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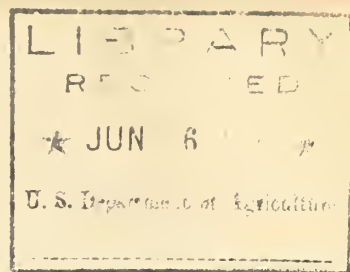

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SHEEP, MUTTON, LAMB AND WOOL - ANALYSIS OF FOREIGN TRADE OF THE UNITED STATES

Sheep

Exports of sheep though relatively small advanced from only a few thousand head prior to the Civil War to an average of 381,000 head during 1901-1905; our period of heaviest export. However, for most years imports exceed exports. Early in the 70's sheep in large numbers began to be imported from Mexico and Canada so that most subsequent years show a balance in favor of imports, reaching a high point in 1893 when net imports amounted to 422,000 head. The last 10 years are marked by a decided decline in both imports and exports, average net imports during 1924-1929 amounting to only 28,000 head. Average export values per head during the last 30 years have ranged from \$3.24 to \$21.75 per head.

Mutton and Lamb

Foreign trade in mutton and lamb is small in proportion to other meats. Prior to 1914 the balance had favored exports, but with two exceptions, subsequent years show net imports ranging from 1,000,000 pounds to 46,000,000 pounds, most of it coming from Argentina, Australia and New Zealand.

Only small quantities go to Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico, shipments to these three possessions amounting to less than 1,000,000 pounds annually.

Wool

Although the United States is the world's third largest producer of wool, production has never been equal to domestic consumption. Average wool production during 1925-1929 amounted to 331,003,000 pounds as compared with an average of 313,648,000 pounds during the pre-war years, or nearly 6 per cent above the pre-war level. Notwithstanding this increase in production foreign wools make up a larger per cent of our total consumption than they did before the war. Later post-war years show that approximately 45 per cent of all the wool consumed in this country was supplied from foreign sources whereas during 1910-1914 only about 40 per cent was of foreign origin. During 1925-1929 the average net imports of wool amounted to 273,332,000 pounds as compared with an average of 203,578,000 pounds during the 5 years immediately preceding the war or an increase of 34 per cent.

A large volume of our imports come from Australia and Argentina, the only countries surpassing the United States in wool production and a considerable quantity is also credited as coming from the United Kingdom. Formerly a large per cent was purchased on British markets and reported in our official trade statistics as coming from that country. However, these imports from the United Kingdom consisted largely of colonial wools shipped

there for resale. As a result of the changes in marketing methods and the rearrangement of the great trade routes which followed the World War, much of the wool which a few years ago was purchased on British markets is now bought directly from the primary markets of Australia, New Zealand and British South Africa.

Boston is the most important port of entry serving as an important distribution point to the great wool manufacturing centers of the east. A large volume of the combing wool is received through the port of Boston but in recent years it has stood second to Philadelphia in imports of clothing wool. The bulk of the carpet wool enters the country through New York and Philadelphia with Boston ranking third.

When compared with imports and domestic production, United States exports of wool are unimportant. In 1915, a little over 8,000,000 pounds was shipped to foreign countries but in most normal years exports have amounted to considerably less than 1,000,000 pounds. Though above the pre-war level, average exports during 1925-1929 were still insignificant amounting to only 328,000 pounds.

Reexports show considerable fluctuation, ranging from 605,000 pounds in 1919 to a maximum of 33,152,000 pounds in 1924. Most of the reexports during 1924 went to the United Kingdom. In that year prices in the United States were very little over those prevailing in the United Kingdom and with our tariff of 31 cents per pound resulted in an unusually large volume of foreign wool being diverted to British markets.

Clothing and combing wool

Approximately 48 per cent of our total imports are made up of clothing and combing wool, about a third of which comes from Australia and at least another third from Argentina and Uruguay. An increase in imports from Australia and a decline in imports from Argentina have been features of the later post-war years. Uruguay, the Union of South Africa and New Zealand are sending us larger quantities than they did before the war. During 1925-1929 average imports of clothing and combing wool amounted to 136,870,000 pounds as compared with an average of 102,117,000 pounds during 1910-1914 or an increase of 34 per cent.

Carpet Wool

At least half of our total wool imports consist of carpet wool which does not compete directly with the wool produced in the United States. During the year ended June 30, 1929, imports of wool of this type amounted to 164,712,000 pounds which was only a little below the maximum reached in 1923 when American buyers took 171,879,000 pounds. Average imports during the last 5 years amounted to 142,276,000 pounds as against an average of 105,124,000 imported during 1910-1914 or an increase of 35 per cent.

