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
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

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PATTERNS OF WORLD TRADE IN PROCESSED FOODS

INTRODUCTION

Compared to basic agricultural commodities, international trade in high-value agricultural products, including processed foods, is both more stable from year to year and associated with greater income and employment multipliers in the trade-originating countries (Schluter and Edmondson, Henderson). However, in the U.S. agricultural economists have given relatively little attention to international trade flows in processed foods. At least conjecturally, such lack of attention may be due in part because, on a volume basis, exports of basic commodities overshadow processed foods by a ratio of roughly 9 to 1; in part because exports account for only a small share, less than 4 percent, of the output of U.S. food manufacturers; and in part because markets for processed foods are characterized by competitive imperfections such as product differentiation, increasing returns to scale and seller concentration which are not compatible with neoclassical international trade theory.

The purpose of this paper is to characterize major international flows of processed foods, with particular emphasis on the types of products that are traded, shipments to importing countries, and leading export suppliers. The intent is to stimulate interest by agricultural economists to turn some analytical attention to both the causes and consequences of international trade in processed foods, and in so doing, develop an understanding of how such trade determinants and effects compare and contrast with those for basic commodities.

DATA

Data herein represent the most internationally comprehensive information on sourcedestination trade flows in definitive product categories. They are drawn from magnetic computer

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tapes containing the D-series trade statistics compiled by the United Nations. These data are also available in a publication series from the Department of International Economic and Social Affairs, Statistical Office of the United Nations, titled "Statistical Papers, Commodity Trade Statistics, according to the Standard International Trade Classification, Series D".

These data have been reported to the United Nations Statistical Office on an annual basis. The computer tape version has been converted to a common format that allows direct comparisons across countries and over time (SITC Rev. 1). The Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) has undergone three revisions; the first revision came into use in 1960, the second in 1976 and the third was implemented in 1988. Data that are provided to the United Nations classified by any SITC revision are published as reported. Data that are provided according to a national classification scheme are converted to the current SITC revision. Thus, the printed reports may contain data classified by any of the three SITC revisions. The computer tapes standardize all classifications into SITC Rev. 1. SITC is a hierarchical classification; both the computer tape and the publications report aggregates as well as individual products.

This is the only available source of time-series trade data that is comprehensive with regard to product definitions that allow identification of processed foods and that matches individual exporting and importing countries. The U.N. data include trade between 232 trade partner countries, based on reports of exports and imports from about 160 reporting countries. In many cases, there are substantial differences in the quantity and/or value of a product reported as exported from country A to country B and B's reported imports from A. While numerous attempts have been made to reconcile these differences (see Tsigas et al, for example), ambiguity remains. For purposes herein, reported imports are used exclusively, based on the convention

that the existence of revenue-producing import tariffs create greater national incentives for accuracy in import than export reporting.

Revision 1 of the U.N. SITC includes about 360 different categories of food and agricultural products. To extract processed foods, a concordance was developed between the SITC and the 4-digit Standard Industrial Classifications (SIC) used by the U.S. Census Bureau to define food manufacturing industries. This concordance was based on concordances used by the International Trade Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce and by the Food Manufacturing and Distribution Section of Economic Research Service, United States Department of Agriculture. These 4-digit classifications can be aggregated to 3-digit major product categories such as meat products, and to the 2-digit SIC 20, Food and Kindred Products category, representing all processed foods.

With roughly 360 product categories traded among more than 36,000 pairs of countries, it is necessary to partition the U.N. bilateral trade data in order to comprehend the most significant trade flows. To that end, data were compiled on reported imports by selected country groups; North America (U.S., Canada, Mexico), the 12 member countries of the European Community (EC), 7 other Western European counties not included in the EC (Austria, Finland, Iceland, Malta, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland), other developed countries (Australia, Israel, Japan, New Zealand), and a group of Newly Industrialized Countries (NICs: Hong Kong, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia, Singapore, Taiwan). A 25 year period encompassing 1962-1987 was examined at five year intervals. With the exception of Mexico, the first four groups of countries were selected based on the convention that by virtue of a relatively high per capita income, industrialized countries are the major import buyers of processed foods. Mexico was included

due to proximity to the United States and to fully represent a potential North America Free Trade Area. The countries for the last group were selected to represent rapidly-growing economies that are becoming important importers of processed foods. These countries now represent more than 90 percent of the total value of world imports of SIC 20 - Food and Kindred Products as reported by the United Nations data set. The values herein used are those as reported in U.S. dollar amounts on the U.N. series D data tape, no adjustment was made for inflation.

