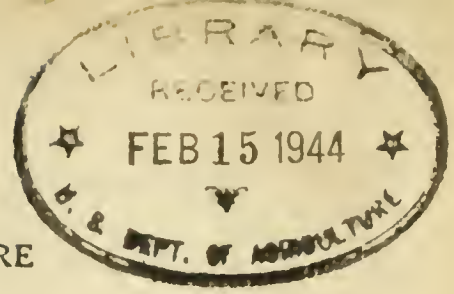

PREFACE

This is a selected list of economic periodicals of foreign countries published in the English language which have been found useful in the United States Bureau of Agricultural Economics. The list includes some periodicals which are not strictly economic. These have been included because the library does not have in its files any economic periodicals published in English in the countries they represent.

In the table of contents the countries in which the above described periodicals are published, are arranged alphabetically by continents and then by individual countries. This table of contents does not, however, show the countries which may be covered by a periodical which contains material on several countries, such as The Near East and India- ("A weekly review of ... the Balkan Peninsula, Turkey, Egypt and the Sudan, Syria, Palestine, Arabia, Iraq, Persia and India.") The names of such periodicals and the headings under which they appear are as follows: The Far Eastern Review, The Near East and India, Under Asia; Anglo-International Bank Ltd. formerly Anglo-Austrian Bank Ltd.; Monthly Review of Central Europe, under Europe; and The Pan American Union Bulletin, under South America.

Publications from the Philippine Islands have been included in the bibliography on account of the general use of Spanish in the Islands.

International

Annals of collective economy. Geneva. 280.8 An73.

An International review published in four editions - English, French, German and Spanish. Was issued quarterly 1925-1927. Three numbers each were issued during 1928 and 1929.

The publication is composed of long articles, which are signed and a Current Event section. The following are typical of the material they contain: A Decade of Collective Economy in Austria; The Co-operative Bank of Lithuania; The Public Credit Corporations of Germany; and Land Reform and Collective Economy in Czechoslovakia.

International chamber of commerce. American section. International information service. Paris letter. Washington, D. C.

Contains "timely and authoritative information on economic and commercial developments throughout the world," which is usually presented in a review of general European conditions. Also contains an occasional article such as Germany To-day.

International labour office. Industrial and labour information. Geneva. 283.8 In82

Published weekly by the International Labour Office.

Contains "current events affecting industry and labour, and the work of the International Labour Organisation." A few statistical tables are given.

International labour review. 283.8 In8

Published monthly in the United Kingdom for the International Labour Office (League of Nations) by George Allen and Unwin, Ltd., London.

Contains signed articles dealing primarily with the various problems affecting labour; summaries of all important reports and enquiries; statistical tables giving employment and unemployment

figures; index numbers of prices and cost of living, migration movements, statistics showing movements in the general level of wages, comparison of real wages in various countries; bibliographies of recent labor legislation, and book notes. The arrangement of material in issues prior to 1925 is somewhat different.

International management institute. Bulletin. Published monthly in English, French and German. Geneva. 280.8 In8

According to an editorial notice the objects of this bulletin are "To further the development of scientific methods of management as an essential factor in economic stability and social progress, and to this end to collect and distribute information concerning management in its various aspects and to facilitate contact between persons and institutions interested in the subject by providing them with an international meeting-ground and focus of activity."

Contains editorial comment; management notes or news reports of national and international movements; case reports; technical notes; and a bibliography.

During 1927 supplements to this periodical were issued.

International review of agriculture. Published by International Institute of Agriculture. [monthly] Rome. 241 In82.

The International Review of Agriculture was formed in Feb., 1927 by a union of two quarterly publications, viz; International Review of the Science and Practice of Agriculture (241 In82) and International Review of Agricultural Economics ... (280.29 In83). These publications were issued for 17 years, 1910-1926. (They were published monthly 1910-1922, but became a quarterly with the Jan.-Mar., 1923 issue)

Beginning with the issue of January, 1929 the International Review of Agriculture appears in three separate parts: I, Monthly Bulletin of Agricultural Science and Practice; II, Monthly Bulletin of Agriculture Economics and Sociology; III, Monthly Crop Report and Agricultural Statistics. (For earlier numbers of monthly Crop Report and Agricultural Statistics see International Institute of Agriculture. Bureau of Statistics. International Crop Report and Agricultural Statistics (251 In8E) This new development is due to a decision of the Directorate of the Institute "to introduce important modifications in the contents of the International Review of Agriculture, destined to increase its interest and value. The principal aim of these alterations is to replace isolated fragmentary items of technical, economic or legislative information by comprehensive studies based on the information available at the institute, giving a general review of the actual situation in questions of international importance and having an up-to-date character or a practical interest for agriculture." Part I has a section Agricultural Industries and occasionally has an article under that heading but usually only a bibliography is given on this subject. In addition to articles

dealing with economic and social questions, part II of International Review of Agriculture gives information regarding agricultural legislation, including summaries of the new laws and regulations. It carries a list of books received at the Library, also a bibliography on economic and social questions. The articles in this bulletin are often accompanied by tables and charts. As indicated by the title Part III contains many statistical tables including area condition and production of specified crops in various countries and figures of prices, imports and exports (amount) also by countries. Crop reports are usually given for the following commodities: cereals, maize, rice, potatoes, sugar, vines, olives, cotton, flax, fodder crops, and other products.

. There is an index to this Report for the year 1929.

Africa

African world and Cape Cairo express; with which are incorporated the "Anglo-African Argus" and the "African Review." [weekly] London. 226.8 Af8.

"A record of African developments, political, mining, and commercial." There are also supplements devoted to a special section of Africa, such as the North African Monthly Supplement, and the West African Monthly Supplement. These supplements contain also a produce market report.

Commercial Bulletin of South Africa. Being the official organ of the Association of Chambers of commerce of South-Africa with which is incorporated the journals of the Cape Town and Johannesburg Chambers of commerce. [Cape Town] [monthly]

Contains regularly Notes of the Month which include reports of conferences, comments on current legislative, industrial, commercial and economic topics. Also contains articles by "Our Financial Expert" and other articles of value to commerce. Most of the issues contain a Monthly list of wholesale prices; Pastoral produce market report; Johannesburg Chamber of Commerce supplement; Capetown Chamber of Commerce supplement; and some of the 1929 issues have also a supplement of the Durban Chamber of Commerce and the Port Elizabeth Chamber of Commerce.

Farming in South Africa. Published monthly in English and Afrikaans by the Department of agriculture, Union of South Africa. Pretoria. 24 So842.

"This publication is chiefly comprised of information in the form of notes and short articles, emanating from the Department of Agriculture, of practical value to farmers in South Africa" - Editorial comment.

