ANNOUNCEMENTS

NINETEENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE SOCIETY

Members may be aware of the 10th International Conference of Agricultural Economists which was held at Mysore during 24th August—3rd September, 1958, under the joint auspices of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Government of India and the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics. Your President, Hon. Secretary and the staff of the Society have been heavily and very nearly fully occupied with the arrangements for the International Conference. There are still heavy arrears of work connected with the International Meet which remains to be cleared, particularly relating to the preparation of accounts, their audit and submission to the Government of India. In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Society feel that it will be extremely difficult to hold the 19th Annual Conference of the Society. Accordingly, the idea of holding the 19th All-India Agricultural Economics Conference scheduled to be held in December, 1958, has been dropped. Members are requested not to send papers on the subjects chosen for discussion this year. This, however, would mean considerable disappointment to many in the fraternity as this will deprive them of an opportunity to meet annually to exchange research experience and take stock of the progress of their Society. But we are sure you will appreciate that the decision of your executive was the only possible under the circumstances.

TENTH INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMISTS

The 10th Session of the International Conference of Agricultural Economists was held at Mysore from 24th August to 3rd September, 1958 under the joint auspices of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Government of India and the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics. The Session was inaugurated by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the Prime Minister of India. About 350 delegates from 58 countries participated in the deliberations of the Session. The Indian delegation consisted of about 60 eminent economists. The delegates who are specialised in their fields of study, were drawn from the Universities, Research Institutions and Government Departments. The general theme of the Session was "Agriculture and Its Terms of Trade." Twenty-two papers on diverse aspects of the general theme were read and discussed.

Excursions were arranged around Mysore to provide the delegates an opportunity to see the world famous treasures of art and architecture, large and small scale industries as also the working of the multipurpose co-operative society at Mandya, Agricultural Research Farm, the Village Level Worker's Training Centre and the Home Science Section of the Gram Sevika Training Centre at Ganadalu. The delegates also visited the Krishnaraja Sagar Reservoir and the Brindavan Gardens as also the Bandipur (in Mysore) and Madhumalai (in Madras) game sanctuaries and tea and coffee estates in the Nilgiris.

A post-conference All-India tour was organised from the 4th to 12th September, 1958, covering various places of historical and agricultural interest in South, Central and North-West India. Some of the places visited were Ajanta-Ellora Caves, the Taj, the Bhakra-Nangal and some of the Community Projects and National Extension Service Blocks. Nearly 180 delegates joined the tour.

A resume of the Papers and Proceedings of the International Conference will be published in the next issue of the Journal.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF PAPERS BY AUTHORS

1. **Subjects:** The objective of the *Journal* is to provide a forum for dissemination and exchange of findings of research on agricultural economics. Purely descriptive material is not appropriate for such a journal. Papers dealing with (i) new developments in research and methods of analysis, or (ii) which apply existing empirical research methods and techniques to new problems or situations, or (iii) which attempt to test new hypotheses/ theoretical formulations or modifications of existing theories or policies to explain economic phenomena especially in the Indian context, or (iv) papers based on research done by the authors bringing out new facts or data presented in an analytical frame will be preferred. Younger economists are advised to seek guidance from their seniors in the preparation of the paper for the *Journal*. A one-page statement indicating the author's own assessment of the importance and relevance of the findings reported in his paper in the context of recent researches would be welcome.

2. **Size of Paper :** In view of the exorbitant increase in the cost of printing, it has become necessary to restrict the length of the papers accepted for publication to 20 (double space) typed pages (of the size 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ -by-11 inches) including tables and appendices (with margins on all sides of at least 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches). Papers exceeding this size limit will be returned to the authors. The authors may however send along with their papers such "supporting material" as may be of help to the referees in evaluating them. Abstracts not exceeding 100 words should be submitted in duplicate along with the paper.

3. **Copies :** Two copies of each paper should be submitted along with a processing fee of Rs. 15/- either by M.O. or crossed I.P.O. (\$ 4.00 or £ 2.50) drawn in the name of the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics, to meet partly the postage and other incidental charges.

4. **Author's identification :** To protect the anonymity of authors while referring the Papers for expert opinion on their merits, authors are advised to avoid disclosing their identity in the text and to attach a separate page showing the name(s) and affiliation(s) of the author(s) along with any footnotes containing bibliographical information or acknowledgements.

5. **Mathematical notations :** Only essential mathematical notations may be used; it is prohibitively costly to typeset such notations. All statistical formulae should be neatly typed.

6. **Figures-Charts and Tables :** Professional assistance should be availed of while presenting figures and charts. They should be drawn in black ink which can be easily reproduced by photographic process. Typescript is not suitable for reproduction. Roman numerals may be used for tables.

7. **Footnotes :** Footnotes should be numbered consecutively in plain arabic superscripts.

8. **References and citations :** Only cited works should be included in the reference list. Please follow the style of citations as in previous issues of this *Journal*.

9. **General :** While sending papers the authors should state that the material has not been published elsewhere or is not being published or being considered for publication elsewhere.

10. **Reprints :** Ten free reprints of the paper would be given to the author; additional reprints, if required, are supplied at cost which may be ascertained from the Editor.
