Honorary Life Member Award

David A. Storey

Department of Resource Economics University of Massachusetts at Amherst

Dr. David A. Storey is recognized as Honorary Life member of NAREA based on his exemplary career at the University of Massachusetts; his contribution to marine and resource economics in the Northeast; and his active participation in NAREA over the years. Dr. Storey came to Massachusetts in 1960, beginning his career in agricultural marketing. He responded to the changing Northeast economy by initiating work on the fish and shellfish industries and in the environmental and natural resource areas. His active participation continued up to his retirement this year, with his latest project being analysis and planning for the Conte National River Preserve on the Connecticut River. Dr. Storey has been a fine teacher

and a highly respected mentor to undergraduate students pursuing careers in the resources field.

Dr. Storey has been a long time active member of NAREA. He served as a Director of the Association's first elected board and has served on many committees over the years, including the Master's Thesis Award, Finance, and Selected Papers Committees. Dr. Storey has published frequently in the Association's journal and has been a regular participant in our meetings. We recognize Dr. Storey as an Honorary Life Member based on his record of active service to the Northeast and his contributions to NAREA.