Included in the economic articles are many dealing with some phase of agricultural co-operation. Other typical topics are: Organisation

of markets for citrus fruits, Standardisation of wools; Economic aspects of the skin and hide industry; Tobacco trade with the United Kingdom; and Farm cost accounting.

Social and industrial review ... Die maatskaplike en nywerheidsblad. - [monthly] Pretoria. . 280.8 Sol2

"Issued by the Union Department of Labour and containing news and information on Industrial and Labour affairs in the union and abroad."

"The Social and Industrial Review ... serves as a medium for the dissemination of news and official information concerning the work and objects of the Department, [of Labour] in so far as they are of current public interest and have an immediate bearing on the economic problems and activities of the South African people. The Review is also designed to record from month to month the principal developments of social and industrial significance in the Union, and in the international sphere" - Editorial note.

Some articles appear in both English and Afrikaans.

Standard bank of South Africa, ltd. Monthly review.

Business conditions and Conditions of farming, mining, and Manufacturing industries are given regularly under heading, Notes of the Month. Foreign trade returns; Trade reports; Trade conditions in specified areas; Agricultural conditions by specified crops; The London Report, which gives the position of the markets by commodities; South African exchange rates; and Current statistics of finance, industry and trade generally comprise the material found in this little publication. Each issue during 1928 and 1929 contains charts showing graphically such data as Prices of farming land in the Union of South Africa and Southern Rhodesia; Exports of South African products; Output of certain farm products in the Union of South Africa; Prices of farm produce exported from British South Africa; etc. Some of the issues during 1923 also include charts.

Earlier publications are smaller but they contain the same type of material presented in a somewhat different way.

Asia

The Far Eastern review. A monthly review of Far Eastern trade, finance and engineering, dedicated to the industrial development and advancement of trade in Far Eastern countries. Shanghai. New York. London. Berlin. 286.8 F22

An illustrated periodical containing a variety of material dealing primarily with the problems of the countries of the Far East. Only the 1929 issues were examined and these contained many articles on such subjects as the problems of extraterritoriality, railway

problems, financial problems, industrial enterprises, notices and reports of conferences and a series of articles entitled Some Thoughts Concerning Economics in the Development of China. Each number includes Engineering Notes which give comments on the following subjects: electric light, power and traction; railways; industry; shipping and shipbuilding; public works; telephone, telegraph and radio; roads; and aviation. Some of the articles dealing with financial questions contain comprehensive statistical tables as in China's Internal Loan Obligations, an Analysis and Statistical Research.

The Near East and India. London. 286.8 N27

"A weekly review of the politics and commerce of the Balkan Peninsula, Turkey, Egypt and the Sudan, Syria, Palestine, Arabia, Iraq, Persia and India."

Contains articles, notes, special letters from countries of the near and middle East which give general news and news on current political, commercial, and financial subjects; a Commercial and Financial Section, also sections devoted to the Week's Finance; Cotton and Cotton Goods; and Stock and Share Markets. Also gives a list of books received, and book reviews.

Ottoman bank. Monthly circular. London. 284.9 Im7

This Circular of the Ottoman Bank, formerly the Imperial Ottoman Bank contains an occasional rather full review on conditions in Turkey including such topics as The railway system of Turkey; Industrial production in Turkey; Agriculture in Turkey; and Demography. These reviews also contain statistics. In addition there are sections in the Circular devoted to finance - which deal with such matters as Turkish loans, the budget for the year, taxes etc.; a review of the exchange; exchange diagrams; commerce; foreign trade; reports of meetings held by banks, public utilities, financial and commercial companies, etc.; Agricultural and trade reports which include exports and imports, crop conditions and statistics, prices and market conditions in Turkey, Greece, Yugo-Slavia, Roumania, etc.; the Manchester monthly cotton trade review; financial notices and notices of general meetings; reports of the London Stock Exchange, the Istanbul (formerly Constantinople) Bourse, and the Paris Bourse.

China

China monthly trade report compiled in China by the Foreign Commerce Service of the U. S. Department of Commerce in cooperation with the Foreign Service of the Department of State. [Washington, D. C.] 157 C44. Mimeographed.

For this publication extracts have been prepared from various reports compiled by Consular officers. The material is divided into the following classifications: Summary of general conditions; Exchange, banking, credits, finance; crops and agriculture; Regional trade conditions; Export commodities; Import commodities; Transportation and communications; and unclassified.

The Chinese economic bulletin. [weekly] Compiled and published by Bureau of Industrial and Commercial Information, Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor. National Government of the Republic of China. Shanghai. 269.1 Ec7

"The national Government Bureau of Industrial and Commercial Information is an organ of the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor, and provides economic, commercial, financial and industrial information relating to the Republic of China."

Contains a review of the bond market; communications financial, industrial and commercial, and miscellaneous notes; rates of exchange; and a section devoted to weights, measures and coins. In addition, there are short articles or reports on current topics, which often include statistics. Many of the bulletins include index numbers of wholesale prices for numerous commodities.

Chinese economic journal. [monthly] Published by The Bureau of Industrial and commercial information, ministry of industry, commerce, and labor. National government of the Republic of China. Shanghai. 280.8 C442.

Supersedes the Chinese Economic Monthly (269.1 C422)

This publication contains articles - signed and unsigned - and special data, including maps and charts relating to the economic, commercial, and industrial conditions of the Republic of China. Articles typical of the material included are: Cost of Growing and Marketing Peanuts in China; Twenty-seven Years of Trade in China; Labor Conditions in Chekiang. Book reviews are sometimes given.

Chinese social and political science review; published quarterly by the Chinese social and political science association. Peking, China. 280.8 C44

This publication contains numerous signed articles on such subjects as: Tax Reform in China; Some Thoughts Concerning Economics in the Development of China; Prices and Price Fluctuations in North China 1913-1929; Unemployment Among Intellectual Workers in China, etc. A Public Documents Supplement (separately paged and indexed) is included in this publication. Comprehensive book reviews are usually given.

Manchuria monitor [monthly?] Harbin. 280.8 M31. Published by the Chinese Eastern railway administration.

"On the pages of the 'Manchuria Monitor' are published original articles, dealing with the work of the Chinese Eastern Railway and describing economic activities in the regions tributary to the railway. Simultaneousli [!], the periodical devotes much attantion to the problem of studying different features of the life of nations, and countries of the Far East, and principally, of Manchuria ...

"A bi-weekly supplement ... [is] issued with the 'Manchuria Monitor' in the form of the 'Economic Bulletin' in which ... [is] given information regarding the current activity of the Chinese

Eastern Railway, as well as articles, reviews and observations on questions of economics, transport and technical science."

The Monitor has a section in English and there are notes and abstracts of the material appearing in the Supplement in English.

India

Agricultural journal of India. Calcutta. 22 Ag83.