LEADING IMPORTERS OF PROCESSED FOODS

SIC 20 - FOOD AND KINDRED PRODUCTS

The value of imports of all processed foods (SIC 20) for 1987 and 5 year intervals there before are reported in Appendix Table 1. The countries were ranked according to the total value or processed foods imported in 1987. Appendix Table 2 displays the ranking of each country in order of importance as an importer of SIC 20 products for each of the 6 interval years and Appendix Table 3 reports SIC 20 imports by country as a percent of the total SIC 20 imports by the selected countries.

These data reveal a remarkable stability over time in the relative importance of countries as importers. However, there are some interesting trends. Japan has steadily increased in importance, moving from the eighth ranked importer in 1962 to third in 1987. The United Kingdom slipped a couple of places over the same period from number two to number four. A decided down trend in share of the total imports is exhibited between 1962 and 1987 by both the United States and the United Kingdom, moving from 26% and 23% respectively to 16% and 9%, while Japan's share of during the same period increased from 3% to 12%.

Developed countries, as a group, dominate world trade in processed food. The 30 selected

countries account for approximately 90% of world imports; the Newly Industrialized Countries account only 6% of this total. By bloc, the relative importance of Western Europe, including the EC, has remained remarkably stable while North America has declined. In absolute values, there are 6 major import markets, those that imported more than \$10 billion in processed food products in 1987. The United States with \$23 billion is the largest, followed by West Germany, Japan, the United Kingdom, France, and Italy (Table 1). These 6 countries account for approximately 55%

of all SIC 20 imports. The EC-12 countries accounted for approximately 52% of the world total in 1987.

Average annual rates of change in the nominal value of imports over each 5 year interval are reported in Appendix Table 4. overall, growth was more rapid during the 1970s than in the 1960s and 1980s. This may reflect relative inflation rates more than real growth, however. Most recently, Taiwan, Spain, Portugal, Greece, Japan, Korea, Denmark and Italy stand out with the most rapid rates of import growth; North America has grown at a below average rate across the entire 25 year period.

Table 2 shows each of the 3-digit SIC categories as a percentage of total SIC 20 imports. Both 206 - Sugar and Confectionery Products and 207 - Fats and Oils, have declined in relative importance. 209 - Misc. Food and Kindred Products displays an uptrend; this category includes seafood and a wide range of branded, packaged, and highly differentiated products; it is also the largest category. SIC 201 - Meat Products is the second largest grouping, with a relatively stable share averaging around 18% of all SIC 20 product imports.

Because the EC countries, as a bloc, dominate imports of SIC 20 products, intra-EC trade should be examined. A total of 50% of the food imports by EC counties were imported from other EC countries (Table 3). Intra-EC trade was calculated for each of the 3-digit SIC categories. This is particularly high in beverages, dairy products, meat products, and bakery products. By contrast, it is low in SIC 209, Miscellaneous Food and Kindred Products, at 31%, and in Fats and Oils, SIC 207, at 35%.

TRADE BY MAJOR FOOD GROUP

The value of imports of processed foods are reported in the Appendix Tables 5-22, detailed for each 3-digit SIC in pairs of tables. The first reports the value of imports by country and year; the second reports the percentage of total SIC 20 imports in the same format.

SIC 201 - MEAT PRODUCTS

The Meat Products group (SIC 201) represents 18% of total SIC 20 imports in 1987. The data in Appendix Table 5 indicate that the same 6 countries that dominate total SIC 20 trade are even more dominant in meat imports; Italy, Japan, West Germany, France, the United States, and the United Kingdom account for about 75% of the total (Table 4). Meat imports have become relatively more important in Japan and Italy; less so in the U.S., UK and Germany.

