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

INTRODUCTION

The Office of Civil Defense is assigned the responsibility for development of civil defense preparedness measures by Executive Order 10952. One important concern of civil defense is the availability of food supplies and the number of days during which a given population can be fed from stocks on hand in emergency situations. With an abundance of food on a national basis, the problem centers on the geographic distribution of the available supply in relation to population.

Executive Order 10998 directs the U. S. Department of Agriculture to assess periodically food resources available from all sources in order to estimate availability under an emergency situation. Executive Order 10958 gives the Department of Agriculture responsibility for any food stockpiling.

In connection with its responsibilities, the Office of Civil Defense requested the Department of Agriculture to provide technical assistance and guidance in assessing total available supplies of food and their geographic distribution, with particular emphasis on household, retail, and local wholesale stocks. The Department of Agriculture is concerned with food production and with food stocks in food processing plants, public cold storage warehouses, and those wholesale establishments with wide geographic distribution.

This report was prepared to meet the needs of the Office of Civil Defense and the Department of Agriculture and others concerned with civil defense. The data by counties, States, and regions are not precise. They are intended to show where available food supplies might be large or small in a national emergency. Even if different assumptions were made regarding the ability to transport food and minimum civilian food requirements in an emergency, the picture would remain relatively the same. Local food surpluses and deficits, in this case, might be greater or less than those shown here.

I. METHODOLOGY

U. S. and regional food inventories were approximated through independent surveys of public cold storage warehouses, wholesale and retail levels of distribution, and households. These inventories were also made from estimates of stocks at food processing plants based on surveys, mandatory reports, and other information available. Since Alaska and Hawaii and offshore possessions were excluded from this analysis, a supplementary study covering those areas is needed. Estimates of food stocks in transit were also excluded as figures for these stocks were not available.

Food stocks in homes and in retail food stores were computed for individual counties by apportioning U. S. and regional inventories on the basis of population estimates for January 1, 1963. Food stocks at wholesale were not calculated in the same way as they are not necessarily related to size of population. A county with dense population may handle a limited volume of its food requirements through warehouses. An adjacent county may have a heavy concentration of food warehouses which supply retail food stores within the county as well as stores located in other counties. To take account of this, food stocks at the wholesale level were computed for individual counties by distributing U. S. inventories in proportion to the number and size of wholesale warehouses physically located in the counties.

Population estimates for January 1963 were computed by the National Resource Evaluation Center of the Office of Emergency Planning, Executive Office of the President, and were based on the 1960 Census of Population adjusted for apparent population trends.

The number of man-days' supply other than in homes was calculated as follows: The calories in the amount of food available were divided by 2,000, the level of calories specified per person per day for this report. It is recognized that 2,000 calories would be adequate for a limited period only. The average consumption in the United States in recent times has been about 3,150 calories per person per day. The choice of 2,000 was arbitrary; the data may be adjusted for any other energy requirement specified. Estimates of homemakers as to how long available food supplies could be stretched in an emergency were used to represent man-days' supply in homes.

Some Definitions and Assumptions

Food as used in this report is defined as that nutrient ready for household or restaurant use. Thus, meat and flour and prepared bakery products are defined as food, whereas live meat animals and wheat and other unprocessed grains are not. Potatoes and dry edible beans, both processed and unprocessed, are defined as foods, since they are ready for immediate kitchen or table use.

This report is designed to provide rough approximations of the probable food availability within counties and States in the event the areas are cut off for a period of time from outside food sources. No

special assumptions are made regarding risk of damage to persons or communities. If a community is not hit or seriously damaged by enemy attack, the accompanying tables would indicate the relation of the community's available food supplies to the population ordinarily there. If a community is hit or damaged, additional information would be needed for proper assessment of the food situation.

The effects of "fallout environment" are not analyzed in this report.

In the analysis that follows, the assumption is made that enemy attack might seriously disrupt transportation of food and other agricultural commodities between counties or groups of counties, States, and regions up to 90 days. It is further assumed that people could survive without serious health hazard for a limited time period at the level of 2,000 food calories per person per day--slightly under two-thirds the usual diet. In this connection, provision is not made for assuring a balanced diet in terms of the different food nutrients.

