The Research Programmes Committee of the Planning Commission was set up in July 1953 to sponsor and assist research in problems of economic development. The Committee consists of senior social scientists in the country. So far the Committee has sponsored more than 200 research projects on problems of economic and social development, of which reports on 80 have been published. Out of the various categories of subjects on which research has been sponsored in co-operation with the Universities and other research institutions in the country, projects relating to agricultural economics and related fields number 27. Besides, reports have been completed in respect of 40 other projects in this particular field. 2. WORLD AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS AND RURAL SOCIOLOGY ABSTRACTS (WAERSA)

A significant step forward in the development of this world-wide abstracting and information service was announced at the International Conference of Agricultural Economists in Lyon, August, 1964.

Sir Thomas Scrivenor, Secretary to the Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux (CAB), informed the Conference that CAB had agreed to accept responsibility for the production and publication of WAERSA at least until October, 1967, and that Mr. J. O. Jones, then Director of the Institute of Agrarian Affairs, University of Oxford, had been appointed to succeed Dr. von Frauendorfer who had announced his intention of retiring from the editorship. The Conference paid tribute to Dr. von Frauendorfer's pioneering work in establishing this much needed service.

The Editorial Office has since been transferred to Oxford; and at the CAB Review Conference held in July, 1965, it was resolved that the Editorial Office should become a full Commonwealth Bureau not later than 1967. Continuity is thus assured. This Bureau will cover world literature on both economic and social aspects of agriculture, and WAERSA will continue to be the principal means of disseminating information in the form of classified abstracts and review articles.

The opportunity has been taken to develop the classification of subject matter, which is now arranged under 10 main headings—Agricultural Policy; Agricultural Products—Supply, Demand and Prices; Marketing and Distribution; International Trade in Agricultural Products; Finance and Credit; Economics of Preduction; Co-operation; Education and Training; Rural Sociology; and Research Methods and Techniques relating to the preceding sections, together with a selection of reference material. Under each main heading the material is further sub-classified according to a simple decimal pattern which is being progressively developed. Annual and quarterly author indexes and annual subject indexes are at present provided. Beginning with Volume 8 (1966) it is hoped also to include quarterly subject and geographical indexes.

As WAERSA is now heavily subsidized by the countries of the British Commonwealth and the Republic of Ireland, subscribers from these contributing countries are enabled to receive WAERSA at the low price of £3.0s.0d. per annum. Subscribers from other countries pay £5.0s.0d. per annum—which is still much below cost.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF PAPERS BY AUTHORS

- 1. Subjects: The objective of the Journal is to provide a forum for dissemination and exchange of findings of research on agricultural economics. Purely descriptive material is not appropriate for such a journal. Papers dealing with (i) new developments in research and methods of analysis, or (ii) which apply existing empirical research methods and techniques to new problems or situations, or (iii) which attempt to test new hypotheses/ theoretical formulations or modifications of existing theories or policies to explain economic phenomena especially in the Indian context, or (iv) papers based on research done by the authors bringing out new facts or data presented in an analytical frame will be preferred. Younger economists are advised to seek guidance from their seniors in the preparation of the paper for the Journal. A one-page statement indicating the author's own assessment of the importance and relevance of the findings reported in his paper in the context of recent researches would be welcome.
 - 2. Size of Paper: In view of the exorbitant increase in the cost of printing, it has become necessary to restrict the length of the papers accepted for publication to 20 (double space) typed pages (of the size $8^{1/2}$ -by-11 inches) including tables and appendices (with margins on all sides of at least $1^{1/2}$ inches). Papers exceeding this size limit will be returned to the authors. The authors may however send along with their papers such "supporting material" as may be of help to the referees in evaluating them. Abstracts not exceeding 100 words should be submitted in duplicate along with the paper.
- 3. Copies: Two copies of each paper should be submitted along with a processing fee of Rs. 15/either by M.O. or crossed I.P.O. (\$ 4.00 or £ 2.50) drawn in the name of the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics, to meet partly the postage and other incidental charges.
- 4. Author's identification: To protect the anonymity of authors while referring the Papers for expert opinion on their merits, authors are advised to avoid disclosing their identity in the text and to attach a separate page showing the name(s) and affiliation(s) of the author(s) along with any footnotes containing bibliographical information or acknowledgements.
- 5. Mathematical notations: Only essential mathematical notations may be used; it is prohibitively costly to typeset such notations. All statistical formulae should be neatly typed.
- **6. Figures-Charts and Tables :** Professional assistance should be availed of while presenting figures and charts. They should be drawn in black ink which can be easily reproduced by photographic process. Typescript is not suitable for reproduction. Roman numerals may be used for tables.
 - 7. Footnotes: Footnotes should be numbered consecutively in plain arabic superscripts.
- 8. References and citations: Only cited works should be included in the reference list. Please follow the style of citations as in previous issues of this *Journal*.
- **9.** General: While sending papers the authors should state that the material has not been published elsewhere or is not being published or being considered for publication elsewhere.
- 10. Reprints: Ten free reprints of the paper would be given to the author; additional reprints, if required, are supplied at cost which may be ascertained from the Editor.
