## PREFACE

There has been a continuous demand for a publication presenting a review of shipments under U.S. food aid programs for the period since the initiation of Public Law 83-480, the Trade Development and Assistance Act of 1954, as amended.

This publication presents a statistical summary of shipments under programs authorized by P.L. 480 and Mutual Security (AID) programs for 12 fiscal years, 1955 through 1966. Exports are reported by commodity, value, and quantity, for each year of the 12-year period. They are also reported by commodities grouped by individual years. The value of exports by country is shown for each year and for the 12-year period. Exports under credit sales programs -- the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) export credit sales program and Export-Import Bank loans and guarantees -- are reported by commodity and by country. The extent of export payment assistance to commercial sales for dollars is briefly summarized.

The text reviews the evolution of P.L. 480 programs through the most recent amendment, P.L. 89-808, effective January 1, 1967. Individual programs are summarized and some of the principal achievements noted.

In the statistical series included, values shown for Government-to-Government donations authorized by Title II, P.L. 480, have been revised from the CCC cost basis previously employed to an estimated net export value. All revisions in program and in total export data which were available at the time of compilation in early 1967 were included.

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## SUMMARY

Public Law 480 is the basic legal authority for sharing the abundant agricultural production of the United States with the developing food-deficit countries. Since its inception in July 1954, this program has evolved from a temporary measure of surplus removal into a major tool in the world struggle for freedom from hunger and an effective instrument to stimulate economic development and to support U.S. foreign policy goals.

Public Law 89-808, the Food for Peace Act of 1966, extended this legislation for 2 years (through December 1968) and authorized a comprehensive new program which emphasized self-help by recipient countries in bringing the world food supply into balance with a rapidly increasing world population. It also calls upon other highly developed countries to contribute toward the solution of the world food deficit. It no longer limits food aid to surplus commodities, but encompasses commodities determined to be available by the Secretary of Agriculture. Another important feature of the new legislation is a provision for a transition from sales for foreign currencies to sales for dollars on credit terms at a rate whereby the transition can be completed by the end of 1971.

Food has been furnished under Public Law 480 to hundreds of millions of people to meet emergency situations and to supply nutritional needs as a contribution to the economic development of recipient countries. Loans to recipient countries for economic development are the largest single use of foreign currencies under the program. Commodities sold under long-term dollar credits generate local currencies which recipient governments apply to economic development. The use of local currencies to pay U.S. expenses abroad, dollar payments of principal and interest on long-term credits, and barter procurement abroad for U.S. agencies have a favorable effect on the U.S. balance-of-payments position.

During the 12 fiscal years, 1955-66, \$15.0 billion of U.S. farm products were exported under P.L. 480. An additional \$2.2 billion were shipped under Mutual Security (AID) programs, a total of \$17.2 billion, 30 percent of total agricultural exports during the period. These exports assisted in the reduction of Government-owned inventories. The transition of recipients of commodities on concessional terms to dollar customers and the use of foreign currencies for market development programs have contributed to the growth in U.S. commercial sales.

The program of sales for foreign currency has been the basic tool of food aid under P.L. 480. From the beginning of the program through fiscal 1966, agreements were signed with 53 countries. Exports totaled \$9.8 billion, nearly two-thirds of P.L. 480 exports.

Government-to-Government donations for disaster and other emergency relief and donations through U.S. voluntary relief agencies, although making up less than one-fifth of the total value of P.L. 480 shipments during 1955-66, were distributed to millions of needy people annually in more than 100 countries. School lunch and child-feeding programs have been major phases of these programs with emphasis in recent years on improving the nutritional quality of donations. Since 1960 donation programs have stressed the use of food as part payment of wages in self-help community activities.

During 1955-66 over \$2 billion of agricultural commodities were shipped under the barter program. Barter transactions were used primarily to acquire foreign-produced strategic materials for Government stockpiles prior to 1963. In recent years emphasis in the barter program on overseas procurement for other U.S. agencies has contributed substantially to improvement in the U.S. balance-of-payments position.

Exports of agricultural commodities under long-term dollar credit agreements with foreign governments and later with private trade entities in foreign countries began in fiscal 1962 and totaled \$454 million through fiscal 1966. This program enables countries which have reached an appropriate stage in economic development to become dollar customers of the United States, at the same time conserving their national capital and manpower resources for further advances. Proceeds from the sale of agricultural commodities in the recipient country are used to finance economic development projects in the country, and the increasing dollar payments to the United States have a beneficial effect on the U.S. balance of payments.

U.S. farm products totaling \$2.2 billion were shipped under Mutual Security (AID) programs during 1955-66, mostly during the first 7 years. Until 1962 these exports were principally sales for foreign currency. In later years, shipments have consisted of loans or grants of agricultural commodities in connection with specific projects or under programs in which the commodity supplied was the primary U.S. concern.

Another form of assistance to U.S. agricultural exports during the period consisted of credits under the CCC credit sales program and credits and guarantees by the Export-Import Bank. These credits and guarantees were for relatively short periods, repayable in dollars plus interest covering the costs of the lending agency, and resulting in no net cost to the Government in the long run. Over \$600 million of farm products were exported under the CCC credit sales program from inception in 1956 through fiscal 1966. Exports under Export-Import Bank loans and guarantees totaled \$890 million, of which nearly 90 percent consisted of disbursements for cotton exports.