Some local food production might be counted on in a defense emergency in communities not severely damaged but nevertheless cut off from outside supplies such as fuel, feed for livestock, grain for milling, or flour for baking. The simplified assumption is made that for the first 90 days local food production might be continued in substantially undamaged communities at about one-third its usual rate, without benefit of inshipments of additional fuel, feed, or raw materials. The assumptions are for the purpose of this study only and should not be considered as the Department of Agriculture's appraisal of what would likely occur in a national emergency.

Procedure Used in Home Study

Estimates of household food supplies were derived from data obtained in personal interviews with over 11,000 homemakers living in representative U. S. households. The data were collected during the last 2 weeks of June 1962, in conjunction with the Census Bureau's Current Population Survey. The Current Population Survey uses 8 rotation sample groups. Each group is designed as a sample of the Nation. The home survey was based on a combination of 3 of the 8 groups. The response rate was 93 percent.

Estimates of food stocks are based on homemakers' opinions of the length of time food on hand in the household could be made to last if all household members ate all meals at home and no other food could be obtained. An unpublished methodological study showed that homemakers generally can make satisfactory estimates of this type.

The medians of all inventory estimates made by homemakers in each of 3 population density groups, by civil defense regions, were used as factors. The number of days' supply of food for individual counties was computed by multiplying the population of each county by the factor representing the density of the population group and the civil defense region to which the county was assigned.

Procedure Used in Retail Survey

The basic data for retail food supplies were obtained by mail questionnaires in the spring of 1957 from a national sample of about 7,000 stores engaged primarily in selling food for off-premise consumption. The sample was based on the Census Bureau's retail trade sample. It was composed of 2 sample panels, plus a sample of large independent food stores and stores of large food-chain organizations. Each establishment was asked to report inventories of 4 commodities. The number of retailers selected to report inventories of any one food commodity was in direct proportion to the estimated importance of that commodity in total retail food sales.

Regional food stocks were estimated for 3 levels of population density from the sample data and expressed in terms of total available calories per person. Estimates of retail food stocks in each county were computed by multiplying the per capita inventory factor of its respective region and population density by the county population. Inventory factors for civil defense regions and population densities are shown in Marketing Research Report No. 577, "Estimated Number of Days' Supply of Food and Beverages in Retail Stores," U. S. Department of Agriculture, 1962. Population density groups are defined as:

Density Group A--Includes counties and independent cities in the 25 largest Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

Density Group B--Includes counties and independent cities with population of 100,000 or greater except those included in Density Group A.

Density Group C--Includes counties and independent cities with populations less than 100,000 except those included in Density Group A.

Procedure Used in Wholesale Survey

A survey of approximately 5,000 wholesale establishments, with inventories reported as of June 30, 1962, was conducted by mail. The sample was selected on a probability basis from a universe of about 45,000 establishments which were classified in the 1958 Census of Business in the following categories:

1. Merchant food wholesalers, including beer distributors, but excluding distributors of wine and distilled liquor
2. Manufacturers' sales branches with stock, primarily engaged in the sale of food, including beer distributors
3. Assemblers of edible farm products
4. Nonfood merchant wholesalers and farm product assemblers reporting food sales, including wine distributors

5. Warehouses of retail multiunits engaged in the sale of food (including central administrative offices and other functional offices with stock)

6. Food agents and brokers with stock

Each establishment was asked to furnish physical inventory information for a sample of commodities selected from a master list of 187 products and groups of products. The probability of selection of each commodity varied by kind of business. The number of commodities selected varied for each establishment, depending largely on its size. Six items were selected for most establishments, fewer than 6 for some specialty line establishments, and as many as 150 for certain large establishments.

All stocks of the items selected, which were physically located in the establishment--whether owned by it or by others--were included in the stocks reported.

Inventories were converted to caloric values to permit summarization on a uniform basis.

