II. Schedule for Volume 22 (1990)

The *Journal* maintains a continuous review process. Articles approved and notes, comments, and replies accepted for the *Journal* normally are published in the following issue. However, the Editors reserve the right to hold approved manuscripts for a subsequent issue if their inclusion in the nearest issue would delay its printing or for other reasons approved by the Executive Committee of the SAEA. The current manuscript review process ranges from a low of three months to more than 12 months, the length depending upon the condition of the manuscript as submitted, the reviews of Editorial Council members, author revision time, and decisions in the editorial office. All papers approved for publication by the Editors subsequently are sent to the technical editor for markup and editing.
