NOTES TO CONTRIBUTORS

- The Bangladesh Journal of Agricultural Economics is a half yearly publication of the Bureau of Socioeconomic Research and Training, Bangladesh Agricultural University, Mymenshingh. Issues are published in June and December.
- 2. Articles and short notes based on basic and applied research on socioeconomic aspects of agriculture and rural development are accepted for publication.
- Papers may be written in English or Bengali. For papers written in Bengali, an english translation of the summary must be given. Each paper should contain an abstract not exceeding 150 words.
- 4. Two copies of the manuscript typed in double space althrough on good quality white paper should be sent to the Executive Editor.
- 5. Name (s) and identification of the author (s) should only be provided on a separate page along with the title of the article.
- 6. Foot notes should be numbered continuously and be typed together at the end of the main text. Tables and graphs should be typed on separate page.
- 7. References in the text or in a footnote should be given in the following manner: (Khan 1972, p.27), (Khan and Bose 1967) etc.
- 8. A bibliography of all the references given in the text arranged in alphabetic order be provided at the end of the paper. Style of typing should be thus: Khan, 1972 Khan, A.R.: The Economy of Bangladesh. London: Macmillan, 1972. Alamgir, 1975 Alamgir, Mohiuddin: "Some Aspects of Bangladesh Agriculture".