"Estimated Number of Days' Supply of Food and Beverages in Warehouses at Wholesale, 1963," Marketing Research Report No. 632, U. S. Department of Agriculture, 1963, shows food inventories for civil defense regions and for kinds of business by storability type and major food groups. Inventories are also shown for Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

Estimates of food inventories for individual counties are not shown in MRR 632. They were computed by dividing total U. S. inventories of each kind of business by the number of employees of each business. The resulting factors represent the average inventory of food per employee, by kind of business. Inventory estimates then were computed for each county by multiplying the number of employees of each warehouse in the county by the factor representing its kind of business. In the case of chain store warehouses, however, the factor represented the U. S. average stock per warehouse. Employment was not used as the computing factor because of the combination of management and warehouse personnel at some chain store warehouse locations.

Procedure Used for Food Processing and Cold Storage Plant Inventories

Several procedures were used in estimating available stocks of food in food processing plants as of January 1, 1963. Various basic sources of information were available, such as special sugar stocks reports, weekly and monthly slaughter reports for meat-packing plants, special reports for the peanut industry, and surveys of fats and oils production and refining capacity. Basically, the commodity experts within the Department of Agriculture were requested to pool their knowledge and to provide estimates of the various kinds of food stocks on hand for the 48 States. These estimates were then allocated to individual counties, except where county data were already available, on the basis of the number of employees, by type of establishment, as shown by records of the Bureau of Old Age and Survivors Insurance, U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

Data showing stocks of food in public cold storage warehouses are reported monthly by individual establishments. Such data for January 1, 1963, were combined with the estimates of food stocks in food processing plants, by counties, in such a way as not to reveal operations of individual firms.

Procedure Used for Estimating Food Production

In several cases, January 1963 food production data were available from existing reports. Monthly meat production, for example, is available from Federal meat inspection records, and non-Federally inspected production is estimated by the Statistical Reporting Service of the Department of Agriculture. Monthly fats and oils production and stocks data are reported by the Bureau of the Census. Special sugar statistics are reported to the Department in connection with the Sugar Program. Peanuts stocks and processing reports are mandatory under law. Monthly data are estimated regularly for production of milk, eggs, and poultry meat. Similarly, grain millings are reported monthly. In making the analysis, annual production data for fruits and vegetables as estimated by the Statistical Reporting Service were prorated by months. The livestock, dairy, and poultry production estimates were distributed to counties on the basis of farm production as shown by the Census of Agriculture. Mill products such as flour and soybean and cottonseed oils were distributed to counties on the basis of relative employment in mills.

Seasonality in Food Stocks and Production

To determine the months of highest and lowest food supplies for the year, commodity specialists furnished estimates of monthly distribution of production and of stocks in food processing plants. Cold storage holdings were also available by months.

It turned out that January 1 food inventories in food processing and cold storage plants and January food production were the highest for the year. Supplies in July were found to be the lowest. The difference in the July supply amounted to about 20 percent of the January total. Food inventories were down 23 percent and daily food production was approximately 11 percent lower in July than in January.

It was estimated that food inventories in homes, retail food stores, and wholesale warehouses, while perhaps changing some in composition throughout the year, remained about the same from month to month in terms of total food value.

II. HIGHLIGHTS

Maximum Food Supplies

If it is assumed that food production for the first 90 days of a national emergency would be only a third its usual rate, and, further, that transportation across county lines would be severely disrupted during that time, 7 States, the District of Columbia, and over 40 percent of the counties in the 48 States

would have less than 90 days' food supply at the 2,000-calorie level. These estimates are based on January 1 food inventories and the January food production level.

The major deficits would occur in parts of New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, the Washington, D. C., trading area, 1/ the Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Dayton, and Detroit trading areas in the Midwest, the central Appalachian region, the Miami and Mobile trading areas in the South, and the Los Angeles and San Diego areas in the Far West. Other, less densely populated parts of the country also would be in a deficit position in the sense that less than 90 days' supply of food might be available from local stocks and production in an emergency, even at a sharply reduced rate of consumption.

Details by counties are presented in Table 1A--Analysis of Maximum Food Supplies, by State and County, 1963. The last column in the table shows the number of days that total stocks, plus local production at one-third the usual rate, would last. The maximum food availability is estimated to be in January.

