THE INDIAN SOCIETY OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS
PRIZE AWARDS SCHEME FOR 1959

Under the Schemes of Annual Prize Awards instituted by the Society, the following prizes will be awarded for the year 1959.

- (1) Two prizes under Scheme No. I for best articles on: "Obstacles in the Expansion of Agricultural Production."
- (2) Two prizes under Scheme No. II for the best paper of published research in Agricultural Economics.

The first prize under each of the above Schemes is of the value of Rs. 500 and the second prize is of the value of Rs. 250.

## Rules for the Award

- 1. Selections for Scheme No. II will be made from research papers published not earlier than 1st July 1958.
- 2. The article or paper selected for Award under Scheme No. I shall not be entitled for a further Award under Scheme No. II.
- 3. Papers which may have received previous Award by any other Institution or the Society will not be eligible for competition under the Scheme.

# Conditions for Eligibility

- 1. The candidates entering for the Prize Awards shall be either teachers or students of Economics.
  - (i) The candidates shall have qualified themselves by holding the first Degree of any Indian University. (ii) They shall have done or be engaged in some original research work as a part of Post-graduate research study, or independent research work under a recognised Institute, or under the guidance of an Economist.

The Awards Committee shall have the discretion to determine the Institutes which can be considered as recognised institutions for this purpose. The condition may be waived in cases where the standard of research of the selected article or piece of published research is of exceptional merit.

- 2. The entries of the Awards shall be endorsed by the Administrative Head of the University, College, School or Institute, as the case may be, along with a statement from the Head of the Institution giving particulars of age, the period of work and the nature of research work, if any, of the candidate.
- 3. The entrants for the Prizes under Scheme Nos. I and II shall ordinarily not be over 40 years of age.

# Dates of Entry and Announcement

- 1. The entries for Awards under Scheme Nos. I and II must reach the Honorary Secretary, The Indian Society of Agricultural Economics, 46-48, Esplanade Mansions, Mahatma Gandhi Road, Bombay 1, on or before 31st March, 1960.
- 2. Six typed copies of the article under Scheme No.I, and six typed or printed copies of published research under Scheme No. II should be submitted.
- 3. Announcement of the Awards will be made at the time of the Annual Conference of the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics.
