

### S.J.J. DE SWARDT AGREKON PRIZE

The S.J.J. de Swardt Agrekon Prize for 1978 has been awarded to Dr D.F. Coetzee of the University of the Orange Free State. The award is for his article "Some recommendations and guide-lines which may lead to more successful agricultural development in Lebowa and other Black homelands" which appeared in the October 1978 and

January 1979 issues of Agrekon.

It is the seventh time this award has been made since Mr S.J.J. de Swardt, former Secretary for Agricultural Economics and Marketing, made a donation to the Department of Agricultural Economics and Marketing in 1973 for the purpose of establishing a fund from which to award prizes for meritorious contributions in the field of Agricultural Economics which have appeared in Agrekon.
