

You have just opened the newest edition of the Journal of the ASFMRA with the most up-to-date collection of agricultural consulting, farm management and rural appraisal topics in the world. In the following pages you will find cutting-edge manuscripts documenting research, field studies, practices and methodologies proposed by the leading academic, appraisal, consulting and management leaders of agriculture. This edition of the Journal continues to provide our membership and the agribusiness community with topics on newly evolved issues and concepts for your review and consideration.

The Editorial Committee was asked to review a large number of papers and has selected these eighteen as providing the best assortment of topics.
