#### ABSTRACT

Farmers and farm managers are the largest single group of owners in the sixteen southern states; they own 36 percent of all private noncorporate holdings and almost 43 percent of land in farms, according to a 1978 ESCS survey of privately owned farm and ranch land, other rural land, and urban land. Sole proprietorships and husbands and wives own 72 percent of all farmland; the largest 1 percent of all ownership units own half of all privately held land; and about 75 percent of the land is owned by people over 45 years old. The report also characterizes landownership by race, sex, method and date of acquisition, residence, and education.

#### WHO OWNS THE LAND? A PRELIMINARY REPORT FOR THE SOUTHERN STATES

#### Introduction

In 1978, the Economics, Statistics, and Cooperatives Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture conducted a nationwide survey of the owners of privately held land. More than 37,000 individuals, partnerships, and corporations were surveyed in an effort to learn more about ownership patterns on 1.35 billion acres of privately owned U.S. land. The survey covered farm and ranch land, other rural land uses, and urban land. In addition to privately owned land, the Federal, state, and local governments own almost 900 million acres.

This report summarizes selected ownership patterns in the South which includes the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, and West Virginia. These states contain about 520.3 million acres of privately owned land held by about 14.0 million ownership units. Public lands comprise only about 40 million acres in the South, a relatively small part of the total land in the region. The tables and figures accompanying this report provide detail and highlight relationships between landownership and occupation of owners, type of owners, their race, age, sex, education, residence, and method and time of land acquisition.

#### Why the Survey?

The land and how its various owners use or abuse it is vitally important to the American public and decisionmakers in government. ESCS will closely analyze the data from the new survey to help the public better understand how decisions made by landowners affect the environment, food and fiber supplies, employment, distribution of wealth and income, resource development, and the competition for land and water resources. One important use of the coming analysis will be to help design government programs which affect land use, such as conservation, farm production, supply management, credit, and technical assistance programs. The ownership data can be correlated with soils and land use data, thereby providing information about ownership patterns on prime agricultural lands.

#### Survey Highlights

#### Occupation

Farmers, a relatively small group of owners, own about 36 percent of all noncorporate land and almost 43 percent of the noncorporate farmland in the South (tables 1 and 3, figure 1). Retired persons and white collar workers each own about 19 percent of all land and about the same proportion of farmland. Blue collar workers make up about one fourth of the ownership units of noncorporate land and own about 10 percent of all land and farmland. About 14 percent of all noncorporate owners did not list an occupation; 5 percent of the farmland owners failed to list an occupation. The two largest states in the region, Texas and Oklahoma, along with Maryland, had the highest proportion of land owned by farmers (tables 2 and 4). Retired persons were the group owning the most land in Alabama, Louisiana, South Carolina, Tennessee, and West Virginia.

#### Type of Owner

Sole proprietors and husband-wife ownerships are the dominant type in the South (tables 5 and 7, figure 2). About 90 percent of all ownership units are

sole proprietors or husband-wife. They own 64 percent of all land and 70 percent of the farmland in the South. Family partnerships are also common in the South, especially in Texas. Few ownership units are corporations in the South (tables 5 and 7) but several states have large corporate holdings. Among them are Florida, 48 percent; Louisiana, 41 percent; and Arkansas, South Carolina, and West Virginia, each with 24 percent (table 6). About one-third of the farmland in Florida is corporately owned (table 8). Nonfamily corporations are the largest type of owner in Florida and Louisiana. Size of Holding

One percent of the ownership units with the largest holdings (a unit can be an individual, a partnership, or a corporation) own about half of all privately owned land in the South (table 10). At the opposite end of the size spectrum, 77 percent of all owners own only about 4 percent of the land. Many of these small parcels are residential or commercial in use. There is much less concentration of land holdings among owners of farm and ranch land. The largest 1 percent own about 31 percent of the land (table 12). Concentration of landownership is apparent in Florida; Kentucky, Delaware, and Maryland have slightly less concentrated ownership than other states.

#### Race

About 80 percent of the landowners in the South are white; they own almost 89 percent of the land (table 13), and dominate in every state. Blacks comprise 8 percent of the owners and they control over 2 percent of the land. Black landownership is concentrated most heavily in Mississippi, Alabama, and South Carolina (table 14). Little land is owned by other races in the South. American Indians own about 4 percent of the privately owned land in Oklahoma. About 10 percent of all owners did not list their race.

Almost 75 percent of the land is held by owners who are 45 years or older (table 15, figure 3). Owners under 35 own less than 5 percent of the land. Older owners tend to have larger holdings as well. Owners 65 years and over own one-third of the noncorporate land in Alabama, Louisiana, and Tennessee (table 16). About 13 percent of the noncorporate owners did not list their age.

#### Sex

Age

About three-fourths of the owners in the South were identified as males; however this statistic does not fully recognize ownership participation by females through husband-wife holdings and family partnership (table 17). About 25 percent of the privately owned land is held by husbands and wives jointly (see table 5). The greatest share of land owned by females in the South is 21 percent in North Carolina (table 18).

#### Method of Acquisition

Purchase is the dominant means of acquiring land in the South. Almost 52 percent is purchased from nonrelatives; over 12 percent is purchased from relatives (table 19, figure 4). Almost 21 percent was inherited. However, owners tend to acquire the largest tracts through inheritance. Acquisition from relatives is most prevalent in North Carolina, Mississippi and Texas, where almost 40 percent of the privately owned land is inherited or purchased from relatives (table 20). Florida has the lowest combined rate and the highest proportion of land acquired by purchase from nonrelatives. About 10 percent of the owners did not respond to methods of acquisition.

#### Date of Acquisition

About 24 percent of the privately owned land in the South has been acquired since 1970 while 16 percent has been in the same ownership since 1940 (table 21,


figure 5). In Louisiana, 28 percent of the land has been in the same ownership since 1940; by contrast, over 30 percent of the privately owned land in Kentucky and Delaware has been purchased since 1970 (table 22). Fourteen percent of the owners failed to list an acquisition date.

#### Residence


Over 84 percent of the ownership units in the South (who own 64 percent of the privately held land) reside or have their business headquarters in the same county as their reported holdings (table 23, figure 6). Less than .05 percent of the ownership units have their residence or corporate headquarters outside the United States. Florida and Louisiana have the lowest rate of ownership by residents of the same county in the South (table 24). None of the states had significant holdings by foreign residents.

#### Education

Landowners with 8 or fewer years of schooling own over 17 percent of the private, noncorporate land in the South, exceeded only by high school and college graduates with 21 and 20 percent, respectively (table 25, figure 7). However, the average size of holding increases with increases in the level of formal education of the owner. Landowners with 8 or fewer years of schooling own 25 acres; those who are college graduates own 43 acres of land. Kentucky and Tennessee have the highest proportion of land owned by owners with 8 or fewer years of schooling (table 26). Over 60 percent of the privately owned noncorporate land in Delaware, Florida, Mississippi, and Oklahoma is held by owners with at least 12 years of formal education.




#### Figure 3

#### Age of Landowners, South






Method of Acquisition of Land, South

Figure 5 Period of Acquisition of Land, South






Period Acquired