This journal which is issued every two months is edited by the Agricultural Adviser to the Government of India and published for the Imperial Department of Agriculture in India. It is "A journal of agriculture and allied subjects for the general reader interested in agriculture and in Indian agriculture."

It contains original signed articles, notes, reviews of books, lists of new books on agriculture and allied subjects and illustrations. Many of the issues include articles on cotton. Most of the articles are on cultural subjects on control of insects and diseases but there are a few dealing with economic phases of agriculture.

Indian trade journal; issued by the Department of commercial intelligence and statistics, India. Calcutta. [weekly] 286.8 In24

Contains a variety of material relating to trade and economic conditions. The following sections are of especial interest: Weather and Crop Reports; Crop Forecasts; Summary of Crop Forecasts; Prices and Trade Movements of Coffee, Cotton, Jute, Rice, Tea, Wheat, Wool, etc.

There are numerous supplements to this journal most of which include much statistical data such as raw cotton trade statistics; statistics of trade at various stations which include wholesale prices of staple articles; Indian rubber, coal and tea statistics; statement of stock companies; etc.

Mysore economic journal; a monthly periodical. [Bangalore City]
280.8 M99

"The Mysore Economic Journal is an independent monthly periodical devoted to the discussion of all economic topics of interest. Its special features are: Original articles on Economic Subjects ... ; London and American letters on Economic topics of the month; Summary of articles of interest from Indian and Foreign Economic periodicals; Selections from speeches and papers on Economic topics; notes and gleanings from trade and scientific journals; Progress reports of Development Work in Mysore and India generally... ; Reviews of notable books on Economics; and Topical portraits and illustrations."

Japan

Japan financial and economic monthly. Tokyo, Japan. 280.3 J27

The contents of this periodical are grouped under seven sections - Review of Foreign Trade; Investigations; Commodity Prices; Current Events; Company Meetings; Miscellaneous; and Statistics.

The Review of Foreign Trade includes a review of Japanese exports and imports and of trade in China. Under the heading Investigations, reviews of the various industries - silk, shipbuilding, spinning, mining, and electrical- are given. Statistical tables are included in these reviews. Other typical reviews are on unemployment, the stock market in Tokyo, the money market in Tokyo; clearing returns; bank accounts, etc. The general average of wholesale prices in Tokyo; price movements; and movement of prices for principal commodities for given periods of time are given under Commodity Prices.

The section Company Meetings contains reports of meetings of banks in which the economic conditions at home and abroad are set forth. The statistical section includes statistics of banks; mines; stocks in store; imports and exports specified according to countries; monthly return of the Tokyo Stock Exchange; and receipts of the Department of Railways.

Kyoto. University. Dept. of Economics. Kyoto university economic review. Memoirs of the Department of economics in the Imperial university of Kyoto. Tokyo. 280.8 K99.

Published twice a year.

With the exception of a few notes this periodical is composed of rather lengthy signed articles. The following are typical of the material included: A Study in Financial Statistics; The Establishment and Maintenance of Peasant Farms; and The Tenant System of Formosa.

Palestine

Palestine and Near East economic magazine; a fortnightly for trade, industry and agriculture. Tel-Aviv, Palestine. 286.8 P172.

Contains notes and comments dealing primarily with Palestine questions and signed articles on subjects relating to legislation, finance, transport, trade, industry, colonization, urban development, etc. Also includes reviews of current topics of Palestine and Syria and sometimes comprehensive book reviews. Many of the issues are special numbers and are devoted to one subject only. Some of the titles are: Settlement Planning; Public Works in Palestine; Palestine Citrus Industry; Railways in Palestine, etc.

Palestine economic society: Bulletin. Tel-Aviv, Palestine. 280.9 P17B

The first bulletin of this society appeared August 1921 and the second one October 1922. From the Introduction of the second Bulletin the following is quoted: "The society was created for the purpose of studying and encouraging the study of the economic conditions of Palestine in the broadest sense of the word, and of putting the knowledge thus gained at the disposal of all those who wish to participate in the economic development of the country." The leading article in Bulletin No. 2 is entitled The Economic Development of

Palestine Past and Future.

Considerable space in these bulletins is devoted to signed articles on general industrial conditions such as Industry in Palestine, its Condition and Prospects, and to specific industries such as The Orange Trade of Jaffa; and The Dairy Industry as a Basis for Colonisation in Palestine. Some of the publications give Immigration statistics, also a statistical survey of Jewish trades, industries and liberal professions in Palestine. Several of the bulletins contain material on one subject only. They are issued irregularly and are printed in English and Jewish.

Siam :

The Record. The Journal of the Board of commercial development. Issued by the Ministry of commerce and communications. Bangkok, Siam. 269 Sel4

Contains a variety of material including abstracts of reports; notes on current events; on trade; on consular trade reports; market reports on timber, minerals; rice export trade; statements of exports, imports, and shipping; and a table showing the number of foreigners entering and leaving Bangkok for a given time.

c These various reports contain considerable statistical data.

Australia

Commerce. The official organ of the Sydney Chamber of commerce (Incorporated) Sydney, N.S.W.

Contains a review of the month which covers such topics as wages and employment, standard of living, business conditions, pastoral and agricultural conditions, marketing, tariffs and trade, taxation, investment market, etc.; abstracts and reports of conferences and meetings; and addresses and short articles or notes on subjects of local interest.

Economic record. The Journal of the Economic society of Australia and New Zealand. Melbourne. 280.8 Ec74.

This publication which is issued twice yearly contains numerous signed articles, book reviews and notes. The following articles are typical of the material included: The Australian and American Labour Movements; The Application of Economic Research to the Agricultural Industries; Australasian Business Finance; Forecasting Economic Conditions in Australia; The Course of Rural Land Values in New Zealand; etc. The notes include digests of legislation and comments on other subjects of current interest.

One Special Supplement was issued with the title: Marketing Primary Products with Special Reference to Australia and New Zealand.

The Journal of commerce of Victoria and Melbourne prices current, with which is incorporated the Australasian trade review and manufacturers' record. Melbourne. 286.8 J823

Contains Statement of stocks in bond at Melbourne: Melbourne prices current; Financial notes; Commonwealth overseas trade; commercial notes; and Melbourne market report which includes imports, exports, home consumption and prices of various commodities.

National Bank of Australasia Ltd. Monthly summary of Australian conditions.

Contains a brief general review of trade, commerce and finance, which is followed by reports on conditions in the various states. The wheat, wool and butter situation is described. Sections are devoted to Stock exchange notes, Overseas trade, the New Zealand letter and sometimes to Migration, Australian exchange rates, Unemployment, etc.

The Pastoral review; a journal and a record of all matters affecting the pastoral and agricultural interests throughout Australasia.