China supplied 33 per cent of the average imports of carpet wool during 1925-1929 and the United Kingdom 28 per cent, both countries supplying a somewhat larger proportion than during the 5 years, 1910-1914. British India and Argentina send us more carpet wool than they did before the war but Russia, formerly our third largest source of supply is practically out of the world markets.

Mohair (hair of the angora) and other like animals

Imports of mohair which showed considerable increase during the war and the years immediately following reached the peak in 1923 when imports amounted to 10,072,000 pounds. By 1928 imports had dropped to 2,204,000 pounds the lowest point since 1914 when imports of mohair were first separately reported. At least 2/3 of the imports come from Turkey and British South Africa.

Separate figures are not available for hair of the alpaca, cashmere and other like animals but since 1920, imports of these commodities as a whole have ranged between 200,000 pounds and 1,400,000 pounds annually. A large per cent of the hair of the alpaca comes from Peru, hair of the cashmere from India and camels' hair from China.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

DOMESTIC EXPORTS - Goods produced or manufactured in this country from either domestic or imported raw materials and which are shipped to foreign countries. The kind, quantity and value of exported merchandise are ascertained from the shipper's export declarations filed by the exporters with the collector of customs at the port of exportation.

Include exports to the Philippine Islands and Virgin Islands of the United States. Since 1902, excludes shipments from the United States to Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico.

1790-1802 - Include reexports or exports of foreign merchandise.

IMPORTS, GENERAL - Embrace articles entered at the customhouses for immediate consumption and imported articles entered for warehouse. Imports prior to 1821 are incomplete, as imports paying ad valorem duties were reported in value, but not in quantity and prior to 1817 the imports paying specific duties were reported in quantity but not in value.

Include imports from the Philippine Islands and Virgin Islands of the United States. Since 1902, exclude shipments to the United States from Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico.

IMPORTS FOR CONSUMPTION - Embrace articles entered for immediate consumption and imported articles withdrawn from warehouse for consumption. The statement of general imports and the statement of imports entered for consumption for any period will always differ to the extent that the value of entries for warehouse for the period differs from the value of withdrawals from warehouse for consumption. The term "entry for consumption" is the technical name of the import entry made at the customhouse and implies that the goods have been delivered into the custody of the importer and that the duties have been paid on the dutiable portion. Some of them may be afterward exported.

Imports for consumption were first reported in 1867 and published in 1868.

KIND, QUANTITY AND VALUE OF IMPORTS - The kind, quantity and value of imported merchandise are ascertained from the entry filed by the importer at the customhouse.

The value of imported merchandise as shown in the statistical tables is the foreign value or the export value, whichever is higher; that is, the market value or the price at which the merchandise, at the time of exportation to the United States, is offered for sale in the principal markets of the country from which exported, including the cost of containers or coverings and all expenses incident to placing the merchandise in condition ready for shipment to the United States.

REEXPORTS OR EXPORTS OF FOREIGN MERCHANDISE - Goods which have been imported into this country either for reexport or consumption and are afterward exported having undergone no change in form or condition or enhancement in value by application of labor in the United States.

1790-1802 - Combined with domestic exports.

NET EXPORTS - Domestic exports and reexports minus imports.

NET IMPORTS - Imports minus domestic exports and reexports.

AVERAGE EXPORTS VALUE PER UNIT - These have been computed by dividing the total export value each year by the total quantity and are not to be regarded as a quotation of prices.

The value upon which a given average in this table was based is composed of items which represent shipments possibly of different grades of the articles mentioned from different parts of the United States and at different seasons of the year. The actual value of any one shipment included in this total is its value at the time and place of exportation.

YEARS - The years end as follows: September 30, 1790-1842; nine months, October 1, 1842 - June 30, 1843; June 30, 1844-1929.

LEADERS - Indicate no information exists but do not necessarily signify that, there were no reports for that period as they may have been included with "all other" or with the "unenumerated".

NONCONTIGUOUS TERRITORY - In the statistics of foreign commerce of the United States, the Philippine Islands and the Virgin Islands of the United States are treated as foreign countries.

The statistics of foreign commerce include the trade of the customs districts of Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico with foreign countries but do not include the trade of these territories with the United States.

In 1903, the trade with Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico was for the first time fully and definitely recorded (See Commerce and Navigation of the United States, 1903, Vol. 1, page 31). Therefore separate tables have been compiled showing shipments from the United States to Alaska, Hawaii and Porto Rico, 1903-1929.

