

PREFACI

This is Part V of the third of a series* of indexes or source books of agricultural statistics issued by the Library of the United States Bureau of Agricultural Economics. It is issued in cooperation with the College of Agriculture of the University of California. The indexing of the other parts is finished and they will be issued as rapidly as it is possible to do so.

This Index to the state official and unofficial sources of agricultural statistics of the state of California was undertaken with the idea of issuing it in one volume as were the Alabama and Oklahoma indexes. When the indexing of the collected references was finished it was realized that it would be impossible to publish the Index in one volume because of its size, so it was decided to issue it in five parts. Part I includes the fruit, vegetable and nut crops of the state. Part II will include the crops other than fruits, vegetables and muts. Part III will include livestock and livestock products. Part IV will include miscellaneous items, such as irrigation, land, farm property, labor, Delhi and Durham state land settlements, etc. Part V, which is the present volume, is a Guide to Some Unofficial Sources of California Agricultural Statistics and was compiled under the direction of Mrs. M. J. Abbott, Agricultural Reference Librarian, University of California Library.

A classified arrangement always presents a certain amount of difficulty to both the compiler and the user of a bibliography. To obviate this difficulty to some extent an alphabetical index will accompany each volume of this Index.

The compilers of this Index have tried to index the statistical tables as accurately as possible. The task, however, was a difficult one. Sometimes it was practically impossible to tell just what was meant by the table headings or the dates used and often there was nothing of an explanatory nature in the text. Users of this Index should remember that it is merely a guide to the sources of certain statistics and that before they use the statistics they should carefully examine the accompanying text or any notes which may explain the terms used and the scope of the compilation.

Statistical tables only have been indexed; no attempt has been made to index untabulated statistics occuring in the text. Undated tables have been indexed when the exact or probable dates could be ascertained.

*The first two indexes in the series are: Alabama, An Index to the State Official Sources of Agricultural Statistics, compiled by Margaret T. Olcott and issued as Agricultural Economics Bibliography No. 15; and Oklahoma, An Index to the State Official Sources of Agricultural Statistics, compiled by Icelle E. Wright..including a List of the Unofficial Sources of Oklahoma Agricultural Statistics, compiled by Margaret Walters and issued as Agricultural Economics Bibliography No. 21.

Among the publications examined, which has not been indexed since the few statistics that it contains are reprinted from other sources, but which may be mentioned here is "California, Its Products, Resources, Industries, and Attractions, What it Offers the Immigrant, Homeseeker, Investor and Tourist," published by the California Louisiana Purchase Exposition Commission in 1904. The California Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition Commission and the California Lewis and Clarke Exposition Commission also issued publications with similar titles.

Special mention, also, may be made of the index to the San Francisco Call for the years 1894-1903(5 volumes). We are reliably informed that the only existing copies of the bound volumes of this index are in the California State Library. The California Department of the California State Library has, from 1903 to date, a detailed subject card index of one important San Francisco newspaper. All of these indexes will doubtless prove additional sources of information for the student of California statistics.

Since the completion of this index the Research Department of the California Development Association has issued a 77-page mimeographed publication entitled Economic Survey of California Counties, 1928: Research and Industries, Growth and Development. This is a compilation of the latest available California statistics collected mainly from state and Federal official sources. This will also be found useful.

SOURCES CONSULTED

Associated Grower, Fresno, California. v. 1 - 6, 1920 - 1924:

A continuation of the Sun Maid Herald, Official organ of the Sun Maid Raisin Growers Association. Contains statistics on production of grapes and raisins and prices paid to members. Later numbers are limited more strictly to statements of sales made by the association.

California Annual, see Calpak Annual.

California Bean Growers Journal, San Francisco, California. v. 1 - 4, 1919 - 1923:

Official organ of California Bean Growers Association. Gives statistics on bean production, prices, marketing and stocks on hand by varieties. Gives very complete tables.

California Board of Trade, see California Development Association.