Melbourne and Sydney. [monthly] 23 Au75

An illustrated journal containing "expert information and statistics on the world's wool, meat and produce trades."

Producers' review. Darling Downs, ed. Brisbane. 23 P942

At head of title: The Dairyman, Farmer and Grazier.

This is the "official journal of the Queensland Cane growers' association, the United Cane Growers' Association of Australia, and the Queensland Cheesemakers' association." Includes much material such as is found in general farm papers but also includes short articles and notes of which the following are typical: Produce More and Get Less; Do Governments Want Lower Wages; The Burden of Land Values; The "Economic Five," and Production Costs in Sugar Industry. Many issues contain market reports. Lists of books or book reviews are often given.

Canada

Agricultural and industrial progress in Canada. Montreal.

A monthly review published by the Department of Colonization and Development of the Canadian Pacific Railway, at Montreal, Canada.

As the title indicates, this publication contains reviews of the agricultural and industrial situation in Canada. Reviews having the following titles are typical of the material included: Canadian Economic Development; Industrial Outlook in Western Canada; Immigration and Land Settlement; Canadian Trade; Mining; Canadian Population; General Agricultural Situation; and reviews of numerous industries such as silk, nuts, tobacco, coffee and spice, rubber, furs, etc.

Cuba

Cuba review. Published by the Munson steamship line. New York City.

Contains reviews of Cuban financial matters; Cuban commercial matters; Cuban government matters; the sugar industry; and a sugar review in English and in Spanish.

Europe

Anglo-International bank ltd. formerly Anglo-Austrian bank, l td. Monthly review of Central Europe. London.

This small periodical gives a brief record of Central European events, and supplies useful and interesting information regarding general business conditions in these countries. It contains regularly an unsigned article; and sections devoted to finance, industry and trade; foreign exchange market; and Central European bourses.

Nos. before no. 22, Oct. 1926 have title: Anglo-Austrian Bank Ltd. Monthly review of Central Europe.

Belgium

Journal of the American-Belgian Chamber of commerce in Belgium. Brussels. [monthly]

This periodical is published in English and French. It is made up for the most part of information on trade topics of mutual interest to America and Belgium.

Czechoslovakia

National Bank of Czechoslovakia. Bulletin. Prague. [monthly]

In three languages - French, German and English. Included in the contents are: Summary of business conditions in Czechoslovakia; Report of the national bank; Foreign trade; Summary table of economic activities; Financial situation of the Republic; Money market; Production and agriculture; Trade, transport and movement of prices; and Reports from abroad, which includes Index of prices on the world market. Diagrams and statistical tables are included in the above mentioned material.

Denmark

Copenhagen. Danske landmandsbank. Monthly review of the economic situation in Denmark. Copenhagen.

A small publication which contains a Monthly review of the economic situation in Denmark. It includes reviews of agriculture, industry, and freight market, bonds and shares, the exchange market, banks, foreign trade and credit associations.

Danish foreign office journal - Danish commercial review; published for the Danish foreign office by the Danish publishing office.

Copenhagen. 286.8 D22

A monthly review of Danish trade, industry, agriculture, finance and banking, shipping, and related subjects. The subject index for each volume is quite useful.

Denmark abroad; a monthly review; published by the Commercial daily, Copenhagen. 286.8 D412.

This monthly review "has for its object to extend the knowledge of Denmark and Danish culture and to promote Danish financial and commercial interests abroad." It regularly contains these sections The Money Market - the stock exchange, foreign exchange, price movement; note circulation, foreign trade, the banks; Danish Agricultural Export; The Copenhagen Stock Exchange; and Copenhagen Exchange Rates.

v.18 has a "special number," "The Key to the Baltic."

Finland

Bank of Finland. Monthly bulletin. Helsingfors. 267.5 B22

This bulletin contains regularly a review of the Finnish market; statistics relating to the money market, State finance, trade, traffic, level of prices, and labour market; one or two signed articles; and a section entitled: Certain Particulars about Finland, which contains information on the following subjects: form of government, land, industry, and finance and banking.

Finnish trade; bulletin for Finnish trade, industry, agriculture and finances. Published by the Finnish central chamber of commerce, the Export association of Finland, the Central association of Finnish woodworking industries, the Central union of agricultural producers, and the Federation of Finnish industries. [monthly] Helsingfors. 286.3 F494

"The main object of the journal ... [which is the successor to Financial and Business Report of the Finnish Central Chamber of Commerce] is to supply regular information about the commercial life of Finland and the conditions prevailing there to its readers in foreign countries who are interested in the industry, trade, and finance of the country."

Each issue carries a "List of goods and trades."

France

American chamber of commerce in France. Foreign trade. Paris. 286.8 F76

An illustrated publication which gives a month's survey of European trade; exchange notes for a specified period; trade opportunities; Franco - American trade which includes statistics of import and export; and signed articles, a few of which are economic in character.

Germany

Dresdner bank. Monthly report of the Dresdner bank. Berlin.

This report usually contains a review of economic conditions and regularly contains statistics on the following subjects: The German economical situation; Situation of the Germany industry; International economic development; German foreign-trade; and Quotations of the Berlin stock-exchange.

Great Britain

Barclays bank limited. Monthly review. London.

This monthly review contains regularly sections devoted to Trade Conditions; Review of Trade in India; The Money Market; The Stock Exchange; Foreign Exchanges; Commodity Reports which give reviews of conditions in agriculture, coal and coke, cotton, grain and seed, iron and steel, jute, shipbuilding and engineering, shipping and freight, timber, and wool; Review of Business Conditions in the United States; Reports from Barclays Bank (Dominion, Colonial and Overseas); Report from Barclays Bank (France) Ltd.; and Report from Barclays Bank, (S.A.I., Italy). Most issues give the London exchange rates, and Bank of England returns.

The form of the 1930 Review is slightly changed but contains the same type of material. In addition to the sections mentioned there is a statistical section which gives figures of trade, finance, unemployment, and prices.

The British trade journal and export world. [monthly] London. 286.8 B77

And independent journal which contains "information regarding phases of British industry in relation to the shipping trade - the introduction of new products, machinery and processes, the opening for new commodities, the hints to producers when new buying markets are concerned, the price current, the latest movement in staples - these and other features are invaluable to overseas importers and producers."

From Jan., 1863 to June, 1870, the title is Morgan's British Trade Journal and Export Price Current.

With v.67 no.793 Feb. 1929 the British Trade Journal absorbed The Export World.

Commercial. Published [weekly] by the "Manchester Guardian." Manchester. 286.8 M315 C.

A weekly world-review of industry, trade and finance. In addition to articles there are reports of the financial situation; the cotton market; the rayon, wool, and chemical industries; shipping and transport; engineering; and iron, steel and coal. The Commercial also issues an annual trade review.

