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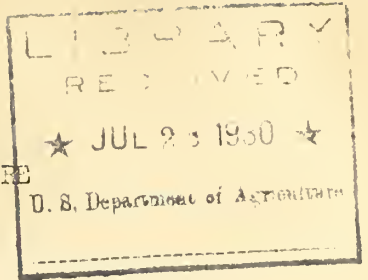

FRUITS

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ANALYSIS OF FOREIGN TRADE IN FRUIT

The striking increase in domestic exports of fruit during the last ten years has been an outstanding feature of the foreign trade of the United States in agricultural products. Although the United States in earlier years exported fresh and dried apples and imported dried fruits in considerable volume, our foreign trade in fruits did not assume any great importance until near the opening of the present century. Prior to 1912, the balance of our foreign fruit trade was decidedly in favor of imports but since that year exports have exceeded imports in decreasing volume. Average exports during 1925-1929 were valued at \$115,992,000 compared with an average of \$28,025,000 during the period 1910-1914, a gain of 314 per cent. A considerable part of this increase was due to a rise in prices but even on a volume basis our fruit exports have been about 225 per cent larger in the last five years than during 1910-1914. During the 1925-1929 period fresh and dried apples constituted 27 per cent of the total value of all fruit sent to foreign countries.

Imports of fruits have also shown a noticeable upward trend in recent years but the rate of increase has been much below that of exports. Average imports of fruit during 1925-1929 amounted to \$54,096,000 against \$28,608,000 during the pre-war period. This was an increase of 89 per cent. During the last five years bananas have accounted for 59 per cent of the total value of imported fruit.

FRESH FRUIT

Apples and pears

Apples have been an important item in the export trade of the United States since the establishment of the national government. Up until 1910 most of these exports consisted of hardy varieties of eastern barreled apples shipped to European markets. The expansion of apple growing in the Pacific Northwest, the opening of the Panama Canal and improvements in respect to refrigeration and transportation facilities have resulted in a marked expansion in the apple export trade during the past two decades. Exports of fresh apples increased from an average of 1,551,000 barrels during 1910-1914 to the equivalent of 4,826,000 barrels annually during the period 1925-1929, a gain of 211 per cent. About one-half of the exports at present are boxed apples from the Western States.

Pears have never figured to any important extent in our fresh fruit export trade but their importance in this trade seems to be growing. As in the case of apples, the expansion of pear production on the Pacific Coast together with the opening of the Panama Canal has given an impetus to the export trade in this fruit. Average exports of fresh pears during the period 1925-1929 amounted to 64,088,000 pounds, most of which went to Canada and the United Kingdom.

Citrus fruit

Between 1870 and 1900 the annual value of imported oranges ranged between \$1,000,000 and \$3,000,000, but with the development of the industry in this country imports rapidly declined and since 1903 there has been a rapidly growing export balance.

Canada has always been our principal export outlet for oranges but during the last three years there has been a significant increase in exports to Europe, principally to the United Kingdom. The latter exports consist largely of California Valencias shipped during the summer and fall months when competition from other orange producing countries is less than in the winter months. Orange exports for the United States reached the record of 4,223,000 boxes during the fiscal year 1928-29. Average exports of oranges during the last five years showed an increase of 153 per cent over the pre-war average exports.

The demand for grapefruit in the United Kingdom has shown a significant increase in recent years. Most of the grapefruit shown in the official export figures as going to the United Kingdom from the United States comes at present from Florida and Porto Rico but there has been an increasing exportation of grapefruit from California in recent years. Exports of grapefruit during the five years 1925-1929 averaged 461,000 boxes. Canada is second to the United Kingdom as a foreign market for American grapefruit.

The United States has always been on an import basis in respect to lemons. Before the war, more than half of the lemons consumed in the United States were imported from Italy. With the rapid expansion of lemon growing in California imports declined and now amount on the average to only about 10 per cent of our total consumption. Imports of lemons into the United States during 1925-1929 averaged 974,000 boxes compared with 2,001,000 boxes during the four years 1910-1913.

Bananas

Bananas have become by far the most important item in our fruit import trade and are the only fresh fruit imported in significant quantities at the present time. Imports of bananas reached 58,743,000 bunches during the period 1925-1929 compared with 43,683,000 bunches during 1910-1914, an increase of 35 per cent.

Grapes, fresh

Grapes were at one time an important item in the import trade of the United States but are at present of minor significance, consisting largely of hothouse grapes from Belgium and Argentine grapes imported during the winter. Imports of grapes into the United States during the period 1910-1914 averaged 35,293,000 pounds. In the last five fiscal years,

1925-1929, imports averaged only 2,989,000 pounds. The relatively small imports during recent years may be partly attributed to the quarantine on Spanish grapes on account of the Mediterranean fruit fly, but it is probable that imports would have declined considerably without the quarantine in view of the large and increasing production and low prices of grapes in the United States in recent years. Exports of grapes from the United States during the period 1925-1929 averaged 33,964,000 pounds going largely to Canada, Cuba and Mexico.

