PREFACE

This issue of the Journal contains the Papers selected for discussion at the 34th Session of the Annual Conference of the Society scheduled to be held under the auspices of the Punjabrao Krishi Vidyapeeth, Krishi Nagar, Akola (Maharashtra) from 1st to 3rd December, 1974. The subjects selected for discussion at this Conference are:

- (1) Wages and Incomes of the Weaker Sections in Rural India.
- (2) Economics of Commercial Crops.
- (3) Strategy for Agricultural Growth and Equity.

This issue also includes the Rapporteurs' Reports on each of these three subjects. We are glad to note that a very large number of Papers has been received on the second subject. The President-Elect of the Conference on the recommendation of the Rapporteurs has accepted 81 Papers for discussion at this Conference.