The Economic journal; the quarterly journal of the Royal economic society. London, New York. 280.8 Ec72

This journal, "published quarterly by Messrs. Macmillan, and Co., Ltd., London ... is intended to represent the various shades of economic opinion, and to be the organ, not of one school of economists, but of all" - Editorial Statement. It contains signed articles; extensive, signed book reviews; notes and current topics; and lists of recent books and new periodicals.

Economica; issued terminally by the London school of economics and political science. London 280.8 Ec73

This periodical "is intended primarily to afford a means to the public of becoming acquainted with the results of investigations or other work by the staff and students (past or present) of the School, but contributions of a similar kind from other sources will be welcomed. The scope of the journal includes all the social sciences - economics and economic history; commerce; political science; law; sociology, anthropology and ethnology; social biology; etc."

Each number contains comprehensive signed book reviews, a list of books and pamphlets received, and school notes.

The Economist, weekly commercial times; a political, literary, and general newspaper. London. 286.8 Ec7

Contains a review of the money market; special article, notes, and correspondence dealing with international politics, finance, commerce and trade; reviews of books and pamphlets, and lists of books and publications received; stock exchange news; bank and company reports and notices; "government returns;" and commercial reports, which consist of market and trade reviews and a list of prices current. There is also a Monthly Supplement, "in which will be found an appreciation of the trade situation at home and abroad, together with statistical information on the foreign trade, price movements, currency, and production of the leading commercial countries of the world." - Editorial statement.

Empire production and export. The journal of the British Empire producers' organisation. London. [monthly] 286.8 Em7

The following editorial statement is made of the Journal: "The Empire Production and Export - the official Journal of the British Empire Producers' organisation, advocating a self-supporting empire and recording the primary production, manufacturing, and overseas trade development of the Britannic Peoples."

Each issue carries a buyers' classified directory of British engineering and manufacturing firms. Some numbers include book reviews and most of them include a list of recent publications or of periodicals or publications received.

European finance in which is incorporated the Economic review: [weekly]
London. 284.8 Eu7

May 23, 1926 absorbed the Economic Review; a Review of the Foreign Press.

There is a monthly Supplement entitled; Economic Review and a Quarterly Index.

"European Finance is an entirely independent journal in no way 'tied' to any banking or financial group. In providing a platform from whence authoritative spokesmen may put forward their views on every subject of interest to the financial and commercial world, it does not necessarily identify itself with any particular opinion."

Contains regularly news from all the financial centers of Europe and from overseas - Buenos Aires, Melbourne, Montreal, Tokio, New York, etc. and sections devoted to London Money Market; New York Money Market; Continental Markets which includes latest reports on finances from Berlin, Paris, Amsterdam and other centres; and Insurance. There are also articles and abstracts of articles on commercial, industrial, and financial subjects.

Great Britain. Board of trade. Journal and commercial gazette. London.
[weekly] 256.03 T67J

Contains statistics, notes, and special articles dealing with the trade, commerce, and industry of Great Britain and foreign countries. A brief summary or abstract of these special articles is given in which they are listed in order of their appearance. There are sections devoted to Board of Trade Notes; Department of Overseas Trade; Trade Notes; Exhibitions and Fairs; Imperial and Foreign Trade; Shipping and Railways; Crops; Minerals and Metals; Commercial treaties and arrangements; Customs Regulations and Tariff changes; Proposed Tariff changes; Government notices relating to Export and Import Restrictions; and Openings for British Trade. Many numbers carry lists of commercial officers; British chambers of commerce in certain foreign countries; principal publications of the Board of Trade; and H. M. trade commissioners and Imperial trade correspondents.

v.1-27, July-Aug, 1886 - Dec. 1899 issues were published monthly.

Imperial food journal and Dominions meat and produce gazette; a monthly review founded to promote inter-empire food commerce. London.
389.8 Im7

"The Imperial Food Journal is ... established to reflect and promote trade and industry in Dominions food (1) by informing meat, provisions, dairy produce, and fruit marketers, wholesale and retail in Great Britain of the resources and supplies available from the different parts of the Empire, and (2) presenting to Empire producers a reliable record of the Home Markets in these food trades with information calculated to increase British business."

In addition to articles and newsitems often accompanied by statistics, the following material is regularly given in tabular form: monthly prices for frozen meat; meat and produce cargoes afloat; provincial frozen meat and produce prices; Dominions' food imports; Colonial produce arrivals; and Colonial and foreign food prices. Most issues give frigorifico slaughterings in South America, and contain a section devoted to Colonial produce arrivals.

Lloyds' bank monthly; a survey of international trade conditions.
London. 284.8 L77

A publication which is devoted largely to reviews of business conditions. It regularly contains reviews of business conditions in England and Wales, Scotland, Ireland, on the continent - by countries, Morocco, India, Australia, Canada, United States, and South America. There are also notes on Foreign exchanges and comments on topics of current interest.

London and Cambridge economic service. Monthly bulletin. London, Published by the Executive committee of London and Cambridge economic service. 280.8 L84

"Issued in co-operation with the Harvard university committee of economic research."

The Bulletin includes charts, tables and comments dealing with the current trade position in the United Kingdom and in America (by cable from the current Harvard Service)

The Supplement issued on the 7th of each month contains charts, tables and comments dealing with European countries and the latest available British figures.

The statistics in the Bulletin embrace finance (stock prices, exchanges, bank activities, etc.) prices and wages, inland and sea transport, output, trade and employment.

The special quarterly issue contains a review of the preceding quarter, brief articles on such matters as capital issues, movements of exchanges, movements of foreign trade, and public finance during that quarter, and charts and tables covering longer periods. There are also special memorandum numbers issued from time to time on special economic subjects.

Martins bank, limited. Monthly circular. Liverpool. 284.8 M36
Formerly Bank of Liverpool and Martins Limited

A monthly publication which contains one unsigned article on a current economic subject; a review of conditions in Great Britain and abroad; notes and statistics of public income and expenditure; notes of the money market with statistics of the Bank of England; comments on the stock exchange; summary of imports and exports; changes in prices of commodities; industrial reports including agriculture, corn, cotton, hides, rubber, West African produce, etc. and the following trade reports; coal, engineering, iron and steel, provision, timber, wholesale clothing and wool textile.

Midland bank limited. Monthly review. London. 284.2 M58

Formerly London Joint City and Midland Bank Ltd. Changed title Jan. 1924.

A monthly review which contains reports from the various industrial centres of Great Britain, and one or two unsigned articles of which the following are typical: The Dollar Exchange, Commodity Prices and Money Rates; Quarterly Graphical Survey of British Economic and Financial Conditions; and British Economic Statistics - Their Use in History and Business.