Olives

Spain and Greece supply most of the olives coming into the United States. Average imports during 1925-1929 amounted to 6,104,000 gallons compared with an average of 4,388,000 gallons during 1910-1914, a gain of 39 per cent.

DRIED FRUIT

Prunes

The export trade of the United States in dried prunes has shown a remarkable development in the last twenty-five years. During the decade 1881-1890, imports of prunes into the United States averaged 59,182,000 pounds annually. Production of prunes in California was increasing rapidly, however, and in the next ten years there was a decided decline in imports and by the opening of the present century the United States had shifted from an import to an export basis with respect to prunes. During the five years 1925-1929, exports of prunes from the United States averaged 206,479,000 pounds compared with 80,428,000 pounds during 1910-1914, an increase of 157 per cent. Germany, the United Kingdom, France and Canada are the principal foreign markets for prunes.

Raisins and currants

The history of our foreign trade in raisins and currants has been similar to that of prunes. During the decade 1881-1890 net imports of raisins and currants into the United States averaged 69,445,000 pounds. As a result of the expansion in the raisin industry in California, imports of these products declined reaching an average of 35,217,000 pounds for the five-year period 1910-1914. Since that period exports of raisins from the United States have been gradually increasing and amounted to 153,952,000 pounds annually during the period 1925-1929 compared with 14,704,000 pounds during 1910-1914. On the other hand, imports of raisins and currants into the United States during 1925-1929 averaged only 17,252,000 pounds of which 73 per cent were currants. Raisin imports now consist largely of fancy packs, particularly of cluster raisins from Spain and amount to between 2,000,000 and 10,000,000 pounds annually. Practically all of the

currants (produced from small seedless grapes) come from Greece. They compete with the small seedless raisin produced in California and, largely as a result of the increase of raisin production in that State, imports of currants during the last five years show a decrease of 61 per cent compared with imports during the five years immediately preceding the war.

Peaches and apricots

Exports of dried apricots from the United States during the period 1925-1929 averaged 19,532,000 pounds compared with 19,438,000 pounds during the five years 1910-1914. Exports of dried apricots now represent a much smaller proportion of the production than was the case before the war. Exports of dried peaches averaged 6,793,000 pounds during 1925-1929, an increase of 24 per cent over the pre-war average, but exports in recent years have never been as large as those in the fiscal years of 1915 and 1916.

Apples, dried

Exports of dried apples show a definite downward trend. Prior to 1915 dried apples were by far the most important item in our dried fruit export trade. Exports during the period 1910-1914 averaged 35,137,000 pounds compared with an average of 29,710,000 pounds during 1925-1929. During the period 1880-to 1915, when our dried apple export trade was at its height, New York state supplied the bulk of the exports. Although New York is still probably the most important dried apple export State, California and the Pacific Northwest have been assuming increasing importance in recent years. Germany and other northwestern European countries are the principal foreign outlets for our evaporated apples.

Dates

Dates are the outstanding item in our dried fruit import trade. From an average of 25,463,000 pounds during 1910-1914, net imports increased to 52,749,000 pounds annually during 1925-1929. More than 80 per cent of the total imports now come from Mesopotamia and Arabia.

Dried figs

Imports of dried figs are increasing in spite of expansion in dried fig production in California. Imports of dried figs increased from an average of 18,704,000 pounds during 1910-1914 to 35,267,000 pounds during 1925-1929, a gain of 89 per cent. Asiatic Turkey (Smyrna) supplies between 50 to 60 per cent of the imported figs.

CANNED FRUIT

There has been a considerable growth in the last few years in the exports of canned fruit. Quantity data on domestic exports of canned fruit

are available only since 1922. In the fiscal year 1922-23 exports of canned fruit totaled 207,220,000 pounds, while in 1928-29 exports amounted to 329,822,000 pounds. The average exports for the five years 1925-1929 were 268,177,000 pounds of which 31 per cent were peaches, 25 per cent pears, 11 per cent apricots and 15 per cent pineapples. Most of the exported canned fruit originated in California, except the pineapple which comes from Hawaii and is either shipped directly to foreign markets from the Islands or by way of San Francisco. The United Kingdom is our outstanding market for canned fruit, taking about three-fourths of our total exports.

FRUIT TRADE OF NON-CONTIGUOUS TERRITORIES WITH THE UNITED STATES

Shipments of fruit from the United States to non-contiguous territories consist largely of apples, oranges and canned fruit. Canned pineapple from Hawaii and oranges, grapefruit and fresh pineapple from Porto Rico are the principal items entering into the shipments from outlying territories to the United States. Shipments of canned pineapple from Hawaii to continental United States increased in value from \$3,173,000 during 1911-1914 to \$34,532,000 during 1925-1929. Shipments of grapefruit and pineapple from Porto Rico show an upward trend.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

DOMESTIC EXPORTS - Goods produced or manufactured in this country from either domestic or imported raw materials and which are shipped to foreign countries. The kind, quantity and value of exported merchandise are ascertained from the shipper's export declarations filed by the exporters with the collector of customs at the port of exportation.

Include exports to the Philippine Islands and Virgin Islands of the United States. Since 1902, excludes shipments from the United States to Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico.

1790-1802 - Include reexports or exports of foreign merchandise.

IMPORTS, GENERAL - Embrace articles entered at the customhouses for immediate consumption and imported articles entered for warehouse. Imports prior to 1921 are incomplete, as imports paying ad valorem duties were reported in value, but not in quantity and prior to 1917 the imports paying specific duties were reported in quantity but not in value.

Include imports from the Philippine Islands and Virgin Islands of the United States. Since 1902, exclude shipments to the United States from Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico.

IMPORTS FOR CONSUMPTION - Embrace articles entered for immediate consumption and imported articles withdrawn from warehouse for consumption. The statement of general imports and the statement of imports entered for consumption for any period will always differ to the extent that the value of entries for warehouse for the period differs from the value of withdrawals from warehouse for consumption. The term "entry for consumption" is the technical name of the import entry made at the customhouse and implies that the goods have been delivered into the custody of the importer and that the duties have been paid on the dutiable portion. Some of them may be afterward exported.

Imports for consumption were first reported in 1867 and published in 1868.

KIND, QUANTITY AND VALUE OF IMPORTS - The kind, quantity and value of imported merchandise are ascertained from the entry filed by the importer at the customhouse.

The value of imported merchandise as shown in the statistical tables is the foreign value or the export value, whichever is higher; that is, the market value or the price at which the merchandise, at the time of exportation to the United States, is offered for sale in the principal markets of the country from which exported, including the cost of containers or coverings and all expenses incident to placing the merchandise in condition ready for shipment to the United States.

REEXPORTS OR EXPORTS OF FOREIGN MERCHANDISE - Goods which have been imported into this country either for reexport or consumption and are afterward exported having undergone no change in form or condition or enhancement in value by application of labor in the United States.

1790-1802 - Combined with domestic exports.

NET EXPORTS - Domestic exports and reexports minus imports.

NET IMPORTS - Imports minus domestic exports and reexports.

AVERAGE EXPORT VALUE PER UNIT - These have been computed by dividing the total export value each year by the total quantity and are not to be regarded as a quotation of prices.

The value upon which a given average in this table was based is composed of items which represent shipments possibly of different grades of the articles mentioned from different parts of the United States and at different seasons of the year. The actual value of any one shipment included in this total is its value at the time and place of exportation.

YEARS - The years end as follows: September 30, 1790-1842; nine months, October 1, 1842 - June 30, 1843; June 30, 1844-1929.

HEADERS - Indicate no information exists but do not necessarily signify that, there were no reports for that period as they may have been included with "all other" or with the "unenumerated".

NONCONTIGUOUS TERRITORY - In the official trade statistics of the United States, the Philippine Islands and the Virgin Islands of the United States are treated as foreign countries.

The statistics of foreign commerce include the trade of the customs districts of Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico with foreign countries but do not include the trade of these territories with the United States.

In 1903, the trade with Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico was for the first time fully and definitely recorded (See Commerce and Navigation of the United States, 1903, Vol. 1, page 31). Therefore separate tables have been compiled showing shipments from the United States to Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico, 1903-1929.

The collection of statistics of trade with all noncontiguous territory was authorized by an act of Congress, April 29, 1902.

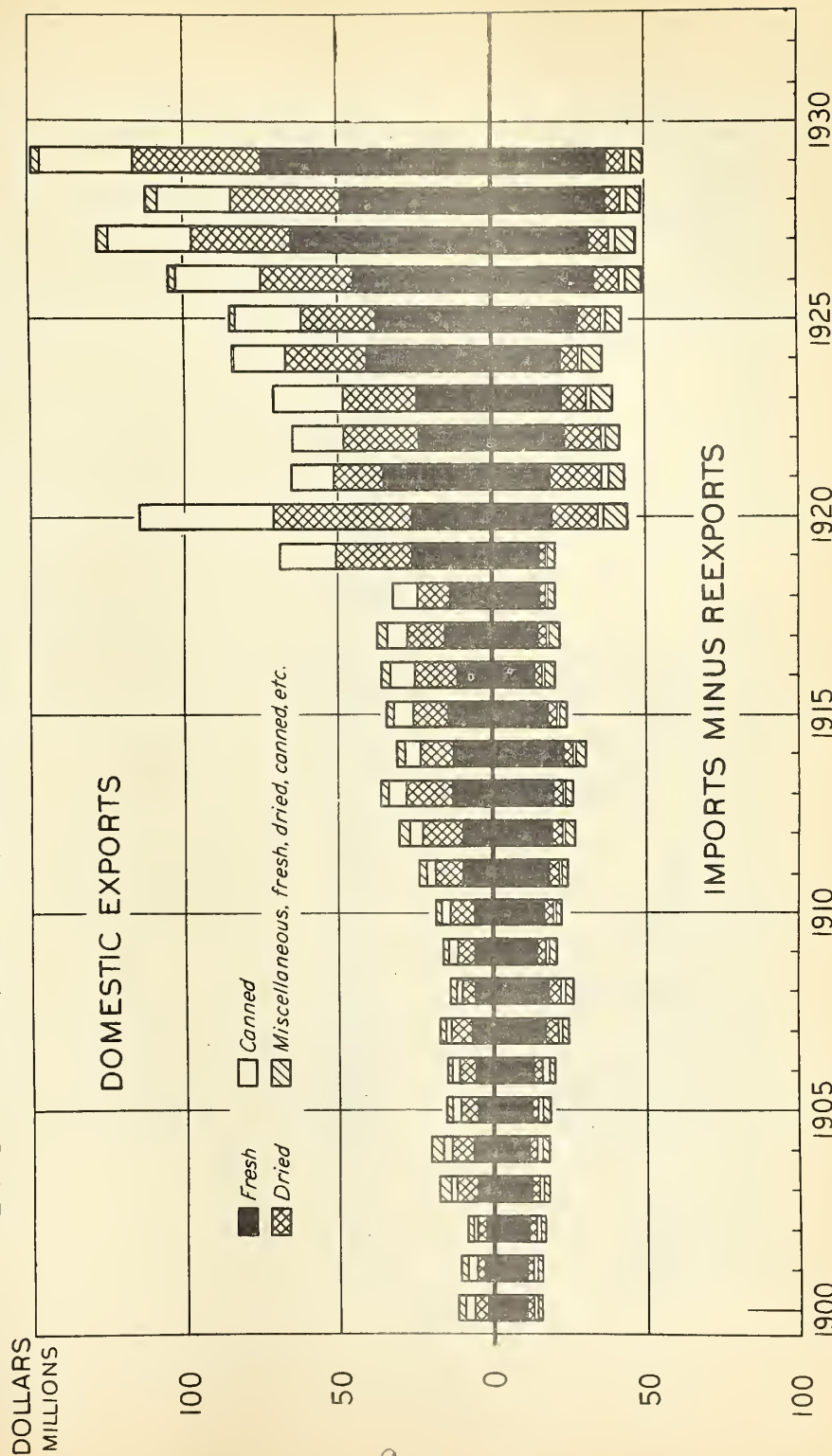


FIGURE 1 - THE GRADUAL GROWTH IN EXPORTS WHICH TOOK PLACE PRIOR TO 1910 WAS FOLLOWED BY A PERIOD OF RAPID EXPANSION AND AN EVEN MORE DECIDED INCREASE SINCE 1923. THE PROPORTION GOING OUT AS FRESH FRUIT SHOWS AN UPWARD TREND AND A CORRESPONDING DECREASE IN THE PROPORTION OF DRIED AND CANNED. IMPORTS ALSO SHOW A NOTICEABLE UPWARD TREND, AN INCREASING PROPORTION OF WHICH IS IMPORTS OF FRESH FRUIT. AFTER REACHING THEIR PEAK IN 1921, IMPORTS OF DRIED FRUIT HAVE DEFINITELY DECLINED



APPLES, FRESH AND DRIED: VOLUME OF NET EXPORTS OF THE UNITED STATES, 1900-1929

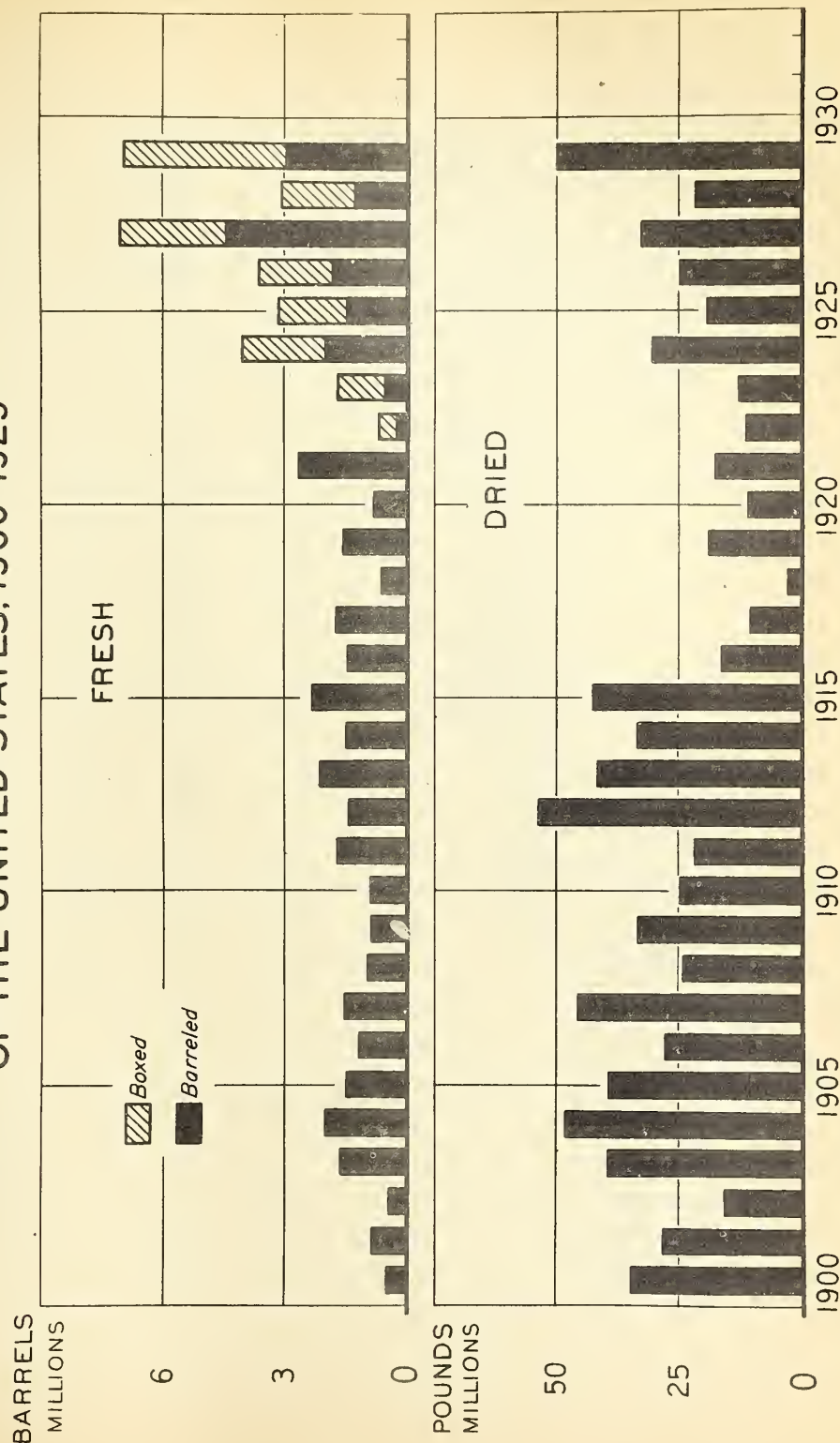


FIGURE 2 - EXCEPT FOR TEMPORARY FLUCTUATIONS, EXPORTS OF APPLES SHOW A NORMAL GROWTH PRIOR TO 1924 AND A VERY DECIDED GAIN DURING SUBSEQUENT YEARS. EXPORTS OF BOXED APPLES HAVE STEADILY ADVANCED AND MAKE UP ABOUT 50 PER CENT OF THE TOTAL EXPORTS. EXPORTS OF DRIED APPLES SHOW A DEFINITE DOWNWARD TREND

