Lecturer of Agricultural Economics University of New Hampshire

George "Curly" Frick has given the University of New Hampshire and the U.S. Department of Agriculture more than four decades of exceptional service. Along with the responsibilities of being a USDA economist stationed at the University of New Hampshire, he has lectured in courses, provided valuable input on research projects, and served on numerous thesis committees. He officially retired from the USDA in 1983, but he still remains an active lecturer in the Department of Resource Economics and Development, and continues to advise graduate students.

NAREA and its earlier organizations. He has presented several papers at our annual meetings, published in our journal, and has served on many NAREA committees. He was president of our Association in 1978 and received the Distinguished Member Award in 1984. Curly has also received the Award of Superior Service from the USDA.