Certain price-supported agricultural commodities cannot compete in foreign markets without some form of compensation to the exporter who purchases at the higher domestic price and sells in foreign markets at a lower world price. This compensation during 1955-66 consisted of export payments in cash or in kind, or sales from CCC inventory at competitive world prices. Minimum resort to export payments has been a guiding principle in the design of U.S. price-support programs for several years. An average of 30 percent of dollar exports of U.S. farm products received this form of assistance in 1955-66.

## TWELVE YEARS OF ACHIEVEMENT UNDER PUBLIC LAW 480

### EVOLUTION OF P.L. 480 PROGRAMS

The basic instrument provided by the Congress for sharing the abundant agricultural production of the United States with the developing food-deficit countries to prevent hunger and malnutrition and to stimulate economic growth is Public Law 83-480 (P.L. 480), the Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act of 1954, as amended.

During more than 12 years of operation, progress has been made in transforming this program from a temporary measure primarily of surplus removal to a major tool in the worldwide struggle for freedom from hunger and an effective instrument to stimulate economic development and to support U.S. trade and foreign policy goals.

During this period, P.L. 480, as originally enacted, has been substantially amended to meet changing conditions. The most recent amendment was P.L. 89-808, the Food for Peace Act of 1966, approved November 11, 1966. It extended the legislation for 2 years (January 1, 1967, through December 31, 1968) and authorized a comprehensive new program designed to take into account changing conditions in the agricultural situation both at home and abroad.

The new legislation incorporates the major principles recommended by the President in his Food for Freedom message to the Congress on February 10, 1966. In his message, the President recognized the urgent need for bringing the world's food supply into balance with a rapidly increasing world population and at the same time maintaining progress in health, education, and economic development.

One of the most significant features of the new program is the recognition that the long-run solution to the problem of world hunger and malnutrition cannot be found in food aid but rather in improving the productive capacities of the developing nations themselves. Under the amended program, to qualify for U.S. food aid, developing countries must be trying to provide more and more of their own food requirements from their own resources and by their own efforts. Where countries show their willingness to give high priority to improvements in their production, storage, and distribution of agricultural commodities, the United States will reinforce such efforts with financial, technical, and scientific support.

U.S. surplus stocks have played a major role in maintaining the precarious balance between world food production and world food consumption for a number of years, particularly in the 1960's when the expansion in world food production has not kept up with the growth in world population. The new Act no longer limits food aid to surplus commodities, but encompasses commodities determined to be available by the Secretary of Agriculture. U.S. reserve acreage can be returned to production as needed for U.S. uses, commercial exports, and food assistance exports.

Another important feature of the new program is a call upon other highly developed countries to contribute their share to the solution of the world food deficit. The threats to freedom and prospects for peace which accompany hunger and poverty are so great and the issues so complicated that the experience, ideas, skills, and resources of as many countries as possible must be brought to bear upon the problem. The amended program supports the expansion of international food and agricultural assistance programs, including the United Nations World Food Program.

The recent legislation places new emphasis on nutrition. It provides authority to fortify commodities with proteins, minerals, and vitamins to combat malnutrition in children, through school lunch and preschool feeding programs.

As in the past, concessional sales of U.S. farm products will be made only to friendly countries.

Under the new legislation, all sales programs -- sales for foreign currencies, sales for local currencies convertible to dollars, and long-term dollar credit sales -- are authorized by an amended Title I. The new program provides for a progressive transition from sales for foreign currencies to sales for dollars on credit terms at a rate whereby the transition can be completed by the end of 1971.

Title II of the Amended legislation authorizes donations of U.S. agricultural commodities "to meet famine or other emergency relief requirements; to combat malnutrition, especially in children; to promote economic and community development in friendly developing areas; and for needy persons and nonprofit school lunch and preschool feeding programs outside the United States." This authorization will permit continuation of donations for disaster relief and for economic development through friendly governments previously authorized by Title II, as well as donations through U.S. voluntary relief agencies and intergovernmental organizations previously authorized by Sec. 302, Title III, P.L. 480.

Section 303, Title III, P.L. 480, as amended, the Commodity Credit Corporation Charter Act, as amended, and other legislation continue to authorize the barter of U.S. agricultural commodities for the purchase of materials, goods, and services for U.S. Government agencies abroad and for strategic materials for stockpiling in the United States. Since many of the emergency stockpiling needs of the Government have been met, the barter program from 1963 has emphasized overseas procurement to meet the needs of U.S. Government agencies abroad.

## BENEFITS FROM U.S. FOOD AID PROGRAMS

It is not easy to measure the accomplishments of a program with such multiple objectives as U.S. food aid. Hundreds of millions of people, including a high proportion of children, have benefited from food supplied by the United States. Food has been furnished to meet emergency situations and to meet nutritional needs as a contribution to the development of the economies of the recipient countries. Loans to foreign governments for economic development are the largest item in the uses of foreign currencies generated under the program of sales for foreign currency. Sales of commodities received under long-term dollar credit sales generate local currencies which recipient governments apply to economic development.

