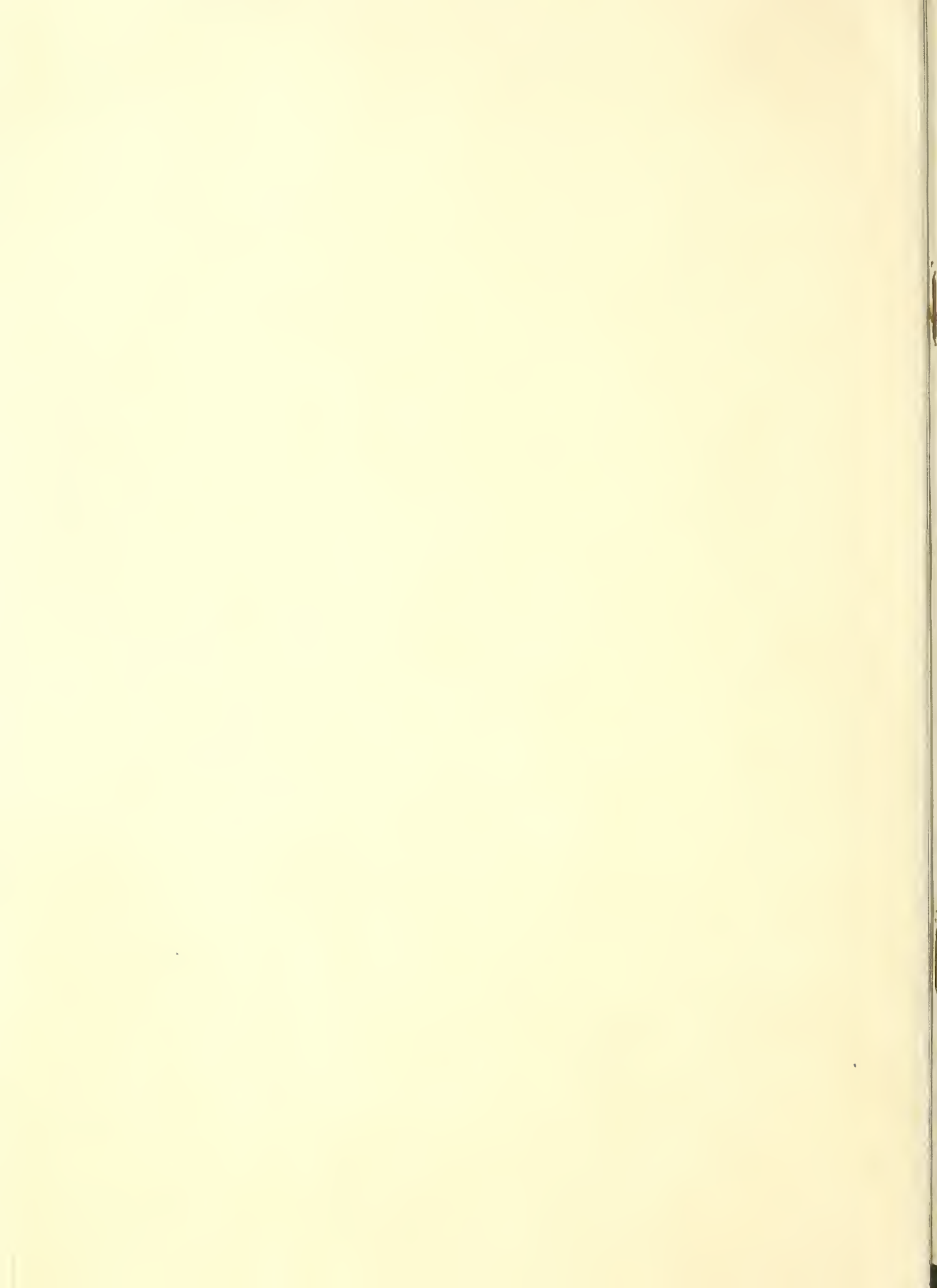

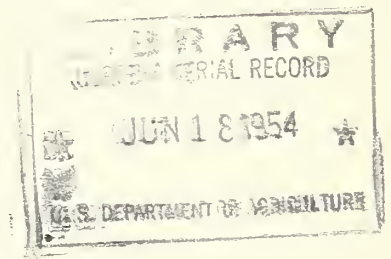

## FOREWORD

By Joseph G. Knapp, Administrator, Farmer Cooperative Service

Farmers work together through their cooperative associations in order to make their farm businesses more efficient. Through this form of joint, self-help effort individual farmers market their products and purchase farm supplies effectively in an economy marked by many large business enterprises.

According to Farmer Cooperative Service, farmers' marketing, purchasing and related service cooperative associations numbered 10,166 in 1951-52. Memberships totaled 7,363,129. This figure contains duplications as many farmers are members of more than one association. It is estimated that about 60 percent are members of one or more cooperatives performing marketing, purchasing, insurance, or other essential services.

It is also estimated that in 1951-52 marketing business of these associations totaled \$7,411,059,000 after adjustment for duplications arising from intercooperative business. The volume of purchasing business was \$1,917,217,000 after adjustment for intercooperative business.

The strength of farmer cooperatives depends upon adequate knowledge and understanding of sound cooperative principles and practices by members, boards and responsible employees of cooperatives, and upon the effectiveness with which these principles and practices are used.

As cooperatives grow in order to serve farmers effectively, they increase the number of their services for members, including processing and manufacturing activities. These factors render cooperative operations more complex and bring about the need for a better understanding and a wider dissemination of other cooperatives' experience and of the results of research dealing with cooperative organizational and operating problems. These are important objectives of this bibliography.

## PREFACE

This list continues Library List 41 from September 1946 to the end of 1953. Like that bibliography, this supplement consists primarily of references to books and monographs, although some periodical articles are included. While agricultural cooperation in all parts of the world is covered, the emphasis has been placed on the United States and the British Commonwealth.

The final selections were made from a great many references contained in the Bibliography of Agriculture and in the card catalog of the U. S. Department of Agriculture Library. References to periodicals listed on pages 138-143 of Library List 41 have been excluded, as have references in languages other than English and those of western Europe.

The bibliography is classified geographically, and the references are annotated where necessary for clarity. The combined author and subject index has been somewhat simplified, and multiple indexing avoided. Since the list is on the subject of agricultural cooperation, these two words have been deleted from the index. Subjects formerly listed under Cooperative associations and Cooperation will now be found listed alphabetically as main subjects.
