Personal report Biography of Bruce Greenshields

Editor-in-Chief of Agricultural Economics, Vols. 8-11

Bruce Greenshields obtained a Bachelor's degree in Political Science and a Master's in Economics. He began his career at the Economic Research Service of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) in 1967 as an Agricultural Economics Researcher in the areas of trade, policy and food demand. He later became Assistant Administrator and in 1991 Deputy Administrator in the USDA.

Bruce Greenshields organised the contributed paper competitions and sessions for the IAAE triennial conferences in Tokyo (1991), Buenos Aires (1988) and Malaga (1985). He co-edited (with Margot Bellamy) the proceedings of the contributed paper sessions for five IAAE conferences (the three listed above as well

as Jakarta (1982) and Banff (1979)), which were published as books in the IAAE Occasional Paper Series. He also launched and was the first Editor of the IAAE Newsletter.