The Ministry of Labour Gazette. London. 283 L11 monthly..

"The Gazette takes the whole of the labour aspect of industry as its province, and illumines every phase with fact and figure. Its scope embraces the conditions of employment from recruitment, apprenticeship and training, to wages, hours of labour and general industrial organisation. In addition, general economic movements reflecting the state of the demand for labour as seen in statistics of trade disputes, unemployment, wage rates, the cost of living, etc., are regularly shown in tables and charts which in turn are commented upon in special articles" - Editorial comment.

There is a classified index for each volume.

Royal economic society, London. Memorandum. London. 280.9 R81M

6 nos. a year

Issued by arrangement with the London and Cambridge Economic Service.

This publication contains the same material that is given in London and Cambridge Economic Service. Monthly Bulletin, the Supplement and Special Memorandum.

Statist. A journal of practical finance and trade. London. [weekly]
286.8 St2

An economic journal devoted to finance and trade. Contains special articles; financial, and insurance notes; reviews of the money market and the stock exchange followed by a tabular appendix which lists, in addition to other things, wholesale prices of commodities; "new issues;" reports of meetings of public companies; and special sections devoted to American, mining, rubber and tea topics, commerce, and industrial companies.

Index numbers "published in The Statist exclusively" are: Wholesale Prices of Commodities; The Foreign Exchange Value of the Sterling; and British Shipping Freights.

Twice a year this publication issues its Half-Yearly Banking and Commercial Review which provides "an analysis of the position of British home banks at the end of December last, with a series of special articles and statistical data which together present a comprehensive survey of current financial and business conditions." - Editorial notice.

The Times, London. Imperial and foreign trade and engineering supplement [weekly] folio. London. 286.8 T482.

v.4, no.58-v.10, no.212 (Aug. 16, 1919 - July 29, 1922) have title: Imperial and Foreign Trade Supplement.

Incorporated the "Engineering Supplement" Mar. 11, 1922 (v.9, no. 192)

Contains regularly notes and comments on questions of current interest; "leading articles;" sections devoted to industrial finance, trade within the Empire, state of home industries, transport and freights, engineering, market movements, and commercial conditions abroad. Many numbers have a section Commodity Prices which gives prices of leading commodities and index numbers of prices. There is also a variety of other material relating to trade and commerce. Special numbers appear from time to time covering a country or special commodities as Canada Power Transport; Mining Number; and British Empire Products Number.

Westminsterbank limited. Review [monthly] London, Eng. 286.8 W52.

Contains each month a special article and special sections devoted to reviews of British trade returns, the stock exchange, home industries which includes a report of agricultural conditions, and foreign news. A statistical supplement gives, in addition to other things, figures of import, export, employment, and index numbers of commodity prices.

Hungary

Budapest. Central corporation of banking companies. Economic bulletin. (Pénzüntézet Központ) [Budapest] 266.5 B853

This bulletin contains comments, tables, charts and maps relating to the economic, agricultural, financial, commercial, and industrial conditions of Hungary. There are no signed articles.

Irish Free State

Irish trade journal. [Published by the Department of industry and commerce, Dublin] [quarterly] [Dublin] 286.8 Ir4

Title also in Gaelic.

Prior to November 1927 this periodical was published monthly.

According to the prefatory note in the first number, the Department of Industry and Commerce has begun this publication with the special purpose of "spreading economic information of a practical kind" as an aid to the furtherance of Irish industry and trade.

There is a variety of material on this subject including a table - External Trade of the Irish Free State - unsigned articles; trade agreements; etc. The publication also contains notes from abroad; industry and labour surveys; lists of recent customs changes, a list of recent publications, a list of articles in the periodical press dealing with trade and industry - general and specific - and sections devoted to Cost of Living, Cattle Trade, Agricultural Prices, Crops and Livestock, Bacon Production and Saorstát Fish Catches. Many of the issues contain information relating to the employment situation and water-power development. A subject index is given for each volume.

Italy

Associazione fra le società italiane per azioni. Business and financial report; a monthly survey of Italian trade and industry. Rome 286.8 As12.

A four-page publication which gives briefly a review of the economic, industrial, or financial situation or the situation on some related subject. Figures are given regularly of Italy's foreign trade, the bank, treasury and budgetary situation, Bachi wholesale price index-numbers, foreign exchange rates, stock exchange quotations, and sometimes crop yields and values.

Jugoslavia

Belgrade economic review. Belgrade. 280.8 B41.

"A monthly journal devoted to the economic, financial and industrial questions of the Kingdom of Jugoslavia."

Contains signed articles with such titles as: Jugoslavia Banks in 1928; Taxation of Industry and Trade; Circulation of Agricultural Credit in Jugoslavia; The Privileged Agrarian Bank; and The Economic and Financial Policy of the government. It also contains regularly a Monopoly statement of receipts and expenditure; State receipts and expenditures; Reports on the foreign trade; Postal Savings bank; Belgrade Bourse; National bank; and sometimes mining and foundries.

Latvia

Bank of Latvia. Economic review. [Riga?] 267 B22

A small periodical, published twice a year, which contains information relating to the economic and financial conditions of Latvia. Only four issues were examined but in each of these the

following material is included: Some "guiding facts" as to government, land, population, industry, finance and banking; the "Activities of Latvijas Banka" which includes tables, charts and comments of the banking activities; Latvian import and export shown in tabular and graphic form; and the Economic situation also shown in tabular form. Three of the four numbers examined contain unsigned articles on Latvia's economic situation.

Netherlands

Amsterdamsche bank. Financial & economic review of the statistical department. [quarterly] Amsterdam.

Each issue contains a signed article dealing primarily with some Dutch industry as: The Dutch Cotton Industry; the Diamond Cutting Industry of Amsterdam; Bulb Cultivation and Trade in Holland; etc.; and a section entitled; Financial and Economic Conditions in Holland.

Amsterdam. Rotterdamsche bankvereeniging. Monthly review.

The contents of this periodical are usually divided into five sections including (1) an unsigned article.- which often includes statistical data on such subjects as The Dutch-Belgian Relations, Dutch Foreign Trade in 1928; The Stabilization of the World Production of Petroleum, and Dutch East Indian Agricultural Exports in Relation to World Economy; (2) reviews of the general economic situation; (3) of the stock market; and (4) of the foreign exchange market. The fifth of the sections mentioned is a table showing the foreign rates of exchange and money-rates at Amsterdam.

In addition to the statistical data given in the unsigned articles there are numerous tables included in the section Economic Review relating to foreign trade - imports and exports, unemployment, wool, cotton and ship building industries, production and consumption of sugar, stock exchange index figures, wholesale and retail trade index, and index of the cost of living, etc.

