NOTES TO CONTRIBUTORS

- The Bangladesh Journal of Agricultural Economics is a half yearly publication of the Burgau of Socioeconon ic Research and Training, Bangladesh Agricultural University, Mymensingh. Issues are published in June and December.
- 2. Articles and short notes based on basic and applied research on socioeconomic aspects of agriculture and rural development are accepted for publication.
- Papers may be written in English or Bengali. For papers written in Bangali, an
 english summary must be given. Each article should contain an abstract not exceeding 150 words.
- 4. Three copies of the manuscript typed in double space althrough on good quality white paper should be sent to the Executive Editor.
- 5. Name (s) and identification of the author(s) should only be provided on a separate page along with the title of the article.
- Foot notes should be numbered continuously and be typed together at the end of the main text. Tables and graphs should be typed on separate pages.
- References in the text or in a footnote should be given in the following manner: (Khan 1972, p. 27), (Khan and Bose 1967) etc.
- 8. A bibliography of all the references given in the text arranged in alphabetic order be provided at the end of the paper. Style of typing should be thus:
