Editor's Note: In its 1992 annual business meeting, the NAREA Executive Committee and the general membership voted to change the name of the *Northeastern Journal of Agricultural and Resource Economics* (NJARE) to *Agricultural and Resource Economics Review* (ARER). The *NJARE* was published starting with volume 13, number 2, October 1984 and ending with volume 21, number 2, October 1992. The name change to *ARER*, effective with the April 1993 issue, was undertaken to broaden the scope of the journal and communicate theoretical, applied, and empirical findings in agricultural and resource economics to regional as well as national and international audiences. It is the editorial policy of the *ARER* to encourage manuscript submission without regard to author(s) affiliation and/or location. In this issue, there are five regular articles accepted, six articles accepted under the theme "Agricultural, Resource and Environmental Policies in the 1990s" and one invited article focusing on commercial agriculture in metropolitan areas. All manuscripts were reviewed by at least two reviewers. Three new editorial board members begin their three-year terms with this issue. They are Daniel Lass (Massachusetts), Erik Lichtenberg (Maryland) and Cathy Roheim Wessells (Rhode Island).