Appendix Table 6 reports imports of meat products as a percent of total SIC 20 imports by country. Korea and Taiwan both exhibit strong uptrends; Mexico also shows sizable recent gains. Imports by Korea jumped from 6% of total SIC 20 imports in 1972 to 40% in 1977 and 54% in 1987. While several years of information is missing for Taiwan, the available date indicate a move from 9% of total imports in 1967 to 35% of SIC 20 imports in 1987. Imports of meats by Spain, however, trended down as percent of the total from a high of 38% in 1972 to 18% in 1987. Meat products represent more than 30% of total SIC 20 imports for both Greece and Italy over the entire period.

Because Meat Products are the second largest category of imports, comprising 18% of the total, data on imports were compiled in this category for both 4-digit SIC's and all available SITC's (Table 5). This demonstrates the complexity of actual trade flows; even when reported at the 4-digit SIC level, a multiplicity of products are included in various categories. SIC 2011 contains bovine, pig, mutton, and horse meat, in addition to hides and skins. Meats make up approximately 78% of SIC 2011; 41% is bovine, 26% is pig, and 5% is mutton. Edible offal, hides and skins account for most of the remaining 22%. While this level of detail is not

presented for most 3-digit categories, it can be generated where needed for detailed analysis of trade patterns in any specific category of processed foods.

SIC 202 DAIRY PRODUCTS

Of interest in Appendix Table 7, SIC 202 - Dairy Products, is the importance of the EC. Approximately 70% of all dairy product imports are accounted for by the EC countries. Of this, 71% is intra-EC trade (Table 3). This suggests that proximity is a particularly important factor determining trade patterns for these products. In 1987 West Germany, the Netherlands, and Italy each import more than \$1.5 billion, while the United Kingdom and Belgium/Luxembourg each imported approximately \$1 billion in dairy products. Imports of dairy products as a percent of total food imports have increased sharply in both the Netherlands (1% to 20%) and Mexico (19% to 32%) from 1962 to 1987 (Appendix Table 8). In contrast, an opposite trend was exhibited in the United Kingdom and Taiwan.

SIC 203 - PRESERVED FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PRODUCTS

A similar pattern of dominance by 6 countries, West Germany, the United States, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom, France, and Japan, is exhibited in Appendix Table 9. In 1987, each of these countries imported in excess of \$1 billion of SIC 203 - Preserved Fruit and Vegetable Products; together these countries account for 50% of the import market. Data in Appendix Table 10 show imports of Preserved Fruits and Vegetables increasing as a percent of total food imports. This is particularly pronounced in the United States, and to a lesser extent in the EC. Overall, in terms of share of total food imports, preserved fruits and vegetables have increased more than any other category except miscellaneous food products (SIC 209).

SIC 204 - GRAIN MILL PRODUCTS

EC countries dominate the import market for SIC 204 - Grain Mill Products (Appendix Table 11), accounting for 70% of the total imports. West Germany, the Netherlands, Italy,

Belgium/Luxembourg, France, and the United Kingdom each imported more than \$500 million of these products in 1987. Japan imported \$474 million; it is the only other major buyer in this market segment. Grain Mill Products as a percent of total food imports are shown in Appendix Table 12. Portugal and Ireland are the only countries where the share increased appreciably. In contrast shares have trended sharply downward for the entire set of Newly Industrialized countries and show little or no trend in either direction for the majority of importing countries. When contrasted with, for example, meat products (SIC 201), a relatively low income elasticity of import demand for grain mill products is suggested.

SIC 205 - BAKERY PRODUCTS

Bakery Products, Appendix Table 13, make up the smallest 3-digit category of processed food imports, accounting for less than 2% of total SIC 20 imports. SITC 04881 Bread and Biscuit, etc.; SITC 0482 Cake and Pastry, etc.; and SITC 04883 Communion Wafers etc., are the only products imported in this classification. But, as can be seen in Appendix Table 23, some countries have experienced considerable growth in this category; most notably, Japan, France, Ireland, Italy, Norway, and New Zealand. As with other highly perishable products, a considerable amount of trade in SIC 205 products is intra-EC (Table 3).

