# DOCUMENTED INDEX OF ARTICLES RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS

A documented index of 11,039 articles relating to Agricultural Economics published in Indian and foreign periodicals, covering the period 1951-70, classified according to the Dewey Decimal System and computer-printed is available for sale to Universities and research institutions at cost (Rs. 350 per set).

A similar index of articles has been computer-printed covering each of the years from 1971 to 1977. The index for 1977 covers 968 titles. The index is supplied at a subsidised cost of Rs. 25 per set for each of the years 1971-77 (excluding forwarding charges) to enable a larger number of research institutions and Universities to avail of this facility. This service is rendered on non-profit basis. Orders for the supply of these indexes may be placed with the Hon. Secretary of the Society.

#### PREFACE

This issue of the Journal contains the Papers selected for discussion at the 39th Session of the Annual Conference of the Society scheduled to be held under the auspices of the Institute for Social and Economic Change, Bangalore (Karnataka) from 18th to 20th December 1979. The subjects selected for discussion at this Conference are:

- 1. Economics of Investment in Organization of Extension Services in Agriculture.
- 2. Inter-sectoral Linkages.
- 3. Price Spreads of Agricultural Commodities in Recent Years.

The issue also includes the Rapporteurs' reports on the second and third subjects. A very large number of papers has been received on the third subject. On the recommendation of the Rapporteurs, the President-Elect has accepted 96 papers for discussion at this Conference. Out of these, 29 papers have been published in full in this issue along with Summaries of 67 papers. We regret that it has not been possible to print all the papers in full because of the exorbitant increase in the cost of printing. We apologise to the authors whose papers could not be printed in full. We are grateful to the Rapporteurs for sending their Reports covering the important points contained in the papers and also for highlighting the issues for discussion.