The collection of statistics of trade with all noncontiguous territory was authorized by an act of Congress, April 29, 1902.

WOOL UNMANUFACTURED: IMPORTS BY CLASSES INTO THE UNITED STATES 1870-1929

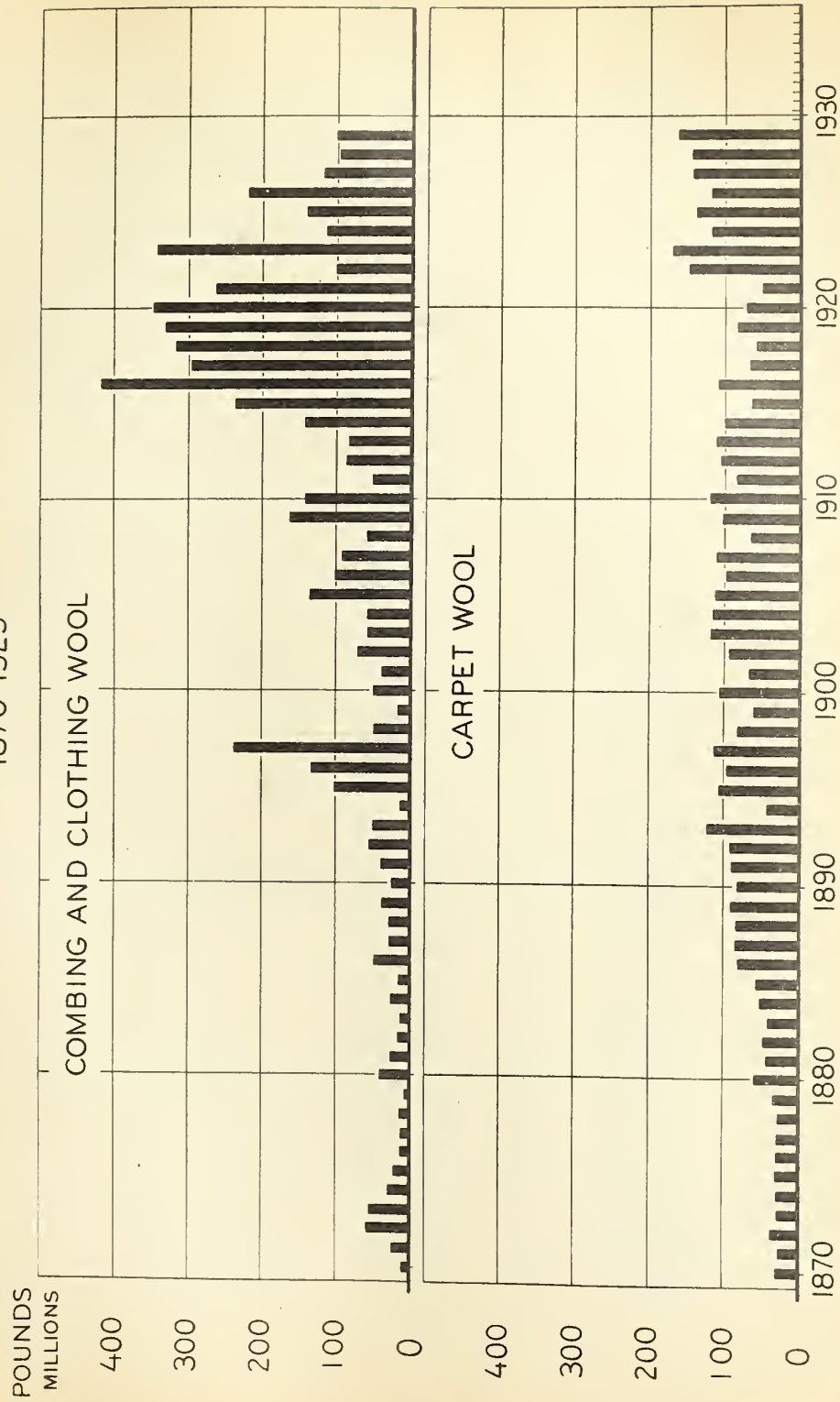


Figure 1.-The upward trend in imports of clothing and combing wool which took place prior to 1897 was followed by a short period of declining imports after which imports rose rapidly, reaching a peak in 1916. Later post-war years show a recession from the abnormally heavy imports received during and immediately following the World War, but imports are still 34 per cent above the pre-war level. The increase in imports of carpet wool which set in early in the 80's was only temporarily interrupted by the World War, after which imports continued to advance and in 1929 amounted to 164,712,000 pounds, the second highest on record.
