Honorary Life Member Award

MARY E. TEMPLETON

Professor of Resource Management West Virginia University

Professor Mary E. Templeton served the Northeastern Agricultural and Resource Economics Association and its predecessor organization for 14 years as secretary-treasurer, a greater period of time than any other person has served in that capacity.

In a field dominated by men, Professor Templeton has made numerous contributions to agricultural economics. She has served as a teacher, adviser, researcher, and role model to young people entering the profession, but especially to women. Since first being

employed at West Virginia University in 1955, she has worked tirelessly and continuously to advance the cause of professional women. She was instrumental in forming the Committee on Women in Agricultural Economics at the national level.

Professor Templeton has made significant contributions to both the regional and national professional associations and therefore is highly deserving of the Honorary Life Member Award.

Honorary Life Member Award

JOHN H. FOSTER

Professor of Resource Economics
University of Massachusetts

Dr. John H. Foster retired last June after over three decades of active participation in and service to the Northeastern Agricultural and Resource Economics Association and its predecessor organizations. During this period, Dr. Foster regularly attended the annual meetings of the association, presenting papers on numerous occasions and often serving as a manuscript referee for its journal. He served as a judge for student paper contests and as a member of the Resolutions Committee. He chaired the Local Arrangements Committee for the Annual Conference in 1985 and served on the Executive Committee during 1977-82. Dr. Foster was a member of the NAREA Awards Committee during 1988-90 and chaired it in 1990. In all of these capacities, he carried out his duties with his characteristic thoroughness and distinction.

John Foster came to the University of Massachusetts directly from Cornell, where he completed his doctoral degree in 1957. He served as director of the Center for International Studies during 1968-73 and as chair of the Department of Resource Economics during 1976-82. He was Fulbright Senior Lecturer in India (1964-65), Senior Fellow, East/West Center, Honolulu, Hawaii (1972-73), and received a Fulbright Travel Grant to India (1980).

Over the years, he received nearly two dozen major research grants and has published his work widely. He has been an exceptional teacher and mentor over his distinguished career. In brief, in all his aspects, he has been a credit to his department, his discipline, and certainly to this association.