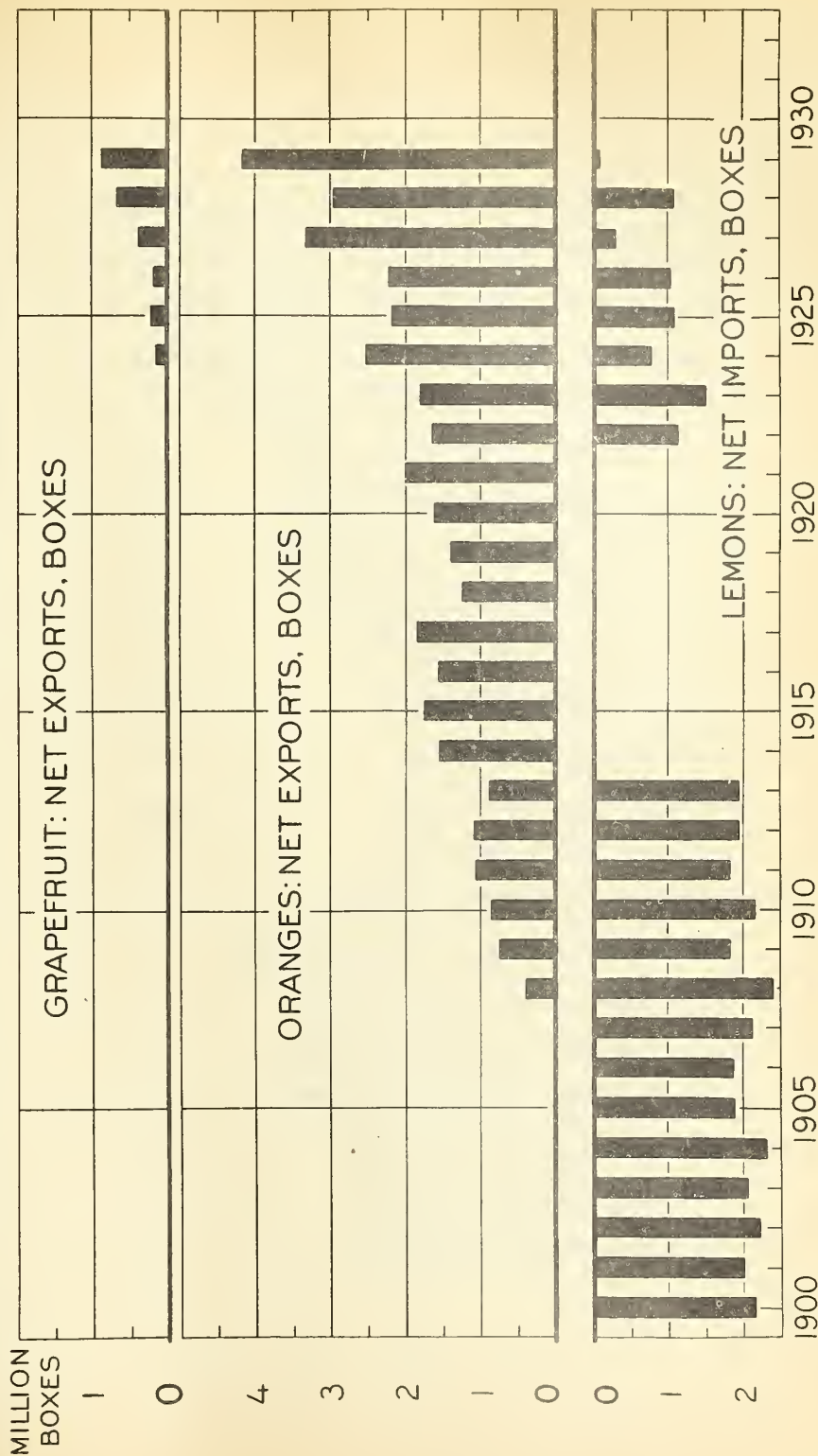


FIGURE 3 - NET IMPORTS OF LEMONS SHOW A GRADUAL DOWNWARD TREND FROM 1900-1913 AND A VERY ABRUPT DECLINE SINCE 1921. PRIOR TO 1924 THERE WAS A MODERATE INCREASE IN NET EXPORTS OF ORANGES WITH THE LAST SIX YEARS SHOWING A MORE DECIDED GROWTH. THERE HAS BEEN A RAPID AND ALMOST CONTINUOUS GROWTH IN EXPORTS OF GRAPEFRUIT



