ABSTRACT

This bibliography lists research publications on the economics of fruits and vegetables from January 1, 1976 to December 31, 1980. References cover various activities: (1) production, yield, and harvest, (2) storage, marketing, packaging, and handling, (3) costs, demand, supply, and utilization, (4) grades, standards, and consumers, (5) interregional competition, (6) projections, forecasts, and outlook, (7) shipments, transportation, and foreign trade, (8) processing, and (9) miscellaneous. References have been compiled from land-grant institutions and from The National Bibliography of Agriculture. An author index is included.

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PREFACE

This bibliography lists research reports published between January 1, 1976, and December 31, 1980, on the economics and related areas of producing and marketing fruits and vegetables. It updates ESCS-50, "Bibliography on the Economics of Fruit and Vegetable Production and Marketing, 1965-76," published in May 1979. Included are references on costs, prices, grades, competition, projections, shipments, processing, and miscellaneous activities. The research reports are listed alphabetically by author and referenced under 10 major headings. An author index with page number references comprises the last section of the compilation.

Bibliography references were compiled from the National Bibliography of Agriculture of the National Agriculture Library (NAL), CRIS Report, other bibliographies, and fruit and vegetable research publications submitted annually to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) by land-grant institutions.

USDA publications still in print may be ordered from the distribution office of the appropriate agency while supplies last. USDA distribution offices do not have copies of research publications issued by other institutions. Institutional publications of the land-grant universities and colleges should be ordered directly from the issuing institution. Publications which are out of print may be ordered from NAL or from the land-grant university or college libraries subject to institutional rules.

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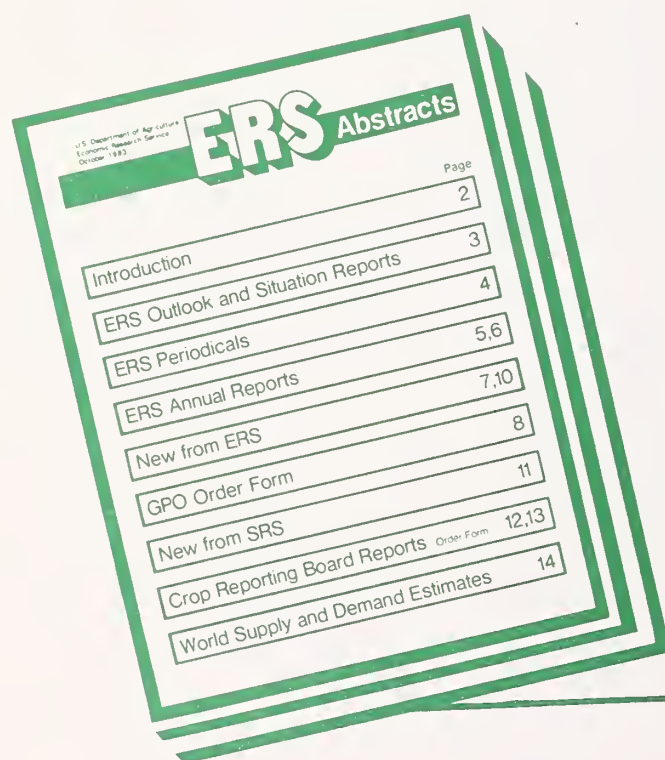
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