Increasing emphasis has been placed on the role of P.L. 480 in helping to improve the U.S. balance-of-payments position. Local currencies derived from the program of sales for foreign currency have been used to pay U.S. expenses abroad whenever possible. During 1955-66,<sup>1/</sup> the balance-of-payments benefit derived from foreign currency usage in lieu of dollars has resulted in a total saving of \$1,453.6 million.

Dollar payments of principal and interest from long-term dollar credit sales authorized by Title IV rose from \$0.1 million in 1963 to \$41.1 million by 1966, and totaled \$56.6 million for the 4-year period 1963-66.

Beginning in 1963, barter program operations emphasized overseas procurement of materials, goods, and services required abroad by U.S. Government agencies, resulting in a saving of dollars. Barter contracting for procurement for U.S. agencies amounted to \$23.6 million in 1963, increased to \$229.8 million in 1966, and totaled \$479 million for the 4-year period.


During the 12 years (fiscal 1955-66) covered by this report, U.S. farm products amounting to \$15.0 billion were exported under P.L. 480 programs, 26 percent of the \$57.6 billion total of U.S. agricultural commodities. An additional \$2.2 billion moved abroad under Mutual Security (AID) programs, making a total of \$17.2 billion of food assistance exports, 30 percent of agricultural exports during the period. Exports under food aid programs reached a high of \$1.9 billion in 1957, but leveled off to an average of \$1.6 billion during the last 6 years of the period (fig. 1, table 1).

Exports of wheat, the principal commodity supplied under Government programs, totaled 4,861 million bushels, approximately 70 percent of total wheat exports of 7,001 million bushels during 1955-66. Feed grain exports, although an important component of program shipments, were largely dollar sales. Shipments of feed grains under Government-financed programs amounted to 33 million metric tons, over one-fifth of total exports of 151 million tons. Exports under food aid programs during the period included over 130 million hundred-weight of rice, more than 18 million bales of cotton, 826 million pounds of tobacco, nearly 9 billion pounds of edible vegetable oils, and 6.5 billion pounds of nonfat dry milk (fig. 2, table 2 and fig. 3, table 3).





P.L. 480 operations have assisted in the reduction of Government-owned inventories of a number of commodities, helping to maintain U.S. farm income and relieving the American taxpayer of the costs of maintaining food surpluses.

Familiarity with U.S. farm products and reliance upon them on a concessional basis, as well as market development programs involving funds generated under P.L. 480, contributed to the growth in U.S. commercial sales from over \$2 billion at the beginning of the P.L. 480 period to \$5.1 billion in 1966.

One of the major objectives of the P.L. 480 programs and an important measure of the success of foreign policy goals is the transition of countries from food aid to commercial trade. Japan, which during 1956 and 1957 received over 30 percent of its imports of U.S. farm products under P.L. 480, increased its U.S. dollar purchases from around \$300 million in those years to more than \$900 million in 1966, and has been the largest dollar market for the products of American farms for a number of years. During 1955-61, Italy received substantial quantities of agricultural commodities under P.L. 480 and Mutual Security programs. Dollar sales of U.S. farm products to Italy increased from over \$36 million in 1955 to nearly \$275 million in 1966. Another example of the transition from "AID" to "trade" may be found in Spain, which during 1956-62 received from \$61 to \$141 million annually in U.S. food aid. Since 1956, Spain's dollar purchases increased from under \$10 million to nearly \$200 million in 1966.

#### PROGRAM SUMMARIES

This publication presents a statistical review of exports under P.L. 480 and Mutual Security (AID) programs, dollar sales, and total agricultural exports during the 12 fiscal years 1955-66. The programs summarized and the legal authorizations cited for P.L. 480 programs are those under the Act as amended prior to the effective date (January 1, 1967) of the most recent amendment, P.L. 89-808.

Title I, sales for foreign currency.--The basic tool of food aid provided under P.L. 480 as originally enacted was the program of sales for foreign currency authorized by Title I. This program provides for the sale of U.S. agricultural commodities under Government-to-Government agreements with friendly countries, with payment in the currency of the recipient country. Currencies generated under Title I are used for a variety of activities including loans and grants to the recipient country to further economic development, contributions toward U.S. agricultural market development, and a wide range of research, educational, and defense-support activities. Whenever, possible, the costs of U.S. overseas expenses are paid from foreign currencies generated under this title. Foreign currencies are also sold to U.S. citizens for travel and other purposes. These U.S. uses result in a direct dollar saving and a positive benefit to the U.S. balance of payments. The United States also benefits indirectly from the many other activities to which contributions are made from foreign currency holdings.

During 1955-66, 452 agreements were signed under this title with 53 countries, for a total of \$10.3 billion of agricultural commodities at an estimated cost to the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) of \$16.0 billion, including the ocean transportation financed by the CCC. Until October 8, 1964, ocean transportation in U.S. flag vessels was financed through local currencies. An amendment to P.L. 480 on the above date limited financing by the CCC only to the differential between U.S. and foreign flag rates on the 50 percent of the cargo which is required to be transported in U.S. flag vessels.

