COLLECTED WRITINGS OF PROFESSOR M.L. DANTWALA

Professor M.L. Dantwala completed 80 years on September 18, 1989. Many of his students, colleagues and friends suggested that it would be an appropriate tribute to him if his writings spanning over a period of five decades could be brought together in a single volume. Such a collection would be particularly helpful to researchers, since Professor Dantwala's writings are scattered over a number of journals, both Indian and foreign. The Indian Society of Agricultural Economics undertook the work of carefully going through over 250 papers of Professor Dantwala and made a collation of 207 papers, both published and unpublished.

The selected papers are grouped under 13 sections and brought together in four mimeographed volumes, running into 1652 pages. A set of these volumes was presented to Professor Dantwala on his 80th birthday.