BANANAS: VOLUME OF NET IMPORTS OF THE UNITED STATES, 1908-1929

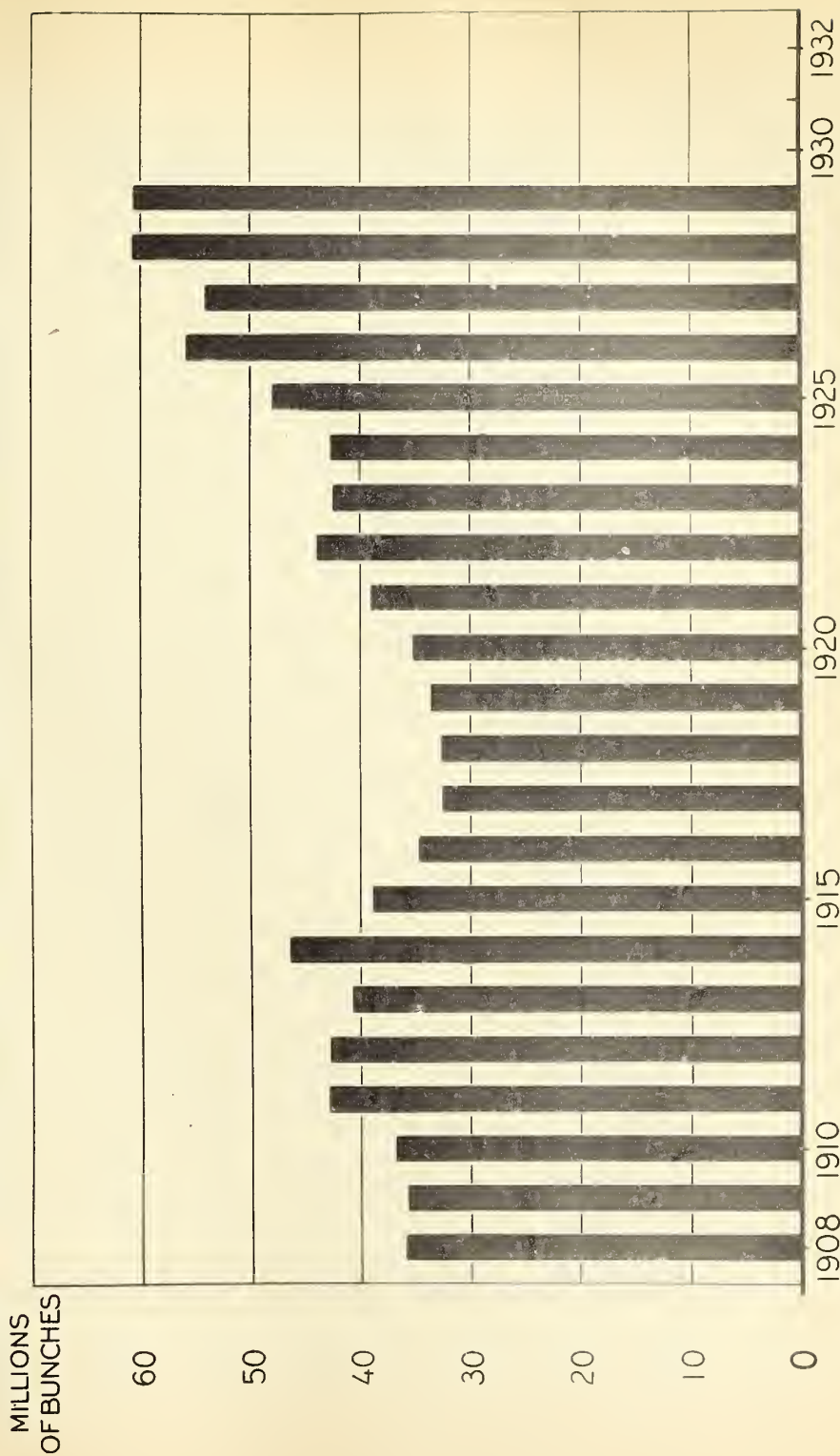


FIGURE 4 - EXCEPT FOR THE YEARS OF THE WORLD WAR, THERE HAS BEEN A DECIDED ADVANCE IN NET IMPORTS OF BANANAS, THE INCREASE BEING ESPECIALLY MARKED DURING THE LATER POST-WAR YEARS

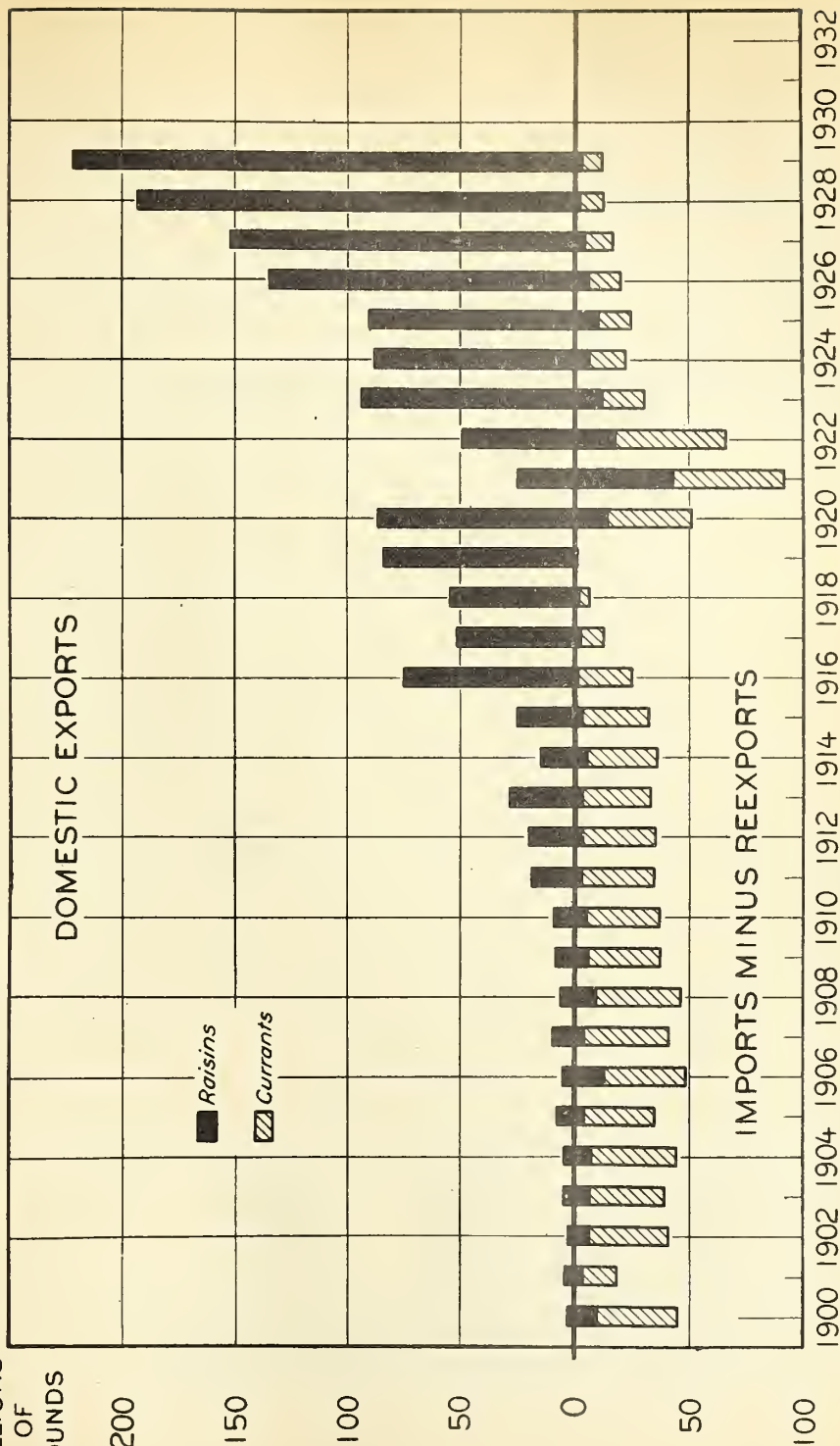


FIGURE 5 - THE INCREASE IN EXPORTS OF RAISINS HAS BEEN UNUSUALLY RAPID, AVERAGE EXPORTS DURING THE LAST FIVE YEARS BEING MORE THAN TEN TIMES AS LARGE AS THEY WERE DURING 1910-1914. ALONG WITH THE STRIKING ADVANCE IN EXPORTS IS SHOWN A HEAVY DECREASE IN IMPORTS OF CURRANTS AND RAISINS, THE GREATEST DECLINE BEING IN THE IMPORTS OF CURRANTS