Shipments under this program totaled \$9.8 billion during the 12-year period and made up nearly two-thirds of total exports under P.L. 480. They ranged from 13 percent to 21 percent of total exports and averaged 17 percent during the period. Wheat and flour exported under Title I accounted for nearly three-fifths of the total value of exports under this program. The 3.4 billion bushels of wheat and flour exported under the program represent two average U.S. wheat crops, plus four-fifths of another. Over 9,000 ships of 10,000-ton capacity would be required to transport this volume of wheat overseas. Shipments of wheat to India alone totaled over 1.3 billion bushels through fiscal year 1966. Shipments of cotton made up nearly 14 percent of total shipments under Title I, vegetable oils nearly 10 percent, and feed grains and rice about 6 percent each. Dairy products, tobacco, lard, tallow, beef, poultry, fruits, and beans were included among the commodities shipped under this program.

The leading recipients of U.S. farm products under the sales for foreign currency program were in the following order: India, Pakistan, United Arab Republic (Egypt), Yugoslavia, Poland, Brazil, Korea, Turkey, and Spain. Although not among the largest recipients, South Viet-Nam received over \$200 million of agricultural commodities under Title I, mostly during the latter half of the period. Food aid under this program has been extended to a number of Latin American Republics and to a number of African countries newly emerging from colonialism.

Several former recipients of commodities in exchange for local currencies have become important dollar markets for U.S. farm products, notably Japan, Italy, and Spain. Others continue to require some food aid under the sales for foreign currency program or under long-term dollar credits, but have increased their dollar purchases substantially. This group includes Taiwan, Greece, Iran, Israel, and Korea.

Title II, donations for disaster and other emergency relief and economic development.--This title authorized the use of stocks held by the CCC for disaster relief, school feeding, and community and other development purposes. Section 201 authorized commodity donations to meet famine and other urgent or extraordinary relief requirements. Under this authority, the United States provided food assistance to victims of various disasters, including volcanic eruptions, cyclones, earthquakes, droughts, floods, and civil strife. The authority to use food as a direct self-help incentive was written into P.L. 480 in 1960 under Section 202 of Title II. This authority marked the beginning of the shift from straight relief to self-help programs utilizing food as part payment of wages for work on community development projects.

The World Food Program was established in April 1962 by the United Nations (UN) and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the UN. The program is financed by voluntary contributions of UN and FAO member countries in the form of commodities, services, and cash. The program operated on an experimental basis for 3 years, 1963-65, with a budget of \$94 million, of which the United States pledged \$40 million in commodities and about \$10 million in ocean freight and cash. Sixty-nine countries provided commodities or cash to the experimental World Food Program. The U.S. contributions of commodities and ocean freight are under the authority of Title II and U.S. donations under the program are included in Title II donations in this report.

In December 1965, the World Food Program was extended on a regular and continuing basis with a goal for the 3 years, 1966-68, of \$275 million. The United States pledged up to \$130 million on a matching basis, including commodities, services, and cash. At the end of the first year, out of total pledges of \$166 million, the U.S. commitment totaled \$80 million, including \$55 million in commodities, an estimated \$19 million in transportation costs, and \$6 million in cash. Food aid under the World Food Program is used for a wide range of emergency relief and economic development projects.

Donations under Title II totaled \$762 million during the 12 fiscal years covered by this report, amounting to 1 or 2 percent of total agricultural exports annually. The above valuation is an estimated net export value, i.e., domestic market value at port less any applicable export payment. The values previously used in the reporting of donations under this title were full-reimbursement cost to CCC.

Wheat and flour made up nearly three-fifths of the dollar value of Title II donations during this period. Feed grains and dairy products were second and third in importance. Substantial quantities of vegetable oils, rice, cotton, and dry beans were included in the commodities donated under this program. The 10 largest recipients of U.S. farm products under Title II were in the following order: Tunisia, Italy, the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) for the relief of Palestinian refugees, Morocco, Pakistan, Algeria, Korea, Afghanistan, South Viet-Nam, and Yugoslavia.

Title III, donations through voluntary relief agencies and international organizations.--Section 416 of the Agricultural Act of 1949, as amended on July 10, 1954, by Section 302, P.L. 480, authorized donations of available surplus food to accredited U.S. voluntary relief agencies and to international organizations for use in the assistance of needy persons and in nonprofit school lunch programs in friendly countries abroad. Donated foods were made available only after the requirements of domestic food assistance programs and other high priority requirements had been met.

The costs of processing, packaging, and other related costs are usually paid by the United States. The Agricultural Act of 1956, enacted May 28, 1956, authorized the use of Title II funds to finance the ocean freight costs of these shipments. The recipient government pays the costs of handling, internal transportation, storage, preparation, and for some programs the serving of the donated foods. The voluntary agency supervises or assists in the supervision of the program, trains the local personnel, and contributes funds for equipment, supplemental foods, and other necessary supplies.

School lunch and other child-feeding programs have been major phases of this program from its inception. It is recognized that food deficiencies result in high death rates and widespread disabling diseases in children, as well as in permanent mental and physical retardation. Of the millions of recipients of food aid under Title III, the majority of the beneficiaries were children.

After several years of mutual sharing of program costs with the governments of the recipient countries, child-feeding programs have become established as permanent programs. In some countries host governments have taken over complete responsibility for the programs and have replaced food aid contributions with their own food contributions.