Norway

Norwegian trade review, published by the Press bureau of the Ministry of foreign affairs. Norway. Oslo. 286.8 N832

An illustrated trade journal containing articles such as Norwegian Trade and Industry in 1929, Norwegian Finance, The Fishing Industry in 1928, and Norwegian Dairy Farming and its Exporting Potentialities. Most numbers prior to the 1929 issues carry a section: Market Reports, which contains reports of the Bank of Norway and Norwegian private banks; various fishery statistics; exports of canned products and electro-chemical products; and exports of, and quotations on, timber, and mechanical and chemical pulp and paper.

Poland

Bank of Poland. Bulletin [quarterly] [Warsaw]

Contains the quarterly report of the Foreign member of the Council of the Bank of Poland and Financial Adviser to the Polish Government.

Report is submitted to the Bank of Poland and according to the letter of transmittal accompanying the report it is the Adviser's intention not only to report the progress of the various aspects of the Stabilization Plan but also "to describe the general situation as regards the credit of Poland and the economic conditions as they exist in the country." The program of stabilization was adopted with the "view to stabilize the zloty on a gold basis, establishing Poland's credit at home and abroad and ensuring a solid foundation for the economic development of the country."

There is a statistical section which contains tables relating to banking; indices of wholesale and retail prices and cost of living; employment and unemployment; imports and exports; foreign trade; foreign shipping; etc.

National economic bank. Monthly review. Warsaw.

A review of about twenty pages most of which is devoted to the economic situation in Poland for the month just passed. The review of the situation is sub-divided as follows: General characteristics, money market, agriculture, mining, smelting industry, industry, trade and shipping, and employment and wages. There are several pages of statistics including wholesale prices of specific commodities.

Polish business conditions. Warsaw. 280.6 P753

Monthly publication of the Institute for Economic Research.

This publication was issued quarterly the first year of its publication (during 1928) Volume 1, no.1 was issued under title The Polish Economic Review and is in Polish.

As its title indicates, the periodical contains a survey of general business conditions including the money and investment markets, prices, wages, mining and manufacture, the labor market, and agriculture. There are numerous charts and one page of statistics - figures of finance, prices, commerce and transport, production, and employment.

Polish economist, a monthly review of trade, industry and economics in Poland. Warsaw. 280.6 P752

Formerly The Polish Economic Bulletin.

In addition to articles, economic in character, this publication contains "market reports covering grain, butter, eggs, timber, coal, petroleum, iron, zinc and lead, etc., as well as notes on the state of employment, movement of prices, foreign trade, railway, port and aerial traffic, State budget, Stock Exchange Bank of Poland, etc."

There is a classified list of contents for each volume.

Spain

The Anglo-Spanish trade. Spanish export gazette.

A quarterly review, published by the Spanish Chamber of commerce in London.

This publication is printed in Spanish and English. It contains statistics of trade such as Exports from Great Britain to Spain;

statistics of strikes in Spain; a list of goods requiring certificates of origin on entering Spain; notes affecting trade which includes the value of agricultural production in Spain, the textile industry in Spain, Spanish mining, etc.

Only one number was examined.

The Spanish title of this periodical is: El Comercio Hispano-Británico. Gaceta de la Exportacion Española.

Sweden

Index. (Svenska handelsbanken, Stockholm) [monthly]

Tables and diagrams illustrating Swedish trade conditions appear regularly in this small monthly. They include Wholesale price level in Sweden, Price movements of certain imports and export commodities, Volume of Swedish foreign trade, Sweden's foreign shipping, Swedish freight index, and Industrial unemployment in Sweden. Beginning with the January, 1930 number the table on Industrial unemployment is discontinued and a table entitled: Foreign Payments Position of the Riksbank and the Swedish Commercial Banks is added. Building costs in Sweden, Unemployment, and Foreign trade tables are to appear quarterly. (Editor's note in January 1930 issue)

In the third month of the quarter, the "regular economic survey" is given for the three months past. Each issue usually contains one economic article which is signed.

An occasional number contains only the tables and charts.

Skandinaviska kreditaktiebolaget. Statistical dept. Quarterly report. Gothenburg, Stockholm, Malmö.

Contains a review of the economic situation in Sweden during the quarter, illustrated by tables and charts which covers the general situation, timbers, wood pulp and paper, foreign trade, iron and steel, stock exchange, bonds, etc. It also contains signed and unsigned articles of which the following are typical: "Idle" Money; Abnormal Rates of Exchange; The Problem of Stabilization; and The Annual Growth of the Swedish Forests in Relation to the Consumption of Timber.

The January, 1930 issue contains a classified index for the years 1920-1929.

Swedish-American trade journal: published by the Swedish Chamber of commerce of the United States of America. New York. 286.8 Sw3

An illustrated monthly journal containing signed and unsigned articles and news items relating to the trade of Sweden with the United States. Many of the numbers carry a list of "trade opportunities" which have arisen through the activities of the Swedish Chamber of Commerce of the U. S. A."

Swedish economic review. Compiled by the Swedish Board of trade. Published by the Swedish Foreign office. Quarterly.

Contains comments on the following subjects: general review, State finance, the money market, agriculture, industry, the labour market, timber, wood-pulp, iron, and foreign trade and shipping. There are several pages of statistics relating to the money market and general business conditions, import, export, foreign trade, prices of staple

goods and foreign exchange.

U. S. S. R.

Economic review of the Soviet Union. Published by the Amtorg trading corporation, Information department. New York. 267 Ec7

Contains articles relating to the Soviet-American trade; summaries of new developments in the economic life of the U. S. S. R.; etc.; notes of foreign trade, industry, agriculture, and finance. Occasionally there is a comprehensive table entitled: Soviet Economic Statistics. Most of the earlier issues contain a statistical survey. There is a classified index of contents for each volume.

Beginning with the February 15, 1929 issue there is printed in this review "a bibliography of books, periodicals and articles in periodicals dealing with economic conditions in the Soviet Union, which have appeared in the United States in the English language since 1920." The bibliography does not appear in each issue.

Soviet Union review [monthly] Washington, D.C. 280.3 R922

Semi-monthly, v.1-4, no.6. Sept. 15, 1923-Mar. 15, 1926.

Published by the Soviet Union Information Bureau (formerly the Russian Information Bureau) Washington, D.C.

v.1-4, Sept. 15, 1923-Dec. 1926 have title: Russian Review.

Contains recent material on "Foreign Relations, Legislation, Cultural Life and Economic Conditions of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics."

U. S. S. R. Chamber of commerce for western trade. Monthly bulletin. Moscow. 287 M85

Is composed largely of signed articles on trade and economic conditions of the U. S. S. R. and related subjects.

