to 885,000 in fiscal year 1982. However, this figure would be well below fiscal years 1978-80, when shipments were in the 1- to 1.2-million-ton range. This decline can be attributed to a number of factors: significant reductions in purchases by India; a shift in export emphasis to other oils, primarily sunflower; and large stock buildups. Pakistan has become the largest U.S. market, with purchases of 92,000 tons through March, followed by Colombia (51,115 tons) and India (50,600 tons). Total U.S. exports of soybean oil in the first half of fiscal year 1982 were 392,000 metric tons, up 9 percent from a year earlier.

Despite less than favorable economic conditions worldwide, the sensitivity of textile production to these conditions, and a record crop in China, U.S. cotton exports this year are expected to reach 1.5 million tons. Shipments to China in the

first 6 months of 1981/82 were down a third, or 76,000 tons. However, increases to Korea, Taiwan, Japan, Indonesia, and Western Europe more than compensated for this decline. U.S. cotton exports of 858,000 tons are 14 percent ahead of figures a year earlier. The effects of the Multi-Fiber Agreement and the EC's efforts to support its own textile industry through a significant reduction in textile imports could have a serious impact on U.S. cotton exports in the years ahead.

Tobacco exports have recovered from last year's low level--the lowest in 9 years--in large part due to demand in East and Southeast Asia. Half of the 156,000 tons of tobacco shipped during October-March went to this region, compared with less than 40 percent a year ago. A larger, better quality crop last year and steady prices have helped boost U.S. tobacco exports.

The threat of an EC-imposed levy on previously duty-free corn gluten feed has not slowed U.S. shipments in 1982. Exports in the first half of fiscal year 1982 reached 1.35 million tons, or 6 percent ahead of those a year ago. On top of continued gains to the EC, primarily to the Netherlands and the United Kingdom, Mexico had purchased nearly 34,000 tons through March.

Weak prices also have lowered the total value of animal-product exports this year. Butter, inedible tallow, red meat, poultry meat, and cattle hide markets all have seen falling prices over the past 6 months. Nonetheless, exports of animal products were 4 percent ahead of last year's pace by April 1. Volume is up 7 percent, a major factor being the 12-percent increase in whole cattle hide exports. Following the "boom" years of 1976-79, when the United States exported 24 to 25 million cattle hides annually, herd rebuilding began, slaughter declined, and exports fell to under 20 million pieces during fiscal years 1980 and 1981.

Developing country markets have been recognized as a major growth sector for U.S. agricultural exports over the past few years. Exports to these areas grew at an annual rate of 22 percent from 1978 to 1981 (compared with an overall growth rate for U.S. farm exports of 17 percent), increasing their share of total U.S. exports to 39 percent. The worldwide economic downturn has impaired that growth, however, as evidenced by the first half of fiscal year 1982's export statistics. U.S. exports to developing countries during October-March fell 18 percent to \$7.1 billion. While wheat, cotton, vegetable oils, soybean meal, and red meats increased in volume, declining shipments of corn, grain sorghum, soybeans, and inedible tallow, and generally lower export unit values far outweighed these increases.

U.S. Agricultural Imports Down 17 Percent in the First Half of Fiscal Year 1982

U.S. agricultural imports totaled \$7.7 billion during the first half of fiscal year 1982, 17 percent less than those a year earlier. Import values declined for most products except bananas, tea, apparel wool, dairy products, fruits, vegetables, malt beverages, and wine.

Noncompetitive imports of \$2.6 billion fell 20 percent below the same period in 1980/81. Green coffee--accounting for nearly half of all noncompetitive imports--dropped one-fourth in value and one-tenth in volume. The unit import price fell from \$1.36 per pound during the first half of fiscal year 1981 to \$1.13 in 1981/82. Brazil continued as the principal green coffee supplier, providing 18 percent of the import volume in 1981/82, down from 23 percent of the total a year ago. Import volume from Brazil fell 26 percent. Imports from Colombia and other South and Central American countries also declined. Supplies increased from most other major exporters, including Mexico, Indonesia, the Ivory Coast, and Uganda.

Rubber, the second major noncompetitive import, dropped 19 percent in value but rose in volume, mainly to replenish stocks. About 54 percent of rubber volume came from Indonesia and 27 percent from Malaysia. Cocoa bean import volume was nearly the same as a year ago, but import prices averaged 11 percent lower. Cocoa bean imports are expected to continue near last year's levels because of prospects for relatively low prices and a continued large domestic bean grind.

