III. Schedule for Volume 18 (1986):

The Journal maintains a continuous review process. Articles approved and notes, comments, and replies accepted for the Journal are normally published in the following issue.

However, the editors reserve the right to hold approved manuscripts for a subsequent issue if inclusion in the nearest issue would delay its printing or for other reasons approved by the Executive Committee. The current manuscript review period ranges from a low of 3 months to more than 12 months, the length depending upon the condition of the manuscript as submitted, the reviews of council members, authors revision time, and decisions in the editorial office. All papers approved for publication by the editors are subsequently sent to the copy editor for markup and editing. Printer imposed deadlines for 1986 are May 1 and October 1 for the July and December issues, respectively, for mail-out in the month of issue.

Microcomputer software submissions are subjected to a two-tier review process. The SAEA Microcomputer Software Committee must approve the article, documentation, and software provided on diskette(s) before the article is submitted to the Editorial Council. Consideration of software articles by the Editorial Council is by the same procedure as general articles and notes. Review of software articles will normally require 6 or more months prior to the May 1 and October 1 printer deadlines.