California Citrograph, Los Angeles, California. v. 1 - 10, 1915 - 1925: Official organ of California Fruit Growers Exchange. Gives statistics of cost of production, markets and prices for citrus fruits.

California Cultivator, San Francisco, California. v. 12 - 75, 1898 - 1925: Gives general agricultural news of California with special reference to Southern California. Market page is very similar to the Pacific Rural Press, but with the emphasis on the Los Angeles markets, citrus production and sales. There is an index in each volume.

California Culturist, San Francisco, California. v. 1 - 3, 1858 - 1860: An early farm paper containing some statistics of production and trade of historical value.

California Development Association, San Francisco, California.

Reports 2, 7 - 30, 1891, 1897 - 1918/19. Early numbers called Annual Report of California Board of Trade, Later California Development Board.

Supplement to 1918/19 covering 1920, 1921.

Monthly bulletin, v. 12:3 - 15, Jan 1911 - Jan 1922.

California Development, v. 12:3 - 13:2, Mar 1922 - Jan 1923.

California Journal of Development, v. 13:3 - 15, Feb 1923 - 1925.

Report on problems of Agricultural Development in California. 1924.

The reports of this Board gave general reviews of the agricultural resources of the state: production, shipments of farm produce and canned and dried fruits and vegetables; dairy production and values; lumber cuts and s shipments, etc. Many of the tables cover a series of years.

The monthly journal is "A summary of business conditions in California, including available statistical indices of production movement and prices."

The Report on Problems of Agricultural Development in California was issued by the Department of Research and Information. It gives some good compilations of prices, value and acreage of farm products. Also figures on irrigation districts.

California Fruit Grower, San Francisco, California. v. 1 - 50, 1888 - 1914. Title changed to California Fruit News with v. 51, 1915. California Fruit News, San Francisco, California.v. 51 -73, 1915 - 1926. Continuation of California Fruit Grower.

The most important publication for statistics on prices, production and movements of fruits and vegetables. Gives monthly and annual imports and exports from California, stocks on hand and annual packs. Notes transportation rates and changes in rates. Gives wholesale and association prices, also auction sales. The annual statistical number summarizes the weekly reports and includes many extra tabulations of the state agricultural products. The annual reviews are to be found in the following numbers and volumes:

California Grape Grower, San Francisco, California. v. 1 - 6, 1920 - 1925: Official organ of the California Grape Growers Exchange. Interested primarily in juice grapes. Gives production, movements, and some prices of grapes, obtained chiefly from official sources.

California Journal of Development, see California Development Association.

California Pear Grower, San Francisco, California. v. 1 - 5, 1921 - 1925 Official organ of the California Pear Growers Association. Contains production and marketing statistics for California pears - especially prices paid by the association.

Calvak Annual, San Francisco, California. 1924 - 1926. Continuation of California Annual.

Published by the California Packing Corporation. A compact compilation of canning statistics for ten or more years giving comparative opening prices and packs for canned and dried fruits and vegetables. Has tables giving duration of canning season, shipping weights, exports and imports. Gives statistics also for fruit and vegetable packs in Oregon, Washington and Idaho, Hawaiian pineapple and canned fish.

Carmany, John H. <u>A Review of the Year 1866</u>. San Francisco, California. 1867. Compiled from the Mercantile Gazette and Prices Current of Jan. 9, 1867. Of historical interest for its reviews of California, especially San Francisco business conditions. Has a section devoted to market reviews of Agricultural produce,, exports and imports by sea and rail.

Commercial Herald and Market Review. "Commercial Herald" Review of the Trade of California and the Entire Pacific Coast, for the Year 1876. San Francisco, California, 1877.

Frepared and published in the Commercial Herald and Market Review of Jan. 18, 1877. Contains reviews of the business conditions of California, especially San Francisco, exports and imports by sea and rail, and market reviews of agricultural produce.

Diamond Brand News, see Diamond Walnut Hews.