Competitive imports of \$5.1 billion were 15 percent below those a year earlier. Beef and veal (accounting for over half of all meat imports) declined 41 percent in value and 29 percent in volume as prices dropped. The continued low demand for manufacturing grade beef, high interest rates, and a shift to more poultry consumption resulted in reduced beef imports. Canned pork, mainly from Poland, declined while fresh and frozen pork (mostly from Canada) increased slightly.

Sugar imports of \$848 million dropped one-third while volume rose 28 percent, with substantial increases during October-December 1981 before fees and duties increased. Sugar import prices fell sharply because of increased world supplies. Brazil, the leading sugar supplier, provided 26 percent of total import volume, up from 23 percent a year ago. Import volume also rose from most other leading suppliers--Australia, Thailand, and the Dominican Republic. In early May, an emergency sugar import quota program was implemented to prevent increases in foreign purchases from disrupting U.S. price supports. A global import quota of 220,000 short tons was set for the period between May 11 and June 30.

Among other competitive products, import values for live animals, poultry products, hides and skins, nuts, oilseed products, and tobacco declined. Live animal imports dropped 13 percent, mainly in cattle and horses. Hide and skin imports dropped 10 percent, mostly in furskins. Oilseeds fell 31 percent in volume, mostly in peanuts, as the U.S. crop recovered from last year's record low level. Vegetable oils (mainly coconut oil from the Philippines) declined 32 percent.

Fruit imports, mostly concentrated orange juice from Brazil, jumped 22 percent while vegetable imports gained 36 percent, mainly due to the Florida winter freeze. Smaller value gains occurred in wine and malt beverage imports. Apparel wool imports increased due to higher prices and greater consumer demand for finer quality wool. Australia supplied over one-half of these wool imports.

International Commodity Prices Decline in March

Most grain prices declined in March from the previous month and were considerably lower than a year ago. Market activity focused on continued depressed demand, the prospect of large crops next year, and large buildups in stocks. Other factors that influenced the world grain situation in March were:

- poorer production prospects for Southern Hemisphere corn growers, especially in Argentina and South Africa,
- heavy coarse grain shipments to the USSR,
- a reduction in both U.S. 1981/82 wheat and corn export forecasts,
- additional increases in projected U.S. grain ending stocks, and
- a reduction in the 1981/82 Brazilian soybean crop estimate.

International Wheat Export Prices Drop

Wheat export prices in the United States, Canada, Australia, and Argentina in March dropped from the previous month. Australian export prices were nearly \$10 per metric ton higher than the U.S. gulf price, while both Canadian and Argentine export prices averaged \$10 a ton below the U.S. price. The U.S. gulf price fluctuated within \$10 per ton over the past year and was only \$7 below the price last March, while foreign export prices ranged between \$20 and \$45 a ton below prices a year ago.

Soviet Purchases Support U.S. Corn Prices

U.S. corn prices held steady from February, averaging \$116 a ton at gulf ports. Soviet purchases of U.S. corn increased, prompting USDA to raise the forecast of USSR coarse grain imports in 1981/82 by 1 million tons. Corn prices in Rotterdam increased slightly.

Soybean Prices Dip Despite Encouraging Prospects

U.S. soybean and product prices continued to spiral downward despite some bullish news. The Brazilian soybean crop estimate was reduced from the previous month. In addition, import demand in the EC and the USSR was strong, particularly for U.S. supplies. Domestic soybean meal prices dropped, while soybean oil strengthened slightly. Crushing margins in the spot market have been hovering around 20 to 25 cents a bushel for the last few months, an improvement from earlier in the crop year but well below industry norms.

Export and Import Unit Values Fall

The index for U.S. agricultural export unit values fell 12 percent during the quarter ending in March compared with the same quarter the previous year. Unit values declined the most for corn, wheat flour, sorghum, and cotton. Unit values for tobacco and nonfat dry milk increased.

The U.S. import unit value index also dropped 12 percent for the quarter ending in March. The average unit value for sugar was little changed from the previous quarter, but half the value of January-March 1981. Rubber, beef, and cashew nut prices also declined. Import unit values increased for tobacco, cattle, and bananas.

In the upcoming months, price changes are most likely to be affected by:

- the degree of participation in the reduced acreage programs in the United States,
- weather in the Northern Hemisphere as the winter wheat crop is harvested and coarse grains and soybeans are planted,
- developments in U.S.-USSR trade,
- financial constraints in importing countries, and
- the expected upturn in the U.S. economy in the second half of the year followed by increased growth in other areas of the world.

