

ABSTRACT

Farmers and farm managers are the largest single group of owners in the nine Northeast States; they own 26 percent of all private noncorporate holdings and over 40 percent of land in farms, according to a 1978 ESCS survey of privately owned farm and ranch land, other rural land, and urban land. Sole proprietors and husbands and wives own 80 percent of all farmland, 1 percent of all ownership units own half of all privately held land, and about 60 percent of the land is held by people over 50 years old. Report also classes landownership by race, sex, method and date of acquisition, residence, and education.

WHO OWNS THE LAND? A PRELIMINARY REPORT FOR THE NORTHEAST STATES

INTRODUCTION

The USDA recently conducted a nationwide survey of the ownership of privately held land. More than 37,000 individuals, partnerships, and corporations were surveyed in 1978 by the Economics, Statistics, and Cooperatives Service in an effort to find out more about 28.8 million owners of 1.25 billion acres of privately held U.S. land. The survey covered farm and ranch land, other rural land, and urban land.

This report presents a statistical summary of selected characteristics of ownership for the Northeast States. Additional reports which will treat ownership characteristics in greater depth will be developed in the near future. Ownership data are provided for Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont. The survey covered over 6.3 million owners of 87.2 million acres (83 percent of all land) in the nine-state area. The remaining acreage is held by Federal, State, and local units of government and was excluded from the USDA survey. The tables and charts provided in this report highlight relationships on occupation of owners, type of owners, their race, age, sex, education, and residence. The method and timing of land acquisition is also highlighted for the region and for individual states.

Why the Survey?

The land and how its various owners use or abuse it is vitally important to the American public and to decision makers in government. An analysis of the survey data by the USDA will help the public better understand how

decisions made by landowners affect the environment, food and fiber supplies, employment, distribution of wealth and income, resource development, and the competition for land and government programs which affect land use, such as conservation, farm production, supply management, credit, and technical assistance programs. The ownership data can be correlated with soils and land use data, thereby providing information about ownership patterns on agricultural lands that are well suited to future use for farm production.

Survey Highlights

Occupation

In terms of acreage owned, farmers and farm managers are the largest single group of owners in the Northeast. They own 26 percent of all private noncorporate holdings and over 40 percent of land in farms (tables 1 and 3 and figure 1). White collar workers hold approximately the same amount of all privately held land, 24 percent, but only 19 percent of the farmland. Blue collar workers' holdings are slightly less than those of the white collar workers, 21 percent of all land, 16 percent of farmland. Retired workers' holdings account for similar proportions of all land and of farmland. While farmers are the predominant land owning group in the Northeast as a whole, the proportion varies widely from state to state. In New York and Vermont, farmers own about one-third of all land and 54 percent of all farmland (tables 2 and 4). Owners accounting for 12 percent of all farmland in Vermont did not respond to questions regarding their occupation. Individuals in white collar occupations are the principal holders of farmland in New Hampshire and Rhode Island.

Type of Owner

Sole proprietors and husbands and wives hold two-thirds of all privately

held land in the Northeast States (table 5 and figure 2) and more than 80 percent of all farmland (table 7). Nonfamily corporations hold 18 percent of all private land but only 2.8 percent of all privately owned farmland. In Maine, nonfamily corporations own 45 percent of all land (table 6). Nonfamily corporations are a relatively unimportant type of farmland ownership in the Northeast. With the exception of New Jersey, nonfamily corporations held less than 5 percent of all farmland in any Northeast State (table 8).

Size of Holdings

One percent of the ownership units (a unit could be an individual, a partnership, or a corporation) own about half of all privately held land. Looking from the opposite direction, about 87 percent of the owners hold only about 10 percent of the land (table 9). However, many of these are owners of residential and commercial properties on small lots. Holdings are more evenly distributed among owners of farm and ranch land. The percentage of acreage held by the one percent largest owners of farmland is 30 percent nationwide and varies regionally from 6 percent in Vermont to 25 percent in Main (table 12).

Race

Over 90 percent of the private landowners in the Northeast States are white and non-Hispanic; they own 95 percent of the land (table 13). Blacks represent 0.8 percent of all owners and own 0.4 percent of the private land. Non-Hispanic white owners predominate in each Northeast State (table 14).

Age

About 60 percent of the land is held by people over 50 years of age.




FIGURE 3. AGE OF LAND OWNERS

Those under 35 own only about 8 percent (table 15 and figure 3). In New Jersey, 46 percent of all land is owned by the 50-64 age group and 25 percent by those over 65. New York shows the youngest pattern of ownership with about 40 percent of the land held by those under 50 (table 16).

Sex

Over 80 percent of the survey respondents were identified as males (table 17); however, this statistic does not fully recognize female ownership participation through husband-wife holdings and family partnerships.

About 40 percent of the private land is held by husbands and wives jointly (see table 5). Land owned by a female ranges from less than 10 percent in Connecticut and Maine to 21 percent in New Hampshire.

How Acquired

Only about 11 percent of all private land in the Northeast was inherited, while 65 percent was purchased from nonrelatives; 14 percent was purchased from relatives (table 19 and figure 4). Acquisition from relatives is more prevalent in Rhode Island and Vermont where about one-third of all privately owned land was either inherited or purchased from a relative. That proportion is in the vacinity of 18-22 percent in Maine, Massachusetts, and New Jersey (table 20).

When Acquired





FIGURE 5. PERIOD OF ACQUISITION OF LAND

About 25 percent of the private land has been acquired since 1970 while 16 percent has been in the same hands since 1940 (table 20 and figure 5). In Maine, 30 percent of all land has been in the same hands since 1940 (table 22); the owners of 10 percent of all privately owned land in Maine did not provide information on the date thier land was acquired.


Residence

Over 90 percent of the owners (who hold 73 percent of the land) reside in the same county with their reported holdings. Less than one-tenth of 1 percent of the owners have residence or corporate headquarters in a foreign country (table 23 and figure 6). Foreign ownership accounts for only 0.1 percent of all land in the Northeast States.

Education




FIGURE 7. EDUCATION OF LANDOWNER

Although rates of non-response were relatively high on questions dealing with the educational level of landowners, level of formal education does not appear to be a major factor in landownership. For those owners who responded, the proportion of all land held by owners with 8 or fewer years of schooling is only slightly smaller than that held by college graduates (table 25 and figure 7). The proportion held by owners with 8 or fewer years of schooling ranges from 3.5 percent in Rhode Island to 21 percent in Pennsylvania (table 26). The proportion owned by college graduates ranges from 11 percent in Pennsylvania to 39 percent in Connecticut.

FIGURE 2. TYPE OF OWNER

FIGURE 4. METHOD OF ACQUISITION OF LAND

FIGURE 6. RESIDENCE OF LANDOWNER


