APPENDIX I
REPORT
OF THE
HONORARY SECRETARY AND TREASURER

For the year ending 31st December, 1949.

The Ninth Annual Conference of the Society was held at Hyderabad (Deccan) under the auspices of the Hyderabad Government on 29th, 30th and 31st December, 1948. Sir S. V. Ramamurthy presided. The Conference was inaugurated by Sri D. R. Pradhan, Finance and Revenue Member and Additional Chief Civil Administrator of Hyderabad. Sri L. N. Gupta gave the Welcome Address. About 200 members and delegates and several visitors attended the session.

Papers on the following subjects were read and discussed at the Conference :—

1. Scope and Method of Teaching and Research in Agricultural Economics in India.
2. Economics of Mechanisation of Agriculture.
3. Price Spreads in Marketing of Agricultural Produce.

The current topic discussed was :—

“Grow More Food Policy in India.”

The proceedings of the Conference were published in Vol. IV, No. 1 of the Society's Journal in March, 1949.

Publications : Journal

Two issues of the Journal were brought out during this year one of which is the Conference Number. We are grateful to the Indian Council of Agricultural Research for their sanction of grant equal to one-third of the cost of publication of the Journal but not exceeding Rs. 2,000.

The Indian Rural Problem

All the copies of the third Edition of the book are nearly sold out and preparations are being made for publication of a revised Edition. It is proposed to add a new chapter surveying the important events of the Post-war and Post-independence period which have a close bearing on the subject of Agricultural Economics.

Bhuvel : A Socio Economic Study of a Village

The Survey was published in Gujarati in March this year and the English Edition of the same was brought out in August. This study which was prepared during 1946-47 covers all aspects of rural life, economic, as well as social, in a village in the Charotar area in Baroda. In this undertaking we were assisted by the then Government of Baroda State, which readily placed the services of all the Departments concerned at our disposal for helping us in studying technical problems such as classification of soil, irrigation, medical examination of the people of the village, etc. Government of Baroda gave us a grant of Rs. 2,500 towards the expenses of printing the English Edition of "Bhuvel."

"Rural Life in Baroda"

This monograph was published this year. It was compiled by the Government of Baroda in accordance with the synopsis prepared by the Society on the lines of the League of Nations' Monographs relating to the

Continental countries. The first publication in the series was published by the Madras Government for their Province. We thank the Government of Baroda for the grant of Rs. 1,450 towards the cost of its printing.

Both the "Bhuvel Survey" and "Rural Baroda" have been distributed free to the members of the Society.

A Design for the Layout of the Indian Transport and Communication System

This thesis by Dr. Deodikar is now printed and is ready for sale. The brochure brings out the inadequacy of the means of transport and communication in the country in general and in rural areas in particular and puts forward a scheme for providing these facilities speedily and at a low cost.

Problems of Land Tensures and Population in West Bengal (by Visva-Bharati, Sriniketan)

Sri Jyoti Bhattacharjee, the Economist of Visva-Bharati Institute of Rural Reconstruction, Sriniketan, has submitted a detailed report of progress of the Research Scheme. It will be remembered that the Society made a donation of Rs. 4,000 for making a research investigation into the problem of Land Tenure, Tenancy and Pressure of Population in West Bengal. "Test Surveys" in five villages in Birbhum and Burdwan Districts have been completed. Schedules have been prepared on the basis of the knowledge gained. Till the end of November 1949 enumeration work covering 578 families living in 7 villages has been completed. The work of tabulation is proceeding side by side. The study will be continued in the next year when a further sum of Rs. 4,000 will be paid towards its expenses. It is regretted that there is very little co-operation from the Government of West Bengal.

Readings in Agricultural Economics

The series has been planned with a view to bringing together in a concise form, selected extracts or readings from various important works in Agricultural Economics published in America, Great Britain, India and elsewhere. For the present, subjects such as Agricultural Price Policy, Rural Sociology, Agricultural Rehabilitation, Land Tenure and Tenancy, etc., have been selected for the purpose. A volume on Rehabilitation is almost complete and will shortly go to press. Volumes on Agricultural Prices and Extension Service are nearing completion. We are grateful to the Reserve Bank of India for their grant of Rs. 10,000 towards the cost of preparation of these volumes.

Enquiries

The Society continued to supply information on topics on Agricultural Economics referred to it by Governments and other bodies.

Stresa Conference

The Seventh International Conference of Agricultural Economists was held at Stresa (Italy) between 21st and 28th August 1949. Sir Manilal Nanavati, Mr. M. L. Dantwala and Dr. B. Natarajan, the Economic Adviser to Government of Madras attended the Conference. Part of the expenses of the Hon. Secretary was paid by the Society.

Library

During the year, 72 volumes besides a number of valuable pamphlets and reports were added to the Library, bringing the total number of books in the Library to about 1,300. The Library is open to the members of the Society. Research students in the Agricultural Economics Section of the Bombay University School of Economics are making good use of the Library. Books are loaned to members on payment of a deposit.

During the present year, 85 new members were enlisted.

Accounts

The audited Balance Sheet for 1948 is printed herewith. The trial balance for the current year ending 30th November is also submitted herewith (Annexure C).

The loss in the working of the Society for the current year so far comes to Rs. 5,000.

The expenses of the Society both for printing of publications and on the office staff are increasing every year and all our efforts to obtain grants from the Government of India or from the Government of Bombay whom we had approached have not so far met with success. Time has come when the Society should secure some permanent sources of income.