In recent years great emphasis was placed on enhancing the nutritional quality of donations. AID appropriations were used to fortify nonfat dry milk, U.S. processed flour and cornmeal, and blended foods (grain-oilseed-milk) with minerals and vitamins. Recognizing the importance of eliminating the debilitating effects of vitamin and mineral deficiencies, P.L. 89-808, the most recent amendment to P.L. 480, provides authority to fortify U.S. donated foods with minerals and vitamins.

Food assistance to disaster victims was provided under this program through voluntary agencies, which could begin food distribution within hours from Title III stocks already in the area, prior to the arrival of food shipments.

Under this program, food assistance has been furnished to refugees from natural and manmade calamities throughout the entire world.

In response to a directive from Congress in extending P.L. 480 in 1964, voluntary agencies have accelerated the trend away from chronic relief to self-help activities such as construction of schools and roads, reclamation of tidal lands, erection of flood embankments, well-digging, vocational training, water development, village sanitation, and the clearing of land for new agricultural settlements.

Beginning in January 1965, Section 203 of Title II provided authority to make grants of local currencies accruing under Title I to assure more effective use of foods made available under Titles II and III.

Donations under Title III during 1955-66 amounted to \$1,923 million (estimated net export market value) and were nearly 13 percent of P.L. 480 shipments and 3 percent of total agricultural exports during the period. Although Title III donations were the third largest P.L. 480 program in terms of value, in recent years they furnished supplementary foods for 55 to nearly 80 million people annually in more than 100 countries.

Because it is highly valued for its protein content and is simple to use, nonfat dry milk has been distributed to nearly all countries receiving commodities under this program. The nearly 5.5 billion pounds of nonfat dry milk donated during this period were exceeded only by donations of wheat flour, which totaled 10.1 billion pounds. Much of the flour and cornmeal are pro-

cessed abroad into bread, rolls, noodles, and other products for consumption in schools and institutions. Wheat and corn grain are donated primarily in countries in which it is customary for recipients to process such grains at home. More than 900 million pounds of vegetable oils were donated during this period, as well as cheese, butter, butteroil and ghee, rice, dry beans, and a relatively small quantity of grain sorghums. The general acceptance of bulgur wheat, which was introduced under an experimental pilot program in 1962, resulted in larger requirements of this commodity. Rolled wheat was also made available for foreign donations for the first time in fiscal 1962. The introduction of these commodities provided a broader commodity composition and increasing food nutrients for hungry people overseas.

Title III, barter.--The authority to barter agricultural commodities for goods and services procured abroad for U.S. Government agencies and for foreign-produced materials for stockpiling is provided under the CCC Charter Act; Section 303, Title III, P.L. 480; and other legislation. The fundamental objectives of the barter program are to increase exports of U.S. agricultural commodities, reduce the drain on U.S. gold and dollar holdings, and help in achieving U.S. international policy objectives.

Prior to 1963, barter transactions were used primarily to acquire foreign-produced strategic materials for Government stockpiles. Because many of the Government's emergency stockpile needs had been met, the barter program from 1963 has emphasized the use of U.S. agricultural commodities to procure materials, goods, and services for U.S. Government agencies, which in turn reimburse CCC in dollars for such procurements. Barter procurements for Federal agencies have contributed substantially to improvement of the U.S. balance-of-payments position by using funds generated by agricultural export sales for purchases which otherwise would have been paid for in dollars.

Under the barter program, private U.S. firms agree to acquire and export eligible agricultural commodities to approved destinations. Agricultural commodities eligible for export under this program as originally enacted were limited to those in CCC inventory. In addition to commodities in Government inventories, private stocks of soybean and cottonseed oil were made eligible for shipment under the barter program on August 12, 1964. On July 5, 1966, the program was further revised to make private stocks of a number of agricultural commodities eligible to be exported under barter contracts covering offshore procurement for other U.S. Government agencies.

To prevent barter exports from unduly disrupting world agricultural prices or replacing cash sales for dollars, restrictions have been placed on the countries to which such exports may go. The restrictions are based upon an assessment of each friendly country as a market or potential market for U.S. exports.

From July 1, 1954 through June 30, 1966, U.S. farm products valued at \$2,077 million were exported to all areas of the world under the barter program. Shipments under this program accounted for 14 percent of exports under P.L. 480 and 4 percent of U.S. agricultural exports during the period. Shipments of wheat and flour, valued at \$737 million, made up 35 percent of the

total. Exports of feed grains, principally corn, amounted to \$622 million, 30 percent of total barter shipments. Other commodities important under the program included cotton, tobacco, vegetable oils, dairy products, and rice.

Title IV, long-term dollar credit sales.--Title IV, which was added to P.L. 480 on September 21, 1959, provided for the sale of U.S. surplus agricultural commodities on a long-term dollar credit basis by agreement between the United States and recipient governments. Periods for the delivery of agricultural commodities up to 10 years were authorized, but in practice the supply period was generally limited to 3 years. Dollar payment periods up to 20 years were authorized by the law. Major objectives of the program were to stimulate and increase the sale of surplus U.S. agricultural commodities by enabling countries which had reached an appropriate stage in the development of their economies to become dollar customers of the United States, while at the same time preserving their national capital and manpower resources for further advances.

