### NOTES TO THE CONTRIBUTORS

- 1. The Bangladesh Journal of Agricultural Economics is a half yearly publication of the Bureau of Socioeconomic Research and Training, Bangladesh Agricultural University, Mymensingh. Issues are published in June and December.
- 2. Articles and short notes based on basic and applied research or policy issues on socioeconomic aspects of agriculture and rural development are accepted for publication.
- Papers may be written in English or Bengali. For papers written in Bengali, an English summary must be given. Each article should contain an abstract not exceeding 150 words.
- 4. Three copies of the manuscript typed in double space on good quality white paper should be sent to the **Executive Editor**. Accepted article may be sent in a retrievable Floppy disk (using MS-Word).
- 5. Name (s) and identification of the author (s) should only be provided on a separate page along with the article.
- 6. Footnotes should be numbered continuously and be typed together at the end of the main text. Tables and graph should be typed on separate pages.
- 7. References in the text or in a footnote should be given in the following manner: (Khan 1972, p. 27) or (Khan and Bose 1976) or (Winnergren et al. 1984)
- 8. A bibliography of all the references given in the text arranged in alphabetic order be provided at the end of the paper. Style of typing should be:
  - Alamgir, M. (1975). "Some Aspects of Bangladesh Agriculture", *Bangladesh Development Studies*, 4,2 (April): 402-68.
  - Colman, D. (1983). "A Review of the Arts of the Supply Response Analysis", *Review of Marketing and Agricultural Economics*, 51 (3): 201-30.
  - Khan, A. R. (1975): The Economy of Bangladesh. London: Macmillan.
  - Cummings, J. T. (1974): Supply Response in Peasant Agriculture: Price and Non-Price Factors. Unpublished Ph.D. Thesis, Tufts University.
- 9. For articles published in the Journal, Author (s) will get 10 copies of reprint free.
- 10. Proofs will be sent to authors, if there is sufficient time to do so. They should be corrected and returned to the Executive Editor within three days of receipt. Major alterations cannot be accepted.