Diamond Walnut News, Los Angeles, California .v. 1 - 7, 1917 - 1925: Vol. 1 - 4, 1917 - 1922 has title Diamond Brand News. Official organ of the California Walnut Growers Association. Gives general information on walnut production and prices.

Farm and Ranch Market Journal, Los Angeles, California. v. 3, 1925: Concerned only with cattle, sheep and hogs. Gives daily shipments to the Los Angeles Union Stockyards, also sales and prices.

Fig and Olive Journal, Los Angelos, California. v. 1 - 6, 1916 - 1922: Vol. 1 - 2:10 has title Olive Journal.

The best source of information on olives and figs for the years covered.

Mercantile Trust Company, San Francisco, California.

Mercantile Trust Review of the Pacific. v. 11 - 14, 1922 - 1925: Vol. 11 - 13:6 1922 - June 1924 has title Monthly Review.

Gives agricultural statistics from official sources. Also often published valuable articles on special products which include good compilations of statistics.

Nulaid News, San Francisco, California. v. 1 - 3, 1923 - 1925;

Published by the Poultry Producers of Central California. Gives receipts and sales of eggs by the association and quotes official statistics of interest to poultrymen.

Olive Journal, see Fig and Olive Journal.

Pacific Dairy Review, San Francisco, California v. 1 - 29, 1901 - 1925: Publishes statistics on dairy and poultry products giving daily prices in San Francisco and, in later years, in Los Angeles. Also quotes wholesale prices on dairy feeds.

Pacific Rural Press, San Francisco, California. v. 1 - 110, 1871 - 1925: Gives general agricultural news, emphasizing northern California. Weekly pages of market statistics have continued very similar from the beginning to date. San Francisco prices, wholesale and to the producer are the most fully given.

Los Angeles prices have been given during later years. Seasonal quotations on all farm produce, also receipts of livestock and sales of California shipments 'in eastern fruit auctions are given. There is an index in each volume.

San Francisco. Chamber of Commerce. Annual Statistical Report. 1 - 9, 1911 -1920:

Gives quotations from Western Canner and Packer for production of dried and canned fruits and vegetables. Exports and imports by place of origin and destination, receipts of agricultural produce at San Francisco and stocks on hand, also prices in the grain exchange. Continues Annual reports of San-Francisco Merchants Exchange.

San Francisco, Federal Reserve Bank. Special Report:

1. Barley. 2. Cotton: 3. Sheep. 5. Lemons.

.These reports are statistical compilations giving a comprehensive review of the particular commodity studied.

San Francisco. Merchants Exchange. Annual Report. 1 - 10, 1901 - 1910. The San Francisco Merchants! Exchange succeeded the San Francisco • Produce Exchange and was merged into the San Francisxo Chamber of Commerce. Their reports include the same type of material.

San Francisco. Produce. Exchange. Annual Report. 20 - 34, 1887 - 1901. Continued by San Francisco Merchants! Exchange. Annual Reports. Gives statistics on grain including receipts, exports and imports at San-Francisco, stocks on hand, daily high and low prices and freight rates; lumber receipts; production and shipments of fresh and dried fruits, beans and hops; wool production.

Sun-maid Herald, see Associated Grower.

Sun Sweet Standard, San Jose, California. v. 1 - 9, 1917 - 1926:

Official publication of the California Prune and Apricot Growers Association. Contains information of interest to members of the association, particularly production and prices for prunes and apricots.

Western Canner and Packer, San Francisco, California. v. 10 - 17, 1918 - 1926; Annual statistical numbers, 1912 to date:

"Devoted to the industries and trade in canned and cured fruits, vegetables, and fish of the Pacific region." Contains detailed statistics on wholesale and jobbers prices and prices offered by cooperative associations and commission houses to the producers. Gives exports and imports by month and year for California and the Pacific coast ports. Gives also very complete statistics of canned and dried fruit and vegetable packs. The yearly statistical number, published in February, is most valuable and is fairly consistent in the material included, but monthly numbers have no regualr plan and no indexes, so are difficult to use. X dexes, so are difficult to use.