Connecticut, the first State listed alphabetically in Civil Defense Region 1, shows 6 of its 8 counties to be in deficit food supply under January conditions. The State as a whole is deficit, with only 58 days' food supply at the 2,000-calorie level. On the basis of inventories only, Connecticut would have only 48 days' supply. Food stocks in homes, retail food stores, and wholesale warehouses would last only 37 days.

In contrast, Maine with over 300 days' food supply, shows a substantial food surplus position. Even so, 7 of the 16 counties show deficits. Aroostook County, with its large supplies of potatoes on hand January 1, 1963, shows over 2,600 days' supply for each of its 107,000 people. But, Androscoggin, Franklin, Hancock, Lincoln, Piscataquis, Sagadahoc, and York counties show less than 90 days' supply.

Connecticut, with a population of 2,683,000 on January 1, 1963, had an estimated food supply in homes equivalent to 27,798,000 man-days (2,000 calories each). The number of days that the home food supply would last if rationed out at the 2,000-calorie level can be calculated by dividing population into man-days. Thus, home food stocks in Connecticut would last approximately 10 days at the reduced rate of consumption. Maine, with a population of 973,000, had a home food supply that would last approximately 12 days at the reduced rate of consumption. The difference apparently results from Maine's greater rurality and less frequent opportunity for shopping for food.

Similarly, food supplies in retail food stores would last longer on the average in Maine than in Connecticut (19 days compared with 17). Here again, less frequent deliveries in rural than in urban areas evidently result in heavier stocking in retail food stores.

Stocks of food in wholesale establishments are almost negligible in some counties and States and relatively large in others. For Connecticut as a whole, wholesale food stocks on January 1, at 26,287,000 man-days, were equivalent to slightly less than 10 days' supply for the total population. In contrast, Maine had a supply in wholesale establishments that would last over 20 days.

Food inventories in other positions--food processing plants and public cold storage warehouses, are also quite variable. Connecticut, with 30,721,000 man-day units, had an inventory on January 1 in such positions that would last about 11 days at the reduced rate of consumption. Maine had an inventory on January 1 that would last 308 days. If total food supply and population associated with Aroostook County are subtracted, the total supply for the remainder of the State would last about 42 days.

Connecticut, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, the District of Columbia, West Virginia, South Carolina, New Mexico, and Nevada had less than 90 days' food supply January 1. But every civil defense region and the 48 States as a whole showed substantial food surpluses. Regional and U.S. totals are shown in Table 1B immediately following Table 1A.

Composition of Food Stocks, January 1

An inspection of the composition of food stocks, by food groups for processing plants and public cold storage warehouses, reveals a few imbalances. In certain trading areas in the Southeast and Southwest, peanuts in shelling and manufacturing plants constituted a large element in the total stocks structure. In the Albany, Ga., trading area, for example, "eggs and vegetable protein"--mostly peanuts--accounted for 269 million man-days of a total of 313 million man-days stocks of all foods in all positions. Nevertheless, subtraction of this product class from the total would still leave the area in surplus food supply. A similar situation existed as of January 1 for the following basic trading areas: Columbus, Macon, and Waycross, Ga., Dothan and Montgomery, Ala., Raleigh and Rocky Mount, N. C., Norfolk, Va., and parts of Oklahoma and Texas, except that in the Sherman/Dennison and Tyler, Tex., trading areas subtraction of the product class would change these areas from surplus to deficit status.

In parts of Maine, potatoes make up a considerable element of the supply. In the Presque Isle trading area, "fruits and vegetables"--largely potatoes--accounted for over 90 percent of the stocks on hand in food processing plants and cold storage warehouses. Grand Forks, N. Dak., Idaho Falls and Pocatello, Idaho, also were areas where potato stocks tended to dominate. But even without the potatoes, these trading areas would have had more than 90 days' food supply.

Similarly, dry edible beans made up a considerable part of total stocks in certain areas of Michigan, such as Port Huron and Saginaw, and in other dry bean producing States. Most of these trading areas would still have more than 90 days' food supply without dry beans, except for minor deficits in such areas as Lansing, Mich., Casper, Wyo., and Farmington, New Mex.