OF THE UNITED STATES, 1900-1929

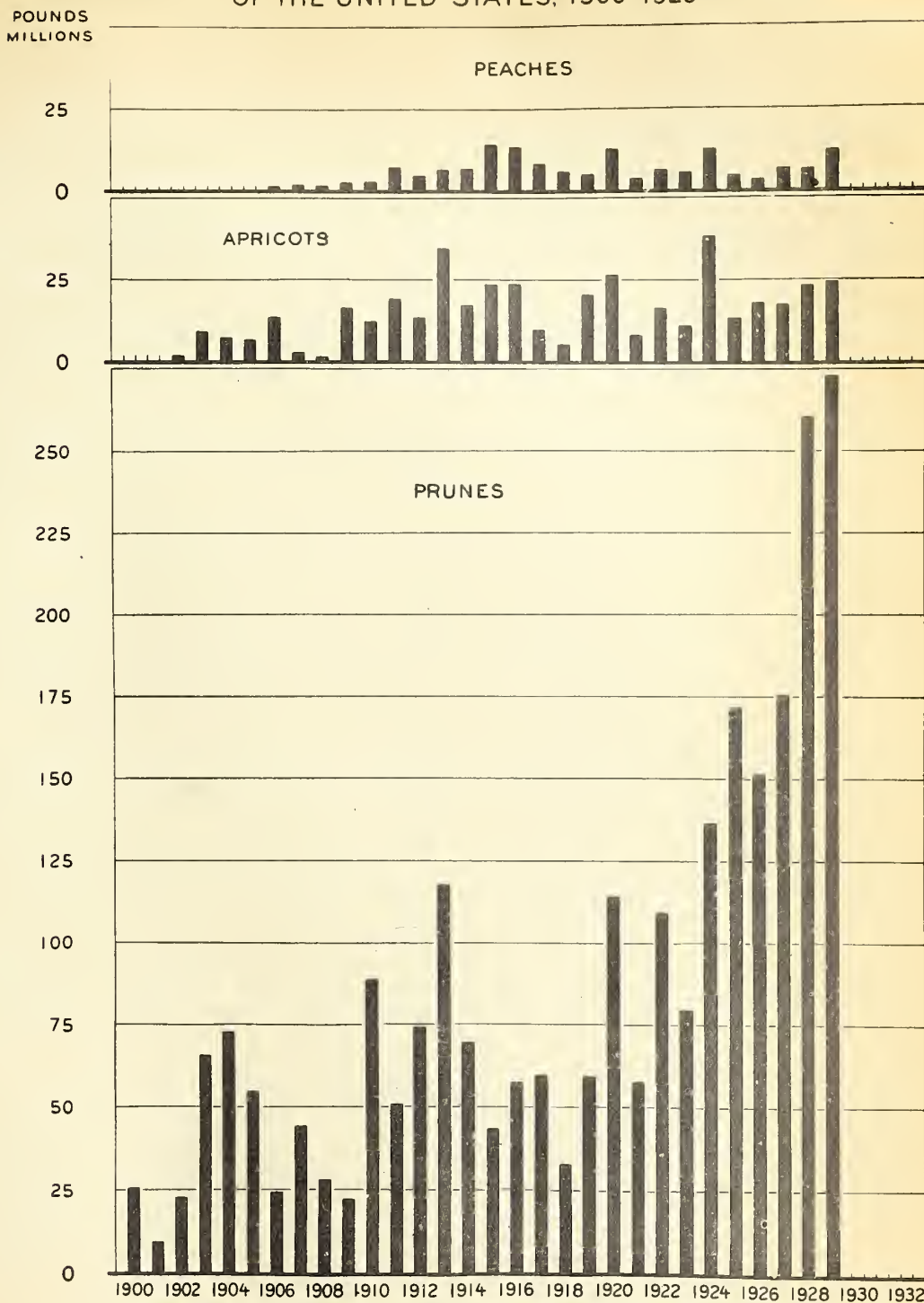


FIGURE 6 - EXPORTS OF PRUNES SHOW A REMARKABLE DEVELOPMENT, ESPECIALLY SINCE THE CLOSE OF THE WORLD WAR, REACHING THE PEAK IN 1929. THE TREND IN EXPORTS OF APRICOTS AND PEACHES HAS ALSO BEEN GRADUALLY UPWARD