We are glad to report that our request for exemption from the payment of Income Tax on donations made to the Society was conceded by the Government of India. This concession may help us to obtain some more donations.

Prof. Ashby's Tour

We are glad Prof. Ashby has been able to accede to our request to attend our Annual Conference and tour the country, visiting Universities and Research Institutes, specialising in Agricultural Economics. He delivered a series of lectures at the University School of Economics at Bombay, visited the Government of Bombay's Milk Colony at Aarey and contacted several Co-operative Institutes in the City. At Poona he gave addresses at the Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics, the College of Agriculture, and the Co-operative College and visited the Co-operative Farm and School at Manjri. He has just returned from a week's visit to Hyderabad. From here, he is due to proceed to Calcutta, Shantiniketan, Allahabad and Delhi and may visit Walchandnagar and some rural areas of Gujarat.

The tour expenses of Prof. Ashby's visit will be met from the grant placed at our disposal by the Hyderabad Government last year and will be supplemented from grants made by some of the Provincial Governments and other non-official agencies for the purpose.

The Branch continued its effort to enroll members residing in the Central Provinces and Berar.

2. *Funds*

Subscriptions received from members were transferred to the Head Office. The Branch incurred small contingent expenditure which was met from the initial grant of Rs. 200/- received from the Head Office in the year 1948-49.

As no donations have been received so far, the activities of the Branch were carried out under severe financial limitations.

3. *Work of the Branch*

(a) A lecture by Shri Subba Rao, Officer in Charge, Agricultural Credit Department, the Reserve Bank of India, on the subject of Co-operative Finance was arranged at Nagpur.

(b) A lecture by Shri B. Shivaswamy on Agrarian Legislation in India was arranged at Nagpur.

(c) A symposium and a series of lectures on the abolition of landlordism were arranged at Jubbulpore and prominent speakers e.g. Hon'ble Pandit D. P. Mishra, Hon'ble Shri P. K. Deshmukh, Shri Charan Singh, Dr. J. C. Kumarappa, Dr. V. G. Vaidya were invited to speak. Shri Beohar Rajendra Singh presided.

(d) Students of local Colleges in Jubbulpore were given a demonstration of tractor farming at Jubbulpore and Shri D. S. Nag explained its economic aspects.

APPENDIX IV

THE INDIAN SOCIETY OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS

CONSTITUTION

1. The name of the Society shall be "The Indian Society of Agricultural Economics".

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the investigation, study and improvement of the economic and social conditions of agriculture and rural life.

These objects shall be pursued by:—

- (a) holding periodical Conferences for the discussion of problems ;
- (b) publishing papers or summaries of papers, either separately or collectively, or in a periodical which may be issued under the auspices of the Society ;
- (c) co-operating with other institutions having similar objects, such as the International Conference of Agricultural Economists and the Indian Economic Association ;
- (d) any other means which the Society may decide.

3. The Society shall consist of (a) Members, (b) Honorary Members, and (c) Member-Institutions, who are interested in the economic and social conditions of agriculture and rural life.

Candidates for Membership shall be nominated by any two Members of the Society and admitted to Membership on being approved by the Executive Committee.

Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be nominated by the Executive Committee and elected by a majority of Members present and voting at a General Meeting of the Society.

Institutions wishing to become members shall apply to the Executive Committee and will be admitted to Membership on its approval.

Members and Member-Institutions shall pay to the Society an annual subscription of Rs. 12/-. The composition of subscription for Life-Membership shall be Rs. 250/-.

Member-Institutions shall be entitled to send only one representative to the Conferences and Meetings and shall not be entitled to the composition of subscription for Life Membership.

4. Except as otherwise provided in the Constitution, the business of the Society shall be conducted by the Executive Committee.

5. The Office-bearers of the Society shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, an Hon. Secretary-Treasurer and an Hon. Joint-Secretary, if appointed.

The Executive Committee of the Society shall consist of:—

- (1) the President,
- (2) three Vice-Presidents,
- (3) an Hon. Secretary-Treasurer,
- (4) an Hon. Joint Secretary (if appointed), and
- (5) nine Members.

The President and in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents present, shall preside at the Executive Committee meetings.

The Office-bearers and the Executive Committee shall hold office till their successors are elected.

The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancies in the Committee occurring during their period of office.

6. The General Meetings of the Society shall ordinarily be held once a year. The time and place of such General Meetings shall be fixed by the Executive Committee and not less than twenty-eight days' notice of these General Meetings shall be given to all members, Hon. Members and Member-Institutions.

A Special General Meeting may be convened by the Executive Committee at any time and shall also be convened on the requisition of not less than twenty-five Members. Fourteen days' notice of such Special General Meeting shall be given.

The following business shall be transacted at the General Meetings:—

- (1) Consideration of the annual report and audited accounts.
- (2) Election of Office-bearers and the Executive Committee.
- (3) Election of Hon. Members if any.
- (4) Appointment of auditors.
- (5) Consideration of any proposed amendments to the Constitution, subject to Clause 7.
- (6) Other relevant business.

7. Any amendments intended to effect any alteration in the Constitution of the Society, shall be submitted in the form of a written notice of motion, to be circulated to Members, Hon. Members and Member-Institutions with the notice of a General Meeting and shall be considered at such General Meeting. Amendments shall be carried with two-thirds majority of the Members present at such General Meeting.