SIC 206 - SUGAR AND CONFECTIONERY PRODUCTS

Imports of SIC 206 - Sugar and Confectionery Products (Appendix Tables 15and 16), have significantly decreased in relative importance over time. This category accounted for approximately 17% of total SIC 20 trade in 1962, but declined to just over 11% in 1987. The EC countries account for 56% of all imports. The United States and West Germany are the largest single importers; these countries along with the United Kingdom, France, the Netherlands, and

Japan import 66% of the total. Sugar and Confectionery products as a percent of total food imports decreased considerably more in the United States, Canada, the Netherlands, Portugal, Japan, and Korea than in other countries. Imports became relatively more important only in Israel, Singapore, Malaysia and Spain.

SIC 207 - FATS AND OILS

Imports of SIC 207 - Fats and Oils are detailed in Appendix Table 17; the EC countries again dominate this market with 74% of the total. Five countries; West Germany, France, Italy, the United Kingdom, and the Netherlands, each imported more than \$1 billion in 1987. Even more so than sugar and confectionary products, the relative importance of imports of Fats and Oils has declined in nearly all countries (Appendix Table 18); in general, however, they appear to be relatively more important in the lower income countries.

SIC 208 - BEVERAGES

The United States stands out as the dominant importer of SIC 208 - Beverages purchasing approximately \$3.5 billion or 28% of all internationally traded beverages (Appendix Table 19). When the beverage imports of just three countries, the United States, the United Kingdom and West Germany, each importing in excess of \$1.5 billion, are combined they comprise 54% of the total. This is a "highly concentrated" import market segment. Imports of beverages have become a considerably larger proportion of total food imports in several countries, most notably in the United States and the United Kingdom (Appendix Table 20).

SIC 209 - MISCELLANEOUS FOOD AND KINDRED PRODUCTS

SIC 209 - Misc. Food and Kindred Products imports (Appendix Table 21) make up the largest single 3-digit SIC category, accounting for 30% of all SIC 20 imports in 1987. This

category has exhibited considerable growth in relative importance over the reported time period (Appendix Table 22). The United States and Japan are by far the largest importers; these two countries accounted for 42% of all imports in 1987. The 12 EC countries account for another 42% of all 1987 imports; yet Portugal, Greece and Ireland are among the smallest importers in this product category. This group of products represents more than 40% of all SIC 20 imports for 8 countries: Japan, Australia, the United States, Portugal, Spain, Denmark, and Hong Kong. Japanese imports as a percentage of all food imports increased from 10% in 1962 to 54% in 1987.

Because of the size and importance of this category, data for SIC 209 was disaggregated to the 4-digit SIC level and to reported SITC's in each 4-digit SIC (Table 6). SIC 2091, Canned and Cured Fish and Seafoods and SIC 2092, Prepared Fresh or Frozen Fish and Seafoods, make up about 60% of the total, followed by SIC 2092 at 46.5%. Coffee, SIC 2095, are 25.4% of the total and SIC 2099, food products not elsewhere classified, account for an additional 13%. This product group contains a large number of branded, highly differentiated products.

GROWTH IN FOOD IMPORTS

Average annual growth rates over this 25 year period in the nominal values of imports for these 3-digit categories of processed food products are shown in Appendix Table 23. The remarkable thing here is, with relatively few exceptions, the similarity in growth rate within a product category across countries. Sugar and confectionery imports and imports of fats and oils have grown relatively slowly; imports of bakery products and processed fruits and vegetables

have grown relatively rapidly. Most countries reflect these general patterns. This suggests that there may be a fairly high degree of global commonality, globally, in both food consumption and trade trends.

Also, it can be observed that trade in most product categories has grown more rapidly in the EC bloc of countries than world-wide. This may be a reflection of the economic incentives

for the formation of a common market among those countries, the actual trade impacts of forming such a market, or more likely, a combination of both.