The United States negotiated with each recipient country an understanding regarding the purposes for which the purchasing government should use the local currencies which became available to it from local sales of the Title IV commodities. This agreement provided assurance that the use of the credit by the purchasing country would be coordinated with other U.S. development and assistance programs in that country.

An amendment to Title IV, P.L. 480, enacted in September 1962, authorized the sale of U.S. surplus agricultural commodities on a long-term dollar credit basis by agreement between the United States and private trade entities of the United States or friendly foreign countries, which otherwise met program requirements. The private trade entity might be an individual, partnership, corporation, or association engaged in private enterprise or nongovernmental activity. Agreements were entered into with the private entity only if the exports would not displace cash sales, and only if the trade entity would utilize the benefits of the credit in carrying out the project set forth in the agreement. Supply periods were determined on a case-by-case basis and generally were for periods not in excess of 3 years, although longer supply periods within the maximum of 10 years were authorized in the legislation. Payment of dollar amounts financed by CCC under private trade agreements were required to be guaranteed by guarantors determined by CCC to be acceptable to act in this capacity. Interest was charged under both Government-to-Government agreements and private trade agreements at relatively modest rates from the date of last delivery of commodities under the agreement in each calendar year.

In addition to increasing dollar sales of U.S. agricultural commodities, Title IV programs are designed to develop future foreign markets for U.S. agricultural commodities and to assist in the economic and social development of friendly nations through the extension of credit. Title IV sales proceeds are being used to finance construction of facilities for marketing and processing livestock and for importing and distributing grain. They are also used to finance such projects as colonization cooperatives and community development, land reform, development of rural settlements, technical training, school construction, and road improvement.

Dollar payments to the United States began in 1963 and through June 30, 1966, totaled nearly \$57 million, including principal and interest. These payments represent a positive benefit to the U.S. balance-of-payments position.

Government-to-Government agreements signed under Title IV through fiscal 1966 amounted to \$684 million at export market value, excluding ocean transportation. Private trade agreements amounted to \$42 million, a total of \$726 million since the signing of the first agreement in August 1961.

Shipments under Title IV totaled \$454 million through fiscal 1966. Over half the exports during this period consisted of wheat. Cotton, vegetable oils, corn, and rice were also important exports under this program. Shipments under Title IV during the period went to 27 countries in all major world areas. Yugoslavia, Chile, China (Taiwan), Greece, and Portugal were the five largest recipients.

Sales for foreign currency, economic aid, and economic development loans authorized by Mutual Security Acts, P.L. 82-165, as amended, P.L. 83-665, and by the Foreign Assistance Act, P.L. 87-195--U.S. foreign aid programs in which agricultural commodities have been exported have been administered since 1948 by the Agency for International Development (AID), earlier by the International Cooperation Administration (ICA), and by other predecessor agencies.

A program of sales of agricultural commodities for foreign currency was begun in fiscal 1954 under the authority of an amendment to Public Law 82-165, the Mutual Security Act of 1951. Public Law 83-665, the Mutual Security Act of 1954, as amended, authorized the operation of the Mutual Security program until September 1961. During this period, programs involving agricultural commodities were principally sales for foreign currency under Section 402 of that Act. Expenditures for exports of farm products under Mutual Security programs, which totaled \$450 million in 1955, declined to \$186 million in 1961. In 1955, grants of agricultural commodities for economic aid amounted to \$170 million of the \$450 million total and sales for foreign currency totaled \$280 million. The following year, sales for foreign currency accounted for \$344 million and economic aid for only \$11 million of the \$355 million total. Sales of U.S. farm products for foreign currency continued as the principal program through 1962, with a small carryover of commodities programmed during 1961.

The Foreign Assistance Act, enacted September 4, 1961, does not include a requirement that certain funds be expended for foreign currency sales. Since 1962, the smaller volume of food assistance under AID programs has consisted primarily of agricultural commodities exported under (1) loans or grants under conditions in which the commodity supplied, rather than its use in connection with a specific project, is the primary U.S. concern -- "nonproject assistance" -- or (2) agricultural commodities exported in connection with activities designed to accomplish specific undertakings -- "project assistance."

Beginning in 1964, exports of agricultural commodities under development loans have been included. Development loans, including Alliance for Progress loans for Latin America, are authorized under P.L. 87-195. These loans are designed to promote economic development of less developed countries and areas,

with emphasis upon assisting long-range plans and programs to develop economic resources and increase productive capacities. The payment period for development loans may extend to a maximum of 40 years, with annual payments beginning at the expiration of grace periods of varying lengths. Interest charges are made during the grace period, as well as during the payment period.

During the 12 years, 1955-66, \$2,169 million of U.S. farm products were exported under Mutual Security (AID) programs. Cotton ranked first in the list of commodities exported, followed by wheat and flour, animals and products (including dairy products), oilseeds and products, and feed grains. Relatively smaller quantities of tobacco, rice, fruits, feeds and fodders, sugar, beans, seeds, and rye were included in commodities exported under Mutual Security (AID) programs. Europe and Asia were the principal areas of destination for agricultural commodities. However, some of the shipments recorded to European countries actually represented aid to colonies of the country shown or to less developed countries under triangular arrangements.