Dairy products accounted for a sizable share of the total supply in such trading areas as Appleton, Green Bay, and Sheboygan, Wis.; Mankato, Minn.; and Watertown, N. Y. Fats and oils tended to dominate

total stocks in Bloomington, Champaign, Galesburg, and Jacksonville, Ill.; Abilene, Lubbock, and Waco, Tex.; Carlsbad, New Mex.; Blytheville, Ark.; and Greenville-Greenwood, Miss. Subtraction of either of these dominant product groups would not change the "surplus" status of the enumerated areas.

Food stocks in most large urban centers appeared to be in fairly good balance, except that seaport cities tended to have large supplies of sugar. Domestic cane and beet processing centers also were relatively high in stocks of sugar and sweets, but not to the extent of falling below the 90 days' supply if stocks of sugar and sweets are excluded.

Stocks of fats and oils and fruits and vegetables were relatively large in the New York City trading area of over 16 million people (including parts of Long Island and northern New Jersey), but they were not dominant. Fats and oils in processing plants and cold storage (butter) made up 21 percent of the total stocks in such positions in the New York City area, and fruits and vegetables made up 19 percent of the total. Stocks of sugar and sweets made up 32 percent of the total. The New York City trading area had a surplus food supply on January 1, 1963, equivalent to 18 days in excess of the 90 days' requirement for the whole population at the 2,000-calorie level.

In contrast, the Philadelphia trading area had nearly 60 percent of its stocks in "other" positions in the form of sugar and sweets. If this item were deducted from the total supply, Philadelphia would move from a surplus to a deficit basis.

Los Angeles, with a supply of ready-to-use foods slightly under the 90 days' requirement, had a fair balance of items in stocks; sugar and sweets made up 25 percent of "other" stocks, meats and seafood 25 percent, fruits and vegetables 18 percent, eggs and vegetable protein 13 percent, fats and oils 10 percent, and dairy products and grain products 4 to 5 percent each.

The Boston/Lawrence-Haverhill/Lowell trading area had 40 percent of its stocks in "other" positions in sugar and sweets, but subtraction of this product class would not shift the area from surplus to deficit food supply status, as supplies of other classes of food were relatively large.

The composition of food stocks by major commodity groups is not shown in the accompanying tables but is available in the Economic and Statistical Analysis Division of ERS in another print-out of tables from the automatic data processing machines.

Minimum Food Supplies

A substantial number of counties, 27 of the 494 basic trading areas, and 6 of the 48 States, showed larger total food supplies in July than in January. But food supplies in the other counties, trading areas, and States were smaller. Forty-two of the States showed reduction in total food supplies from January to July, 13 of them by 25 percent or more.

States showing increases in total food supplies in July were Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Vermont in Region I; Maryland and Pennsylvania in Region II; and Illinois in Region IV. The increases were small and occurred most consistently in production and stocks of dairy products.

States showing the largest percentage reductions in supply were widely scattered. Decreases in food supplies in Maine were chiefly in potatoes. In Georgia, reduction in stocks of peanuts accounted for most of the decline. The decrease in Wyoming was largely in vegetable protein (dry edible beans) and sugar. In North Dakota, Utah, and Oregon, reductions occurred mainly in stocks of fruits and vegetables and sugar. In Michigan, Nebraska, Colorado, Montana, Idaho, Washington, and California, substantial reductions occurred in stocks of fruits and vegetables, sugar, and vegetable protein.

Such changes were not uniform throughout the States. In Maine, for example, most of the change occurred in Aroostook County. Much of the change in Georgia occurred in the peanut-producing area in the southern part of the State. Nor did the decreases in supplies necessarily change the areas affected from surplus to deficit status. The declines took place for the most part in food surplus-producing areas, and the surpluses accumulated, or in process in January after the harvests, had been substantially shipped out or consumed by July.

A Statement on Error

A word of caution: the county, State, and regional estimates are subject to sampling errors, response errors, and errors of estimate both in county population figures and in distribution of larger area totals to counties on the basis of uniform factors. The magnitude of these errors at the county level cannot be determined. Statements on sampling errors at the U. S. and regional levels are given in MRR 577 and MRR 632 for the retail and wholesale food inventory surveys.