U.S. Agricultural Exports to 25 Major Markets, Fiscal Years 1976-81

Total agricultural exports reached a record \$43.8 billion in fiscal year 1981, compared with \$40.5 billion in 1979/80 and \$22.7 billion 5 years earlier. Sharp increases in exports to Mexico, Korea, Egypt, Venezuela, Brazil, Japan, and China more than offset declines to several Western European countries.

Japan continued to be the largest market by far, with \$6.7 billion or 15 percent of farm-product exports in 1980/81. Japan's purchases rose 17 percent from 1979/80, mainly in grains and soybeans. Mexico moved up to the second leading market from fourth place in fiscal year 1980, purchasing \$2.7 billion. Agricultural exports to Mexico increased 36 percent from 1979/80's level, mainly in feed grains, wheat, and oilseeds. Farm-product exports to the Netherlands and West Germany, the third and fourth leading markets in 1980/81, declined from the previous year. Reduced export levels stemmed mainly from low economic growth rates in the EC and appreciation of the dollar which raised the effective prices of U.S. farm products in Europe. Also, marginal livestock growth resulted in cutbacks in soybean imports.

Farm-product exports to Mainland China--the fifth leading market for the last 2 years--rose 12 percent from 1979/80's value, reaching a record \$2.2 billion, mainly due to increased wheat purchases. Wheat export volume to China more than doubled, making that country the principal overseas buyer of U.S. wheat for the second consecutive year. Agricultural exports to Korea--the sixth leading market for the last 2 years--reached a record \$2.1 billion, about one-third higher than a year ago, mainly in grains and cotton.

Farm-product exports to the USSR--the eighth leading market for the last 2 years--totaled \$1.7 billion, 15 percent higher than in 1979/80 when exports dropped sharply after the partial grain embargo. U.S. agricultural exports to Eastern European countries in 1980/81 dropped 14 percent to \$2 billion, partly due to little or no economic growth and foreign exchange shortages. Declines to Czechoslovakia, East Germany, and Yugoslavia more than offset gains to Bulgaria, Poland, and Romania.

Feed grains--the largest U.S. agricultural export--increased in value to \$10.4 billion in 1980/81 because of higher prices. Volume fell, partly due to stagnant economic growth in several foreign markets. Japan took nearly one-fourth of U.S. feed grain exports in 1980/81 and 4 percent more than the previous year's volume. Mexico, the second leading market with 9 percent of U.S. feed grain exports, also increased its import volume. Among other leading markets in 1980/81, Portugal, Korea, Belgium, Romania, Venezuela, and Egypt experienced volume gains. Volume declined mainly to the USSR, Spain, Poland, Taiwan, several EC countries, and China.

Wheat and flour exports increased in value during 1980/81 to nearly \$8 billion. Wheat and flour volume was 17 percent higher than in fiscal year 1979/80. Wheat exports to China, the USSR, Latin America, North Africa, East Asia, and the Middle East provided most of the growth in foreign demand for U.S. wheat.

Soybean exports of nearly \$6 billion declined both in value and volume in 1980/81. About two-fifths of all soybeans went to the Netherlands and Japan in 1980/81, with volume levels to both countries less than in 1979/80. Among other leading markets, West Germany, Taiwan, Mexico, Belgium, Indonesia, and Portugal experienced volume gains. Volume declined mainly to Spain, Italy, the USSR, France, China, Korea, the United Kingdom, and Canada.

Cotton exports of \$2 billion in 1980/81 dropped 16 percent below 1979/80's level. Korea, the largest market, purchased less cotton, as did China and Japan, the other two major markets.

Rice exports of \$1.5 billion increased again during fiscal year 1981. Korea was the leading rice market, with about 37 percent of total U.S. rice export volume, mainly due to its second consecutive poor crop year. Principal growth markets for U.S. rice in recent years have been in Sub-Saharan Africa and the Middle East.

Concessional Agricultural Exports Decline in Calendar Year 1981

Concessional agricultural exports under Government-financed programs totaled \$1.3 billion in calendar year 1981, 6 percent less than a year ago, mainly due to declines in shipments under Public Law (P.L.) 480 Title I sales and Agency for International Development (AID) disbursements. Exports under P.L. 480 amounted to \$1,193 million, 4 percent below a year earlier, while higher commodity prices caused the volume shipped to drop 9 percent. Government programs accounted for only 3 percent of total U.S. agricultural exports in calendar year 1981.