Comments and figures of the foreign trade of the U. S. S. R.; U. S. S. R. economic news; Chamber of commerce activities; miscellaneous notes; and occasionally a list of concessions offered comprise the rest of the material in this bulletin. Only four numbers were examined.

U. S. Bureau of foreign and domestic commerce. Division of regional information. Russian economic notes. [Washington, D. C.] 157.54 [R] Mimeographed.

A weekly circular prepared from official Russian publications by the Division of Regional Information.

The Notes cover a variety of material of Russian economic life. The following typical subjects are included: Ukrainian agricultural machine building industry, Financial structure of manufacturing concessions, Foreign trade in the first quarter of 1929-30 and Difficulties of agriculture in capitalistic countries.

There is a classified index to Russian Economic Notes - no. 1, August 5, 1928 to no. 61, December 27, 1929.

Haiti

Haiti. Republic of. Monthly bulletin. Published by the Office of financial adviser-general receiver. Port-au-Prince. 254.8 H123 (Mimeographed)

This bulletin contains no articles but has sections devoted to the financial and commercial situation; public works; public health service; and agricultural service. It also contains a section giving statistical data but the table titles are given in French.

Mexico.

Mexican commerce and industry [monthly] Mexico City. 287 Am3Mj

Published by the American Chamber of Commerce of Mexico, Mexico City.

Vol. 1, no.9 - v.6 (Oct. 1913-Dec. 1924) have title: Journal of the American Chamber of Commerce of Mexico.

Jan. - Dec. 1925 have title: Mexican Commerce.

Many of the issues of this periodical devote a great deal of space to publishing new laws - sometimes the law itself and sometimes summaries of the law. Some issues contain news of trade and commerce, also articles relating to Mexican-American trade and expansion of American business in Mexico.

New Zealand

Canterbury Chamber of commerce. Bulletin. Christchurch, New Zealand.

Prepared by the Department of Economics of Canterbury College.

This is a small publication which contains economic material on such subjects as The trend of business in New Zealand; Public finance; New Zealand and Australian trade and markets; The Burden of taxation, etc. Usually each issue is devoted to one topic.

Philippine Islands*

Commerce. A magazine of business for business men. Official organ of the Chamber of Commerce of the Philippine Islands. Manila. 286.8 C7324

This magazine has a section in English and one in Spanish. It contains trade notes; signed and unsigned articles; editorial and press comment; monthly trade review, etc.

Manila. Bureau of commerce and industry. Commerce and industry journal. monthly. Manila, P. I.

There are special signed articles on such subjects as rural credit, marketing systems, business conditions, tariff, etc. in this monthly, also sections devoted to monthly Review of the Philippine Trade; Trade Information Section; New Philippine Industries; Commercial News in Brief; and a statistical section which gives wholesale prices, imports, exports and a summary of Philippine foreign trade.

*The Philippine Islands have been included on account of the general use of Spanish in the Islands.

South America

Bank of London & South America limited. Monthly review of business and trade conditions in South America and Portugal. London. 286.8 L844.

At head of title, v.4, no.42-v.6, no.61: London & River Plate Bank, limited.

At head of title, v.6, no.62 - v.8, no.85: Bank of London & South America Limited, formerly the London & River Plate Bank, Limited, with which is amalgamated the London & Brazilian Bank, Limited.

v.4, no.42 - v.6, no.64 have title: Monthly Review of Business and Trade Conditions in South America.

The arrangement of the Review is first by country, then by state. Each issue contains a separate sheet giving "quotations of local stocks and shares as per cables from branches" of the Bank of London & South America, Limited.

Pan American Union, Bulletin. Washington, D. C. 150.9 M76.

An illustrated publication which contains signed and unsigned articles and sections having the following headings: Pan American Union Notes; Legislation; Agriculture; Industry and Commerce; Communications and Transportation; Population and Migration; Labor and Public Works; Economic and Financial Affairs; Social Welfare and Public Health; General Notes; and Subject Matter of Consular reports. The information in these various sections is given by countries. The articles are generally on subjects of current interest in Pan American countries. Reports of conferences of American states are also given.

v.1-26 (Oct. 1893-June 1908) are in English, Spanish, Portuguese and French; v.27-32 (July 1908-June 1911) are in two sections, one in English the other in Spanish, Portuguese and French; beginning with v.33 (July 1911) the foreign sections are published as separate editions.

The title of the publication varies.

Argentina

The Review of the River Plate; all about Argentina, its wonderful resources and possibilities. Buenos Aires [weekly] 286.8 R32

Sub-title varies.

Deals with the commercial, financial, agricultural, and political conditions of the River Plate countries. It regularly contains the following statistics: general produce and grain shipments; exports of cereals from Argentina; grain prices, Buenos Aires; Argentine and Uruguayan wool shipments; approximate traffic receipts of Argentine and Uruguayan railways; report of the Bolsa of Buenos Aires; and quotations on the London Stock Exchange. It contains, also, from time to time, current reports and statistics relating to agriculture, slaughterings at the frigorificos; exports; reviews of the produce markets; etc.

Bolivia

A bi-monthly survey of Bolivian activities.

Published by the Bolivian Consulate, New York City.

"Bolivia is designed to present information dealing with all phases of Bolivian life and to provide in handy form information which is desired alike by exporters and importers in both countries; statistics, official regulations and new laws."

Brazil

Brazilian business; published monthly by the American chamber of commerce for Brazil. Rio de Janeiro. 286.8 B732

Contains editorial, comments, and signed and unsigned articles dealing with all trade topics of mutual interest to Brazil and the United States. Reviews of Brazilian business conditions, and of the import and export markets are given regularly.

Wileman's Brazilian review; a weekly journal of trade, finance, economics and shipping. Rio de Janeiro. 286.8 W64

Considerable space in the Review is devoted to coffee - market conditions, closing quotations and options, prices current, clearances, cost and freight quotations, exports, etc. Contains sections devoted to reports on rubber, cotton and sugar which give market prices, and quotations of cotton and sugar in foreign markets. Many of the issues contain bank statements and give the condition of the exchange market. There are also unsigned articles, many being on some phase of the coffee industry.

Chile

There are signed and unsigned articles; industrial and commercial notes; notes of British and European affairs; the Chilean diary which gives in brief the leading events in Chile by the week; stock exchange impression; and new books for Anglo-Chilean readers.

Peru

Peru. A monthly magazine published by the Peruvian House in New York. New York.

An illustrated periodical, part of which is printed in English. It contains material devoted largely to Peruvian affairs. A section, Flashes from Peru, contains comments on subjects of current interest in Peru. There are signed and unsigned articles. Peru and its Progress is the title of a signed article appearing in one of the two numbers examined. Also contains a bibliography of books, booklets and periodicals which are at the disposal of anyone desiring information about Peru.
