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RESULTS FOR THE THREE YEARS: 1962/3 to 1964/5

Department of Agricultural Economics

The producers co-operating in this survey were asked to provide weekly records showing separately the production and feed inputs of breeding and feeding pigs. The survey, which ran for a period of three years ending on 24th April, 1965, was handled by Mr. G.D. Tyler.

The results listed on the following pages are mainly intended for the information of these producers to enable them to study the comparative efficiency of their own production.

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TRENDS IN PRODUCTION ON AN IDENTICAL SAMPLE OF HERDS

Information for a group of 23 herds for the three years, 1962/3 to 1964/5, shows how pig producers have attempted to maintain net income throughout a period of rising competition and declining returns. During this period two in every three producers expanded production, in some cases very considerably. A marked decline in output occurred, however, on four herds a reflection, perhaps of the high rate of retirement which has been a feature of the national herd over the last decade.

Table 1 shows that while output per herd rose on average by approximately £1000, the rate of profitability fell from 24 per cent of output in 1962/3 to 18 per cent in 1964/5.

The change in the value of output per herd reflects important changes in organization as well as in prices. Two herds switched from breeding and feeding to feeding only; one herd abandoned feeding to concentrate on selling weaners. The principal change, however, was a marked expansion of numbers of pigs. This is illustrated in the following table, which shows the substantial change occuring in respect of sizes of breeding herds.

The very small herd is rapidly becoming a thing of the past, a trend which is noticeable in all branches of livestock production in South East England.

The average number of sows per breeding herd rose by one quarter between 1962/3 and 1964/5, or from 21.1 to 26.4 head. This increase appears to have yielded some economics since costs per sow fell by 10 per cent. Unfortunately, as Table 3 shows, total output per sow fell disproportionately. This offset much of the advantage of larger herd size with the result that breeding and feeding herds showed only a very modest improvement in total profitability.

There was, however, a useful improvement in the efficiency of weaner production, measured in terms of food cost per weaner produced. It can be seen from Table 4 that this resulted mainly from a saving in feed consumption but there was also a slight increase in the number of weaners reared per sow per year. With less than 14 pigs reared por sow on average, there is obvious scope for much further improvement.

The returns from fattening, which are shown in the following table, declined between 1962/3 and 1964/5. This was despite the sizeable increase in production.

As 35 per cent more pigs were marketed in 1964/5, the outturn was obviously very pocr.

The evidence suggests that it was not possible for producers to match the downward drift of prices of fat pigs with greater efficiency^{*} and it was only by virtue of very much increased effort and capitalization that overall profitability was stabilized. While lower market prices were the principal cause of smaller returns in 1964/5, higher weaner costs were also experienced. As the following Table shows, the margin per pig before meeting overheads and labour fell by £1 on average:

The higher cost of feed per lb. liveweight gain in feeder pigs in 1964/5 was associated with a rise in the food conversion rate, from 3.53 to 3.61, and with a rise in food cost per ten, from £27. 4s. to £27 l6s.

* The reader is referred to the table on page 16 for further information in this regard. This table also shows a marked seasonal variation in returns. The margin over feed costs in winter averaged only two-thirds of the level in summer on porker producing herds over a three year period. This contrasts with the position on mainly baconer producing herds where the proportion was four fifths.

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The Cost of Producing a Porker

This has been estimated for eight herds with complete enterprise records covering breeding and feeding stock.

The original data shows a considerable range in both costs and returns. In 1964/5, for example, total variable costs per pig ranged from £5. 12s. to £11. 3s; Gross Margin per porker ranged from £- 19s. to £6. 5s.
