# Biobased Products and Secretary Vilsack 2022 Priorities

### **Addressing Climate Change via Climate Smart Agriculture & Forestry**

- Plants sequester carbon, removing carbon from atmosphere, so products from plants are more sustainable.
- The use of biobased products instead of petroleum counterparts would displace about 9.4 million barrels of oil per year according to latest economic report.
- Potential GHG reductions from the biobased products industry are estimated at 12.7 million metric tons of CO2 equivalents per year according to latest economic report.
- Many biobased products are manufactured near farm gate reducing transportation issues.

### **Advancing Racial Justice, Equity and Opportunity**

 Products made from agriculture, forestry, and marine materials create jobs and improve outcomes for farmers and new opportunities in manufacturing.

### **Creating More and Better Market Opportunities**

 Innovative biobased products create new markets for farm commodities and increase export opportunities.


## The Mission of the USDA BioPreferred Program

- spur U.S. economic development
- create new U.S. jobs
- provide new markets for farm commodities
- reduce our reliance on petroleum,
- increase the use of renewable agricultural resources,
- reduce adverse environmental and health impacts.



## The BioPreferred® Program

- Managed by U.S. Department of Agriculture (within Rural Development)
- Established by the 2002 Farm Bill
- Expanded in the 2008, 2014, and 2018
   Farm Bills
- Identifies and seeks new markets for biobased products
- Two major program elements
  - Mandatory Federal Purchasing
  - Voluntary Labeling Program
- Market Push, Market Pull



# **USDA BioPreferred Program: Mandatory Federal Purchasing**

- Federal agencies and federal contractors required to buy biobased products in categories designated by USDA
- Currently, 139 diverse categories including cleaning products, motor oils, lubricants, and adhesives
- About 17,000 products in BioPreferred Program catalog that qualify for mandatory federal purchasing




## **USDA Certified Biobased Product Label**