Food aid went to over 70 countries in 1981; however, 5 countries--Egypt, India, Pakistan, Indonesia, and Bangladesh--received 53 percent of the total. About 29 percent of all food aid went to Egypt, compared with one-third a year ago. Poland, Peru, Somalia, Sudan, and Morocco were the remaining top 10 recipients in calendar year 1981. Despite the overall decline in food aid, concessional aid increased to 5 of the top 10 recipients--India, Pakistan, Poland, Peru and Morocco.

Exports under P.L. 480 Title I long-term dollar credit sales of \$708 million were 7 percent less than in 1980. Five countries--Egypt, Indonesia, Poland, Pakistan, and Bangladesh--received 60 percent of all Title I sales. The first Title I sale was made to Poland in 1981. Wheat, accounting for 46 percent of the value of all Title I exports, fell 10 percent. Egypt received 44 percent of the wheat, followed mainly by Bangladesh, Korea, Morocco, Sri Lanka, and Sudan. Rice, the second major commodity under Title I, declined 7 percent in value but, because of rising prices, declined 25 percent in volume. Indonesia, Peru, and Liberia were the major rice recipients. Wheat flour, the third major commodity under Title I, rose in 1981, with Egypt the chief recipient. Corn under Title I declined, while soybean oil increased in 1981. Most of the corn went to Poland, and the soybean oil was sent mainly to Pakistan.

Title II donations (36 percent of all food aid) totaled \$485 million in calendar year 1981, about the same as a year earlier. About 57 percent of all Title II exports were donated through voluntary relief agencies, 26 percent moved through the World Food Program, and the remainder was government-to-government shipments. India, the principal recipient, received 26 percent of total Title II donations. Principal commodities under Title II were soybean oil, 20 percent of total value; bulgur wheat, 17 percent; blended food products (wheat-flour-soya and corn-soya-milk), 14 percent; wheat and rice, each 10 percent; and wheat flour and nonfat dry milk, each 7 percent. The quantities shipped in 1981 increased for all these products except wheat flour, rice, and blended food products.

AID disbursements of \$141 million were 18 percent less than in 1980. Almost all recorded AID transactions went to Egypt, mostly in corn, tallow, tobacco, and poultry meat.

Wheat, valued at \$377 million, was the leading agricultural commodity shipped under Government programs in calendar year 1981 and accounted for 28 percent of all concessional exports. The value for wheat (almost all under Title I) fell 10 percent from the previous year as prices rose. Corn, valued at \$164 million, was the second leading commodity shipped under concessional terms in 1981. Both the value and volume declined from a year ago. Among other concessional products, exports of nonfat dry milk, bulgur wheat, and soybean oil gained. Exports of rice, blended food products, pulses, tallow, cotton, and tobacco declined. Wheat flour rose slightly in value but declined in volume as prices increased.

Developments in the Common Agricultural Policy of the European Community

Summary

The European Community (EC) must reduce expenditures for agricultural support programs to avert a budget crisis and maintain funds for other EC programs. Policymakers have a choice of keeping prices low directly or with producer taxes, or of limiting quantities covered by support measures. This study examines future price levels and possible changes in EC policy, and the possible timing of those changes.

Present trends of rising agricultural support expenditures will not leave adequate funds to finance enlargement of the Community to include Spain and Portugal. EC expenditures are close to exceeding revenues, with the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) accounting for almost 70 percent of these expenditures. EC revenues increase roughly in proportion with national income, but CAP expenditures increase in proportion to agricultural surpluses, which have risen 15 to 20 percent annually over the last 5 years. An increase in revenue to solve the budget problem would require modifications of basic treaties, which appear politically infeasible.

Thus, expenditure increases must be contained. Budget costs cannot be controlled if farm prices are allowed to rise enough to cover inflation. Price increases much smaller than past increases would control budget expenditures, or a nominal rise in agricultural prices may be possible if coupled with policy changes restricting production or the quantities which qualify for support.

All alternatives which can reduce EC budget costs also reduce subsidized exports and the protection of EC agriculture, thus easing tensions with EC trading partners. Countries outside the EC which export the products in which the EC has a surplus have a direct interest in the outcome of the Community's internal debate. The United States will be particularly interested because the EC is the largest market for U.S. agricultural exports. Any policy changes or reductions in price increases which adequately control the EC budget, however, may also be too restrictive on farm income and perhaps lead individual EC governments to return to national agricultural support.