#### EXTENSION OF CREDIT

The credits and credit guarantees extended by U.S. Government agencies for exports of agricultural commodities during 1955-66 were for relatively short periods, payable in dollars plus interest covering the costs of the lending agency and resulting in no net financing cost to the Government in the long run. For these reasons, these programs are not reported as "specified Government-financed programs," but are shown separately in this report. The value of the purchases under credits extended by the CCC and disbursements under loans and guarantees by the Export-Import Bank for exports of agricultural commodities are included in "agricultural exports outside specified Government programs," that is, "dollar sales" in this series.

CCC export credit sales program.--This program was initiated by the CCC in 1956 under the authority contained in the CCC Charter Act, primarily to increase dollar exports of U.S. farm products by enabling U.S. exporters to meet credit terms offered by competitors in other Free World countries. This program provides for the financing of exports of U.S. farm products for credit periods up to a maximum of 36 months. As a general policy, the credit period is limited to 12 months for cotton and tobacco and 6 months for all other commodities. Under the program as initiated, approval of a credit arrangement was contingent upon an assurance of payment by a U.S. bank. On February 17, 1966, the program was revised to permit acceptance of certain foreign bank obligations. Interest is charged at the rate announced each month by CCC and runs for the length of the credit period. Export financing is accomplished by the purchase by CCC of the exporter's accounts receivables.

On February 11, 1965, the CCC credit sales program was revised to provide deferred payment terms for certain agricultural commodities from private stocks. Prior to this time, export credit arrangements were available only for commodities in CCC inventory or tobacco under loan to CCC. Provision of deferred payment terms in connection with exports from private stocks has resulted in a substantial increase in exports under the CCC credit sales program and has made it possible to finance commodities such as wheat flour, bulgur wheat, cornmeal, cottonseed oil, and soybean oil, which are not in CCC inventory, and commodities of which CCC stocks were substantially reduced.

From the beginning of the program in 1956 through 1966, \$607.9 million of U.S. farm products were exported under credits extended by CCC. Purchases of feed grains, especially corn and grain sorghums, totaled \$399.6 million, nearly two-thirds of total shipments under the program. Purchases of wheat and flour amounted to \$102.9 million, 17 percent of the total. Purchases of cotton were \$84.3 million, 14 percent of the total. This program, which was relatively small in 1956-62, increased from \$32.8 million in 1962 to \$210.0 million in 1966. Asia was the area of destination for \$277.8 million, 46 percent of total purchases during the period, Europe ranked second, taking \$244.9 million, 40 percent of the total.

Export-Import Bank loans and guarantees.--The Export-Import Bank, established in 1934 as an independent agency of the United States, extends credit to foreign buyers for the purchase of certain U.S. agricultural commodities in situations in which the financing of such purchases is not available from the usual commercial sources. The Bank must have reasonable assurance of payment of the loan in dollars and must make certain that the loan does not compete with private capital. U.S. commercial banks may participate in Export-Import Bank loans at their own or at the Bank's risk. The period for such loans is usually 1 year.

In January 1963, the Export-Import Bank initiated a system of guarantees against political and/or financial risk to be issued by the Bank directly to U.S. commercial banks and those financial institutions undertaking nonrecourse financing of commodity exports. This system of guarantees was designed to encourage commercial banks to provide nonrecourse financing of medium-term export credits and to speed up these transactions by permitting the exporter to deal only with his bank, rather than with the Export-Import Bank in Washington, D.C. It was also designed to create an incentive for banks and other financial institutions to retain in the private sector the paper arising from export transactions.

Disbursements under Export-Import Bank loans and guarantees reported in this statistical series include disbursements by the Bank, and disbursements by commercial banks for their own account and risk or under Export-Import Bank guarantees against political and/or financial risk.

Cotton has been the principal agricultural commodity exported under Export-Import Bank loans and guarantees during this period, amounting to \$768.4 million, 86 percent of total disbursements, which amounted to \$889.7 million. Wheat, soybeans, and barley ranked after cotton in importance. Asia was the major area of destination, accounting for \$803.4 million, 90 percent of total disbursements. Nearly all of the disbursements to this area represented credits and guarantees extended for exports of cotton to Japan. Disbursements for exports to Europe were 8 percent and to Latin America, 2 percent of the total.

#### COMMERCIAL EXPORTS ASSISTED BY EXPORT PAYMENTS

Certain price-supported agricultural commodities cannot compete in foreign markets without some form of compensation to the exporter who purchases at the higher domestic price and sells in foreign markets at a lower world price. This compensation during 1955-66 was in the form of export payments in cash or in kind, or sales from CCC inventory (or tobacco under loan to CCC) at competitive world prices.

U.S. export-payment programs are designed and administered to assure equitable shares of world trade for U.S. commodities and are operated in conjunction with price-support and production-adjustment programs. They are subject to continuous review and revision to meet changing supply and demand situations. They are also subject to revision by agricultural legislation. Minimum resort to export payments has been a guiding principle in the design of U.S. price-support programs for several years. One of the considerations in the formulation of the U.S. wheat and feed grain programs first enacted in 1962 and the cotton program enacted in 1965 was to support prices of these commodities at or near competitive world prices and thus to eliminate or minimize export-payment assistance.