LEADING SUPPLIERS OF PROCESSED FOODS

SIC 20.- FOOD AND KINDRED PRODUCTS

Having identified the leading importers of processed food products and the specific products imported, it can be ascertained who are the suppliers. To that end the top thirty supplier countries of SIC 20 products to the selected country set were identified. As with the importers, suppliers were ranked according to the value of processed food supplied in 1987. Appendix Table 24 shows these thirty suppliers for 1987 and the value of their shipments for each 5 year interval there before. Appendix Table 25 shows changes in these 5 year intervals and Appendix 26 shows how each supplying country ranked in each period.

The pattern here, as for the importers, is remarkably stable over time. For the most part, developed countries are supplying these products to other developed countries; of the 30 largest exporting countries in 1987, 21 are listed among the largest importers. Twelve countries account for 55% of total world exports. No one country dominates as a supplier. For example, the Netherlands has been ranked number one since 1972 but only accounts for approximately 9% of the total shipments. The United States was the number 3 supplier in 1987; this despite the fact that it exports a very small proportion of its total production of processed food products. Sizable gains in ranking were made by several EC countries, notably France, Germany and Belgium-Luxembourg, as well as well as by Mainland China, Taiwan and Thailand. However none of these countries account for more than 8% of the total. Argentina and New Zealand are conspicuous by their large drop in ranking, moving from number 6 and 7 in 1962 to number 20

and 17, respectively, in 1987.

Very little change has occurred in the top 30 exporters list over time. In 1962, three countries; Algeria, Gahana, and the Dominican Republic, were on the list in positions 15, 23, and 29, respectively. In 1967 these three countries were replaced with Mainland China, Indonesia, and the Ivory Coast. Sri Lanka and Nigeria went off the list in 1972 while Taiwan and Malaysia entered. In 1977, Japan, Peru, and Poland were replaced with El Salvador, Gahana, and Kenya. These three countries dropped from the list in 1982. Japan moved back in position 28, Korea and Switzerland made the list for the first time. South Africa was replaced in 1987 by Greece, its first appearance. All countries that fell from this list were ranked in the bottom third with two exceptions; Algeria was ranked number 15 in 1962 as was Japan in 1972.

Appendix Tables 29 through 37 present data on the 15 largest originating countries (1987) for each of the 3-digit SIC categories. The top 15 typically account for 75% or more of all exports in each category. If product categories were further disaggregated, e.g., 4-digit level, supplier concentration would be even greater. In 1987, the Netherlands was the leading exporter in four of the nine 3-digit product categories; the U.S. led in three, and Germany and France had the leading share in one category each. With the exceptions of Germany for bakery products (SIC 205), The Netherlands for preserved fruits and vegetables (SIC 203), and the United States for miscellaneous foods (SIC 209), the leading country has held the leading position for at least a decade.

SIC 201 - MEAT PRODUCTS

The top 15 suppliers of meat products to the selected country set accounted for 82% of world exports in 1987. Eight EC countries; the Netherlands, Denmark, West Germany, France,

Belgium-Luxembourg, the United Kingdom, Ireland, and Italy account for 48% of the world total and approximately 52% of exports to the selected country set. The United States gained about 4% in market share over the 25 years, moving from 7% of total exports in 1962 to 11% in 1987. Taiwan stands out as a big gainer in this market, moving from 61st position, shipping approximately \$1 million, in 1962 to 12th position in 1987, shipping about \$710 million. Argentina dropped from 3rd position in 1962 to 13th in 1987. With the exception of Denmark and Ireland, who both slipped in rankings, the other six EC countries all moved up over the period (Appendix Table 27).

SIC 202 - DAIRY PRODUCTS

Trade in dairy products is very highly concentrated among the European Community countries. There are eight EC countries among the top 15 exporters; they account for 72% of all exports of dairy products. Three of these countries; the Netherlands, Germany, and France, account for 47% of the total. With the exception of Denmark and Italy, all the EC countries made substantial gains in rank over the 25 year period. These gains were offset by large drops by New Zealand and Australia as well as the United States (Appendix Table 28). For the EC countries combined, the growth rate in dairy product exports since 1962 has been 5 times greater than that of the United States, 14 times greater than New Zealand, and 17 times more rapid than Australia.