An average of 30 percent of dollar exports received export payment assistance in 1955-66. Exports assisted by export payments were principally wheat and flour, feed grains (mostly prior to 1962), rice, cotton, and certain dairy products. Other commodities, including flaxseed and linseed oil, peanuts and peanut oil, and limited quantities of tobacco, whole chickens, fruits and juices, tung oil, and dry edible beans, received export-payment assistance during one or more years of the period.

Studies describing the operation of export-payment programs and showing, by commodity groups, the extent of export payment assistance to commercial and Government-financed exports, as well as estimated subsidy payments, are available for fiscal years 1962-66.

Description and Sources of Data Used for the Reporting of Exports Under Specified Government-Financed Programs, Exports Outside Specified Government-Financed Programs, and Total Agricultural Exports

The data on government programs are not obtained from the same source as total exports and are not fully comparable in regard to valuation, shipping period, etc. However, every effort has been made to provide as comparable statistics as is currently possible.

Title I, P.L. 480, Sales for foreign currency: Quantities and values are obtained from the Program Operations Division, Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA. Market values are estimated from quantities reported shipped. These estimated values are later revised to show actual values.

Title II, P.L. 480, Famine and other emergency relief: The revised statistical series for Title II donations included in this report was compiled in the Trade Statistics and Analysis Branch, Foreign Development and Trade Division, Economic Research Service, USDA, from invoices on file in the Fiscal Division, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS), USDA. Quantities are recorded by date of export and values are estimated net export prices (domestic port prices less any applicable export payments).

Title III, P.L. 480, Donations through voluntary relief agencies: For the period 1955-63, quantities were obtained from the Food Distribution Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, USDA. Export values by commodity were estimated in the Trade Statistics and Analysis Branch. Values by country were estimated in the Office of Business Economics, Department of Commerce, from unit values supplied by the Food Distribution Division. For fiscal years 1964-66, quantities and values were obtained from the Program Operations Division, Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA. For current periods, reports prepared in field offices are obtained from the Procurement and Sales Division, ASCS.

Title III, P.L. 480, Barter: Quantities and values are obtained from the Office of Barter and Stockpiling, Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA. Since January 1965, data have been based on evidence of exportation (Form FAS-176, Export Certification, accompanied by copy of bill of lading) furnished to CCC in Washington. Prior to this time, when bills of lading on barter shipments were furnished to ASCS Commodity Offices but were not available in Washington, program export figures were based on lifting or invoice dates.

Title IV, Long-term dollar credit sales: Quantities and values are obtained from the Program Operations Division, Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA. Market values are estimated from quantities reported shipped. These estimated values are later revised to show actual values.

Sales for foreign currency, exports under development loans, and economic aid under Agency for International Development (AID) programs: Quantities and values are obtained from the Financial Review Division, Office of Controller, and Statistics and Reports Division, Office of Program and Policy Coordination, Agency for International Development. Data are on the basis of disbursements for exports (U.S. sources only) during the period covered. The data thus

obtained differ from actual export statistics in the following respects: They include exports during prior periods for which disbursements are made in the reporting period, as well as adjustments for shipments previously reported. They exclude exports during the reporting period for which disbursements had not yet been made.

Total agricultural exports under specified Government-financed programs: Sum of the above-described programs.

Total agricultural exports outside specified Government-financed programs: Difference between total exports under Government programs and total agricultural exports. This difference indicates commercial sales for dollars and includes unassisted commercial transactions and shipments of some commodities with governmental assistance in the form of (1) extension of credit, (2) sales of Government-owned commodities at less than domestic market prices, and (3) export payments in cash or in kind.

Exports under credits and guarantees extended by the Export-Import Bank and credit sales by the Commodity Credit Corporation are not included under specified Government-financed programs. These credits are for relatively short periods, repayable in dollars with interest, and result in no net cost to the Government. These credit programs are reported separately.

Export-Import Bank loans and guarantees: Values shown are disbursements reported by the Export-Import Bank. They include disbursements by the Bank and by U.S. commercial banks participating in Export-Import Bank loans at their own or at the Bank's risk or under Export-Import Bank guarantees against political and/or financial risk.

CCC credit sales: Values of commodities purchased under approved credits are furnished by the Office of the General Sales Manager, Foreign Agricultural Service, USDA.

Certain price supported commodities cannot compete in foreign markets without some form of compensation to the exporter who purchases at the higher domestic market price and sells in foreign markets at a lower world price. This compensation during 1955-66 was in the form of export payments in cash or in kind or sales from CCC inventory (or tobacco under loan to CCC) at competitive world prices. Minimum resort to export payments has been a guiding principle in the design of U.S. price-support programs for several years.

Estimates have been made of the portion of commercial sales for dollars which received export payment assistance, as well as of the unassisted portion, for fiscal years 1955-66.

Total agricultural exports: Total exports of U.S. farm products are reported by the Bureau of the Census, U.S. Department of Commerce, and compiled in the Trade Statistics and Analysis Branch, Foreign Development and Trade Division, Economic Research Service. Commodity detail on the Census classifications, "Donated for relief or charity by individuals or private agencies" is included with the respective commodities.





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