SIC 203 - PRESERVED FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

The standout in this product category is Brazil which was ranked 69th in 1962 and number 2 in 1987. This reflects development of the citrus processing industry in Brazil; it is the dominant exporter of frozen orange juice concentrate. Israel and Germany both became more

important exporters while Italy, Spain, and Greece all became relatively less important. The Netherlands is ranked as the number one exporter, but note that in 1987 they imported \$1,349 million and exported \$1,365 million. This accents the role of the Netherlands as a handler or or further processor and re-exporter of food products (Appendix Table 27).

SIC 204 - GRAIN MILL PRODUCTS

The U.S. has long been the leading supplier of these products to the world market, followed by six EC countries: France, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium/Luxembourg and the U.K. The most significant gains in relative export importance have been EC countries: Ireland, Spain, Denmark, Italy and Belgium/Luxembourg. By contrast, among the major suppliers, Thailand, Canada, Australia and China have grown relatively slowly; all are major grain-growing countries. Japan, the Netherlands, and Belgium/Luxembourg are known to be leading importers of commodity grains; their ranking among the 15 leading exporters of grain mill products suggests that these countries process and re-export substantial volumes of grain-based foods (Appendix Table 30).

SIC 205 - BAKERY PRODUCTS

The value of bakery products traded internationally is relatively small. EC countries hold dominant positions in this trade, accounting for the seven most important exporters and six of the seven largest importers; the U.S. is the other leading importer. The relative importance of exporting countries has been remarkably stable over time; throughout the entire 25 year period, the U.S., Canada, and various EC countries have accounted for all 10 leading exporting positions. Spain and Austria have shown the largest relative export gains. Given the proximity of the major trading countries and the perishable nature of many products in this category, it is likely that

border trade is prevalent (Appendix Table 31).

SIC 206 - SUGAR AND CONFECTIONERY PRODUCTS

Five countries; Germany, the Ivory Coast, France, Belgium/Luxembourg, and Malaysia, all exhibit major moves upward in importance as exporters of sugar and confectionery products. Australia and Gahana both exhibit substantial downtrend as did the Phillipines, who slipped off the list of the top 15 from number 1 in 1962 (Appendix Table 32).

SIC 207 - FATS AND OILS

Imports of Fats and Oils have become less important over time, declining from 12% of total SIC 20 imports in 1962 to 9% in 1987. The United States has held the number one ranking as an exporter over the entire 25 years; but its market share declined from approximately 17% in 1962 to about 11% in 1987. Mainland China, Greece, and Chile have grown dramatically in relative importance over the 25 years (Appendix Table 33).

SIC 208 - BEVERAGES

France is the dominant supplier in this market, with 33% of total world exports of beverages (mainly wine). The United States and the Netherlands both have shown relative improvement over time. Mexico has moved up the most, improving its 33rd position in 1962 to 11th in 1987 (Appendix Table 34). The most noticeable decline was for Algeria, holding the number 1 slot in 1962 and disappearing entirely from the top 15 list a decade later.

SIC 209 - MISCELLANEOUS FOOD AND KINDRED PRODUCTS

No one country dominates this market segment. The United States is the number 1 ranked exporter with 6% of world exports while Mexico, ranked 15th, has 2.4%. There are six countries that have made remarkable gains in their ranking over the 25 years; Taiwan, South

Korea, Thailand, Mainland China, Germany and France. The United States has also made considerable improvement, moving from number 15 in 1962 to number 1 in 1987. The relative importance of coffee in this product category can be seen in the high ranking of Brazil and Columbia; however, both had declined somewhat by 1987, undoubtedly reflecting changes in beverage consumption patterns as well as a probable increase in the relative importance of seafood, accounting for gains by Asian countries, and highly differentiated manufactured foods, accounting for gains by the U.S. (Appendix Table 35).
